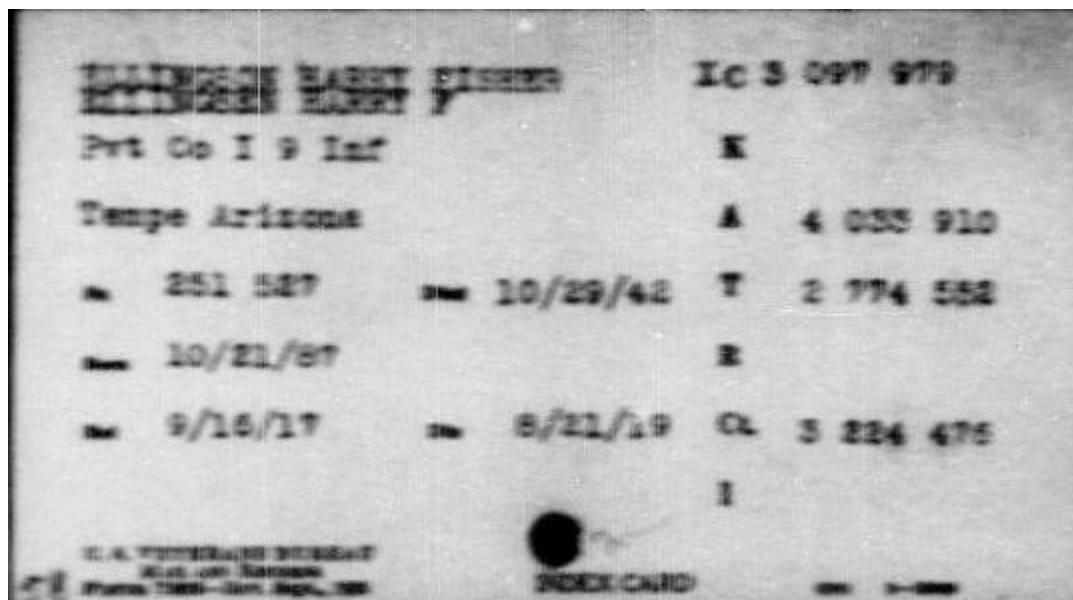

At El Paso, Texas.

Harry Fisher Ellingson was delivered to this office by officer Morris in order to ascertain his status regarding the draft. Employee was directed to make investigation regarding this man. The following statement was made by Harry Fisher Ellingson: "I was born at Tempe, Arizona October 21st, 1887. I am a grain man by occupation, and I have been in El Paso, since September 1st, 1917. I have not worked since coming here, and I am staying at the Roma Hotel on Oregon Street. I registered on the fifth day of June at Brawley, Imperial County, California."

This man had his registration card with him and he further stated that he had not heard from his registration since the day that he was required under the draft act to submit himself to registration. Following telegram was sent regarding this man:

This therefore closes this file.

After registering for the draft in Brawley, Imperial Co. CA, Harry moved to El Paso TX on 1 Sep 1917, where he was not employed & lived in a hotel. He was picked up by the FBI there for evading the draft. He had been called to a draft physical examination in CA on 12 Sep 1917 & failed to appear. [Likely he had left no forwarding address] It was decided to take him to Camp Travis TX under the guard of military authorities at Fort Bliss TX - US Federal

Harry Ellingson Funeral Is Set

TEMPE, Oct. 30—Funeral services for Harry F. Ellingson, who died in a Mesa hospital Thursday night following a heart attack, will be held in the chapel at Carr Mortuary at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon.

The Rev. Berlyn V. Farris, pastor of the First Methodist Church, will officiate. Interment will be in Double Butte Cemetery.

Mr. Ellingson, 54 years old, was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Mons Ellington, early pioneers who ranched in the Tempe district. He was a veteran of World War I and was a member of the American Legion and Knights of Pythias lodge. He owned property in the valley and made his home at Seventh street and Mill avenue in Tempe.

He is survived by two brothers, John and Jay, both of the Tempe district.

Native Of Tempe District Dies

TEMPE, Oct. 29 — Harry F. Ellingson, 54 years old, a native of the Tempe district, died tonight in the Southside District Hospital at Mesa, following a heart attack he had suffered earlier in the day in Tempe near his home, Seventh street and Mill avenue.

