Ed Fink, 44, pioneer of the Alluwe vicinity, died Friday in his home at Welch, Okla., where he moved with his family about 10 years ago. A heart ailment was blamed.

Funeral services will be conducted in the Alluwe Methodist church at 1 o'clock Monday afternoon and burial will be in nearby Ketchum cemetery.

Fink had lived almost all of his life at Alluwe when he moved in 1933, and was well known there. The widow and two children, both of the home, survive.

WAR BOARD NOW IN FULL CHARGE

Ed. (Butch) Fink, of Alluwe, and Joseph R. Johnson, of Cedar, the two Nowata county soldiers who were aboard the Tuscania, were among those who were saved when the big transport was sunk by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland and the kaiser lost in his first round with the soldiers of Nowata county.

August Fink, of Alluwe, the father of Ed. Fink, received notice from the war department Monday that his son was among those who had been landed safely in England. Even before the telegram was received the friends of "Butch" Fink at Alluwe boasted that "if the boat was within 200 miles of land when it was sunk and anyone was saved that 'Butch' would be among the survivors." The Alluwe boy came through without injury and made good the boasts of his friends. Those who knew Johnson were alike confident that if the torpedo did not make a direct hit on his person that he would be in the list of saved. They, too, proved to be good prophets.

The report that the Nowata county soldiers got through without mishap was received with relief by all of the people of Nowata county.

WAS ON BOARD TUSCANIA.

E. D. Fink of Alluwe Has Returned From Overseas.

E. D. Fink, of Alluwe, who was a member of Company C, First Engineers, First Division, who was recently discharged from the service, was in the city Tuesday afternoon, says the Nowata Star.

The Alluwe man was one of those who went with the first draft contingent in September, 1917. He was one of the two Nowata county men aboard the Tuscania when that vessel was sunk. He said that it was late in the afternoon, and the boys had started a big poker game on deck, when suddenly the whole boat shook and they knew they were torpedoed. He said the most of the soldiers who lost their lives could have been saved had they kept their heads but that following the torpedoing of the ship there was considerable confusion.

Private Fink was wounded with shrapnel in the right hip in July at the battle of Soissons. He said that "Jerry's" artillery was at its best in this battle and that for four hours and a half the Germans sent over a deluge of shells on the American forces. Following his injury Private Fink spent several months in hospitals and was at last returned to this country and discharged.

Private Fink stated that people should remember that in considering the hundreds of thousands of casualties credited to the American army, that every man who had a scratch which drew blood was listed as a casual and was sent back from the front. The reason for this was that a mere scratch would become saturated with poisonous gas and become a most dangerous wound if the soldier remained at the front.

Nine Miamians Eligible to Wear Purple Heart Award Originated by Washington

The three Miami veterans who possess the medal are Asa Robinson, H. E. Mozer and Lon E. Grissom. Six other Miamians who are eligible and who have made request for it are E. M. Price, E. D. Fink, James L. McGee, J. L. Vail, Cecil Elkins and Homer Hawker.

Robinson, Price and Fink were wounded by gunshot in the Argonne; Vail, Elkins and Hawker were gassed in the Argonne; Mozer was injured in a bomb explosion in the Somme-British offensive, and Grissom lost an arm at St. Mihiel, when a trench mortar exploded.

The award is made only to service men injured in enemy gunfire in active service.

