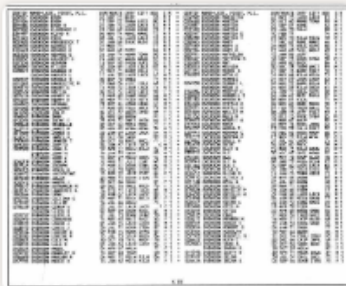

The Tuscania?

Remember the Tuscania?
McKinley Robinson of Appleton does. So does Archie Beaudoin of New London.

Robinson and Beaudoin and numerous other Fox Valley soldiers bound for European duty were aboard the Tuscania when the big British transport steamer was torpedoed by a German submarine off the Irish coast about supertime on Feb. 5, 1918.

The Tuscania stayed afloat for about two hours, enough time for most of the more than 2,000 British and American troops to abandon ship safely. But more than 200 of them died, including James P. Hawley of Neenah and Clifford Norris and W.B. Spencer of New London.

"All Appleton Boys Saved," screamed the banner headline across the top of the front page of the Appleton Evening Crescent on Feb. 11. One who was saved was Arthur Hantschel. He's dead now, but his brother, Erwin, of Appleton, came to the office recently with a fragile, yellowed newspaper front page dated Feb. 10, 1918 that listed the names of all Wisconsin soldiers who survived the disaster.

Many of them are no longer living. I found two who are, and asked them what they remembered about the day the Tuscania was torpedoed.

Beaudoin was 20 years old — "I still had my mother's apron string in my hands." The soldiers were supposed to land in Liverpool the night of Feb. 5.

There was an uneasiness on the Tuscania, because everyone knew there were German U-boats in the area. Against regulations, Beaudoin and a buddy went up to the third deck, thinking it would be safer there. "I looked straight ahead and could see a light flashing," probably from shore, seconds before the torpedo hit, Beaudoin said.

There was no warning it was coming. No sighting. No sound. "But, so help me God, I felt it coming," Beaudoin said.

"The whole boat sort of shivered" when it was struck, he recalled. A second torpedo missed its mark. The first one hit the coal bin. That, Beaudoin said, was fortunate, because the pumps could be used for a while as the men escaped.

Beaudoin saw men disappear when they leaped into the water or when they couldn't make the leap from the listing Tuscania to the destroyer that pulled alongside for the rescue. Beaudoin made the leap, when the Tuscania was "about 45 degrees down."

The Tuscania survivors used to hold reunions. Now there is seldom even any talk about that cold night off the Northern Ireland coast 60 years ago, Beaudoin said.

Robinson also was 20 years old on Feb. 5, 1918. He had left his homeland in Waco, Texas, a member of the 127th Medical Company.

He doesn't recall just where he was on the Tuscania when she was torpedoed, "but I probably was under cover somewhere, because it was cold out."

"There was a lot of screaming and hollering" where he was, Robinson recalled. He said he "nearly drowned" before being rescued from a lifeboat. Robinson escaped the Tuscania with soaked clothes, nine cents and a pouch of Durham chewing tobacco.

According to The Crescent, there were many tense days in Appleton as families and friends waited for the War Department to release the names of Tuscania casualties and survivors. The Crescent of Feb. 8, 1918, stated, "Mothers who could scarcely restrain sobs, fathers whose voices trembled and sisters and sweethearts vainly besieged newspaper offices by telephone and in person to learn the fate of a boy thought aboard the Tuscania."

On Feb. 11, The Crescent published the pictures of the Appleton survivors and the names of other area soldiers who were safe in Scotland and Ireland.

Survivors from Appleton were Robinson, Hantschel, Eric Galpin, Theodore Briggs, Henry J. Pettigrew, Jacob F. Schneider, Irwin H. Meidam, Worth L. Bushey and Paul VanWyk. New London soldiers who were saved were Beaudoin, Byron E. Christian, Frank I. Davis, George E. Doman, Martin D. Bongers, Charles Foley, Leonard Meshke, Elmer A. Hebbe and R.A. Mayo.

Others from the area who survived were Laurel Conant, Harry B. Collier and Arthur L. Steffen of Hortonville; Alexander Steward Jr., Martin C.W. Winter, John C. Barth and Hilding Fagerdahl of Clintonville; W.A. Reichel of Leeman; George D. Danley of Iowa; Martin T. Evenson of Manawa and A.E. Steffenhagen of Neenah.

