Exeter Woman To Tour France

EXETER, July 29.—One of two San Joaquin Gold Star mothers, Mrs. Mollie Galloway, age 69, of this district, will sail soon for France, where she will visit the grave of her son, Newman Galloway.

Mrs. Galloway will leave Exeter August 3, for New York, where she will board the S. S. Leviathan for France with a group of other Gold Star mothers from all over the United States. Newman Galloway was killed in action, July 22, 1918, at the battle of the Marne.

Mrs. Galloway upon her return to this country will visit for a while with friends and relatives in the east and then return to Exeter after October 1.

Mrs. Galloway was born in Alabama in 1863. She lived in Texas for some time and for the past ten years has been a resident of the Exeter district, and owns a twenty acre grape vineyard south of this city.

She is the mother of 13 children but only four of the children are living now. Mrs. Fred Boon, Exeter; E. J. Galloway, of Memphis, Texas; Early Galloway of Exeter; and Mrs. B. A. Ison, of Santa Maria.

MEMPHIS, Texas, Aug. 7.—The mother of a Hall county boy is to visit the grave of her son in France, it was learned this week. Mrs. Mollie Galloway of Exter, Calif., is the mother of the son whose body lies in France. Mrs. Galloway will embark for France Tuesday with other gold star mothers.

Newman J. Galloway was among the first to enlist in the army from Hall county. He was killed in action. A brother, E. J. Galloway, lives at Plaska. He was stationed at Camp Travis for 19 months. Mrs. Galloway is remembered by many Memphis and Hall county residents as she lived in the county a number of years prior to leaving for California some 10 years ago.

Mrs. Mollie Emma Galloway, 83, died last night at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Fred Boon, southeast of Exeter. She had lived in the Exeter district for the last 23 years, coming from Texas. She was a native of Alabama.

A Gold Star Mother of the first World War, Mrs. Galloway was a member of the last group of Gold Star Mothers who visited their sons' graves in France during the '30's. She was a member of the Primitive Baptist church in Lindsay.

The widow of H. J. Galloway, who died in 1923, she leaves two sons, Earley D. Galloway of Exeter and E. J. Galloway of Plaska, Texas; two daughters, Mrs. Cannie Boon of Exeter and Mrs. Aura Isom of Santa Maria; a brother, George Kirkland of Memphis, Tex., ten grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at the Hadley chapel, Exeter, on Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment will follow in the Exeter cemetery.

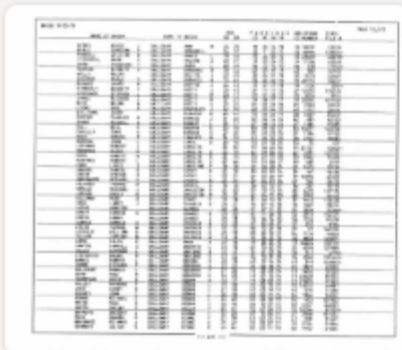

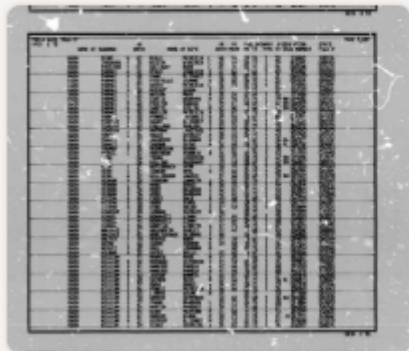

Surrounded by his family, Sonny Galloway passed from his earthly home and entered into his eternal home where he was reunited with his son Patrick Sean Galloway; his mother, Billie Galloway Rice; and his father, Earley Galloway.

Earley Denton "Sonny" Galloway, Jr. was born to Billie and Earley Galloway on April 11, 1930 in Exeter which became his life-long home. He attended Wilson from Kindergarten to eighth grade and graduated from Exeter Union High School in 1948 where he was an outstanding varsity athlete in football, basketball and baseball.
