CLAY S. FERRELL

HAWKEYE — Clay Stanley Ferrell was born Dec. 27, 1895 at Spencer, W. Va., the son of George and Elizabeth Laughlin Ferrell.

He enlisted in the army at the age of 21 at Russellville, Ark., in the First World War. He was a member of the AEF, sailed from the United States Jan. 24, 1918, and arrived at LaHarve, France, Feb. 6, 1918. He received an honorable discharge at Camp Pike, Ark., June 13, 1919. He worked in construction work which carried him throughout every state except California and Oregon. In 1941 and 1942 he helped construct the Alcan Highway in Alaska.

After Alaska he and his family moved to Missouri where he worked until 1950 when they moved to Hawkeye. He was a member of the American Legion post 312 in Hawkeye.

A lung was removed in March, 1954 in the Veterans' hospital at Iowa City. His health made it impossible for him to work. He died at his home Oct. 11.

He is survived by his wife, Mabel, and daughter, Joyce, who teaches at Central City; two sisters, (Rosa) Mrs. Thurman Suttle, Yakima, Wash.; (Iva) Mrs. W. M. Nichols, Spencer, W. Va.; three brothers, Smith Ferrell, Parkersburg, W. Va., Rex Ferrell, Oklahoma City, Okla., and John Ferrell, Paron, Ark. His parents preceded him in death.

Plunge Off School At Atalissa Fatal To Henry Burhop

ATALISSA, Ia. — (Special) — Henry F. Burhop, 55, plunged to his death off the Atalissa school building at 9 p. m. Monday while the board of education was in session.

George Morrison, janitor, heard the body fall and rushed outside to find Burhop on the sidewalk. His skull was crushed.

Muscatine county officials who investigated the case said that no inquest would be held.

It was reported that Burhop had desired to place a bid for painting and decorating the building, but that the board had already awarded the contract when he appeared. Five minutes later he was dead.

The decedent was born in Bremen, Germany, Aug. 10, 1884, and married Marguerite Standusky. She died in 1914. He married Rosie Smith in 1917.

Surviving are the widow; two sons, George and Henry jr., both of Atalissa; seven daughters, Mrs Victoria Pratt and Mrs Marguerite Knouse of Muscatine; Helen Krotz of Mt. Pleasant; Mrs Rose Beh of Muscatine; Mrs Evelyn Schneider, Mrs Anna Baldwin and Mrs Marie Collison, all of West Liberty; seven grandchildren; a brother, Conrad of Bennett and a sister, Mrs Lottie Kelding of Wheatland.

The body was removed to the S. C. Snider funeral home in West Liberty. Services will be held at 2 p. m. Wednesday, at the funeral home. Burial will be in Inland cemetery at Bennett.

Funeral Of Atalissa Accident Victim Held

WEST LIBERTY — Funeral services were held Wednesday at 2 p.m. at the S. C. Snider funeral chapel for Henry Burhop, 56, who died Monday night from a skull fracture suffered when he fell from the roof of the Atalissa high school building.

At the time of the accident, a physician was called and the sheriff of Muscatine county notified. A coroner's jury Tuesday decided death was caused by a fall resulting in a skull fracture and broken neck.

Mr. Burhop was born in Bremen, Germany, and came to this country at the age of 15. He was a painter and carpenter and lived in Atalissa for a number of years.

His first wife was Miss Marguerite Standusky of Bennett, who died in 1914; in 1917 he married Rosie Smith of North Dakota, who survives. 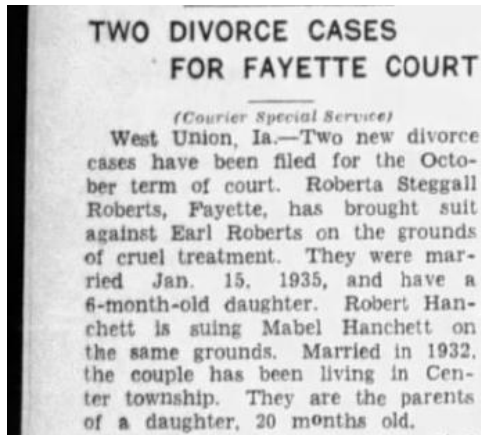

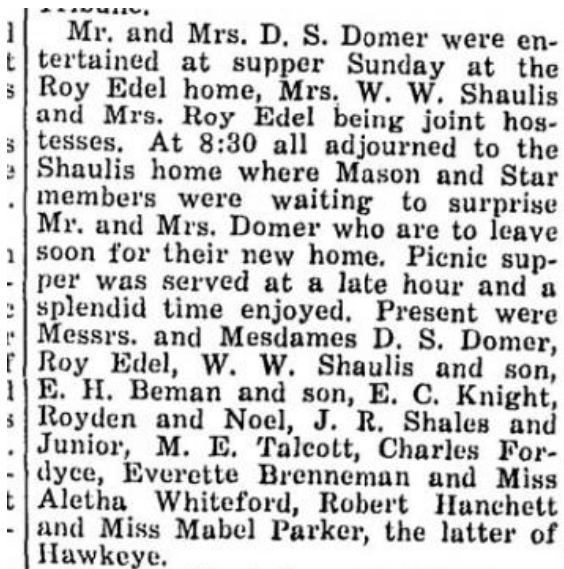

Mrs. Lillian Parker, 87, has resigned after 43 years of faithful service as librarian of the Hawkeye Public Library.