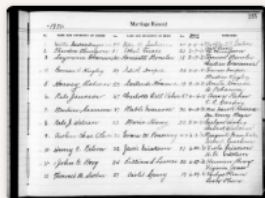

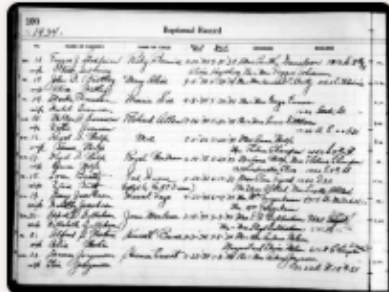

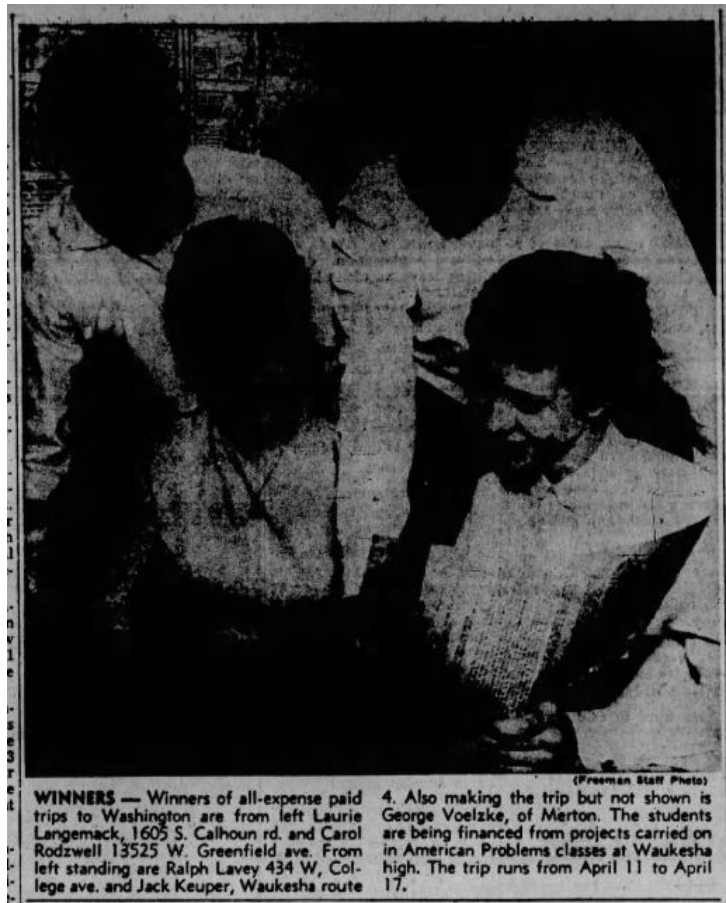

Blum Takes Gullickson Case Under Advisement

The case of Arnold Gullickson, arraigned in county court yesterday for drunken driving, was taken under advisement for 72 hours by County Judge George L. Blum after the opposing counsels, John B. Fleming, corporation counsel, and Laurence J. Riley for the defense, harangued and pleaded for nearly three hours. Mr. Riley was insistent that his client "should not be crucified in this court because he had the misfortune of being convicted here before."

The trial grew out of a collision between the cars of Gullickson and Herman R. Peisch, city employe, and which occurred at noon Aug. 21 at the corner of Dewey and Wisconsin Sts. Peisch testified that his car was standing still when struck by the other car, and also said that Gullickson was very drunk. Peter Walker, local contractor, who was on the scene soon after the accident, said that Gullickson staggered and smelled of liquor. Other witnesses testified substantially the same, while others again who came in contact with Gullickson said that they did not notice anything to indicate drunkenness.

Court Convicts Gullickson in Statutory Case

Sentence Deferred by Wickham Following Testimony

Arnold Gullickson, 31, Eau Claire, was found guilty of breaking and entering with intent to commit the crime of adultery by Judge James Wickham following trial in circuit court Tuesday morning. Sentence was deferred and the court ordered Gullickson held in jail here in the meantime.

Gullickson was charged with breaking into the home of Lawrence Olson, located about 7 miles south of Eau Claire in the town of Pleasant Valley about 1 a. m. Aug. 23, last. District Attorney Connor Hansen appeared for the state and Gullickson was represented by D. O. Hibbard.

State witnesses included Mrs. Lawrence Olson, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel LaBlanc, who lived upstairs in the same house, John Fitzpatrick, Lawrence Olson and James Pendergast. Gullickson and Gordon Schippke testified for the defense.

Claimed He was Invited

The defense contended that Gullickson visited the Olson home on invitation from Mrs. Olson and, on that basis, the state's charge of breaking and entering could not be substantiated and Gullickson denied intent to commit adultery.

Mrs. Olson, 24, testified she was awakened about 1 a. m. on the night in question, and more than two hours after her husband, who was working nights at the time, had left home. Gullickson, she said, was standing at the foot of her bed, in which she also had her infant child, holding a lighted match. She asked what he wanted and told him to get out, she said. Gullickson sat on the side of the bed, she related, and when she attempted to sit up he pushed her back and kissed her.

After a brief conversation, during which the baby awoke and started to cry, she took the child upstairs and told Mrs. Le Blanc of the visitor. Before Le Blanc could get down to the lower rooms Gullickson left the house, entered his car, parked nearby and drove away, she testified. On cross examination Mrs. Olson denied an intimate conversation with Gullickson two nights previously at an Eau Claire tavern or that she invited him at that time to call "any time her husband was away." The night before, she said, some one rapped at the outer door about 1 a. m. but she did not answer the call and the man drove away in a car.

