I entered the U.S. Army on 6/22/17 and am still in the Service.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to George V, King of Great Britain and Ireland of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 15th day of March, anno Domini 1913, and in the State of Texas continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 1st day of Sept, anno Domini 1919, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the 1st Court of San Antonio, Texas, on the 1st day of October, anno Domini 1891, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: None, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Mr. Evans had resided at the Veterans Home since October of 1978.

Her husband Thomas Ellis Evans was born in Wales & emigrated on the “Carmania” from Liverpool, England, on 5 Mar 1913 & lived 9 ½ years in the US, at Chicago IL. He was naturalized in the US District Court at San Antonio TX on 24 Dec 1919. She has lived in the US 2 ½ years, from Nov 1919 to 1922 in Chicago IL & Cincinnati OH.
