Edwin "Ned" H. Fries, 86, Oxnard, died Sunday in an Oxnard hospital after a long illness.

Mr. Fries was born March 27, 1901, in Altoona, Pa. He was a 23-year county resident, coming from Camden, N.J.

He was a machinist for New York Shipyard in New York City before retiring. He was a Navy veteran of World War I, and was a member of First World War Veterans and the VFW in Johnstown, Pa. He was also a 50-year member of the American Legion in Windber, Pa., where he was reared.

He is survived by wife Elsie of Oxnard; and many nieces and nephews in Pennsylvania.

NO NEWS WHETHER SHIELDS WAS ON TORPEDOED VESSEL

Lists of men aboard the torpedoed Tuscania and information as to the units aboard fail to clear up the question of whether Van Shields, of Brookville, was aboard the vessel.

A group of survivors are reported as belonging to Co. E, Second battalion, Twentieth Engineers, while Shields belongs to Co. C, Fifth Battalion, Twentieth Engineers. Whether this unit was aboard the transport or not cannot be ascertained from information in dispatches today.

A DuBois youth in the aero service, Corporal Edward H. Fries, Corporal Basin J. Spellen, was aboard the transport. His fate is unknown. He is the son of James Spellen, of DuBois. Others from this vicinity known to have been aboard the Tuscania, are:

Private Edwin H. Fries, of Windber, Captain Edward J. Gillouly, Ridgway Corporal Earl Pearson, Ridgway Corporal Clea Bargerstock, of Marionville.

FIVE WEST PENNA. BOYS ON TUSCANIA REPORTED AMONG THE SURVIVORS

Conflicting Reports About Scottsdale Boy, Still Officially Unaccounted For; No Word About Ball.

Of the several young men from this immediate section of the state, who were on board the Tuscania when that vessel was sunk by a German U-boat off the coast of Ireland, definite word has been received that five are among the survivors.

Gomer E. Greenwood of Waltersburg, Lester W. Piot of California and Thomas B. Young of Freeport, members of Company D, 20th Engineers, Frank E. Graft of Alverton and Edwin H. Fries of Windber, members of an aero squadron, have been reported by the War Department as among those rescued from the torpedoed ship.

The name of William Lewis Ball of Connellsville, has not been reported in any list issued by the War Department, either of the passengers or the survivors of the Tuscania.

The name of Thomas A. Lewellyn of Scottsdale, a member of Company D, 20th Engineers, has been reported among those not yet accounted for, although word was received in Scottsdale Saturday night that he was among those who had reached land in safety. Still another report stated that he had been lost when the steamer went down.

After hunting wild animals in the jungles of Africa practically all his life, Warren E. Buck, Camden naturalist and big game importer, may soon be going back to that continent, this time to hunt the enemies of his country.

Buck, who has made more than 20 trips into the West African interior seeking rare animals and curios, is among a group of selectees ordered to appear for induction tomorrow by Draft Board No. 8, East Camden.

Of course, there is no assurance he will be sent to Africa if he is accepted, but reports have been circulated he has been consulted by government officials.

Never too outspoken, Buck has been silent about his activity since the United States went to war but reports have it that he had a part in the events that led up to the African campaign.

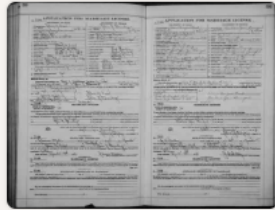

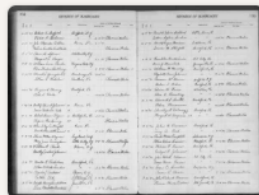