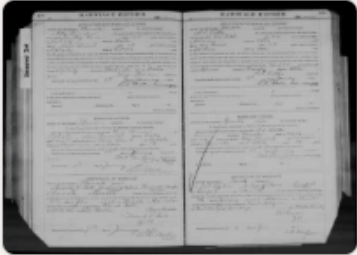

From the Bates County Democrat, April 16, 1931 - "The body of Clay Kinder, for two or three months pasta resident of this city, was found hanging from a small tree on the Butler Country Club golf course about 6 o'clock Saturday morning. He had been dead only a short time when found. The body was first discovered by Junior Rogers, son of Mr. and Mrs. J.A. Rogers, while making his round on his morning paper route. The youth notified residents of the neighborhood, and they in turn notified the officers, who removed the body to the Culver undertaking room. Kinder, who was 42 years of age, moved here with his family two or three months ago from Iowa and rented the Gilbert property just west o the Gilbert filling station on Highway 71 south of Butler. Mr. Kinder, according to his wife, was away from home practically all day on Friday looking for work but was unsuccessful and returned home late Friday evening. Mrs. Kinder stated she was awakened about 2:30 o'clock Saturday morning and that Mr. Kinder was at home at that time. Some time after 2:30, without disturbing the other members of the family, he arose, prepared and ate his breakfast and then left the house. He evidently then went direct to the golf course and climbed a small tree about thirty or forty feet west of the entrance to the grounds, where he hanged himself. Sheriff Hartley, Deputy Geo. Kersey and Dr. C.M. Rice, county coroner, who were summoned after the discovery of the body, found a brief note pinned to Kinder's coat. The note bore the following words: "Mr. Clay Kinder, Butler, Mo. Don't blame anybody but myself." It is believed that the man's inability to find employment was responsible for his act. He leaves his wife and four children, three at home and a married son who lives in Iowa. He also leaves one brother in Oklahoma. The officers also found a small bottle partly filled with chloroform in the man's pocket which he had no doubt used in a previous unsuccessful attempt to take his own life. No inquest was held. The funeral services were held Monday afternoon at Culver's chapel conducted by Rev. Wickizer, pastor of the Christian church. Burial was made in Oak Hill cemetery." He married Dora B. Lamb January 7, 1911 Nowata County, OK.

Three Arrests in Alluwe Store Robbery

In less than twelve hours after the general merchandise store of D. A. Young, at Alluwe, had been robbed, three of those accused of the robbery were in the county jail and warrants are out for two more. The arrest of the last two is expected to be made this afternoon.

Picking up a clue Thursday afternoon, Deputy Sheriff J. E. Taylor, Undersheriff Deardorff and Mr. Young scouted the Alluwe community and it was not long until they arrested Homer Carter, who gives his home as Wichita, Kan., in connection with the theft. The officers then continued their investigation and late Thursday afternoon arrested Mrs. Dora Kinder and Dale Sutton at the Kinder home in this city. The officers found a portion of the stolen goods in the attic and the two were taken to the county jail.

Confronted with the evidence in possession of the officers, the three made statements as to their part in the robbery. They were arraigned this morning before County Judge Thomason and entered pleas of not guilty and were held for preliminary hearing on October 29. Bond was placed at \$2,000 in each case. The three are charged with burglary in the second degree.

The officers making the raid on the Kinder home were Sheriff Gillespie, Deputy J. E. Taylor, Undersheriff Deardorff, Chief of Police Lowrey and D. A. Young. They found two pairs of shoes, two dress shirts, one hat, two pairs of pants and four cartons of cigarettes.

The quick work of the officers in effecting the capture of the three and recovering a portion of the stolen goods was praised by Mr. Young, who stated before returning to his home Thursday night, that he was well pleased with the progress being made in apprehending the guilty parties.

