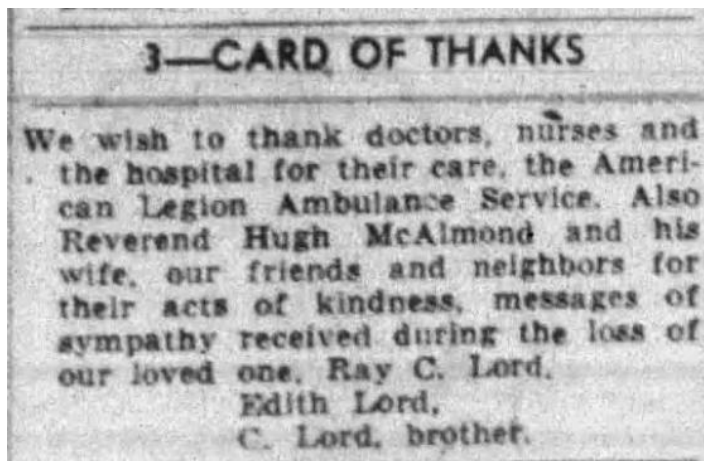

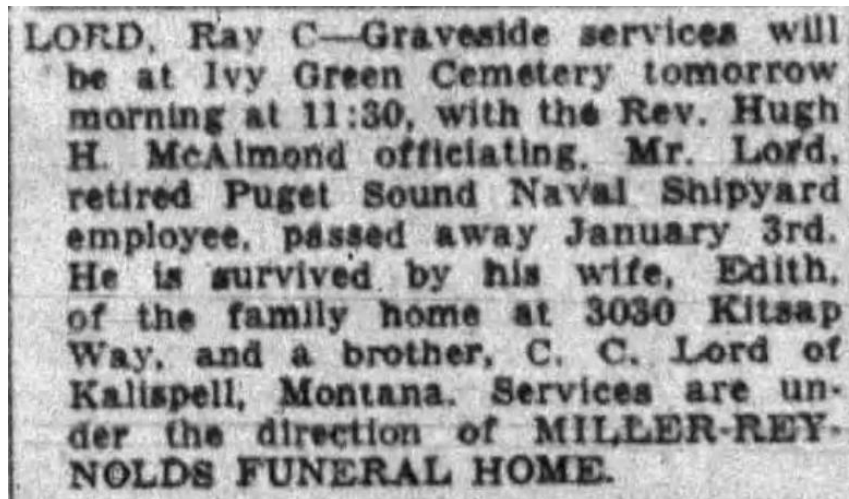

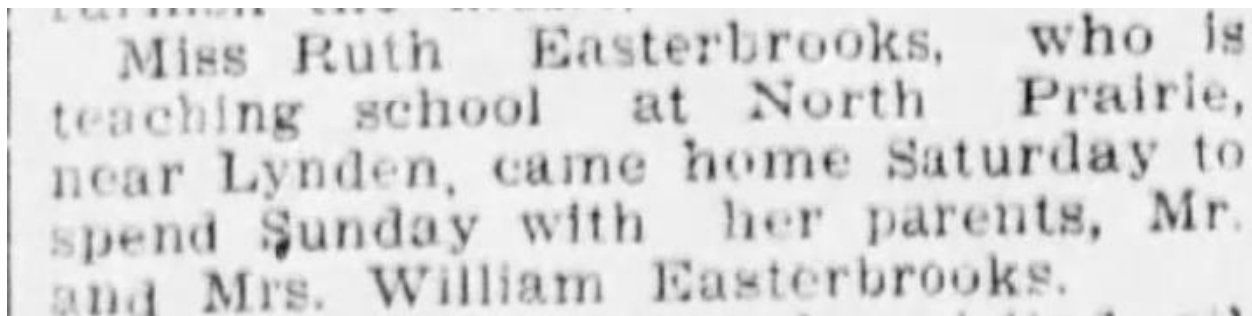

Nick Lahr Took Desperate Chances to Escape from Officers.

Wausau, July 6.—A couple of young fellows—Nick Lahr, of Boyd, and Ed. Heagle, of Thorp—recently appeared at Athens and loafed around that village for a few days. When they went away a number of articles were missed from the Athens House, where Lahr boarded and they were followed to Thorp and arrested. Yesterday they had an examination and were bound over for trial in circuit court on a charge of grand larceny.

The task of bringing them to Wausau to be kept at the county jail fell to Constable Joe Bauman and Village Constable H. B. Esselman. They drove across the country to Edgar and at that place took the North-Western. All went well until the train was this side of Marathon City, when Lahr went into the toilet room. After he had remained there for some time Constable Bauman went to investigate and found that the prisoner had raised the window and jumped out while the train was running at a high rate of speed.

