HE DIDN'T GET WET WHEN TUSCANIA SANK

**William Elmore Of Lynden Wasn't
Even Splashed When Big Trans-
port Was Submarined**

How a Lynden boy went through the Tuscania disaster without even getting wet is told in a letter received this week at the Elmore home south of the city. The writer is William T. Elmore, Company D, 6th Battalion, Twentieth Engineers, a survivor of the transport that was sunk by a German submarine off the Irish Coast last month.

The letter is dated February 14, and at that time young Elmore was under the impression that all the Americans on board had been saved.

"I was on the ship that was sunk with the American soldiers on it," writes Elmore. "I got off safe, and never even got wet. They all got off, I think. I am all alone now; Bud and Bob are both in the hospital.

"We sure had some time coming over here. I lost everything I had when the ship sunk. I was waiting for supper when she got hit, and I didn't have any coat, but I wasn't thinking of anything only getting out.

"I have stayed with it pretty well so far; I haven't been sick a day since I have been in the army. It pays to be tuf, believe me; and I guess I am. This is a pretty nice place where I am now. If only I could get enough to eat! We only get half-rations here, and that isn't enough for me! And there is no tobacco fit to use. I want you to send me some cigarettes.

"Tell 'hello' to all my friends there."

BOYS ASK HERALD TO SAY THEY ARE SAFE IN ENGLAND

A letter was received by The Herald today from four Whatcom county men who were on the transport Tuscania, sunk last month by the Germans, in which they announce their safety. The letter was sent from Manchester and was dated February 27. It follows:

"Believing that we were the only boys from Bellingham on the Tuscania at the time of its torpedoing, we take the liberty to write to your paper, hoping you will print same to assure our many friends of our safety.

"There is lots we would like to say but fearing the censor would stop the whole letter, we will make it as brief as possible. There were on board: Thomas Elmore, of Ten Mile; George Sterling, of Ten Mile; Charles McIntosh, of Bellingham; Oswald Robertson, of Bellingham. Roderick McDonald was taken off the ship at Halifax.

"We wish to thank the Red Cross society for their good work.

"We also wish to state that Bull Durham is one shilling or 24 cents a sack here. Same will reach any company at the front—for example, 'John Doe, Co. D, 6th Bn., 20th Eng. American Expeditionary forces, via New York.'"

There were other Whatcom county boys on the Tuscania but apparently the writers of the letter were not aware of the fact.

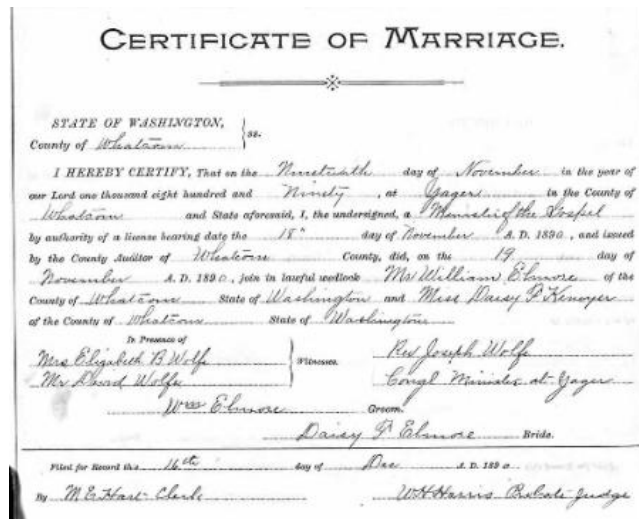

streets.

The heavy car, which skidded at the intersection and before the workmen could scatter, plowed through the group, cutting down D. McCulloch, single, and Thomas Gentile was taken to a hospital, suffering from painful injuries.

Car Skids 165 Feet

Police Constable Stewart was at the corner of Pender and Granville streets when the car passed him, going north. He alleged that it was traveling at a speed which he estimated at twenty-five miles an hour. Elmore saw the workmen and applied the brakes. The automobile skidded a distance of 165 feet and smashed through the gang.

An ambulance was called and Elmore, who, it is said, admitted having two drinks, was placed under arrest. His bail was set at \$10,000.