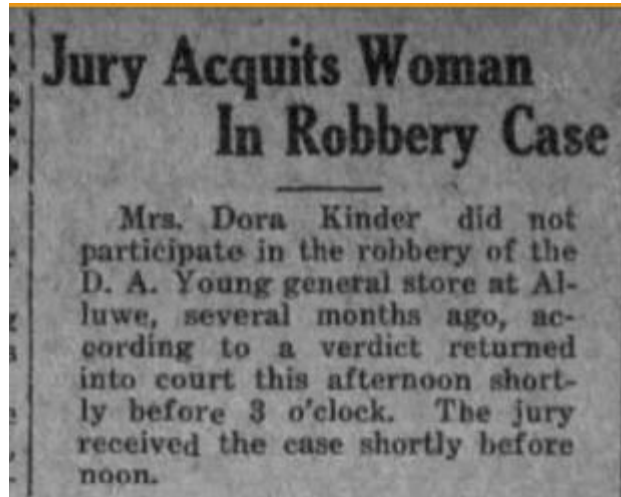

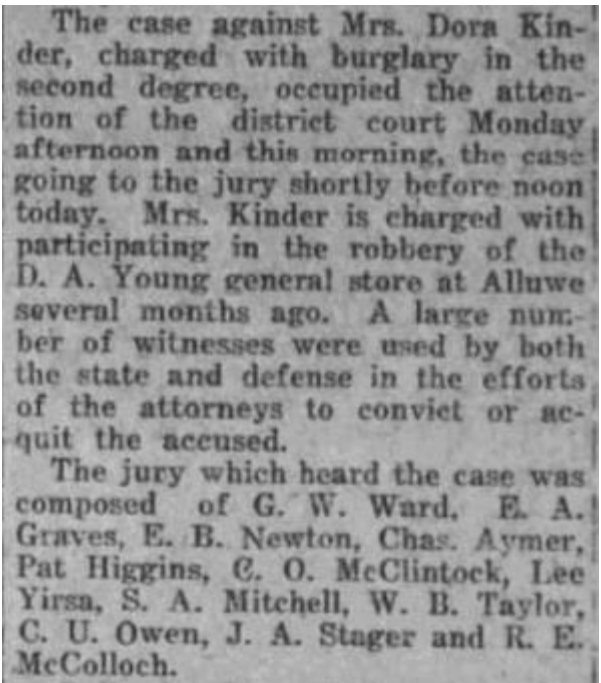

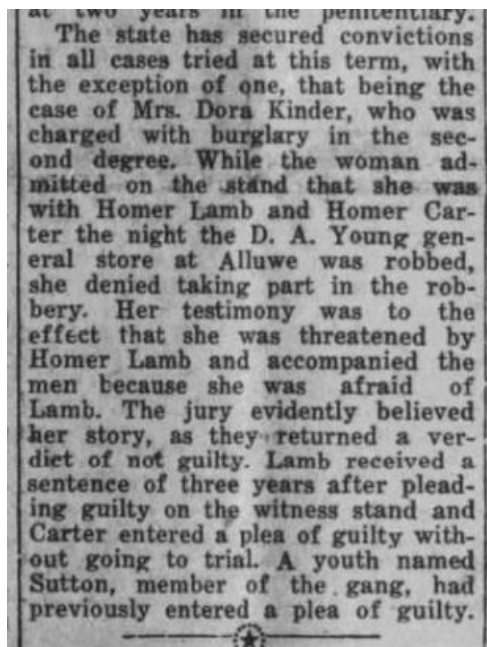

Dora acquitted Apr 1930



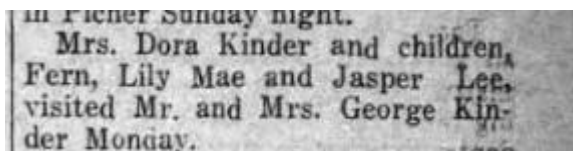

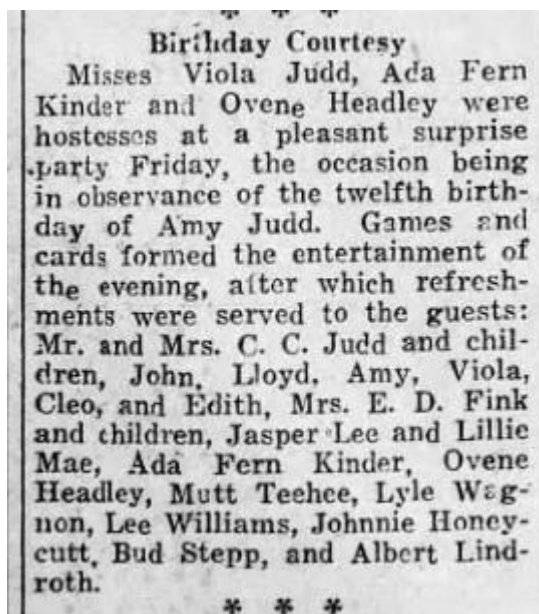
Marriage license with William Edward Fink in Apr 1931

A small bottle partially filled with chloroform was found in his pocket.

After Edd Fink dies in 1943, his widow Dora marries Joseph Robert (Joe) Parker. According to his obituary, they married in Columbus, Cloud KS on 4 Mar 1946. Her name was given as Dora Blanch Lamb. He had married Carrie Mae Pitts on 17 Aug 1941; they had 1 son, Bentley Parker.

Joseph Robert Parker was born 29 Dec 1900 in Welch, Craig OK & died 16 May 1968 in St. Joseph's Hospital, Concordia KS.

Dora was named as Mrs. Bob Parker when her son Jasper was killed in Germany in Dec 1946 and as Mrs. Parker when her father Wilber Lamb died in Apr 1949.

A divorce petition was dismissed between Joseph & Dora Parker in Nelson, NuckollsNE in Sep 1951.
