Ervin Eckel

Ervin Eckel, who was prominent in high school athletics before his graduation from McKinley High School here in 1916, died Saturday at Cheyenne, Wyo., where he had resided at 1216 Richardson Court. Mr. Eckel was a veteran of World War I, having enlisted in the 32nd Division and served as a sergeant major in the 107th Trains. He is survived by his wife and a son who is now serving in the Southwest Pacific war theater. A sister, Mrs. P. D. O'Connor, lives at Milwaukee.

The former Marshfield man had been ill since February. He paid his last visit to Marshfield seven years ago.

Funeral rites were conducted at Cheyenne.

HANDICAPPED IN WEIGHT.

Wausau went into the game with a rush and scored four points before Marshfield steadied down. Then "Bill" Eckel made a long shot which gave the locals a start which they were quick to follow up. The plays worked well and Marshfield scored ten points before the half was up. Wausau, after their brilliant start, did not succeed in doing much in basket work, scoring only on a foul shot. Eckel hurt his knee a short time before the half was over, but pluckily resumed playing.

In the second half Wausau took a brace, making several baskets at the start. At this period Eckel was forced to leave the game on account of his injured knee. Wendt took Eckel's guard position and Anderson, Wendt's forward. On resuming play Marshfield again took the lead by making several baskets. The lead was not great enough, however, for Wausau made three baskets in a bunch, placing them one point ahead. Seehafer then rose to the occasion and made a basket, putting the locals in the lead by one point, 18 to 17, with about three minutes to play. Marshfield worked the ball toward their basket, but were unable to score during this period, while Wausau made two baskets, cinching the game.

The team as a whole and as individuals played a good clean game and attribute their defeat mainly to Wausau's advantage in weight. Seehafer played an excellent game at center, getting the ball on the tip-off nearly all the time, which enabled the team to work their plays well. Wendt and Thom played a fast game at forward, eluding their heavy guards time and time again, but were unable to score many of their shots. Eckel and Cobeen played a good guard game and worked well together. The removal of Eckel was rather disastrous as the new guard combination did not work as well, and Anderson had hard work at forward on account of his lightness. He played a good game but had to take many hard bumps from his heavy opponent at guard. The boys are putting forth every effort to be in trim for the Stevens Point game this week. The Point is said to have a strong team, so a good game may be expected.

The final score was 21 to 18 in favor of Wausau. The game was played Friday evening.

SAVED FROM TUSCANIA

Miss Viola Eckel Receives Telegram From War Department—Brother Is Saved From Tuscania.

Miss Viola Eckel, a teacher at the Bragg School in this city received a telegram late yesterday afternoon telling that her brother, a member of the 107th Supply Company, is among the survivors of the Tuscania.

Miss Eckel received a letter from her brother a few days before his departure for France apprising her of his intention of sailing at an early date. She has been in anxiety since hearing of the tragedy of the Tuscania and entertained fears for her brother's safety. He enlisted in Marshfield during the fall.

The telegram received by Miss Eckel was from the War Department and reads as follows: "Officially reported that Erving E. Eckel was saved from Tuscania."

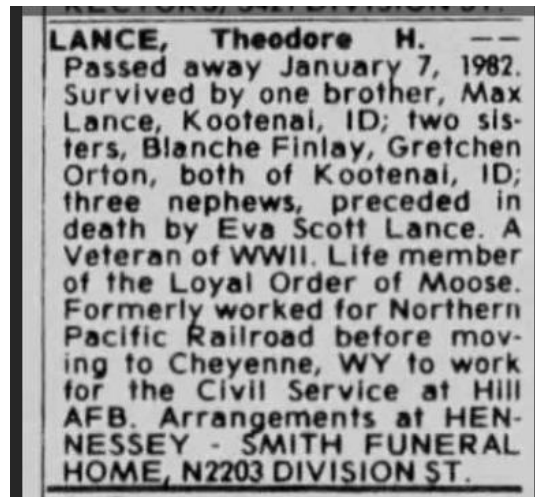

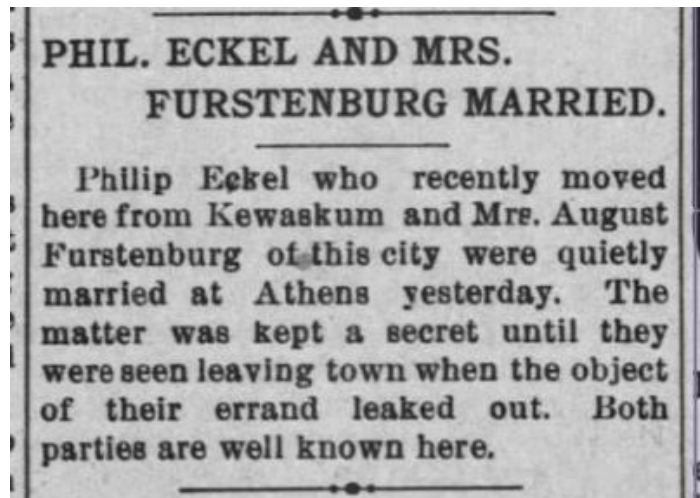

After her husband's death on May 7, 1905, Mrs. Furstenberg married again, her wedding to Albert Bahr taking place on April 6, 1911. Mr. Bahr died on May 16, 1927.

Surviving her are three children: Mrs. A. E. (Mabel) Schreiber, Miss Evelyn Furstenberg, and Edward Furstenberg, all of Marshfield. Two sons, David and Elmer Furstenberg, preceded her in death. A brother, August Wiedenhoft, Park Falls, and 10 grandchildren also survive.