Elmore's occupation was given as that of a lumberman and according to information given the police, the automobile was left by a friend in the custody of Mrs. Beckman, who could not drive. Elmore volunteered to drive her to Vancouver.

Sheriff A. L. Callahan was informed Friday night by Vancouver authorities that Elmore probably would face a charge of manslaughter. According to the records of the police and sheriff's office, Elmore, whose address was given as 2610 Humboldt street, has been in police court on charges of drunkenness. He was arrested by Sam Campbell, of the Canadian customs, at Aldergrove, B. C., last May 22, in alleged possession of an automobile carrying about ten cases of liquor, according to Sheriff Callahan. VANCOUVER, B. C., July 28.—That D. McCulloch, aged 46, came to his death at Granville street as the result of injuries received when he was struck by an automobile driven by Boyd Lester Elmore of Bellingham, Wash., early Friday morning, was the verdict of a coroner's jury which investigated the accident Saturday. G. Gentile, who was with McCulloch, where a crew of men were repairing a street car track, was injured in the accident.

BLAINE MAN ACCUSED OF GRAND LARCENY

VANCOUVER, B. C., Nov. 4.—Boyd Lester Elmore of Bellingham, charged with manslaughter in connection with the death of Donald McCullough, who was struck and killed by an automobile driven by Elmore July 25 last, went on trial here yesterday in the assize court. McCullough, an employe of the British Columbia Electric railway, was killed while he was working on a street, and Dominic Gentile, a fellow employe, was injured.

A coroner's jury which investigated the case a few days after the accident, said that McCullough came to his death as a result of injuries received when he was struck by an automobile driven by Elmore, and the jury expressed the opinion that "the car was not under proper control, being overcrowded and driven at an excessive rate of speed." Police asserted that the car was traveling between twenty-five and thirty miles an hour just before the crash

and they said their measurements showed that it skidded 139 feet before it came to a stop. The marks on the street, which had been watered shortly before, showed that the car went 110 feet before it struck McCullough and seventeen feet further when it hit Gentile.

It is said that there were three other persons in the car at the time of the accident. Claude Mahanes of Seattle, who was a passenger, said that there were two women in the car, Mrs. Mahanes and Mrs. Beckman, and according to the police, headed that they all occupied a single seat.

Those arrested and who were shortly afterward released on \$500 bail each were Richard H. Murphy, 27, who was said to have been acting as bartender; Mucci Tullo, 56, who was also back of the counter, and Dick Bendelli, 56.

Bendelli, police said, was one of two men sentenced by Police Judge Martin L. Potter Wednesday afternoon on liquor charges dating from a raid by state officers April 17, on the same premises.

He was fined \$300 and costs and given a 90-day jail term to be suspended after two days. Sentenced at the same time was Howard J. Wise, who was fined \$150 and costs and given a 90-day term to be suspended after he serves 10 days.

The seven customers, who posted bail for their release under charges of disorderly conduct, were Boyd Elmore, 57; James W. Edrington, 25; Anthony Spadafore, 38; Nick Demira, 42; Shirley Davis, 35; Betty Cunningham, 29, and James Cosgriff, 31.

All three raids, the officers said, were made with search warrants issued by Police Judge Martin L. Potter.

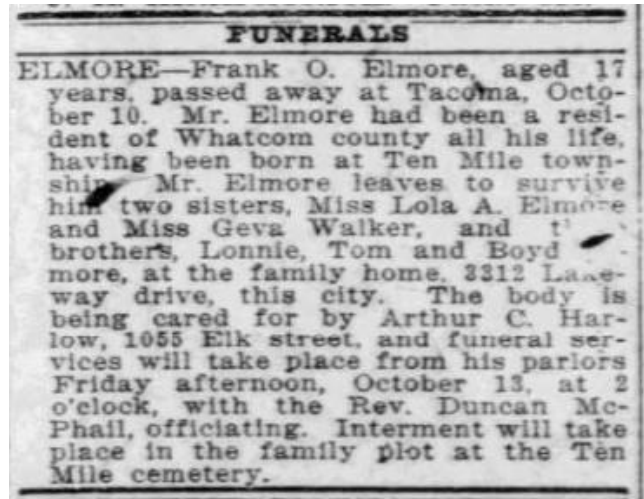
