WORLD WAR I VET DIES OF HEART ATTACK

A heart attack resulted in the death Thursday afternoon at 3:20 o'clock of Lloyd Carlton Garthwaite, 54, of 157 Merritt street, at Mercy hospital.

The deceased was born in Easton Wis., Jan. 10, 1894 and was a veteran of World war I, serving 18 months overseas. He had been field manager for the Fuller Brush Company many years. Mr. Garthwaite attended Central State Teachers college, Stevens Point. He was married to Opel Aodela Irish, at Almond, Wis., in 1920. Since 1923 he had been connected with Waushara County Argus. Wautoma. He was a member of First Methodist church.

Survivors are his widow; a daughter, Mrs. Arthur Howarth, Oshkosh; a son, Edward, De Pere; two sister, Mrs. L. J. Griswold, Monticello, Ind., and Mrs. T. M. Risk, Vermillion, S. D., and a brother, H. E. Garthwaite, Flint, Mich.

Funeral services will be held Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Konrad funeral home, with the Rev. Lowell L. Reykdal officiating. Burial will take place later in Riverside cemetery. Friends may call at the funeral home from 4 o'clock Saturday afternoon until the time of the services.

THEY ARE ALLRIGHT.

**Young Men Who Went Over the Dam
Sustained No Permanent
Injuries.**

Robert Lawrence and Felix Ceplina, the two young men who were carried over the Jackson Milling Co's. dam in the Sellers hotel launch at about 4:30 Wednesday afternoon, were doing their accustomed work about the hotel this morning, happy in the thought that their impromptu voyage had ended so fortunately. Neither shows any outward effects of the trip although Ceplina, who was the one who clung to the outside of the boat, says that his back is slightly strained, due to the sudden jolt as the fall was made.

The trouble all lay in the fact that the rudder had become loose from one of its fastenings and would not do its accustomed duty. They first realized this when a short distance above the Clark street wagon bridge. At that time the boat was headed up stream, when, without warning, it switched to one side and cut a wide circle. No sooner had its course been turned up stream again than it repeated the evolution, this time passing under the bridge. All the way to the dam the movement continued and as the boys realized their plight they called for help. Alf Anderson and Lloyd Garthwaite were at the formers boat house, just above the dam, and thinking the two boys in the boat were intentionally directing it in a circular course, paid little attention to them at first. However, when their cries for assistance were repeated, they hurriedly procured the Anderson launch and started out. But they were too late for when yet some distance away the disabled launch went over the dam.

Ceplina, who is nineteen years of age and a good swimmer, retained his presence of mind and when about twenty feet from the brink got into the water at the rear of the boat and while clinging to the rods steered the craft so that it went over head on. This was a wise precaution for if the plunge had been made sideways both would no doubt have been thrown out and Lawrence, who is twenty years old and able to swim only a few strokes, would probably have drowned. The boat hesitated a minute at the top of the dam and then shot down, the engine ceasing to work as it did so. Ceplina was forced to release his hold and was carried down stream beneath the surface of the water. His sudden disappearance led Lawrence to believe he was drowned and he was greatly relieved when Ceplina reappeared only a short distance from the launch, into which he drew himself. The boat was carried rapidly down stream to a point about the middle of Bliss island, just below the Soo bridge, from where the two voyagers were taken to the mainland in a canoe by Jay Kelsey and Louis Bergholte, who were fishing in that vicinity.

The launch, which is a steel one, was but slightly damaged except for a slightly bent propeller rod, and was brought above the dam today.

TUSCANIA SURVIVORS WILL MEET FEB. 7-8 AT WISCONSIN RAPIDS

The annual convention of the National Tuscania Survivors association is to be held at Wisconsin Rapids, Wis., Feb. 7 and 8 in commemoration of the torpedoing of the troopship Tuscania off Ireland on Feb. 5, 1918.

Five Oshkosh persons have been listed by the secretary as survivors who are eligible to attend the convention. They are: Lloyd C. Garthwaite, Harvey B. Jewett, Kenneth Krippene, Michael J. McGinn and A. G. Meredith.

All of the men, except Kenneth Krippene, are still residents of Oshkosh.

The association of Tuscania survivors meets every year to commemorate the evening hour in 1918 when a German submarine sent the Tuscania to the bottom of the Atlantic. The sinking occurred when a German U-boat struck the ship and sent her down with 2,393 officers and men aboard. British convoys near the ship rescued most of the crew but 269 men perished.

Those who cannot attend the convention will pause at the anniversary time—5:50 p. m.—to say silent prayers for departed comrades.

Flint Man Describes Flood Area

Hotel Without Elevators and Drinking Water, Buick Promotion Executive Writes His Family

A story of privation and destruction in the Pittsburgh flood area is contained in a letter of a Flint man to his family written Saturday night in Pittsburgh.

Arriving from Cleveland, the Flint resident, Henry E. Garthwaite, a member of the sales promotion staff for Buick, could not leave the station until he was escorted by national guardsmen. He had to walk 12 blocks, he writes, to get to the hotel, only three blocks from the station.

On the trip from Cleveland,

where he had conducted a showing of the cut-away chassis of a Buick which was shown here in the Flint showing of the 1936 Buick, he told of passing through high banks of snow. On his trip Saturday, it was snowing heavily, he said.

Electricity was not available at the hotel, he said, and patrons were forced to walk to their rooms. His room was on the ninth floor. Candles were used for lighting.

The hotel issued a notice warning guests against drinking water in their rooms. A safe supply of water was available in the dining rooms for guests only.

The problem of eating also was acute, the writer said, as many restaurants had to provide water at considerable expense. Rates for taxicabs were \$4 an hour, he said.

The chassis, shipped from Cleveland by freight, was partly submerged by the high water in the freight yard when he finally located it. It was sent on to Buffalo, where Mr. Garthwaite went, for another showing.

Mr. Garthwaite is showing the chassis in various parts of the East. He lives here at 909 Belmont street.
