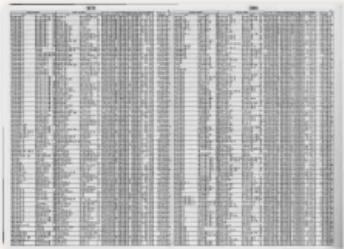

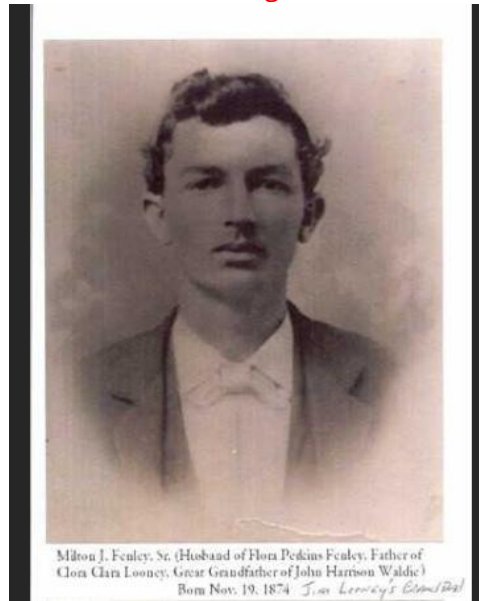

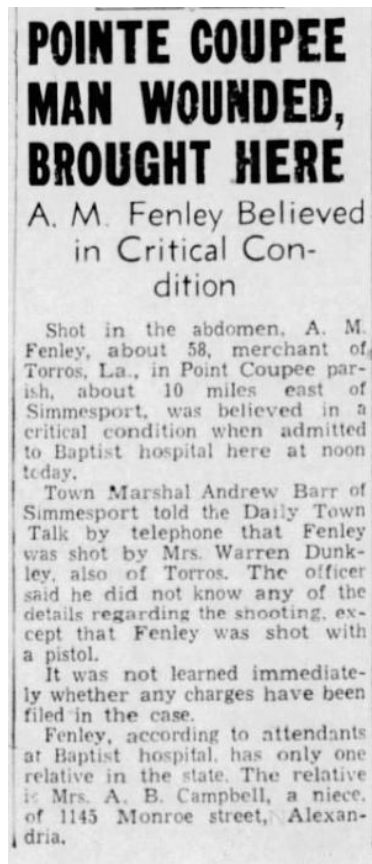

Wounded Man Dies Here; Torras Woman Is Held

Pistol Shot Is Fatal to Pointe Coupee Merchant

Melvin A. Fenley, 54 years old, merchant of Torras, Pointe Coupee parish, who was shot in his store Saturday morning, and was brought to the Baptist hospital here at noon, died at that institution at 9 o'clock last night.

Sheriff L. Bouanchaud of Pointe Coupee parish said today that Mrs. Warren Dunkley, 56, of Torras, is being held in jail at Baton Rouge in connection with the fatal shooting.

Sheriff Bouanchaud said he filed charges of shooting with intent to kill against Mrs. Dunkley Saturday, but that he will change the charge to murder.

The shooting, Sheriff Bouanchaud said he understood, was the culmination of a "misunderstanding over accounts" between Fenley and Mrs. Dunkley. The woman, who operates a boarding house in Torras, was a former business associate of Fenley.

Dr. W. L. Murrell, Rapides parish coroner, impaneled a jury and held an inquest last night. The jury rendered a verdict to the effect that the "deceased came to his death as a result of a pistol shot wound in the abdomen."

The jury was composed of M. E. Scott, I. L. Thompson, M. C. Lyles, T. A. Morgan and A. L. Price.

The dead man is survived by seven brothers. They are M. J. Fenley, Z. T. Fenley and D. T. Fenley of Lufkin, Texas; W. H. Fenley, G. K. Fenley and J. C. Fenley of Pollock, Texas; R. E. Fenley of Kitlys, Texas. He also leaves one niece, Mrs. A. B. Campbell of Alexandria.

The body was prepared at the mortuary parlors of Morgan Bros. and was conveyed today overland to the residence of his brother, J. M. Fenley of Lufkin, Texas, where it will remain until tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, when it will be taken to the O'Quinn Baptist church at Pollock, Texas, where services will be conducted by the Rev. J. R. Nutt, assisted by the Rev. J. C. Dris, followed by interment in the O'Quinn Baptist cemetery at Pollock, Texas, under the direction of Morgan Bros., local funeral directors.

