Superior City Assessor Dies

William H. Forsyth, 63, Superior city assessor, died Friday in a Superior Hospital.

He was taken by Douglas County ambulance to the hospital about 7:45 a.m. Friday from his home, 1308 Tower Ave. An attending physician reported he suffered a stroke.

Mr. Forsyth was born in Port Wing, Wis., and was a Superior resident since about 1925. For the past 25 years he has served as city assessor. Prior to that time he was employed as assistant city engineer.

Painting was one of his favorite pastimes. His works were displayed in City Hall, the museum and several art shows throughout the area.

He served during World War I in the U.S. Coast Guard and was

Assessor Asked To Lecture at National School

William H. Forsyth, assessor, has accepted an invitation to be on the speaking program for the fall training course of the National Association of Assessing Officers, which will be held in Milwaukee September 27-30. It was learned Friday.

Forsyth was asked by Albert W. Noonan, executive director of the association, to give a lecture September 29 on the subject, "Assessments of Docks and Waterfront Property." This address will be part of a discussion on real estate problems.

Between 300 and 400 assessors from every state in the nation, Canada, Cuba, and US possessions, are expected to attend the instruction conference.

This will be Forsyth's second appearance on a program of the national group. His first was in 1938 when he lectured at Cincinnati, Ohio.

Superiorite Recalls Ship Disaster

Survivor of Tuscania, Sunk in War I, Plans to Record Tragedy on Canvas

The terror of one of the major marine disasters of World War I may be put to canvas one of these days by an amateur Superior painter who survived the troopship sinking after a German submarine attack nearly 33 years ago.

Although he says he'll never be able to forget the sinking of the British troopship *Tuscania* off the coast of Ireland, William H. Forsyth feels he's not quite ready to start his masterpiece.

Forsyth, Superior city assessor, was one of the American soldiers on the ship. More than 200 of the 2,400 persons aboard the vessel were victims of the U-boat's torpedo. That was Feb. 5, 1918.

Today, he's very interested in a painting hobby. Whenever he starts talking about this interest, the conversation naturally turns to the burning ambition to reproduce the *Tuscania's* sinking. But it has to be done right, Forsyth will add.

The torpedo hit the troopship shortly after dark, Forsyth recalls, just as he had just climbed into his bunk.

He remembers hearing a dull thud and feeling a jolt. The ship creaked and the engines stopped. After a long cold night of bobbing about in overloaded life boats, destroyers rounded up the survivors and headed for Ireland.

Among Forsyth's prize possessions is a copy of the log of the German UB 77, kept by Capt. Wilhelm Meyer. This he had obtained at a convention of the National *Tuscania* Survivors' association.

The log contains these observations of the attacking submarine captain:

"I thought we were detected as we could easily be seen by them (the convoy) as there still

was a good deal of light. I therefore dived but our visibility was greatly made more difficult. I could perceive things only through the periscope.

"Finally I see gliding into the periscope an indistinct, fogged shadow. Over this shadow, just as indistinct, a smoke stack makes its appearance. I recognize the sought-for ship."

Captain Meyer's records then

indicate two torpedoes were fired and "at this moment a destroyer appears 150 meters (163 yards) away, and heads for the submarine. We dive to 30 meters (98 feet), the crew and I listening in suspense. One minute and 10 seconds later a very violent explosion is felt and told us we had hit the target."

The U-boat then proceeded underwater for several miles

and after 20 minutes surfaced enough to intercept SOS messages being sent by the stricken vessel.

At 7:15 p. m., he relates, he decided to hasten the ship's sinking and fired a third torpedo. It missed, but the submarine was forced to withdraw because of the number of destroyers. The transport sank at 9:40 p. m.

Some day, Forsyth contends, he'll frame his oil version of "The *Tuscania* Goes to a Watery Grave."

Sell Superior's Prospects, Is Philosophy of Assessor

Besides being a city assessor, William H. Forsyth is a public relations man and an advertiser for Superior and never overlooks a chance to sell the city's prospects and possibilities.

