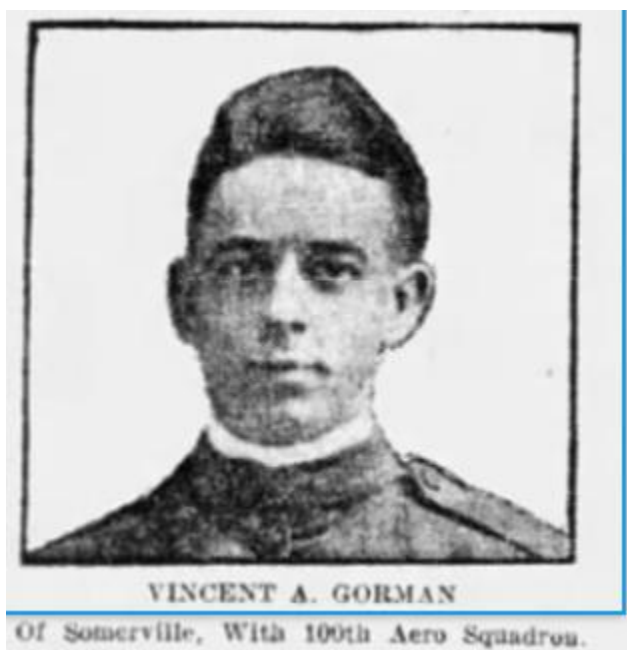

Weymouth, in Norfolk County, Massachusetts, named its intersection of Commercial Street and Middle Street “Vincent A. Gorman Square,” in honor of Vincent Ambrose Gorman, whose tombstone in St. Francis Xavier Cemetery in Weymouth reads: “Killed Feb. 5th 1918 on troop ship Tuscania off the coast of Ireland in the cause of humanity.” His body was not recovered.

MARTYRS TO THE CAUSE OF LIBERTY.

VINCENT GORMAN resigned from the pay-roll department of the Hood Rubber Co. last October, enlisting in the aviation corps. He was sent to San Antonio, Texas, for training. In January he was granted a furlough and came East to marry Miss Grace Gooding, of the accounting department of the Hood Rubber Co. At the end of his furlough he reported at New York and sailed on the troop-ship *Tusconia*, which was sunk on its way to Europe, and Mr. Gorman's name is on the list of those lost.

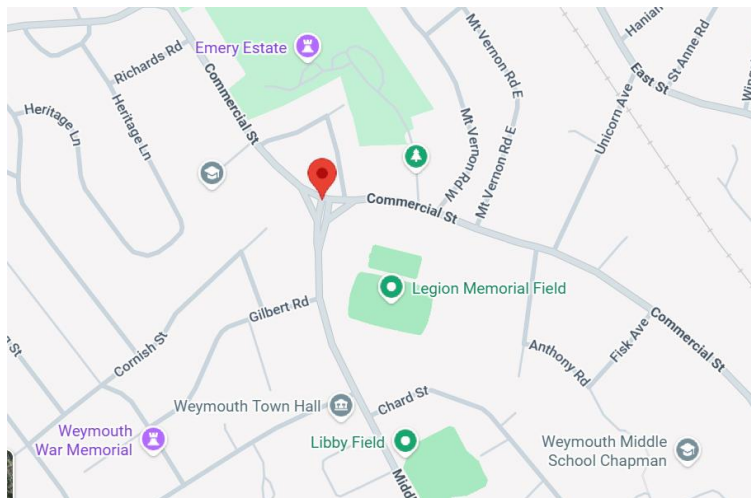

Biography

Vincent Ambrose was born in East Weymouth, Massachusetts, in 1896, the son of Michael Francis and Bridget Mary (Egan) Gorman. ^[1] (Note his birth record calls him Vincent Leo.) He grew up in Weymouth, ^{[2][3]} where he attended local public schools and graduated from Weymouth High School in 1915.