Torras Merchant Killed By Woman

A. M. Fenley, a Torras merchant, is dead, and Mrs. Warren Dunkley is committed to the Baton Rouge jail, held by Sheriff Lamartine Bouanchaud on a charge of murder. Mr. Fenley was shot in his store on last Saturday morning, when the Dunkley woman is alleged to have precipitated a quarrel with the dead man, drawing a pistol and firing the shot which sent him mortally wounded to the Baptist hospital in Alexandria. He lingered until 9 o'clock Sunday night when death ended his suffering.

Immediately after firing the shot, Mrs. Dunkley came to New Roads and surrendered to Sheriff Bouanchaud, who owing to the unfinished parish jail, took her to Baton Rouge. Saturday night the woman is said to have broken her eyeglasses and swallowed the bits of glass in an attempt to end her life. She was taken to a Baton Rouge sanitarium where she is being held under observation.

The coroner of Rapides parish, at the request of Sheriff Bouanchaud, held an autopsy on the body of Fenley, and the coroner's jury held that he had come to his death as the result of a pistol shot wound in the abdomen. After the autopsy, the body was taken to Lufkin, Tex., where it was buried Tuesday.

Wounded Man Dies Here; Torras Woman Is Held

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(From Monday's Daily)

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Mrs. Dunkley Acquitted Of Charge Of Manslaughter

Mrs. Sarah Dunkley, of Torras, tried under an indictment charging manslaughter, in the killing of A. M. Fenley at Torras, last fall, was acquitted in district court Tuesday morning. The case attracted parish-wide interest, and the courtroom was filled to capacity during the day. The crowd remained in the courtroom until the jury, after an hour and ten minutes of deliberation, returned a verdict of acquittal. Additional interest in the case was added by the fact that Mrs. Dunkley is said to be the first white woman in the history of the parish ever indicted and tried for a homicide.

The case was taken up on scheduled time Monday morning, when the empanelling of a jury was begun. By 11:45, the regular jury panel was exhausted, with the jury falling short of four members to complete it. Judge Dupont ordered a panel of 20 talesman drawn, and a recess was taken until 2 p.m., in order to give the sheriff time in which to summon the men. When court reconvened, it did not require long to complete the panel. After the opening statement of District Attorney Claibore, the defense waived making a statement, the taking of testimony was begun.

The first witness was Jim Dawsey, an aged negro who was the only person in the Fenley store when the shooting took place. Dawsey testified that he lives at Torras, knew the de-

ceased and knows Mrs. Dunkley. Saw both of them in Fenley's store when Fenley was shot. Mrs. Dunkley was standing in the rear of the store. He heard a pistol shot. Fenley was standing on north side of the counter. Did not hear any quarreling, and first he knew of trouble was when he heard the shot, when looking back he saw Mrs. Dunkley. When pressed under cross examination, he said he "remained" he saw Mrs. Dunkley as he ran out of the store. He did not see the accused after the shooting.

Jules Patin, deputy sheriff was then sworn as the second witness. On the day of the killing, Mrs. Dunkley came to the sheriff's office and asked for Sheriff Bouanchaud. He informed her that the sheriff was not in. She told him that he would do. The accused then told the witness that she had shot a man, and in answer to his query, she said that it was A. M. Fenley at Torras. Asked if he was dead, she replied: "No, but he is going to die." She added, you may hang me, put me in jail or, do what you want with me." The pistol used in the shooting, was then identified by Mr. Patin, and it was filed in evidence. Mr. Patin stated that the pistol contained six cartridges, only one of which had been discharged.

Frank Lartigue, the next witness testified that he had seen deceased in the office of Dr. Edrington, in Simmesport where he was being given emergency medical attention. Fenley seemed to realize that he was seriously shot.

Nelson Smith testified that he was in the doctor's office, and saw the gunshot wound in Fenley's abdomen, the bullet having entered in the side and made its exit from the other side of the abdomen. Fenley said that he was going to die. Several persons were in the office when deceased made the declaration.

