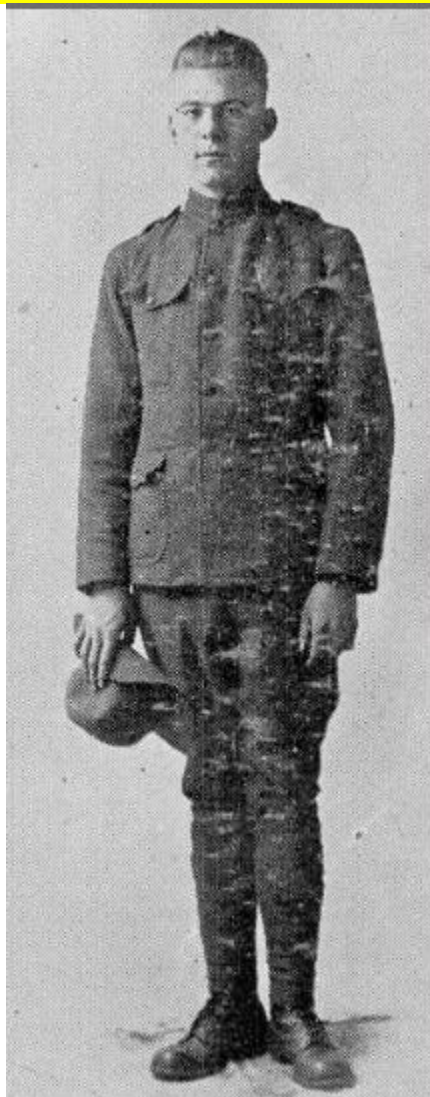

Four Ohio Soldiers Thought to Have Died on Tuscania



Four Ohio soldiers who with Frank F. Reilly of Cleveland are believed to have lost their lives when a German submarine torpedoed the transport Tuscania near Ireland the night of Feb. 4 are shown above.

They are Private Carroll Scully, Toledo, 158th aero squadron; Private Gregg Gehring, Findlay, 213th aero squadron; Private Richard A. Neinhardt, 24, 197 Stauring street, Columbus, and Private Stanley Augspurger, Company D, Sixth battalion, Twentieth regiment (foresters), Dayton.

Gehring was the son of Frank H. Gehring of Findlay. Augspurger enlisted in the forestry regiment while a resident of Oregon. He has studied forestry at Ohio State university and

was on his way to France to direct cutting of timber for the use of troops at the front.

MEMBERSHIP

"Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society, who, being of age of eighteen or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unflinching in his loyalty to, and rendered active service, in the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance of the authority of Great Britain."—Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article III, Section 1.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership fee, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

BOY PLAYS INDIAN; HE IS SHOT IN EYE

Accident to a Findlay Lad to
Cause Edict Against
Air Guns.

Findlay, Feb. 1—Ione Routzan, 11, was shot in the eye by Gregg Gehring, 13, yesterday, and will probably lose the sight of it. The lads, with a number of other boys of their age, were playing Indian, and several of them had air guns. The Routzan boy was an Indian and took refuge behind a tree when the pale faces were closing in upon him. To make the thing appear real, Gehring fired his gun, and the bullet struck young Routzan in the eye.

Because of this accident Mayor Groves has issued orders to the police that all air-guns in the hands of boys of immature years be confiscated.

No word of the fate of Gregg Gehring, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank H. Gehring, of Findlay, has reached the United States, according to late information Wednesday. He is the son of a former tailor of this city and lived in Bowling Green for a while.

Program On Mexican Art Enjoyed By Woman's Club

"Five-thousand years of Mexican art in forty minutes," was the way Dr. Robert H. Gehring of Toledo introduced his fascinating topic as speaker at the Woman's Club guest luncheon Thursday in the Argonne Hotel Crystal room.

Dr. Gehring, a retired dentist, has long been fascinated with pre-Columbian Mexican art. He divided it into three periods: the Pre-classic from 3000 BC - 300 AD; Classic from 200 to 800 or 900; and Historic from 900 to 1521, the year Cortez conquered Mexico.

Emphasis during the pre-classic or village period was on crude, simple pottery. Dogs were a favorite subject, since there were no farm animals at that time. Early Mexican Chihuahuas were fashioned fattened and with an ear of corn in their mouths, because they were a source of food.

The crude abstract art of this time has recently become so popular that the speaker said it is practically unobtainable today. Yet exact copies of centuries-old pieces are sold by the hundreds in Mexican dime-stores.

As villages became more urban, art became more refined, more elaborate. During the Classic period, an age of architecture arrived. Small temples, arenas, pyramids were constructed. The people became carvers of semi-precious stones. Tapestries were created.

During the historic period, Mexican art turned to huge temples, as much as twenty stories high. They developed dams, palaces, monuments and altars set with precious and semi-precious stones. Evidences

of these Mayan and Aztec civilizations were first discovered about 1839, and much remains to be found.

When asked about his favorite reference books on the subject, Dr. Gehring replied, "I can't give you any titles, because I've read more books on Mexican art since I was asked to speak to you than I had ever read before." Then he added, "But the library is filled with them. It's a well-researched subject!"

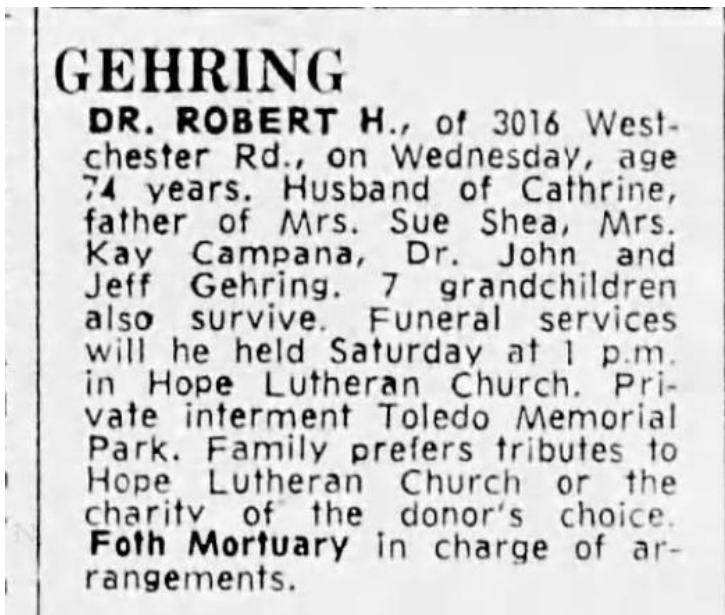