He was single and is survived by two brothers, John and Jay Ellingson, both local residents. Mr. Ellingson had property interests in Tempe and devoted his time to looking after them.

Funeral arrangements have not been made.

FIRE DESTROYS HAY WAREHOUSE

Fire Destroys Several Thousand Dollars' Worth of Baled Hay for Ellingson Brothers—Partly Covered by Insurance

Fire, that probably originated from a spark off a cigarette stub being smoked by one of the Mexican laborers, broke out in the Ellingson hay warehouse on West Seventh street in Tempe shortly before 6 o'clock last evening, and in less time than the alarm could be turned in the huge sheet-iron structure was a complete mass of flames. By the time the hose carts arrived it was out of the question to play any water on the flames, and even at midnight they were burning sufficiently to light the town for blocks away. Insurance for probably half the value of both the warehouse and its contents were carried.

Mexican hay haulers had been working in the storehouse all day and as much as forty tons of hay had been hauled out. Jay Ellingson, the younger of the brothers in the firm, had been in the barn himself but a few minutes before the flames burst out, and he says that even at the time he noticed a rather peculiar odor, similar to something burning, but he paid no heed and continued loading his hay. As he recalls it, the Mexicans who had been in there previously were smoking and from the circumstances under which the blaze broke out there seems little doubt but what it originated from a spark off a cigarette.

Harry Ellingson, general manager of the firm, stated last evening that probably 300 bales of straight alfalfa and alfalfa and grain hay mixed were still in the warehouse. The building itself, built entirely of sheet metal, was valued at about \$1,500, and insurance covering \$700 of this was carried. The hay was also insured for about one-half its actual value.

Dense black smoke poured forth from the structure when it first caught fire and later this was replaced by the intense glare of the blaze that all through the evening extended light for blocks around and that could no doubt be seen in most any part of the valley.

The warehouse is located on West Seventh street, just alongside of the lot the former A. J. Peters warehouse occupied that twice before burned to the ground with thousands of dollars worth of hay. The ginning plant of the Tempe cotton exchange is now located on this site and the premises were closely guarded all last night to prevent any possibility of a spark igniting one of those structures.

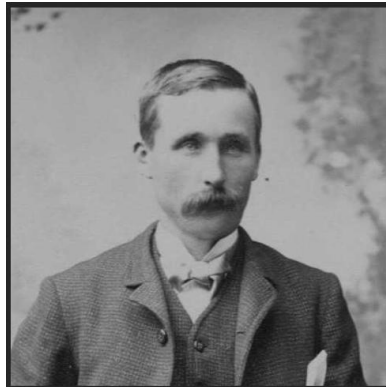

M. ELLINGSON PIONEER TEMPE RESIDENT DIES

TEMPE, July 28.—Mons Ellingson, a resident of Tempe for 51 years, died in a hospital in Boston, Mass., July 21, according to word received here today. He left Tempe for the East with his sister-in-law, Mrs. Anna Custer, July 1, and at that time appeared to be in good health. His death is reported to have followed an illness of four days.

Harry Ellingson, his son, had started for Boston to see his father, but failed to reach his bedside before death came. The body will be brought here for burial.

In addition to his son, Harry, Mr. Ellingson is survived by two other sons, John and Jay, and four grandchildren. Mr. Ellingson was born in Norway, coming to the United States in early childhood. He is well known throughout the Salt River Valley for the large part he took in the development of this community.

Called To Donofrio
Confectionery Early
This Morning.**

FIREMAN INJURED

**Eight Streams Of Water
Poured Into Burning
Basement To Check
Spread Of Flames.**

ALL available fire apparatus in the city of Phoenix was pressed into service shortly before 2 o'clock this morning in an effort to check the spread of flames discovered in the basement of the Donofrio Confectionery building. Dense clouds of smoke issuing from the basement of the store building made it difficult for the firemen to work and eight streams of water were poured into the blazing basement. About 2:30 a. m. the flames broke through the floor and spread to the kitchen at the rear of the store.

