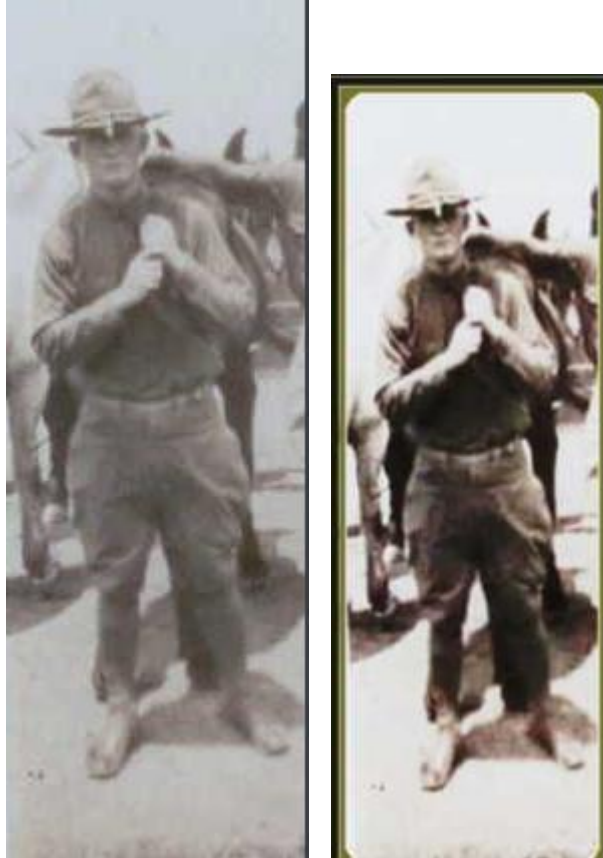

A Letter From Raymond Foutz.

Camp Travis, Texas,
10-11-1917.

Mr. Frank R. Drake,
Hitchcock, Okla.,

Dear Editor:

Our company arrived at Camp Travis at 1 o'clock a. m. Saturday all yelling like warriors.

Mr. Fred Abshire of Eagle City was our captain and Mr. Blithe Burnam of Hitchcock was our lieutenant.

Our motto was, "To Hell with the kaiser, we are going straight to Berlin".

We landed in Ft. Worth at 6 a. m., ate our breakfast and left at 9 30 a. m. for Camp Travis. On our way we passed through a rough country. There was nothing but cotton, mules, negroes and Mexicans. This continued all the way to camp.

I have heard it said if one wanted to go to hell, that Texas was the place to go. I believe it now.

We traveled slow and the distance seemed a thousand miles because we traveled principally after night and did not sleep any.

The people cheered us until we reached the Texas line, then we heard no more cheering until we arrived at camp, 12:30 or 1 o'clock a. m. We did not get to bed until 3 o'clock but all of us enjoyed our night's sleep.

We changed camp Saturday morning permanently for awhile and have had the privilege of sleeping side by side, six of us boys.

Mr. Abshire, our captain, who was so good to us, was transferred to the hospital corps.

We are all proud of our soldier boys and the courtesy they have returned to us since we have been here.

We have trained a little, expecting our suits tomorrow, then look out.

We just finished supper, had some menu.

A fellow that wants to become a man and enjoy life had better take this training. They will never regret it.

With best wishes to you and all of my friends that receive the paper,

Good Letter Received

We received a very interesting letter from Raymond Foutz this week, but on account of the censorship we are unable to print all of it. We have the letter at the office and if anyone cares to read it they may do so.

Among other things he says: "I want to let my friends and relation at Hitchcock know that the soldiers of Oklahoma and other states will have to sail across the pond and get kissed by the French girls.

"I enjoyed the time I spent at Camp Travis as a cook. I received a certificate without taking an examination. This showed me that I was doing better work than I thought I was. Nothing can slip by without it is satisfactory.

"I have heard a number of things about the sorghum country and negroes of Louisiana in breaks and swamps. Some of this I did not believe but now I can tell more than I have heard. Friends it is all true. I wonder if the people will be surprised for me to tell them that there are farmers today farming among the stumps using the poor old oxen, and some still using the old fashioned jerk line. Bye bye stumps, oxen, jerk lines and old fashioned ways. I would rather be shot down in battle than to live this way in life."

The above are paragraphs taken from different parts of the letter. We should have been glad to print the entire letter but thought it best not to.

Raymond Foutz A Tuscania Survivor.

Raymond Foutz was one of the Oklahoma boys aboard the Tuscania when that vessel was torpedoed and sunk by the Germans last week. Everyone was glad to learn that he was one of the survivors. His sister Bertha received a telegram from Washington the first of the week notifying her officially of his rescue.

Raymond Foutz, one of three brothers from Hitchcock, to go to Camp Travis in the October quota from Blaine county, and Ferdie Denner in the same draft from Garfield county, were both on the ship Tuscania, which was sunk last week by a German submarine. Both these boys worked during last summer for John Lary, County Engineer. Young Denner worked in the surveyors' office and young Foutz on his ranch near Hitchcock. Both boys were in Mr. Lary's employ when they were sent to the training camp. They were both among the Oklahoma boys who were saved from the sinking ship.

