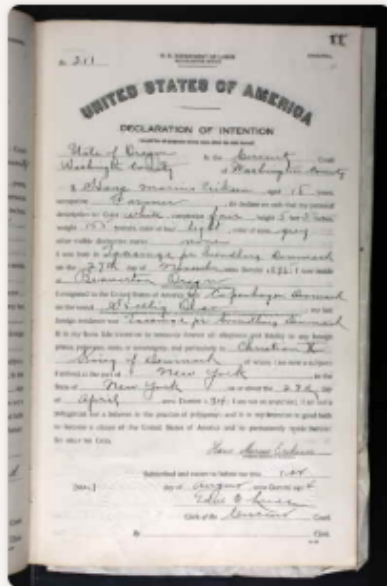

SURVIVORS' NAMES COMING IN SLOWLY

War Department Still Holds
to 113 Missing, but 345
Are Not Accounted For.

LIST STILL INCOMPLETE

Associated Press Compiles and
Makes Public Record of Those
Whose Whereabouts Are Still
Unreported to War Secretary.

(By the Associated Press.)

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.—Eighteen hundred and thirty-two names of American soldiers rescued from the torpedoed liner *Tuscania* had been reported tonight to the War Department, leaving 345 of the soldiers on board unaccounted for.

No official report has reached the Department to change the estimate that all except 113 of the men were saved, but the names have been coming in very slowly over the cables and there is no assurance as to when the list will be complete.

From the names so far received and the passenger list of the lost steamer the Associated Press has compiled the record of those still not reported. Probably more than 200 of the men whose names appear on this record are safe in Ireland and will be so reported soon.

49 MORE ON HONOR LIST

NAMES REVEALED IN CHECK OF WHOLE STATE.

Total in Record Is Brought Up to
934—Thirteen of Additions
Killed in Battle.

SALEM, Or., March 15.—(Special.)—Forty-nine names were added today to Oregon's honor roll of those who lost their lives in the world war. The names were obtained in a state-wide checking up of war records made by George A. White, adjutant-general of the state. The additions bring the total up to 934. It is expected that a few more names may be added.

Of the 49 additional men, 13 were killed in battle and the others died of disease. Nearly every county in the state is represented in the 49 names. Several of the names included had been credited to other states by the war department by reason of enlistment while temporarily away from home. The records in all these cases have been adjusted. Colonel White declared, and the names properly credited to Oregon. The list has been established for the permanent record and for use in histories and memorials.

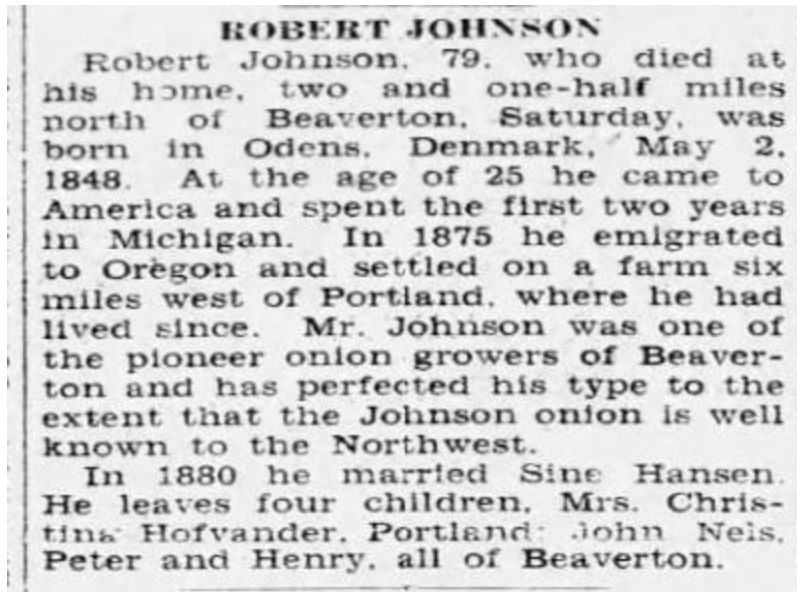
According to Denmark church records, Hans, son of Lars Eriksen & Maren Nielsen, was born 27 Nov 1895 in Bjerreby, Svendborg, Sweden. He was baptized 29 Dec 1895 in Svendborg, Sweden. He was confirmed 3 Apr 1910 in Bjerreby.

M.H. Eriksen, age 19, of Bjerreby, Svendborg, Sweden, who came to the U.S. on the “Hellig Olav” – leaving Copenhagen, Denmark, on 9 Apr 1914 & arriving in NY on 23 Apr 1914.

Hans Marius Eriksen, age 18, farmer, filed a declaration of intention to become a US citizen in Circuit Court, Washington Co. Oregon on 1 Aug 1914. He was 5'5" tall & weighed 155 lbs. He listed a birthplace of Taasinge pr Svendburg, Denmark & a birthdate of 27 Nov 1895. He was a resident of Beaverton OR. He had immigrated from Copenhagen, Denmark, aboard the “Hellig Olav” & arrived in New York City NY on 23 Apr 1914. He was a subject of the king of Denmark.

Wartime:

He had listed Ralph Johnson, a friend residing in Beaverton OR, as his next-of-kin on “Tuscania.” His Oregon service card indicates that Mrs. Robert Johnson, a friend who resided in Beaverton OR, was notified of his death. Perhaps “Ralph” on Tuscania is actually “Robert.” A Robert Johnson (1848 Denmark – 1927 OR, F: 57742779) & wife Sina Hansen Johnson (1850-1932, F: 57742883) lived in Beaverton, Washington Co.