Her influence in the community has been extraordinary. Children call her the "Library Lady" and have looked to her for that special book. Older people request Mrs. Parker to pick a book for them because she knows all the books as well as the people.

Letters have been received from former citizens saying that Mrs. Parker was responsible for opening the world of books to them.

Lillian Gieseke Parker was born July 14, 1887, in Chicago, Ill. She moved with her mother, father and sister to a tenant farm north of Hawkeye in 1898.

She is a 1903 graduate of Hawkeye High School, having walked two miles to school rain or shine.

She has four children, Lloyd Parker of Oakes, N. Dak., Mabel Ferrell, Ruth LaLone and Clifford Parker, all of Hawkeye. Her husband, Pierce Parker, died in 1913.

After working a number of years setting type by hand for the Hawkeye Beacon, she became assistant librarian in 1929. In 1931 she became librarian.

The library, which now houses between five and six thousand books, was organized in January of 1898. A onetime prominent citizen of Hawkeye, Charles W. Bopp, had suggested the original public library and donated \$500 for the purchase of its first books.

Champions Choice, an ice-skating equipment shop in Midtown Anchorage, is moving across the road and into the struggling University Center mall.

Today, store owners Bob and Joyce Zorick plan to sign a five-year lease for 6,000 square feet in the mall, Bob Zorick said Tuesday.

The couple must leave their store next to New Sagaya on Old Seward Highway by mid-summer because the Asian grocery store is considering an expansion, he said.

ping centers.

For several years, the mall has watched storefronts go dark as big retailers — like Wal-Mart, Kmart and Fred Meyer — siphon business from its smaller, independently owned shops. Also, upheaval in the retail industry has led to store closures in the mall, according to University Center managers.

As of two weeks ago, 26 of University Center's 63 storefronts were empty, including the 60,000-square-foot hole

left by PayLess when it closed in 1998.

Champions Choice should bring shoppers into the mall and help turn it around, said Bill Gee, who handles leasing for University Center. The skate shop sells and rents equipment and does repairs for hockey, figure skating and in-line skating.

"It's a destination, the type of business we're trying to fill this mall up with," Gee said.

Gee declined to disclose terms of the lease with his new tenant.

At about the same time

Champions Choice opens, two new anchor tenants are expected to make their debut at the mall.

Natural Pantry, an Anchorage natural-foods supermarket, has been remodeling the mall's former Safeway store and plans to open in July. And California-based Gottschalks Inc. has bought the Lamonts Apparel chain and is planning a grand opening in late August or early September.

An Iowa woman named Helen Barkalow is divorced from Joseph Barkalow in Mar 1931 in Muscatine IA on the grounds of desertion. They had married in Illinois on 17 Jul 1927. She was granted the right to return to her maiden name of Krotz & could remarry after 3 months.

On 23 Jan 1932 in Rock Island IL, Helen Krotz, listed as the daughter of Mrs. Helen Krotz, married Fred Schneider Jr.

When Clay married Mabel Parker Hanchett in 1942, he stated it was his 2nd marriage. Clay reports himself as married in the 1940 census.

In the 1940 census for Mount Pleasant, Henry IA, Helen Mildred Krotz, 28 IA, divorced, who lived in Atalissa, Muscatine IA in 1935, is a resident of the Mount Pleasant State Hospital. The census was conducted 15 May 1940; Helen is on line 58. This state hospital, originally named the Iowa State Insane Asylum, was the first mental health facility in the state of Iowa.

On 20 Aug 1945, Helen Krotz married Charles Dale Fisher (1917-2012, F: 96621858). He noted it was his 1st marriage on their marriage license; Helen said it was her 3rd marriage.

Mabel & Robert had a daughter, Joyce Hanchett, who later adopted the surname Ferrell. She was born 8 Feb 1935 in Maynard, Fayette IA.

Robert Solon Hanchett was born 3 Oct 1906 Fayette Co. IA & died 1 Apr 1972 Fayette Co. IA. He is buried in Grandview Cemetery, Fayette, Fayette IA, F: 60583928 with his wife Blanche S. Stiles, whom he married 16 Nov 1941.
