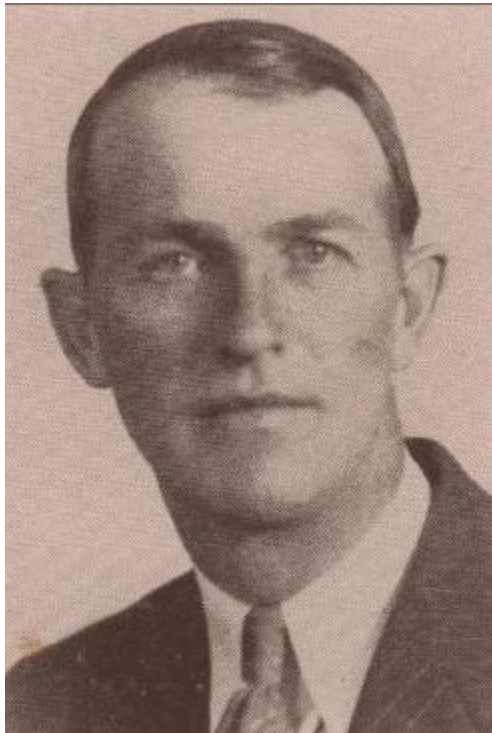

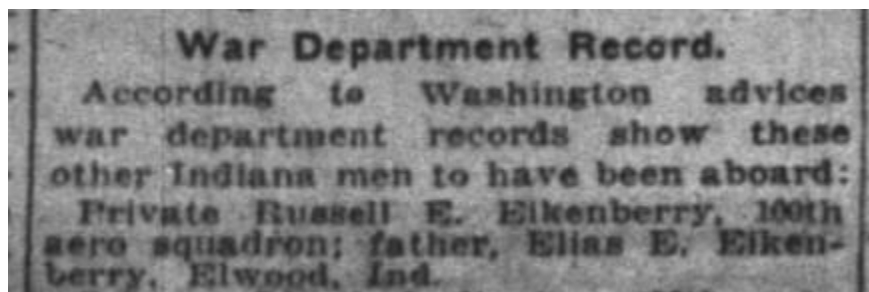

RUSSELL EIKENBERRY IS AMONG MISSING

ONE OF FOURTEEN HOOSIERS LOST

Mr. and Mrs. Elias Eikenberry, 1110 North Anderson Street, Receive News Today. Last Letter From Son Announced He Was Sailing For France, Enlisted at Detroit Last June in Aviation.

ANOTHER SON IS "SOMEWHERE AT SEA"

The war in all its seriousness was brought home to Elwood people when a telegram reached the Call Leader early today announcing that Russell Eikenberry age 26 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. Elias Eikenberry, 1110 North Anderson street, was one of the fourteen Indiana boys on board the Tuscania and who were yet among the missing. Lloyd Ledbetter, of Lapel, so far as has been learned, was the only other Madison county young man reported among the missing.

James B. Myers, of Richmond, cousin of Prosecuting Attorney Oswald Ryan, is on the missing list and it is thought that Lieut. Cleworth, formerly of Anderson and brother of Miss Beulah Cleworth, teacher in the Anderson schools, was on the boat, although his name does not appear among those missing and he was no doubt rescued if on board at all.

Private Eikenberry, a native of Elwood, spent his life in this city until about a year ago when he went to Detroit where he was employed until last June. At that time he enlisted in the Signal Corps, aviation service, and was sent to San Antonio, Texas, where he remained in training until a few weeks ago. He was then transferred to a training camp in New York state and remained there until January 17, when he was among those who left on the Tuscania.

Letter Told of Leaving.

On January 18, the parents received a letter written the preceding day at Homestead, New York. In this letter Mr. Eikenberry stated he was sailing that day, January 17, for

France and that he would notify his parents as quickly as possible following his arrival there. This was the last word received from him.

Hope Not Abandoned.

While the young man has not yet been accounted for, this does not necessarily mean that he was lost. There is a very good chance that he was picked up from the water by some one of the several vessels near at hand when the ship was torpedoed and that he will soon be landed safe on European soil. The message of today has come as a terrible blow to the parents but they have not yet given up hope that their son is still alive and that more reassuring word con-

cerning him will reach them within a few days.

Another Brother At Sea.

Harry Eikenberry, brother of the missing young man, is also in the service, having enlisted in the navy several months ago, and he is also thought to be on his way to France at this time. On January 10 the parents received a letter from him, written at Philadelphia, where he was stationed on the U. S. S. Oklahoma, stating that he expected to sail within a week but that should there be any delay in plans he would write at once. This was the last word from him and it is probable that he is also on the water now unless he has safely reached the other side.

WASHINGTON REPORTS ELWOOD BOY SAFE

RUSSEL EIKENBERRY AMONG RESCUED

WELCOME NEWS CAME TODAY

Message Late This Afternoon
Brings Joy to Grief-Stricken
Parents.

HAD ALMOST GIVEN UP HOPE

Washington, D. C., 2 P. M.—
(Special to Call Leader)—Private
Russell Eikenberry, reported as
among those lost when Tuscania
was torpedoed, was today ac-
counted for and is uninjured.