He has a unique method which was started back in 1939 by himself to keep track of the industrial progress of Superior. When building programs by firms or industries are contemplated Forsyth gets out his camera and photographs the area before the project gets underway and then continues to take more pictures as the construction work progresses.

These shots along with any additional information are placed in a file in his office to be available for future reference. He has also taken pictures of the

many completed industries. The reason for this he explains is that many times changes are made, either something is added to the industry or something taken from it. If questions arise during the discussion over the reason for the assessment made he has the pictured proof to substantiate his decision. Forsyth says it has a two-way value it protects the city from an assessment point and it protects the industry.

When on speaking tours at national meetings Forsyth loads himself down with pictures that he has taken of Superior, showing the water front industries and aerial view pictures of the city, along with miscellaneous shots. These he puts on display at the conference meets to advertise the city he represents.

In many instances Forsyth also makes his own drawings of industrial works to which he can refer when a question of assessment presents itself. He has been city assessor since 1937 having worked with the city as assistant engineer in 1929.

Forsyth said that the public in general should feel free to use the services of his office in problems that develop in which a question of assessment is involved. He said a personal visit oftentimes can settle a question within a short time to the mutual satisfaction of the citizen and the assessor.

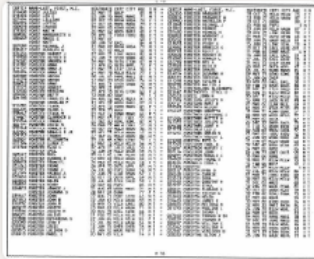

Letter Astray for Five Years Home to Roost

After wandering about over a large part of Africa for some five years, during which time it became worn and weather-beaten, a letter addressed to a Duluthian who was in Africa, from a Wisconsin man now residing in Superior, has returned to the sender.

W. H. Forsyth, now of 1714 Twenty-eighth street sent the letter, from Cameron, Wisconsin on November 7, 1923. He addressed it to Eldon J. Frank, now of Duluth, who he thought then was at Moxico, Angola, in Western Africa. The address gave the names of two persons in this place where Frank might have obtained the letter, but he left before the letter arrived and as a result it was bandied about Africa for five years.

"I've seen Frank since then," Forsyth said, "but I'm going to deliver the letter to him anyway, the next time I see him."

AUTO MISHAPS FEWER IN 1933

Three Fewer Killed in '33 Accidents Compared With Year 1932

William H. Forsyth, chairman of the engineer's staff of the Superior Safety council, Wednesday issued his first annual report on traffic and other accidents for 1932 and 1933.

His report shows that the first seven months of 1933 showed a marked improvement in the accident rate as compared to the same period in 1932. There were no motor accident deaths and the number of accidents was less per month during the seven-month period of 1933 than 1932.

In 1932, according to Mr. Forsyth, there were 414 motor vehicle accidents which caused a total of eight deaths. In addition there were 18 deaths during the year from other causes.

Fewer Accidents.

In 1933, there were 346 accidents involving motor vehicles and five deaths. There were 31 other deaths.

"The annual report of the city board of health," says Mr. Forsyth, "shows that during 1933 there were 31 violent deaths caused from injuries received in falling on streets, playing with matches, injured by domestic animals, industrial accidents and drowning.

gents and drowning.

"A total of 86.2 per cent of all deaths for 1933 were caused from the causes stated above. This shows that we must convince the people of the fact that education is essential to prevent further accidents. The Superior Safety council must have the entire co-operation of every citizen of Superior if it is to serve the purposes for which it was organized in January, 1933.

Urges Safety.

"It is the duty of every citizen to see that the 1934 accident record is the best in the city's history. He who saves another's life after an accident is a hero, but he who prevents an accident which might result in death is also a hero. Let us all be heroes and prevent as many accidents as possible in 1934," Mr. Forsyth urged Wednesday.

