List of Texans on Torpedoed Tuscania

Washington, Feb. 8.—A large number of Texans and Oklahomans, members of army organizations, were on the ill-fated Tuscania, submarined off the Irish coast Wednesday. Who were lost probably will not be known by the war department for several days as it is necessary to cable the names of the survivors to the United States for checking.

The early estimate of 100 lost, of which approximately 75 were members of the military organization, appears from reports received today at the war department from the British admiralty, to have been too conservative. The number probably will be doubled.

The Texans and Oklahomans, for the main part, were volunteers, and are shown to have been members of practically every organization aboard but there was a detachment from Camp Travis, San Antonio. Three Dallas men appeared in the list. They are: Victor A. Mooner, whose address is given as "Dallas;" John Weatherall, Station A. Routel, and Patrick H. White of 711 South Akard Street. The other Texans listed were:

TUSCANIA SURVIVORS IN IRISH HOSPITALS

Twelve Texans Are Among Those
Who Are Recovering From Their
Injuries in Ireland.

Washington.—Sixty-three American survivors of the torpedoed troop ship Tuscania were reported to the war department Monday as recovering in Irish hospitals from the effects of injuries or exposures. The dispatch said none of the cases was serious and that it was expected all the men would soon be discharged.

All of the sixty-three had previously been reported saved and the presence of many of them in hospitals had been recorded in press dispatches, although a later dispatch brought the first official list of those in hospitals.

The body of Private Nicholson, who was a member of Company G, 114th Infantry, 29th Division, was taken in charge by the Wall and Stabe Undertaking Company and was afterwards taken to the home of his father, Peter E. Nicholson, 47 York Street, where it will be held until Saturday morning, then taken to the McAshan Church where it will lie in state until 3 p.m., at which time funeral services under the auspices of the Thomas Dismuke Post No. 52, American Legion, will be held. Rev. L. L. Lloyd will conduct the services. Burial will be in the Evergreen Cemetery. The pallbearers will be: Charles Lescher, Julius Wolfe, Claude Nicholson, Charles Anderson and Jerry P. Tierney.

Private Nicholson enlisted in San Antonio, February 26, 1918, and was sent to France May 23, 1918. He was in the battle at the Alsace front and was killed in the battle of Malborno Hill, October 12, 1918.

He is survived by his father, two sisters, Mrs. H. A. May and Miss Clara Nicholson, and two brothers, C. A. and Charles Nicholson, all of Houston.

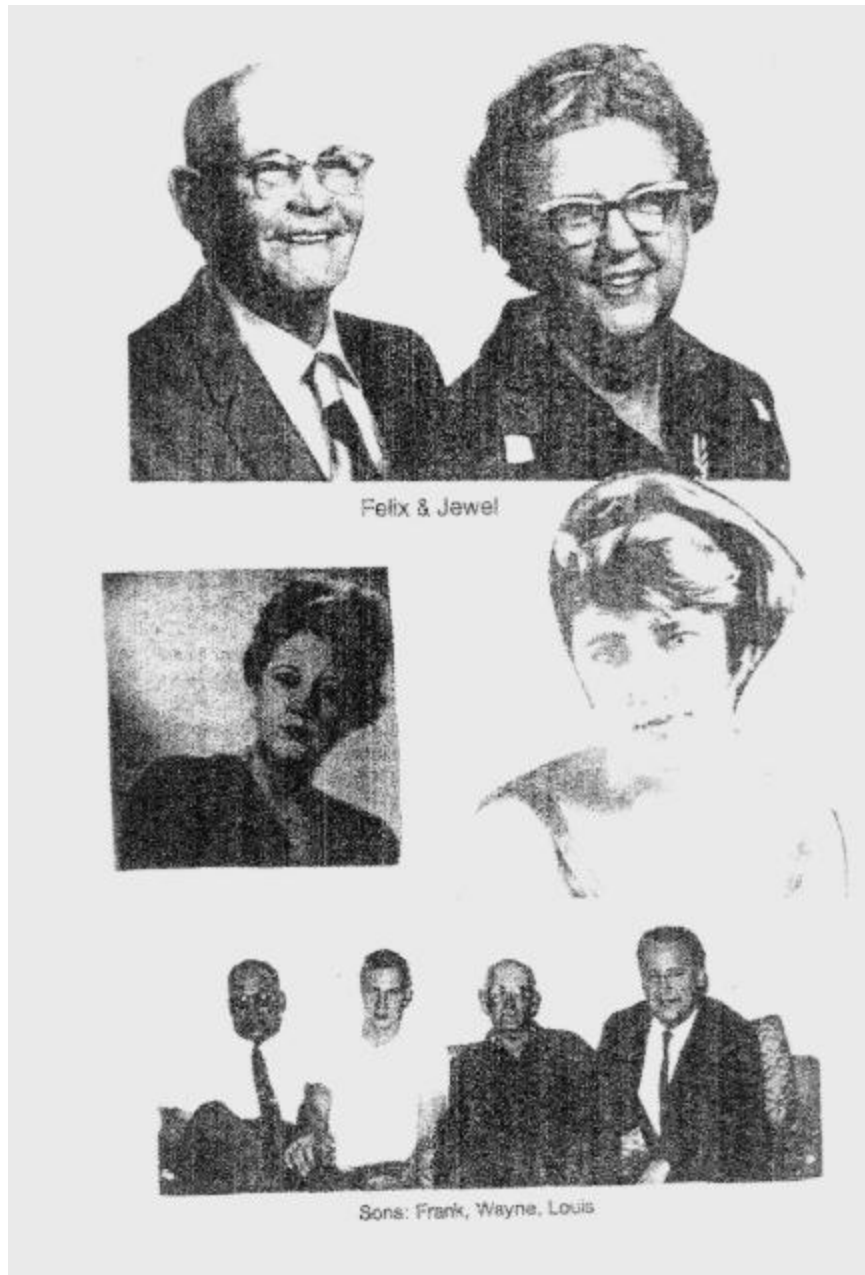

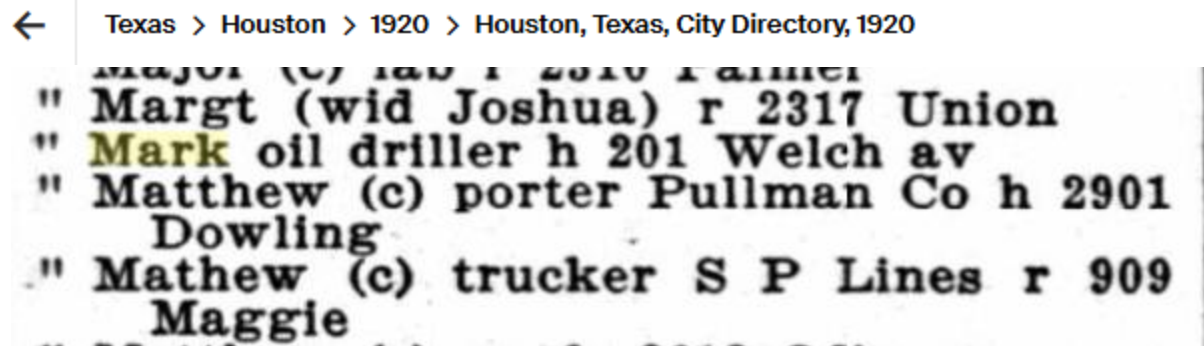