Heagle was brought here and lodged in jail and the officers are out this afternoon looking for Lahr.

BURGLAR ESCAPED.

A robbery was perpetrated in the Athens House at Athens Sunday night and a number of guests lost their valuables. The thieves entered the rooms, while the occupants were asleep, and rifled their pockets, and also took what clothing suited them. One man lost a certificate of deposit on the Athens bank for \$185.

Two young fellows, each about nineteen years old, came to Athens some weeks ago and found employment in the stove and heading factory. They gave their names as Ed. Hegal, of Thorp, and Nick Lahr, of Boyd, and they boarded at the Athens House. After the robbery they left the hotel and were at once suspected of being the guilty parties to the robbery. Hegal was found in the village by the marshal, H. B. Esselman, with some of the stolen property in his possession. Lahr was located at Boyd, and at the time of his arrest a pair of trousers that had been stolen from one of the Athens House guests, was hanging on his bed post. The two young men were brought before Justice Peterson Thursday, plead not guilty, and were bound over to circuit court for trial, their bonds being fixed at \$1,000 each. Marshal Esselman started for Wausau with them Friday morning, to place them in the county jail. When near the Rib river bridge, this side of Marathon City, Lahr asked permission to go in the closet of the car, which was granted. Upon entering the closet he locked the door and crawling through the window, swung himself around on the platform and then jumped to the ground. A passenger standing on the rear platform saw the maneuver, and states that after jumping, the young fellow stood on the right of way and watched the train until it had disappeared from his view.

It is the presumption of the Athens people that it was these same parties who burglarized the Athens post office two weeks ago.

MAN KILLS HIS WIFE, BABY AND HIMSELF

Mrs. William Kreuger, Formerly Miss Jennie Easterbrook, of Sumas, Is Slain.

TRAGEDY AT SEATTLE

Sumas Relatives Leave For Scene of Triple Killing.

(Special to the Herald.)

SUMAS, Oct. 22.—Mrs. William G. Kreuger, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Easterbrook, pioneers of the Sumas district, and her daughter, Louise, aged 2, were killed at 10 o'clock last night by Kreuger, who later ended his own life, according to information received by the Easterbrooks by telephone early this morning. Mrs. Kreuger, who was born and reared here, was 22 years old and was the youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Easterbrook, who live a mile and a half south of Sumas. She was known here as Jennie Easterbrook before her marriage and attended the local schools.

According to information received here the triple tragedy was the result of a petty quarrel in a rooming house at Seattle. Kreuger, who was not known here, was a coal packer. After fatally wounding his wife and their little daughter, it was reported, Kreuger slashed himself with a razor and died at a hospital a short time afterwards. The woman and child were dead when police broke down the door of the room in which the tragedy occurred.

The Easterbrooks have lived in this vicinity for about thirty years. On receiving news of the tragedy Mr. and Mrs. Easterbrook and their son, George left for Seattle at about 8 o'clock this morning.

JEALOUSY BLAMED

Reason Assigned For Triple Tragedy at Seattle.

SEATTLE, Oct. 23.—Jealousy is declared to have been the motive for the triple tragedy of Tuesday night, which resulted in the death of Mrs. William C. Kreuger, 22, formerly Miss Jennie Easterbrook, of Sumas, her baby daughter, Louise, aged 2, and Kreuger, who killed himself with a razor after he had slain his wife and daughter.

Other tenants of the apartment at 615½ East Pike street, which the family had occupied for about a month, had heard Kreuger shout to his wife, "I'm going out." She replied, "You're not." Then sounds of a struggle were heard. The other tenants ran into the hallway when they heard the sound of someone falling and when there was a scream and silence the Kreuger apartment was entered. Mrs. Kreuger and the little girl were dead. Beside the baby was a "Mamma" doll. Kreuger died at the city hospital a short time later.

Mrs. Nellie Merchant, proprietor of the apartment house, blamed the tragedy on Kreuger's jealousy of his wife. Kreuger was 33 years old, an ex-service man and had been working as a coal packer.

Sixth Victim Still in Hospital

THE wave of homicidal mania which early Tuesday morning snuffed out the lives of a man and woman and threatened the life of another woman, climaxed Tuesday night when William C. Krueger, 33, killed his wife, Jennie, 22; his daughter, Louise, aged 2 years, and himself, in their apartment at 615½ E. Pike st.

About 10:30 p. m. two persons living near the Kruegers, Mr. and Mrs. T. R. Bright, heard Mrs. Krueger shout, "You are not going out!" Krueger yelled, "I will go out."

Sounds of a scuffle followed. Then a body crashed to the floor.

Police were called and the officers found Mrs. Krueger and the baby dead on the floor, with their heads almost severed from the bodies by a razor.