His report offers figures to show that in the next 20 years four out of five of the 24,351,676 families in the United States may expect personal injuries and two out of 25 families may expect a death from motor vehicle mishaps.

Urge Tuscania Survivors Tune in On Program

W. H. Forsyth, a Superior survivor of the sinking of the British transport "Tuscania" when it set sail from Hoboken, N. J., bound for France, February 5, 1918, with a loss of 281 men, received a letter recently asking that he attend a re-union on the anniversary in Baraboo, Wis., of members of the National Tuscania Survivors association.

While stating he would be unable to attend, Mr. Forsyth has notified the association of the radio broadcast to be given over station WEBC the evening of February 5, requesting they tune in on the program depicting the disaster in a several-act drama. The background for the presentation will come from the personal experience of Mr. Forsyth who has written the tragedy into play form.

Besides the broadcast, the anniversary of the sinking of the Tuscania will be observed here by a memorial service to be given Sunday morning at 11 o'clock at St. Alban's Episcopal church. Rev. Guy L. Hill will deliver the memorial address.

lakes, because it is only a few rods across the obstruction near the Cameron school building. The creek valley is pretty well wooded, about thirty rods across, and with steep sides about forty feet high. The bottom of the creek valley is nearly thirty feet below the bed of the Red Cedar river. A canal about 1,900 feet long would be required to divert the water from the river to the creek valley.

At the point of diversion a dam would have to be built across the Red Cedar river, with a spillway, so that overflow water could run down the old channel. The spillway dam would be about 240 feet in length. The head of water at the dam could be anywhere from 28.8 feet to 36 feet, thus backing the river up to Meadow creek.

Walter Case, who represents the Northern Cranberry Co. that owns much of the property involved, and who two years ago had options on most of the balance, figures it might cost around \$150,000. Mr. Case would like to see the city of Rice Lake purchase and develop the power site and then sell surplus power to Cameron and Barron. Mr. Case says that three times as much power could be developed with a 30-foot head at Cameron as with the present 11-foot head at Rice Lake, because there is also the water from Meadow creek to help.

The most serious obstacles to be met would be obtaining riparian rights along the river and getting a bill through the legislature permitting a diversion of the waters of the Red Cedar river, which would be changed out of its old course for a distance of about six miles. Another factor governing power development is the flow of water, which in all lakes and rivers in Wisconsin has been decreasing in late years. In fact two small power dams at Barron have proven inadequate, and the present dam in Rice Lake is supplying less than half the power needed here, the balance coming in over the high power line.

PROSPECTIVE DAM SITE AT CAMERON

Cranberry Creek Has a Deep Valley For The Reservoir

(Rice Lake Chronotype).

In company with Walter Case, George Anderson and Iver Forsyth of Cameron, the editor of the Chronotype was taken over the ground of the proposed new power site on Cranberry creek, just above the village of Cameron. With a copy of surveys and estimates, together with blue prints as a guide, the trip proved real interesting. Back of Will Jorstad's farm buildings we came to what looked like almost a natural dam across the creek valley, and it was here that the proposed dam was to be built.

That the Red Cedar river at one time traveled down Cranberry creek, perhaps hundreds of years ago, seems quite likely, and it may have gone through the Chetek

The proposed dam is interesting because, if built, the water might be diverted at Cameron into the Chetek chain of lakes and another dam with a 24-foot head built near Cameron, with the flow also increasing the power at Chetek. In this case the diversion of the Red Cedar river would be nearer twenty miles than six. These are highly interesting possibilities.

START BRUSHING TO CLEAR PATH FOR SEWER JOB

**100 Laborers Will Be Dig-
ging Four Hours Daily
Next Week**

Preliminary work in connection with the laying of a \$142,000 main sewer from Twenty-sixth and Weeks to Thirty-third and Oakes avenue got underway Saturday morning when the county poor committee placed 15 men to work carrying out necessary brushing along the route the sewer will follow.