The above dispatch, which
reached the Call Leader this af-
ternoon just at the hour of our
going to press, came at a time
when parents and friends of the
young soldier had almost aban-
doned hope that he had been sav-
ed. The fact that yesterday after-
noon Mr. and Mrs. Cecero M. Led-
better, of Lapel, received a mes-
sage from the War Department at
Washington announcing that their
son, Lloyd Ledbetter, also report-
ed among the lost, had been ac-
counted for, caused increasing
apprehension here for the reason
press reports today asserted there

seemed little chance of more sur-
vivors being found. The parents,
relatives and hundreds of friends
of young Eikenberry here had
felt since morning that it would
only be a question of time until
their worst fears were confirmed
and few can realize the joy and
relief that the assurance of his
safety brought.

It is supposed that following
the sinking of the transport, Pri-
vate Eikenberry was picked up by
one of the several vessels which
hurried to the rescue of the men,
and that he was not landed until
possibly late last night or early
today. No official notification of
their son's safety had reached
the parents of the young man from
the War Department at the hour
of our going to press this after-
noon.

ELWOOD PARENTS AWAITING NOTE

Private Russell Eikenberry Is
Thought to Have Been on
Board the Tuscania.

A HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE

Elwood, Ind., Feb. 8.—Newspaper dispatches contain all the information yet received here by Mr. and Mrs. Elias Eikenberry, 1110 North Anderson street, concerning their son, Private Russell Eikenberry, reported as one of the thirteen Indiana men on board the Tuscania, and who are among those not yet accounted for. On January 18 a letter written from Homestead, N. Y., by young Eikenberry on the preceding day, stated that he was sailing that day for France. This was the last news received from him.

The young man, a native of Elwood, was 26 years of age, and attended

both the grade and high schools here. Last spring he went from Elwood to Detroit, where he was employed in an automobile factory until in June, when he enlisted in the signal corps service and he was stationed at San Antonio until late in December, when he was transferred to Mineola, N. Y.

Harry Eikenberry, a younger brother, also enlisted here several months ago in the naval service. On January 10 a letter reached the parents here announcing he was expecting to leave Philadelphia where he was stationed, and that he would sail within a week for France. No further word has been received from him and it is hoped he has safely landed by this time.

Elwood Lad on Ship Torpedoed by
Submarine, Returns to States.

Mr. and Mrs. E. F. Eikenberry, residing at 1110 North Anderson street, received a message from their son, Russell Eikenberry, telling that he had arrived safely in New York and is well and they were much pleased at the good news. Russell was a member of the 50th aviation squadron.

Russel Eikenberry had an experience in the war which did not fall to any of the other young men from this city who "got over." He was with the troops on the ship Tuscania that was struck by a torpedo from a German submarine in February of 1918.

The survivors landed in England and from Thursday evening when the sinking of the vessel was reported until the following Saturday his parents were in suspense as to his fate. Then a message came from the war department saying that he was safe.

DRAY HORSE FIGURES IN EXCITING RUNAWAY

Dray Collided With Farm Wagon Badly Injuring One of the Horses.

Becoming frightened at something when left standing in front of the fish market on North Anderson street this morning, the horse hitched to the Elias Eikenberry dray, broke into a run and started north at breakneck speed.

Near the Carlton grocery the horse and dray collided with a wagon filled with grain owned by William Steele, of the Leisure neighborhood and on which was riding Lawrence Steele, age 17, and the 17-year-old son of James Cochran. Both boys were thrown to the street but were only slightly bruised.

The dray struck one of the horses a glancing blow, tearing a great gash in its flank and breaking the animal's leg. A veterinary was quickly called and it is not yet known whether it will be possible to save the animal's life. The dray was somewhat damaged but the runaway horse was not badly hurt.

ELIAS F. EIKENBERRY DIES LATE LAST NIGHT

Elias F. Eikenberry, 76, residing at 1524½ Main street, died at 11:15 o'clock last night, of complications, after an illness of about ten days.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Chris Eikenberry, he was born in Pennsylvania December 6, 1856, and in 1878 he was united in marriage to Miss Sarah Musselman. Five children were born to this happy union. Mrs. Eikenberry died July 17, 1926.

Mr. Eikenberry enjoyed a wide acquaintance and was held in high esteem by his many friends.

Surviving are four children, Charles Eikenberry, of Elwood; Mrs. Cora Mae Ranter, Russell and Harry Eikenberry, all of Los Angeles, Cal.; two sisters, Mrs. Emilene Coons, of Camden, and Mrs. Sarah Rosrokis, of Flora, and one brother, Daniel Eikenberry, of Flora. There is one grandchild.

The body was removed to the Robert L. Jackley funeral home to be prepared for burial and this afternoon it was taken to the home of the son, Charles Eikenberry, 1514 North B street.

Funeral services will be conducted at the Conservative church at Camden tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock with Rev. M. Fisher in charge and burial will be made in the Musselman cemetery there. The funeral party will leave Elwood tomorrow morning about 11 o'clock.

PARALYSIS ENDS LIFE MRS. SARAH EIKENBERRY

Mrs. Sarah Ann Eikenberry, 67, died at her home at 1612 North E street this morning at 6 o'clock, of paralysis. She had suffered a stroke on May 4 last from which she never rallied and members of the family and friends were aware that this useful life was drawing to a close.

Mrs. Eikenberry was born September 2, 1858, near Camden, Ind., and grew to young womanhood there, being united in marriage to Elias F. Eikenberry, Feb. 19, 1880. Five children were born to their union, of whom four survive. They are Charles Eikenberry, of Elwood, and Mrs. Cora Kanther and Russell and Harry Eikenberry, of Los Angeles.