Mike Haven, a resident of Simmesport saw Fenley in the doctor's office. He was suffering from a pistol shot wound in the abdomen, and said two or three times that he was going to die, and began praying. Deceased had all the appearances of a dying man. Fenley stated to him that if he died, he did not want anyone prosecuted. Fenley began praying, using the following words: "O Lord, forgive the woman who did this to me; forgive every wrong that I have committed, and, God, please, if you cannot save my life, save my soul."

Town Marshal Barr of Simmesport, next took the stand. He saw deceased in office of Dr. Edrington in Simmesport. Fenley told him that only reason that he hated to die was that he not prepared to meet his God. Fenley asked him to get a preacher. Witnesses asked the wounded man what the trouble was about. He answered that Mrs. Dunkley had shot him. "I asked him if she had been drinking," said the witness. "and he replied that they had had a bustup, and said further that she had come into the store and told him if he did not come back, she would kill him, she pulled out a pistol, and he cried "For God's sake don't shoot me!" and as he wheeled about, she shot. "Fenley said that he did not want anyone prosecuted."

ing, but it was expected that he would die. The accused surrendered the pistol with which she had shot Fenley. Mrs. Dunkley appeared to be very nervous and depressed. With the testimony of Mr. Bouanchaud, the state announced that it rested its case.

The defense then placed on the stand as its first witness, Lawrence Feduccia. He testified that he was in the office of the doctor in Simmesport for a while, and that he heard the deceased say that he did not want anyone prosecuted, in case he "checked" out.

J. O. Guillot corroborated the testimony of Feduccia, as to Fenley saying he "did not want anyone prosecuted; that he told him to go across the river and to tell Mrs. Dunkley that he was not "mad" with her. On cross examination, the district attorney brought out the fact that the witness was a nephew of the accused.

John Miglicco testified that he had driven the wounded man from Torras to Simmesport, and that during the entire ride, deceased did not utter a word.

ed." Sheriff Bouanchaud was next sworn. He saw the accused on November 11, 1939, when she entered with Mr. Patin. She stated to witness that she had shot Mr. Fenley and thought that he was dead. The witness ascertained over telephone that the wounded man was still liv-

ceased and not utter a word. Frank Lartigue next sworn, said that he heard Fenley say that he did not want anyone prosecuted.

The accused was then placed on the stand. She testified that she had lived in this parish for 25 years, and that she was 57 years of age; that she was sick in November last. On the day of the shooting, she had gone to Fenley's store to collect board money that he owed her; it was rather early in the morning; she needed the money for a sick son and his sick baby. Fenley was standing in the back of the store, drinking a bottle of beer. "I explained to him that I needed money; he was never sober, and he became infuriated and advanced upon me with an upraised partly filled beer bottle, as if to strike me. I reached behind the counter, grabbed his pistol and shot him.

John Guerin, son-in-law of the accused testified that he had gone to the home of the accused, secured the pistol and surrendered it to the sheriff. The defense here announced that it rested its case.

Arguments by both the state and defense attorneys occupied over an hour, after which Judge C. Iris Dupont delivered an exhausted charge to the jury and they retired to deliberate. After being out 1 hour and ten minutes, a knock on the door announced that they had agreed upon a verdict. They were brought into court and the finding was handed to Clerk of court, J. P. Jewell, Sr., who read in a clear voice, "Not guilty." The jury was then polled and the poll indicated a unanimous opinion. The accused and relatives went to the jury box and thanked the jurors. The officers of the court were likewise thanked. Court then adjourned.

The sheriff described the shooting as "a misunderstanding over accounts" and that she and Gus were "business associates." At the trial, in Apr 1940, where Sarah Dunkley was the first white woman indicted and tried for murder in Pointe Coupee Parish LA, she said she went to the store to get board money Melvin/Gus owed her. Gus was behind the counter drinking a bottle of beer. "He was never sober," she testified, and he raised the bottle & she thought he planned to hit her. She grabbed his gun from under the counter & shot him. Gus repeatedly said he did not want her prosecuted, that he forgave her & that he wasn't afraid to die but he wasn't ready to meet God, so he prayed frequently. The jury took 1 hour & 10 minutes to deliberate & acquitted her in district court on 30 Apr 1940. - Gus never married. - Buried in Gann Cemetery, Pollok, Angelina TX. F: 47180758
