An officer during the [Revolutionary War](#), Mercer initially served in the Virginia House of Delegates and then the Maryland State Assembly. The Trial of the Slander Suit Continued to November Upon Motion of the Plaintiff.

 HAGERSTOWN, MD., May 26.—The noted Peter-Gaither suit for slander, removed from Howard to Washington county, was this afternoon continued until the November term, on motion of counsel for the plaintiffs. Mrs. Ella Mercer Peter made the affidavits for continuance in the three cases, Ella Mercer Peter, Mary Peter and Emily M. Peter, all against Sophia B. Gaither and husband. The affidavits also state that the witnesses are experts of long experience. Messrs. Isidor Rayner, Harry M. Clabaugh and Edwin J. Farber, lawyers in the case, were present with the local counsel.

PETER-GAITHER CASE

Attorneys Agree To Final Settlement Of The Now Famous Libel Suit.

INSTITUTED AUGUST 27, 1896

Transferred From Howard To Washington County.

Based On Letters Alleged To Have Been Written By Mrs. Thomas H. Gaither To Mrs. Ella M. Peter, Who Is Now The Wife Of Edwin J. Farber.

The case of Mrs. Ella M. Peter, now Mrs. E. J. Farber, against Mrs. Thos. H. Gaither for libel, which was set for trial at Hagerstown on June 1, has been settled.

The settlement of the case was brought about after a consultation between the attorneys in the case, and it is understood that the costs will be divided.

The suit of Mrs. Ella Mercer Peter against Mrs. Thomas H. Gaither for libel has attracted much attention and caused much comment in social circles in Baltimore city and in Howard county, where both parties are widely known.

It was instituted in the Howard county court on August 27, 1896, Mrs. Peter claiming \$20,000 for herself, and her two daughters, Miss Emily M. and Miss Mary, claiming \$15,000.

It was then charged by Mrs. Peter that shortly after she secured a divorce from ex-State Senator William B. Peter, in 1895, she received two anonymous letters, and her friends received others, attacking the character of herself and her children, and threatening them with bodily injury from vitriol and dynamite. In her suit she charged Mrs. Sophia B. Gaither, wife of Mr. Thomas H. Gaither, with being the author of the letter. This Mrs. Gaither denied, and the foundation of a cause celebre was laid.

celebre was laid.

Mrs. Peter secured an counsel Hon. Isidor Rayner, Edwin J. Farber and John G. Rogers, and Mrs. Gaither employed George R. Gaither, Jr., Attorney-General Clabaugh and State's Attorney Maguire, of Howard county. A number of expert witnesses were employed to give testimony in reference to the similarity of the writing in the several letters.

The case dragged along for some months in Howard county, and was then transferred to Washington county on Mrs. Peter's plea that she could not get a fair hearing in Howard county. It came up at Hagerstown for trial on May 17, 1897, but was postponed until December 10, 1897, because of the absence of the expert witnesses.

On the latter date all the lawyers were on hand in court, but the experts had not come. Mr. George R. Gaither, Jr., opposed further delay, and urged that the case be set for a hearing the next week. 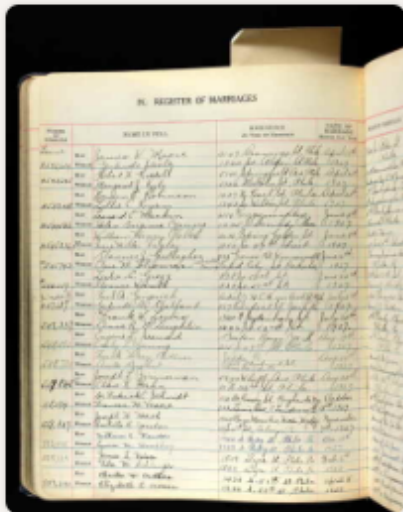

Ella's 2nd husband Edwin John Farber (1879-1942, F: 202509338) had been married to Nellie V. Kenealy (1882-1957).

The "New York Times" of 19 Dec 1897 reported on the wedding of Mrs. Ella Mercer Peter & Edwin J. Farber "of the Baltimore bar" [attorney]. The wedding took place on 18 Dec 1897 at the home of the bride, 204 E. Chase St., with only members of the immediate families present. The officiant was Rev. Edwin Niver, rector of Christ Church.

