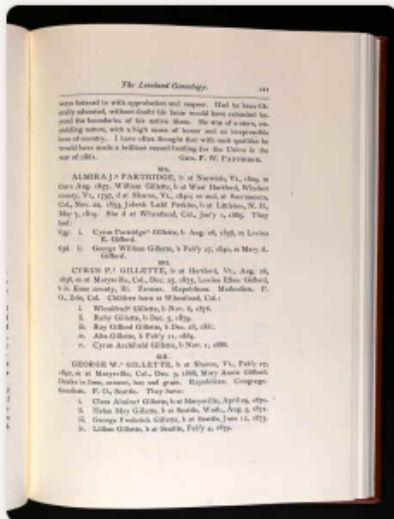

In accordance with his wishes, no services will be conducted for Archie Cyrus Gillette, 99, of Grass Valley.

He died Thursday in a Grass Valley medical facility. He was born Nov. 1, 1886, in Wheatland.

Mr. Gillette spent most of his working life as a farmer. He was a World War I veteran, having served in the Air Force. He survived the sinking of the troop transport ship, the S.S. Tuscania. He was a member of the Veterans of World War I, Eden Barracks of Hayward. Mr. Gillette moved to Grass Valley 10 years ago.

He is survived by nephew H.D. Gillette of Cedar Ridge and nieces Alta May Hamilton of Manhattan Beach and Elsie Simonds of Fresno.

GERMAN BOMB HURLS GILLETTE INTO SEA

It developed yesterday that another Marysville boy was on the Tuscania when she was sunk by a German submarine. The young man is Archie Gillette, known to everybody in this city. The news comes through his brother, R. G. Gillette and is contained in a letter written by Archie to his mother, who is now a resident of San Leandro.

Archie Gillette was born in the Erle district and raised here. His thrilling experiences bring right home the real meaning of the great war in which our nation is engaged. He is a member of the 100th aero squadron and was on his way to France when the ship was torpedoed. In his letter he says:

"Dear Mother: Well, I have mailed a letter or two home to you from different points but don't know whether or not you got them, so will try again. I have also tried to get a cablegram through to let you know that I am safe but haven't succeeded yet as we have been on the move most of the time. You will know by the American papers that I am one of the rescue. I guess you have read all about the torpedoing of the ship, so there is not much I can tell you except that the lifeboat I was in was smashed to pieces. I managed to make it in another boat after being in the water for a long time. I was then taken on board a destroyer and brought to port, where the people treated us very nicely, giving us warm dry clothes and places to sleep and eat.

"Being torpedoed is quite an experience and one I don't care to repeat. I was standing on the second deck about midship on the port side at the time the torpedo struck us. Had just come up from supper and was standing watching the lights on Scotland's shores. I received quite a shock but the exposure to the cold water and mind hurt me more than

anything else. I had just about given up all hope when rescued. I saw many of the boys get crushed and drown and it is a terrible thing to remember.

"The majority of our own company, the 100th, are together now and we will soon be outfitted again. I know you have been terribly worried, but we will not have any more dangerous sea trips to make and are in a very nice camp now. Will write more later. With much love,
"ARCHIE."

WHEATLAND, July 18.—While endeavoring to extinguish the flames raging through a combined harvester they were operating in Linda township, Ray and Archie Gillette, Wheatland young men, were both severely burned yesterday afternoon. They were rushed to the Rideout hospital in Marysville.

Although details of the accident were meagre, it is understood the fire started in the auxiliary engine, and rapidly spread throughout the harvester. The two injured young men made heroic attempts to save the machine and the grain field which they were harvesting.

When he discovered his clothes afire, Ray Gillette started to run, fanning the flames. He was saved from fatal burns by companions, who beat out the fire on his clothing.

ARMY NURSE SECURES FARM FROM STATE

Thirty-Six Awards Made in First
Unit of Delhi Land Settle-
ment District Near Turlock

Announcement was made yesterday of the thirty-six awards of farms for the first unit of the Delhi Land Settlement in the Turlock Irrigation District by Dr. Elwood Mead, professor of rural institutions in the University of California and chairman of the State Land Settlement Board.

Miss M. G. Smith of El Paso, Tex., is the first woman to apply and be awarded a farm under the act. She is a former army nurse and was given preference, with ex-service men, in the settlement of the farms.

