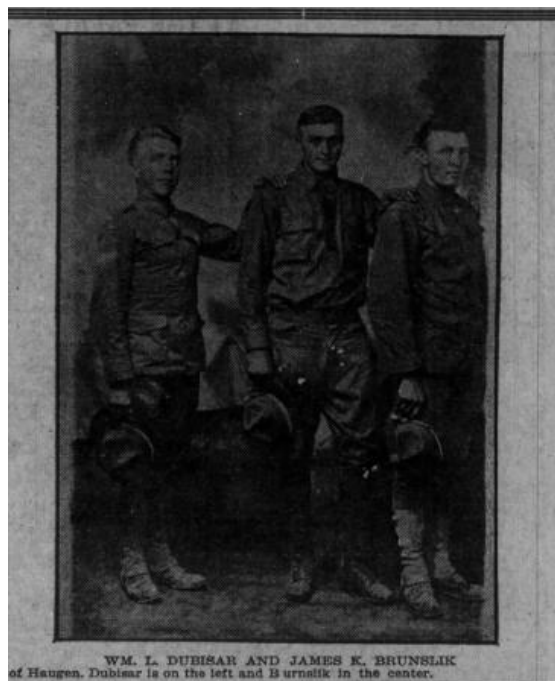

HAUGEN (Special) — William L. Dubisar, 71, Haugen, died at a Rice Lake hospital Wednesday, following a short illness. Funeral services were held Friday at the Hyllengren Funeral Home at Rice Lake and burial was in the Bohemia National Cemetery at Haugen.

He was born at Silver Lake, Minn., and came to Haugen 60 years ago. He was married here in 1919 to Anna Wosepka Bruha, who survives him.

Mr. Dubisar, a retired carpenter and cabinet maker, was a veteran of World War I and was a survivor of the troopship Tucania, which was torpedoed off the coast of Ireland with Wisconsin's 32nd Division aboard. He was a member of the Haugen Post of the American Legion.

Survivors include his wife, two daughters, Mrs. Darrell Foss, St. Peter, Minn., and Mrs. Leighton George, Cumberland; one son, William F., Haugen; four grandchildren; and two brothers, Frank, Saxon and Charles, Haugen.

Names of American soldiers who were rescued after the sinking of the Tuscania continued to come slowly to Washington yesterday.

Eighteen hundred and thirty-two names were listed by the Committee on Public Information, advices from Washington said. The difference between that sum and the total number of men and officers on board, 2177, however, does not indicate that those whose names do not appear in the list necessarily were lost.

The task of compiling the list of survivors landed at widely scattered points in Ireland and Scotland has proved most difficult, so there is no assurance whatever that the list is complete. Army officers are compiling a complete list of survivors for transmission to Washington, paralleling the list now coming in.

The names of survivors which The Tribune presents this morning are in addition to the list of 1060 which was published in The Sunday Tribune.

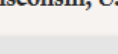