At the time of the war draft registration, in June, 1917, he was living in Medford, Massachusetts, and working as a clerk for Hood Rubber Company in East Watertown. He was described as being of a medium build, with brown eyes and auburn hair. ^[4]

He enlisted in the U.S. Army at Fort Slocum, New York, on October 21, 1917, after resigning from his position at Hood Rubber Co. He was assigned to the 50th Aero Squadron, Signal Corps, and in January transferred to the 100th Aero Squadron, Signal Corps, which which he went overseas the same month.

While on furlough, he married Grace Hartt Gooding, daughter of Henry and Mabelle (Houghton) Gooding, in Somerville, Massachusetts, in January of 1918. ^[5] They had met at Hood, where she was employed in the accounting department. ^[6]

Vincent was killed in action in the sinking of the "S.S. Tuscania" by an German submarine off the coast of island. He was assigned to life boat #10, which was dashed upon the rocks. His body was never recovered. ^[7] His name is on the family headstone at Saint Francis Xavier Cemetery in Weymouth, and his hometown of East Weymouth also dedicated Vincent A. Gorman Square, at the junction of Commercial and Middle Streets, in his honor. ^[8] His name is also on the Tablets of the Missing at the Suresnes American Cemetery and Memorial Memorial in France. ^[9]

Thank you for the info.

My wife and I did visit the chapel at Suresnes, France.

We have also discovered, from the "Massachusetts Gold Star Record", published in 1929, that our great uncle Vincent, did make it into lifeboat No. 10, and almost made it to shore. The lifeboat was dashed on the rocks and many, including Vincent, drowned.

Bride of Month Fears for Husband

Mrs Grace H. Gorman, who makes her home with her parents, Mr and Mrs H. H. Gooding, at 2 Windsor road, West Somerville, is confident that her husband, Vincent A. Gorman, to whom she was married on Jan 9 last, was on board the ill-fated ship.

He was a member of No. 100 Aero Squadron, and according to a letter she received from him two weeks ago last Tuesday, mailed from Garden City, L. I., he was to sail on the following morning.

Gorman is a Weymouth boy, having graduated from the Weymouth High School in the class of 1915. He was captain of the baseball team that year. He was employed in the office of the Hood Rubber Company up to Oct 12 of last year when he enlisted in the aviation branch of the service. He was sent to San Antonio, Tex., for training and was originally a member of the 50th Squadron, but was subsequently transferred to the 100th.

While on a furlough in January he was married at the home of his bride's parents.

Mr and Mrs James J. Crowley of 107 Sawyer av., Dorchester, are clinging to the hope that their son, Thomas F. Crowley, did not sail with the 213th Aero Squadron, which he joined two weeks ago in Philadelphia. Crowley, however, who is 23 years old and a graduate of the South Boston High School, wrote a letter to his parents dated Jan 26, which was immediately followed by a postal to his mother in which he stated, "we sail tomorrow."

The following Wednesday, Jan 30, another postcard, bearing no postmark or date, was received by his mother, which contained these words: "Well, Ma, we are just about to sail."

Besides the 37 new names of survivors contained in dispatches to the department tonight, 37 other men previously listed as missing were found to be survivors today when the Associated Press list of Tuscania missing was checked against all available official records, leaving a total of only 74 American soldiers unaccounted for.

Included in that number are the 33 unidentified dead, buried on the Scottish coast.

Vincent A. Gorman of East Weymouth, Mass, is still unaccounted for.

WASHINGTON, Feb 26—The War Department today gave out the first partial list of those officially reported missing or among the unidentified dead from the Tuscania. In the list appears the name of Vincent A. Gorman, son of Mrs Bridget Gorman, 22 Center st, East Weymouth, Mass.

Gorman was a private in the 100th Airplane Squadron. There were 29 Massachusetts men on the Tuscania, and all the others have been accounted for as saved.

WEYMOUTH RENAMES SQUARES FOR HEROES

13 of World War Victims Honored at Ceremonies

Special Dispatch to the Globe

WEYMOUTH, Nov 18—Under the auspices of Weymouth Post, American Legion, 13 public squares of the town were renamed today in honor of 13 of the 26 Weymouth boys who gave their lives in the World War.