Mr. Elmer Foutz of Hitchcock, spent Wednesday in Watonga. He was on his way home from Camp Bowie where he visited his two brothers who are enlisted men in the army and stationed there. Mr. Foutz says the boys are happy and contented and look forward with delight to crossing the water and getting a "crack" at the famous Hindenburg line and helping to puncture the same. Mr. Foutz, it will be remembered, also had a brother on the ill-fated Tuscania, but was rescued after floating about on the sea for several hours. There are three of the brothers in the service.

On Active Service With
American Expeditionary Force
February 13, 1918.

Dear Brother Abby and Family:

How is everyone? I am just fine. Landed safe and sound across the broad ocean.

I enjoyed being on the water if it was my first time. I never once got sick.

I know if a body has a clean system he can stand most anything.

The people know I have had narrow adventures and by taking care of myself I got thru all right. I hope that every living person would practice going to church and live up to what God teaches. If everyone had the experience I have had on the ship Tuscania they would soon learn that God governs all.

I am going to spend every inch of my life to help draw friendship closer together.

I lost my testament on the Tuscania but was given one tonight by the Y. M. C. A. men. I am certainly pleased to see them and learn how the Y. M. C. A. men help the soldiers.

I certainly have enjoyed some splendid entertainment they have given since I have been here at Winchester Camp, England.

Wishing all of you good luck and may God bless all of you.

He was in training at Camp Travis prior to his sailing for overseas, and was the last person to leave the ship "Tuscania" when it went down. He came so near to losing his life that when he went to leave the ship he was forced to jump from the deck into the life boat. He went through several hard fights and came through without a scratch and in perfect health. Mr. Foutz was with the famous 41st or "Sunset" Division.

R. TOUTZ, SURVIVOR OF TUSCANIA IS HOME

Raymond Foutz of the Forty-first (Sunset) Division received his discharge from the service of the army and was the guest Tuesday of his sister-in-law, Mrs. Lora Foutz, 505 East Maple enroute to his home in Salisaw. He has been in France for the past thirteen months and was a survivor of the Tuscania. He had a very narrow escape for life as he was the last man off the ship.

Each man on the ship was given the number of his life boat, thinking Mr. Foutz was on the ship orders were given to cut the rope. He was left standing on the deck, got up on the railing and jumped fifteen feet into his boat when orders were given him by the captain. Mr. Foutz, in explaining the terrible scene on the ocean, said that while they were floating around on the water the Germans threw a new light on them and took pictures of them.

he expressed himself as being glad he was there and stated that the American Boys always looked on the bright side and their one ambition was to get into the real fight at the front

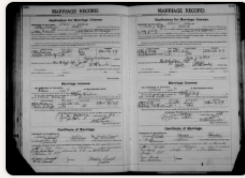

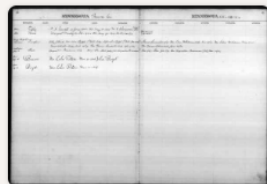

Twenty lives were imperiled by an explosion which wrecked the butcher shop at 1401 Morgan street, Tuesday evening, at 7 o'clock, and which the police believe was caused by an attempt to set the building on fire. The occupants of the endangered block all escaped.

Saxon lives at 1301 Washington avenue and Foutz at 1512 Walnut street. They deny any knowledge of the explosion. Their alleged motive is not explained by the police.

Saxon lives at No. 1301 Washington avenue and Foutz lives at No. 1512 Walnut street. They deny knowing anything about the explosion. Foutz, who was identified as the man who jumped through the window, says he was not in the building at the time.

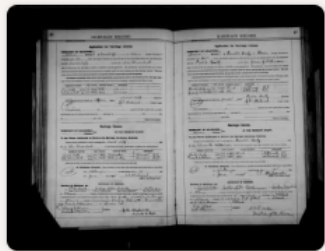

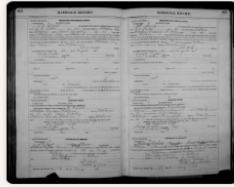

Foutz drove it from here to Arnett, and from there to Selling, where he traded for a new body and then drove it to a ranch where he traded it for another Ford and \$150 cash boot. He brought the old car back to Enid Sunday night and was nabbed by the sheriff yesterday afternoon.

Foutz recently moved to Enid from Hitchcock, Okla., where he claims to have been engaged in the insurance business. Mr. Vessels, owner of the stolen car, is a brother of Tom Vessels, and recently moved to Enid, having bought the old Delmar garage on East Randolph. Sheriff Hume secured from Foutz a confession last night, leaving no doubt as to his guilt. His confession is as follows:

"On the night of July 3, 1917, I took a Ford automobile, engine number 1610479, state license number 53893, from in front of the American theatre and drove this car to Arnett, Okla., and from there to Frank Cronkhite's ranch, six miles southeast of Selling, Okla., and traded this car to him for another Ford car and got \$150 difference for the trade. The car that I drove away from in front of the theatre, engine number 1610479, didn't belong to me, nor at that time I didn't know who owned it."