Krueger was dying from a slash across the throat. He breathed his last in the city hospital several minutes later. The Kruegers had lived at the E. Pike st. address but a month. Their neighbors were inclined to believe that Krueger was jealous of his wife.

He was a former service man and had been discharged from the army a year. Papers in his possession showed he had applied for a war bonus from the state of Minnesota.

HER "DEAD" SON WAS ALIVE

He Arrives, So Does Corpse;
Body Is That of Another

When a body, said to be that of William C. Krueger, a Seattle war veteran, arrived at the home of Mrs. Mary Krueger, Comfrey, Minn., Monday, Mrs. Krueger refused to receive it as that of her son.

Instead, she welcomed home, alive and well, William C. Krueger, who had been absent from home for some time.

A man, supposedly Krueger, killed himself and his wife and baby in a room at 615½ Pike st., on October 21. The body was identified and Mrs. Krueger, in Comfrey, notified. She wired Seattle authorities \$340 and instructed them to ship the body to Minnesota. This was done.

Investigation Monday tends to show, however, that Krueger's mother is Mrs. Gus Krueger, 547 Topping st., St. Paul, Minn. This name is given in army papers as the dead man's "next of kin."

Both Mrs. Mary Kruger and her son declare that the body is not that of the William C. Krueger who lived in Comfrey. They have refused to receive it and it is being held by county authorities, who say they will not bury it.

The body, it appeared probable Monday, either will be returned to Seattle for burial, or shipped to Mrs. Gus Krueger in St. Paul.

- **Edith Louise Easterbrook Brewer Williams Lord**, 21 Oct 1887 Corning, Steuben NY - 20 Jun 1962 Seattle, King WA (in King County Hospital). - Wife of Arthur Sherman Brewer (1882 NE - 1946, cremated, F: 214204095) whom she married 2 Jun 1906 in Sumas, Whatcom Co. WA. – Widowed, Edith Louise Brewer married August Williams (1893 TX – 1984), on 21 Jul 1947 in King Co. WA. The newspaper account says the marriage occurred on 23 Jul 1947. He was the son of August & Annie Williams. A divorce petition was filed in Everett WA by August on 22 Jun 1950 & the divorce was granted 22 Jul 1947 on the grounds of cruelty & abandonment by Edith. - Edith L. Williams married Ray Charles Lord (1883 NY – 4 Jan 1961 WA) on 28 Sep 1951 in King Co. WA. He died 3 Jan 1961 & is buried in Ivy Green Cemetery, Bremerton, Kitsap WA. – Edith had colon cancer & according to her WA death certificate is buried in with the surname Lord in Riverton Crest Cemetery, Tukwila, King WA.
- **Ruth Easterbrook Salthammer**, 12 Sep 1889 Milton, Northumberland PA – 8 Sep 1990 Moose Jaw, Moose Jaw Census District, Saskatchewan, Canada. - Wife of Jacob Christopher ("Jake") Salthammer (1886-1966, F: 178783961) whom she married 22 Jan 1913 in Sumas, Whatcom WA. - Found in the Canada censuses in

1916 & 1920. - Buried in Rosedale Cemetery, Moose Jaw, Moose Jaw Census District, Saskatchewan, Canada. F: 178783971