Leon Keefe, one of the firemen suffered a badly lacerated hand when a window was shattered at the rear of the building. He was given first aid emergency treatment at the Central station and returned to the fire.

The alarm was turned in shortly

The alarm was turned in shortly before 2 a. m. and apparatus from Central station, Five Points and Ninth and Van Buren streets and McDowell station responded.

Firemen had difficulty at first in locating the blaze, due to large, low-hanging clouds of thick smoke, which clung close to the ground for blocks in every direction of the Donofrio Building.

This also necessitated a cautious approach to the downtown business intersection. So thick were the clouds of smoke automobile driving was hazardous.

Firemen had to force entrance into the burning building with axes, but increased volume of smoke then further handicapped their efforts to combat the blaze.

The building is owned by Mons Ellingson of Tempe and the confectionery store owned by Guy Alsap and John Alsap.

The confectionery store including stock and fixtures is valued at \$70,000, practically covered by insurance.

At 3:05 a. m. Assistant Fire Chief Dave Mercer announced that the flames had broken through the wall into the basement of the Talbot and Hubbard Hardware company and were eating their way through the first floor. A valuation of \$65,000 was placed on the Talbot and Hubbard stock and fixtures.

At 3:30 o'clock this morning the fire was still beyond control and the firemen were laying new lines of hose to confine the fire to the immediate building in which it started.

Shortly after 3:30 o'clock this morning the fire had reached the lodge rooms in the Knights of Pythias hall and firemen were getting their ladders into place to fight the flames on the second floor.

No estimate of the amount of damage was possible this morning as it appeared the store would be gutted by fire and water. The flames were spreading between the ground floor and the ceiling of the basement and the firemen forced an entrance at the front of the store room to make it easier to play water on the fire.

A stream of water was played on the burning floor from the confectionery store and much of the stock will be damaged by water, even though the flames are checked before they reach that section of the building.

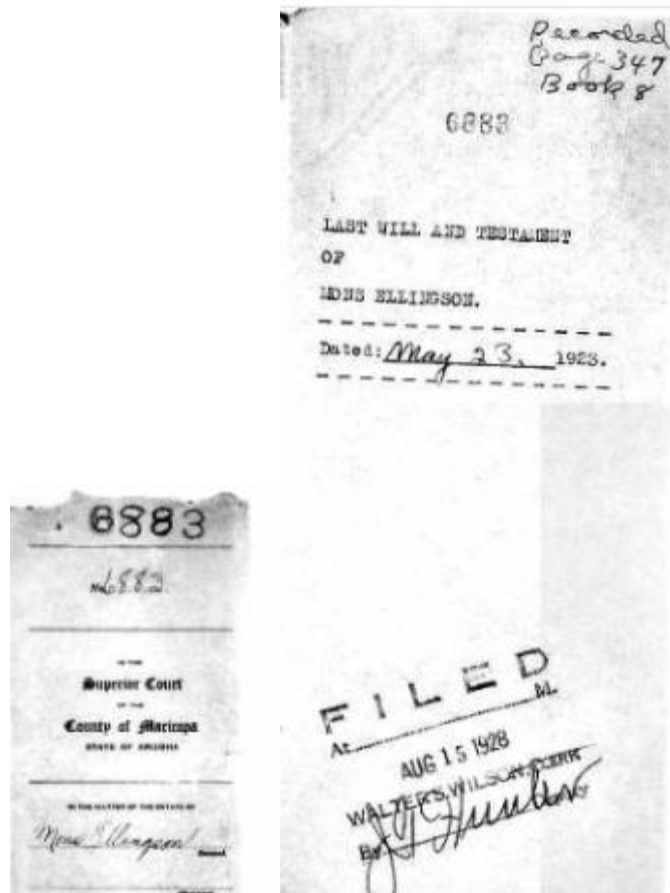

I, MONS ELLINGSON, of the city of Tempe, state of Arizona, being of sound mind and memory and mindful of the uncertainties of human life, do make, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament as follows:

First: I give, devise and bequeath to my wife, Margaret J. Ellingson, absolutely, all articles of personal, domestic or household use or ornament, including my furniture, books, pictures, jewelry, provisions, consumable stores, and all household effects which at the time of my death shall be in, about or belonging to the premises and house in which I may reside at the date of my decease.