The first unit of the Delhi settlement comprises some 2,000 acres. Between fifty and sixty applicants are on the "waiting list" for the second unit which Dr. Mead stated yesterday would be opened about July or August.

Presenting figures which disclose that \$168,959, or an average of \$4,693, was received by the State from the settlers of the first unit, Dr. Mead emphasized in a statement yesterday that the project requires "a certain bit of capital."

For the farm laborer who desires a

homestead with the view of obtaining employment on the larger farm, special allotments of two acres each were provided to fifteen persons in the initial unit.

Mr. and Mrs. Cyrus P. Gillette, who live at Erle, near Wheatland, came near being killed early yesterday afternoon in a runaway accident. Both were injured considerably, Mrs. Gillette's injuries being the more serious, and Dr. Bissell was called to attend the couple yesterday afternoon.

Mr. and Mrs. Gillette were driving in a buggy near the Sutfin place. Coming toward them, but unobserved by either of the occupants of the buggy, was a large touring car filled with Sacramento people. Between the Gillettes' buggy and the car was a huge hay wagon going in the same direction the Gillettes were driving.

The auto passed the hay wagon and came suddenly up in front of the horses Mr. Gillette was driving. The animals were frightened, shied suddenly to one side and broke the tongue of the buggy. Mr. and Mrs. Gillette were thrown violently to the ground, and the horses, freeing themselves from the buggy, dashed madly down the road.

The auto was stopped and Mr. and Mrs. Gillette taken aboard and taken to their home. Dr. Bissell was called, and he reached the Gillette home at 5 o'clock. Mrs. Gillette had two ribs broken, her head and body were badly bruised, and she was badly shaken up.

Mr. Gillette escaped with less injuries, but he was terribly shaken. One of his eyes was nearly put out with sand, and his head was bruised and cut.

Mr. Gillette is past 70 years of age and his wife is past sixty. Their age will make recovery more difficult, though no serious results are looked for.

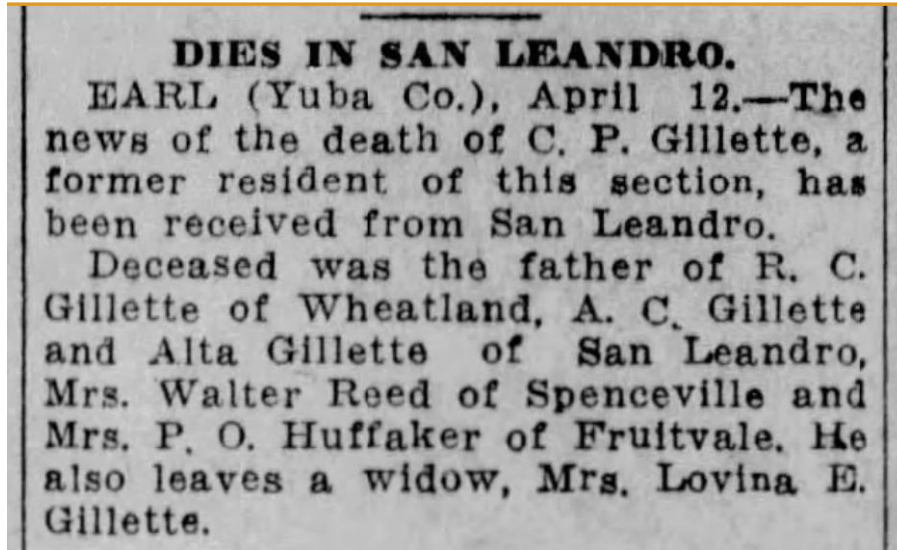

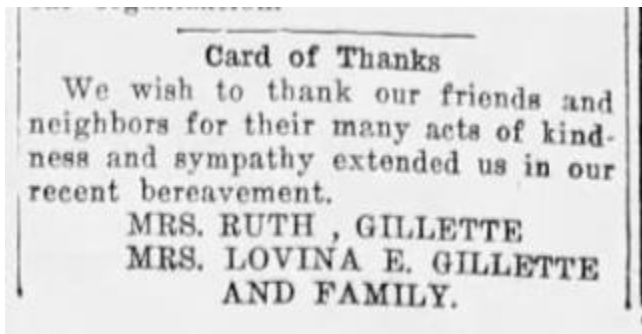