The Ford which was brought back to Enid by Foutz is in the possession of the sheriff. Officers were sent to Cronkhite's ranch this morning to secure the Vessels car, and will return with it tonight.

Hitchcock Okla.

Dear Sirs:

Having a little extra time and since you asked me to drop you a few lines I will proceed to do so. After leaving Watonga at 7:30 we made all the noise we could and shook hands with all the girls from Watonga to the border of Texas and there our fun stopped because we were beginning to get real sleepy and all we saw after we crossed the border were niggers, cotton, mules and saloons. We stopped at Ft. Worth Texas for breakfast at 5:30 Friday morning, and then we continued our journey thru the great fields of cotton, niggers and mules. We arrived at Camp Travis, at two o'clock Saturday morning. There we were taken to a barrack for a slight examination; from there we went to our sleeping rooms which consisted of a spring cot, straw bed and two blankets. Later in the day we changed barracks and in the evening we picked up rocks and trash around the barrack. Sunday morning we were examined and Sunday afternoon we were vaccinated. We sure have the job if we can hold it down.

They furnish us most anything we want. We will get our suits this evening. Grub is light but we will be fed better later on. Each one has to take his turn in the kitchen for two months. Our commanding officers are a set of alright men. All they ask of you is to obey orders and not to speak until you are spoken to. We will begin training about the last of the week. Consumption is about the only thing that will exempt a person.

Tell the boys if any of them have to come, don't bring anything with them, but some old clothes and money if they want to, because they will ruin their good clothes. They sure can have a good time and nothing is hard at all. We all get to stay together. We have seen several old timers, such as Ray Cheyney Palmer Miller and two or three from Watonga. I like it fine so far but as you know I have not reached the hardest yet nor had any bawling outs nor been away from my old friends very long. I may get homesick and disgusted later on but if I do I wont say anything about it, I will try to do the best I can and I guess that is all anyone can do.

I guess I will have to come to a close because it is almost dinner time and my arm is sore from the vaccination. Tell the Hitchcock timers hello; if they want something easier than what they are doing, come and join their Uncle Sammy.

Good by to all.

Dear Sirs:

Will endeavor to write a short letter to the Clarion to let my old time friends know that we are still able to serve our U.S.A.

I expect Tanky told most everything, but there are many news every day. Our time has been changed as to the getting up, and working hours. We get up at 6:45, eat breakfast at seven go to work at eight and work an hour and a half, then we rest till two o'clock and then we drill till four and that ends our day's work. Of course you know the work is easy and it takes a whole lot of that kind of work to hurt a fellow. We go on the rifle range next week and practice shooting. When we get to be crack shots, the Kaiser had better look out because we are going to win this war for our old uncle and it has proven so far that it will take the Oklahoma toughs to do it.

It is rumored that we will leave this place soon but no one seems to know where we are going but we all have a good idea and that is across the duck pond.

Much sickness here now of all kinds. Seven died with pneumonia fever today and six yesterday and several cases of meningitis.

We wish to thank the Yeoman lodge for the necessary articles they sent to us because they are the articles we need most.

Glad to hear the Hitchcock basket ball team is having such great success and hope that they will succeed in holding the loving cup. I would like to be with them at their games, not only as a player, but as a booster as well which I always delighted in doing as often as I could.

I will try to do the justice to my country as I always tried to do toward our athletic team and hope everyone will do the same.

So will close now as it is not far from bed time.

Miss Josephine Bell Uninjured in Crash

Bryan S. Foutz of Okeene, Okla., was lodged in the city jail Sunday night as the result of a car crash that occurred on the Blackwell-Tonkawa pavement, Sunday evening about 6:30 o'clock. Foutz, driving a Star coupe, struck a Ford coupe driven by Miss Josephine Bell, who is employed as an instructor in the Blackwell public schools. No injuries resulted from the accident, but both cars were badly damaged, it was reported.

Foutz was charged with driving a car while intoxicated. He will be taken to Newkirk today by county authorities, as the accident occurred on a county highway. There were three witnesses to the accident, which took place one half mile north of the Esch corner on the pavement.

Miss Bell was driving to Blackwell and the Star car was being driven south. It is understood that Miss Bell drove her car off of the pavement to keep from being run into. However the crash occurred when the Star struck the rear end of the Ford, and then ran into the bank along side the road. The Star was badly torn up, while the Ford was not damaged to a great extent, it was stated.

Fred Lewis of the local police force was called to the scene of the accident, and arrested B. S. Foutz and returned him to Tonkawa. It was rumored that a companion to the Star driver, got away before the officer arrived on the scene, but this report could not be verified.