I also bequeath to my wife, Margaret J. Ellingson, absolutely, all my ready money including moneys in any bank or in the hands of any agent at the date of my death.

Second: I give, devise and bequeath unto my wife, Margaret J. Ellingson, all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate of every kind and description whatsoever and wheresoever located including my separate and community property, for her use and benefit during her natural life, with full power and authority to sell and convert any or all of said property into cash and to invest and re-invest the same in such other property and securities as she may deem most beneficial to said estate, and to have at all times, absolutely, all the income derived from the use of said property, and that upon her death all of the residue of my estate herein devised to her for life I hereby bequeath and devise to my three sons, Harry F. Ellingson, John M. Ellingson and J. T. Ellingson, their heirs and assigns forever, to be divided share and share alike among them, provided however, that in case of the death of any of my said sons leaving issue or wife, then such issue or wife, as the case may be, shall take only the share which the deceased son should have taken had he been living; provided, however, if any one of my said

sons shall die without leaving wife or issue, then, in that event, the survivors of such deceased son shall take share and share alike as his proportion of said estate.

Third: I hereby nominate and appoint my wife, Margaret J. Ellingson, sole executrix of this my last will and testament, and in case of her death or inability to act, then I appoint in her place and stead as such executrix, Harry F. Ellingson to act as executor; and in case of his death or inability to act as such executor, then I appoint my son John M. Ellingson to act as executor; and in case of his death or inability to act I appoint my son J. T. Ellingson as such executor; and I direct that no bond or other proceedings in court shall be required of my executrix or executor other than the probating of this will and the filing of an inventory and appraisal of my estate.

Fourth: I hereby direct that the executrix or executor, as the case may be, shall devote sufficient time to the administration of my estate and for her, or his, services, as the case may be, shall be paid the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per month during the time so served as such executrix or executor, and that this amount shall be full compensation for all fees that would be allowed such executrix or executor by law for such services.

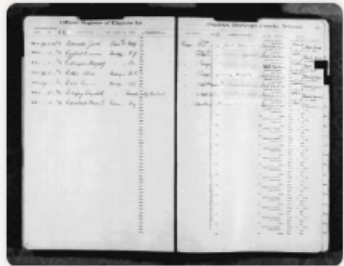

WOMAN PIONEER OF TEMPE FOUND DEAD ON STEAMER

Harry Ellingson of Tempe received a telegram from his father, Mons Ellingson, yesterday, stating that his mother had died on board a ship between Long Beach and San Francisco yesterday morning. The telegram stated that Mrs. Ellingson was found dead in bed, and also stated that preparations were being made to bring the body to Tempe for burial.

Mrs. Ellingson, who was a pioneer of Salt River valley, had gone to California for the summer accompanied by her husband and Tempe friends, and the party was enroute from Long Beach to San Francisco at the time of her death. No details could be learned last night regarding the condition of Mrs. Ellingson's health prior to the departure from Long Beach.

Mrs. Ellingson, whose maiden name was Fisher, was born in Pennsylvania, but came to Arizona in 1885, marrying Mons Ellingson soon after her arrival here. She and her husband have taken an active part in the development of Salt River valley and own considerable real estate in the vicinity of Tempe.

For many years Mr. and Mrs. Ellingson made their home on a ranch near Tempe, but since Mr. Ellingson's retirement from active business they have lived in Tempe. She is survived by her husband, three sons, Harry B. Ellingson, Jay Ellingson and John Ellingson, all of Tempe, and a sister in Pennsylvania. Her sister-in-law, Mrs. Ibbie Fisher of Tempe, also survives. Funeral announcement will be made later.

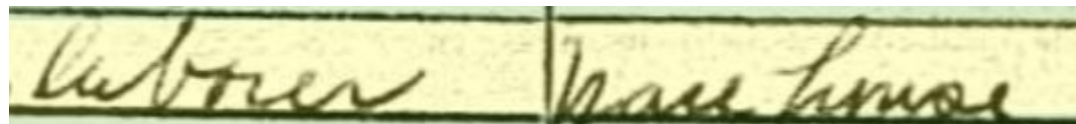