Lawrence Olson testified his attention was called to the first visit by his wife and he examined tire tracks near the home. These were the same as were made by the Gullickson car the following night, Olson declared.

Gullickson Tells Story

Taking the stand in his own defense Gullickson told of meeting the Olsons two night before in an Eau Claire tavern. At first, he said, there were other people in the party including Fitzpatrick and Pendergast. Later these left and, after Olson went to the bar where he talked to Schepke, bartender there at the time, Gullickson testified Mrs. Olson said she and her husband did not get along well. He asked her, he said, if she ever "stepped out" and she said she had not but would if she had a chance.

Gullickson testified he told her not to start doing anything like that as he had had domestic troubles himself and would give her some good advice on the subject. He asked when he could call at their home and she replied, Gullickson said, "Any night this next week as my husband is working nights then." He said he drove to the Olson home the following night but left when no one came to the door where he rapped.

purpose of his visit to the Olson home Gullickson maintained that it was due to Mrs. Olson's invitation. Judge Wickham declared that acceptance of such an invitation, had not been extended, made the matter worse. Gullickson denied any intention of adultery but the court asserted all circumstances pointed to that as the reason for the visit.

Schepke testified that Gullickson and Mrs. Olson sat in a booth together about 20 minutes or a half hour while Olson was talking to the witness at the bar.

Fitzpatrick and Pendergast told of being at the tavern with the Olsons earlier in the evening, leaving before them. Olson, recalled to the stand, said he never had any reason to be jealous of his wife, that he had known Gullickson many years and would have thought nothing of a casual visit at his home by the latter.

Gullickson testified that on the night in question he left Eau Claire some time after midnight, drove to the Olson home and parked his car nearby. He found the back screen door unlocked, he said, and walked in. The bedroom door was ajar, and Gullickson said he presumed it had been so left in anticipation of his visit. He lit a match and Mrs. Olson awoke, identified him and said she wished he had not come that night as the baby had been fretful. Gullickson said they talked and that he offered to leave and was surprised to learn that she had not told her husband of his intended visit. The baby started to cry, he said, and when she went upstairs with the child, he left.

Sentenced to Waupun for Attempting to Commit Adultery

Arnold Gullickson, 31, Eau Claire, must serve not less than three years or more than three years and one day in the state penitentiary at Waupun on a charge of breaking and entering with intent to commit the crime adultery.

Sentence was imposed by Judge James Wickham in circuit court here Wednesday. Gullickson was found guilty after trial before the court here Tuesday.

Judge Wickham remarked, in passing sentence, that the penalty is severe but that it is the minimum permitted by law for the offense charged. 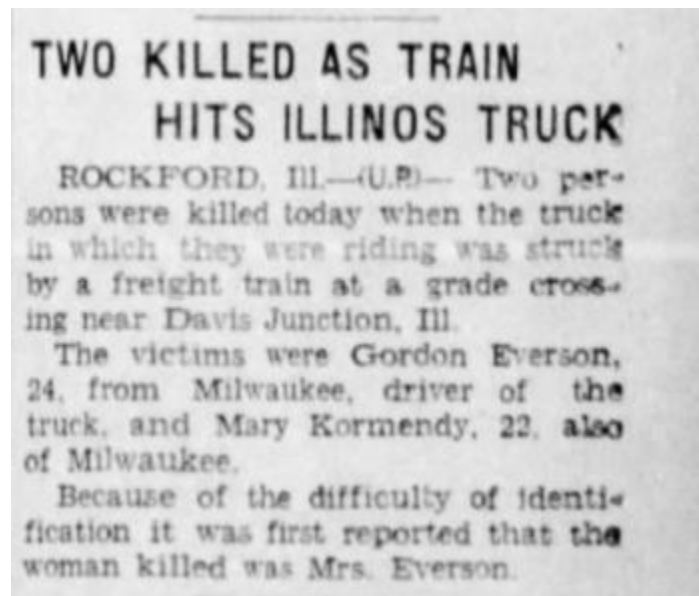

Truck Driver, Girl Killed at Crossing

(By Associated Press)

ROCKFORD, Ill., Sept. 1.—Gordon Evenson, 24, a Milwaukee beer truck driver, and Miss Mary Kormendy, 22, riding with him, were killed today when their huge six-wheeled truck crashed into a fast Milwaukee road freight train at the Meridian highway crossing near here.

Gordon's body was found in the wreckage several hours later. Miss Kormendy's body was identified by her father, Casper, who was called from his home in Milwaukee.

Miss Kormendy's mangled body was found on the right-of-way, 200 feet from the crossing.

The truck burst into flames and firemen from Rockford fought the blaze for an hour while traffic was halted on both highway and railroad. Beer bottles bursting from the heat showered spectators with the foaming fluid and broken glass.

William A. Maddox, president of Rockford college, and Prof. A. O. Wilgeroth were killed at the same crossing a year ago.