The bride was given away by her brother, Richard Mercer, of NY. Mrs. Farber was once the wife of State Senator William B. Peter of Howard Co. MD; they divorced several years ago. She is the great-granddaughter of John Francis Mercer, one of the early governors of MD. Her sister is Mrs. Schuyler Hamilton Jr. Of NY.

"The Mercer women have always been famous for their beauty and brilliancy, and Mrs. Farber and her sister sustain the family reputation." As Mrs. Peter, she has a lawsuit for \$60,000 for alleged slander pending against Mrs. Thomas H. Gaither of NYC. The former Mrs. Peter claims that Mrs. Gaither was the author of anonymous communications reflecting upon the character of Mrs. Peter. The case was called at Hagerstown MD on Thursday but at the request of Edwin Farber, who was retained with Isidor Rayner as the complainant's (Mrs. Peter's) counsel, the trial was postponed. Edwin Farber is president of the Daily Record Printing and Publishing Company & a member of the Maryland Club. "All the parties concerned are prominent socially."

Mary's mother Ella Mercer Peter brought suit in MD on 27 Aug 1896 against Sophie B. (Mrs. Thomas H.) Gaither for libel. She asked damages of \$30,000 for herself & \$15,000 apiece for her 2 daughters: Mary & Emily (then ages 15 & 13), claiming that she & friends had received anonymous letters charging all three of the Peter women with "unchaste" behavior & attacking their character, following Ella's divorce from MD State Senator William B. Peter in 1895. The "poison pen" letters also threatened the three with "bodily injury" from vitriol (sulfuric acid) & dynamite.

Among her lawyers was Edwin John Farber, who would marry Ella before the conclusion of the case. He called in several handwriting experts.

The trial was to be held 1 Jun 1897 in Howard Co. MD but Mrs. Gaither asked for a change of venue. It was then scheduled to begin 17 May 1897 in Washington Co. MD but was then postponed to 16 Dec 1897 & then settled out of court.

Mary Peter was a direct descendant of Martha Dandridge & Daniel Parke Custis. When her husband Daniel Custis died, Martha Dandridge Custis married George Washington, who became a Revolutionary War hero and the 1st President of the United States.

Daniel & Martha Custis had a son - John Parke Custis.

John's daughter was Martha ("Patsy") Parke Custis who married Thomas Peter.

Thomas Peter's son was John Boyce Peter, the father of Mary Peter Gallagher.

William Boyce Peter (1846 WV – 1907 MD) married Ella H. Mercer in Jun 1878; they divorced in 1895. His Find A Grave record at 44119135 mentions his daughter in 1 instance as Mrs. J. Gallaher OF CANADA & in another mention that Mrs. A.J. Philbin Gallagher was present at his death.

His father, Augustus Bernard Gallagher, died 25 Oct 1886. On 20 Oct 1886 Augustus made his will, leaving all his possessions to his "dear wife Sarah" & making her the guardian of their children & executrix of his will. His estate was valued at \$46,791.96 (\$100 is worth about \$2,769 in 2025, making this an estate of \$1.61 million in 2025 dollars). He left \$20,000 in personal property & \$30,000 in real estate. He died at 1823 Wallace St.

Augustus (of the Tuscania) is frequently mentioned before the war playing in golf tournaments as a member of the St. David's Club.

"Baltimore Sun" 8 Feb 1918 p 1 - of 925 N. Calvert St., trained at Camp Kelly (San Antonio). About 4 weeks ago was sent to Garden City, Long Island NY. He was in Baltimore MD on a 6-day leave. His wife is the former Miss Mary Peter, daughter of Mrs. Edwin J. Farber. The couple has an 8-year-old daughter & a 4-year-old son. Born Philadelphia PA; former real estate businessman.

Augustus landed on the isle of Islay & was hospitalized from 9 Feb 1918 to 10 Apr 1918 in Yorkhill War Hospital, Glasgow, Scotland. According to his family, he clung to rocks off the coast of Islay until rescued. His knees were damaged & he walked with a limp for the rest of his life.