- **Clara M. Easterbrooks Clark/Lahr**, 17 Sep 1891 Sumas, Whatcom WA – 28 Feb 1968 Seattle, King WA. – Clara married a man named William J. Clark (1885-1932) on 16 Sep 1918 in King Co. WA. - However, he had been born Nicklaus John (Nick) Lahr on 7 Jan 1884 in Boyd, Chippewa Co. WI, the son of Mathias Lahr (1853-1942, F: 159973928) & Mary Bassel (1856-1926, F: 159973987). In 1900, Nick Lahr lived in Dewey, Chippewa Co. WI with his parents & in 1910 with his parents in Eau Claire, Eau Claire Co. WI. Nick Lahr is listed in the 1905 Eau Claire WI city directory. - He had been arrested for burglary, escaped twice from custody, was sent to the reformatory, then was reluctant to meet his Army obligations in 1918. – On 18 Sep 1918 John Nicholas Lahr registered in King Co. WA for the WWI draft. - William & Clara Clark's son was born William James Clark (12 Jul 1919 San Francisco CA – 12 Jan 2008 Seattle, King WA), but both she & her son took the name Lahr, apparently after "William/Nick"'s death. Clara's son William James died with the surname Lahr. – In 1930, William J. Clark (45 WI, father b. IL, mother b. WI) was an automobile company mechanic who resided in Portland, Multnomah OR in the census conducted 8 Apr 1930. In his household were his wife Clara M. (38 WA, parents b. NY, a maid in a hotel) & son William J. Clark (10 CA). – William J. Clark died of "general paresis" in the Oregon State Hospital, Salem, Marion OR on 4 Dec 1931. His OR death certificate lists his mother as May Bossell but his father as M.B. CLARK. He is buried as W.J. Clark, 1884-4 Dec 1931 in Salem Pioneer Cemetery, Salem, Marion OR, F; 24342018. - Buried in Sumas Cemetery, Sumas, Whatcom WA. F: 182263413
- **Wilma Easterbrook Godbout**, 2 Sep 1897 Sumas, Whatcom WA – 30 Oct 1979 Riverside, Okanogan WA. - Wife of Samuel Arthur Godbout (1893-1965, F: 43311044) whom she married 6 Oct 1920 in Seattle, King WA. - Buried in Riverside Cemetery, Riverside, Okanogan WA. F: 8266947
- **Frances A. Easterbrooks Kirk, reverted to Easterbrooks**, 17 Jul 1899 Sumas, Whatcom WA – 17 Feb 1988 Seattle, King WA. - Death records & Social Security list her surname at the time of her death as Easterbrooks. SSN 534-05-0445. – Frances married Harold/Herold Alwyn Kirk on 27 Dec 1935 in Jefferson Co. WA. - In the 1940 census for Seattle, King WA, Frances A.E. Kirk (39 WA) lived with husband Harold A. Kirk (43 IA) in the Orpheum Hotel. He was a barber, who in 1935 had lived in Port Townsend, Jefferson Co. WA. She had lived in 1935 in Seattle, King WA. - In the 1941 Seattle WA city directory, Harold A. & Frances Kirk live at 4110 – 25th Ave SW; he is a welder. – Harold (buried as Herold) Alwyn Kirk (1897 Tama IA – 1961 Seattle WA) was a resident in 1942 of Seattle WA at 4110 – 25th Ave. SW, Seattle WA when he registered for the WWII draft, but gave his next-of-kin as his mother Mrs. A.L. Kirk, in Tama IA. - Harold Kirk is buried in Oak Hill Cemetery, Tama, Tama IA, F: 209638163. Son of Aaron Lloyd & Lucinda M. Kirk. In 1930 he was living with his parents in Tama IA, divorced. But his obituary & his WA death record claim he never married. – Frances Easterbrooks was cremated at Washelli Cemetery, Seattle, King WA.

- **Jennie/Jenny (born Jane) Easterbrook Krueger**, 14 Apr 1901 Sumas, Whatcom WA – 21 Oct 1924 Seattle, King WA, murdered by her husband. - Birth record lists first name as Jane. - Wife of William Carl Krueger (7 Sep 1891 MN – 21 Oct 1924 Seattle, King WA), son of Gustav J. & Huld A. Kreuger. Their daughter Louise was born about 1922. - The 1924 Seattle WA city director lists William C. (Jennie) Krueger, he a packer, at 8856 – 30th Ave. SW. - On 21 Oct 1924, in Seattle, King WA, William shot & killed his wife & daughter, then killed himself. – William’s WA death certificate lists his cause of death as “throat cut (suicide).” Jennie & Louise’s death certificates read: “throat cut (homicide).” The story made newspapers across the country. A friend in WA told authorities that William’s mother (next-of-kin) was Mrs. Mary Krueger of Comfrey MN. - Notified that her son had committed suicide in WA, Mary paid \$340 to ship his body home by train. - But another William C. Krueger, living in Vader WA as a representative of a Cleveland OH cash register company, learned of this & arrived home in Comfrey MN the day before the “other” William C. Krueger’s body arrived. The man from Vader WA was the “real” son of Mary of Comfrey MN. - As the newspaper stories reported, “William C. Krueger is dead. William C. Krueger is alive and well.” Mary said she would pay for the freight, but the railroad treated the body as unclaimed freight, and county officials in MN refused to pay for the burial of a stranger. - The situation was resolved when Mrs. Gust Krueger, who lived on a farm near St. Paul MN, arrived in Comfrey to identify & claim the body as that of her son. [representative stories: “Salt Lake Tribune” (Salt Lake City UT) 9 Nov 1924 p 1 – “Minneapolis (MN) Star” 13 Nov 1924 p 6 – “Oakland (CA) Tribune” 10 Nov 1924 p 14. – Jennie’s & Louisa’s bodies were cremated.
- **George Weeks Easterbrook**, 16 Feb 1904 Sumas, Whatcom WA – 25 Nov 1987 Bellingham, Whatcom WA. - Husband of Helen Louise McVicar (1905-1989, F: 145456945) whom he married in Sumas, Whatcom WA on 8 Jun 1926 at the home of her parents. - Buried in Sumas Cemetery, Sumas, Whatcom WA. F: 145456913
