Syosset—Services were to be held today for Fredrick Flux, a World War I veteran and survivor of the sinking of the U.S. transport ship *Tuscania*. Flux, 88, died Tuesday.

Born in Brooklyn on Nov. 15, 1887, Flux lived in Manhasset for 15 years before his death. He worked for the New York City Department of Bridges for more than 30 years, retiring in 1942.

During World War I, Flux earned the rank of corporal in the Army's air corps. He was on the *Tuscania* when it was torpedoed off the coast of Ireland on Feb. 6, 1918, with the loss of 101 lives.

Flux is survived by 13 nieces and nephews. Burial at Long Island National Cemetery, Pinelawn.

Four friends in the Bedford district —Charles H. Crofts, 307 Carlton avenue; Melville W. Miller, 70 North Portland avenue; Frederick Flux, 105 Clinton avenue, and Washington Godley Davies, 35 North Oxford street—enlisted December 12 in the 213th Aero Squadron at Mineola.

Flux, aged 30, and Davies, aged 31, were employed in the Bridge Department, the former as a foreman and the latter as driver of a repair truck. Both enlisted as mechanics.

Miller, aged 22, enlisted as a cook in the 213th Squadron. He graduated from Public School No. 12 and was for a time a student at Manual. Just previous to enlisting he was employed by the Columbus Distilling Company of Greenpoint and was a member of the Central Branch Y. M. C. A., where he was taking a course in engineering. He has considerable reputation as a bowler and won laurels on several Y. M. C. A. teams.

Miller and Davies are graduates of Public School No. 12, and Flux of Public School No. 1. Davies' mother, Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Davies, has received a cablegram from him saying he had landed safely and was well.

Kinsfolk Get Brief Word From Tuscania Survivors

Lieutenant James A. Blakely, who lives with his sister, Mrs. McKenna, at 78 India street, sent her this letter, received this morning:

"Dear Sis—By the time this letter reaches you, you will probably know all the details of our list of hard luck. We are in Ireland and being treated very fine by British officers, who have given us clothes and have sheltered us every night since we were brought off of the boat. It happened about 6 o'clock in the evening. I was sitting in my stateroom reading, when the ship was struck with a torpedo.

"There wasn't any panic, but plenty of excitement. I waited until an English destroyer came alongside of our boat to take use off. We had good weather coming over and I wasn't seasick at any time. We were enjoying the trip very much."

A letter received by his mother from Frederick Flux, 105 Clinton avenue, was very much deleted and cut up by the censor. All that was left was the fact that he was well and being treated fine in Ireland. He expected to go to England and France soon.

A letter received by the parents of Washington Davies, of 35 North Oxford street, was so censored that the only fact left about the voyage was the sentence, "I lost all of my personal effects."

Nothing has been received from

Lieutenant Blackman, 519 Clinton avenue, except the first cable that he was safe.

In a letter to his mother, dated February 8, Lafayette Rothsteen, of 235 Van Buren street, one of the survivors of the torpedoed troopship *Tuscania* describes his arrival in Ireland and the reception given the American boys as befitting a king. Although no news regarding the sinking of the ship is allowed to pass the censor, it states that the survivors were given clothing, food, sleeping quarters by the inhabitants and the authorities.

Some of the men had no time to get into their clothes. They simply went into the life-boats, clad as they were, some in pajamas, others with even less clothing on, and still others were clad in sailor suits. Everything that Rothsteen owned was lost with the exception of the clothing he had on, he writes. Nothing regarding his experiences since he left Mineola up to the time that he arrived in Ireland was allowed to pass the censor, with the one exception that the Kaiser sent them a Christmas present in the shape of a "tin-fish" although it did come ten months before time.

A letter received by Mrs. Norris at 703 Greene avenue, from her son, Winfield, who also was one of the survivors, was literally cut to pieces by the censor the letter arriving in the form of newspaper clippings. Nothing but his safe arrival in Ireland was mentioned.

Adolph was a salesman for Corliss Macy & Co. “Brooklyn Daily Eagle” 3 Dec 1926 p 3 - Died at age 36 following a surgical operation. In the printing & stationery business. Survived by wife Florence McCormick Flox [also found as McCormack], mother Mrs. Vera Flox (181 Hall St.), 2 brothers: Edward & Fred Flox & 5 sisters: Mrs. Rose Johann, Mrs. Vera Muller, Mrs. Bertha Bennett, Mrs. Madeline Flood, Mrs. Lillian Lanning. Funeral at the home of his mother, with interment in the Lutheran Cemetery. – In the 1900 census is listed Adolph Flux b. Nov 1890 NY (but there is no Arthur listed so this must be Arthur by default). - In the 1920 census, “Adolph” and wife Florence live with his mother, 2 brothers, unmarried sister Madeline & married sister Lillian (Lanning) in Brooklyn.
- **Madeline Marjorie Flox Flood**, 30 Oct 1894 NYC, NY [or Oct 1893 NY in 1900 census] – 11 Apr 1976 Manhasset, Nassau NY. - Marriage; “Brooklyn Times Union” Sunday 28 May 1922 p 14 – Miss Madeline Flox, daughter of Mrs. Verena Flox, 181 Hall St., married Leslie Flood of Chicago IL on Wednesday [24 May 1922] at St. Paul's Trinity Chapel, Protestant Episcopal Church, Manhattan.