Iver E. Forsyth has been named general foreman in charge of laying the sewer. Byron Kimball, of the city engineer's staff, has been named inspector and timekeeper by the sewer committee of the city council.

The Polaris Concrete Products company of Duluth, awarded a contract to manufacture reinforced concrete pipe for the sewer, was expected to bring necessary equipment to the scene Saturday.

When excavation of the trench will be started could not be learned Saturday, but it is probable that at least 100 men will be digging with shovels early next week.

Work Four Hours Daily.

Laborers in both the excavation and manufacture end of the project will work four hours per day. There will be two shifts, one from 8 a. m. to noon and the second from noon to 4 p. m. They will be given as many days work as is necessary to work out the amount received from the county each week in groceries and other necessities.

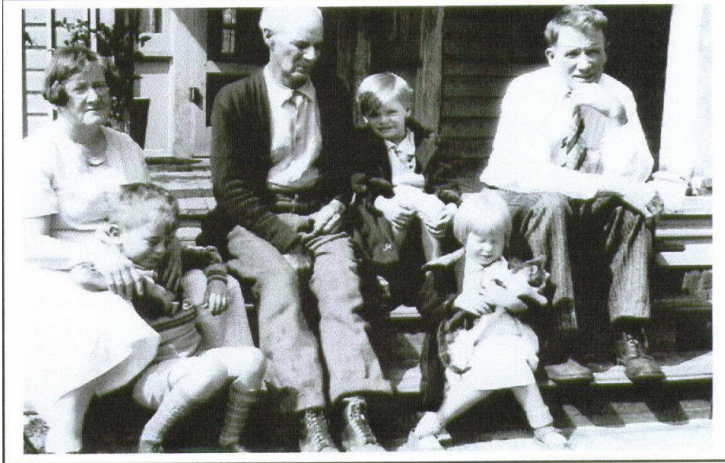

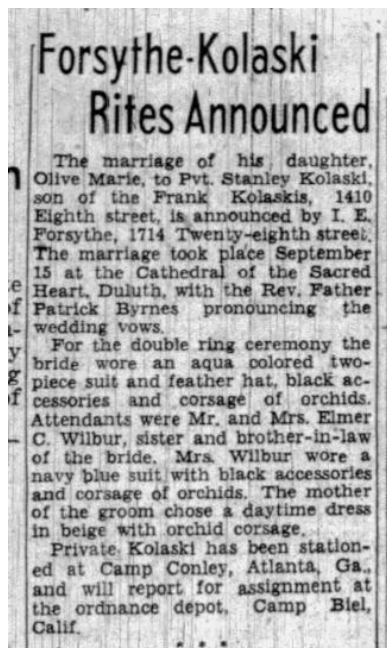

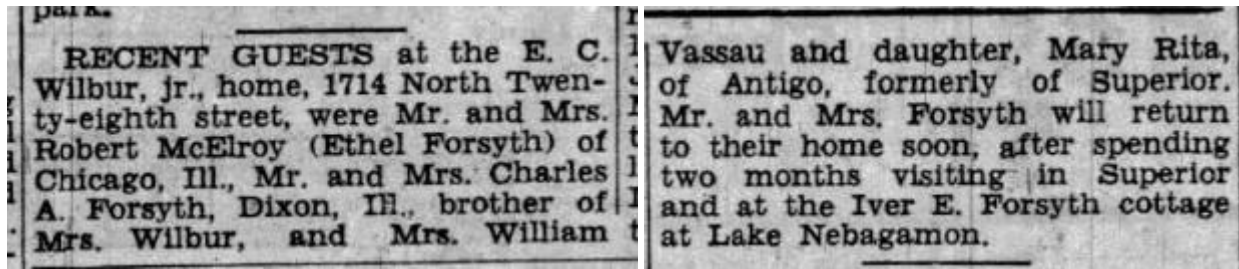