The exercises opened with a meeting in the theatre at Weymouth Landing. Raymond E. Stein, post commander, presided. Rev Dr Francis A. Poole, pastor of the Old South Union Congregational Church, delivered the prayer and the address was made by Rev Fr James P. Sherry of Cohasset, a chap-

lain of the 102d during the war. Music was by the post band and a quartet.

Following this service, the entire assembly marched behind the band to each of the 13 squares.

Massachusetts Legionnaires on Scythia Pay
Touching Tribute to Those Who Died
On Water During War

ABOARD S. S. SCYTHIA, Sept 16
(By Radio)—Solemnly gathered on the afterdeck of this, the official carrier of the bulk of the Massachusetts delegation to the Paris convention of the American Legion, 500 Legionnaires this afternoon participated in impressive memorial services for six World War heroes from Somerville, who, during hostilities, were buried at sea.

At the instant the ship crossed the line at latitude 49, longitude 23, the engines were stopped and all merriment aboard ceased.

The services were conducted under the direction of Adj. Paul E. Laurent of Somerville Post, American Legion, who also is the official interpreter for the Massachusetts delegation.

As the Legionnaires, in uniform, stood with bared heads, Rev. George P. O'Connor, director of the Catholic Charitable Bureau of the diocese of Boston, offered prayer. Memorial wreaths then were dropped into the sea.

Legion Wreath Dropped

Outstanding in the memorials was the large wreath from the Legion,

massed with poppies and centered with a large Legion insignia, which was lowered gently into the calm seas by Miss Etta Wallace.

As the flowers began to drift astern, the Weymouth band softly played "Onward Christian Soldiers."

In a group at the rail, their lips pressed tightly together, were the 15 Gold Star mothers who accompany the Legionnaires. A short address of remembrance was delivered by State Commander Reth.

"Taps," sounded from a distant part of the ship, brought the 15-minute ceremony to a close.

The services were in memory of George F. Conway, killed aboard the U. S. S. Maud; Joseph J. Edwards, drowned from the U. S. S. Lake Weston; Ambrose C. Ford, killed aboard the U. S. S. Covington; Vincent A. Gorman, private in the 100th Aero Squadron, who died at sea; John W. Montgomery, killed aboard the U. S. S. Shaw, and William E. O'Connell, private in Co L, 104th Infantry, the first Somerville soldier to die overseas.

Adj. Laurent will visit the five military American cemeteries in France to decorate the graves of the 50 Somerville World War veterans buried there.

MEMORIAL TO WEYMOUTH WORLD WAR VETERAN

WEYMOUTH, June 21—Another addition is being made to the Civic Center. A triangle at the foot of King Oak Hill, East Weymouth, next to the Legion Memorial Field, is being graded and is to be dedicated to Vincent A. Gorman, a World War veteran who lost his life while in action.

A cement curbing is being put in and the plot will be seeded. A bronze marker is to be placed in the center of the lot. The work is being done under the supervision of the Weymouth Park Department.

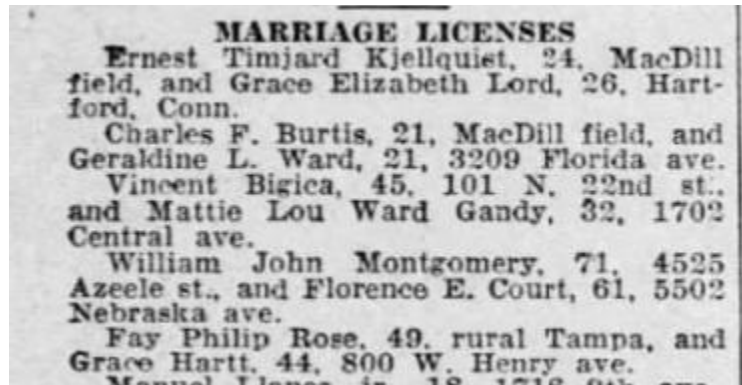

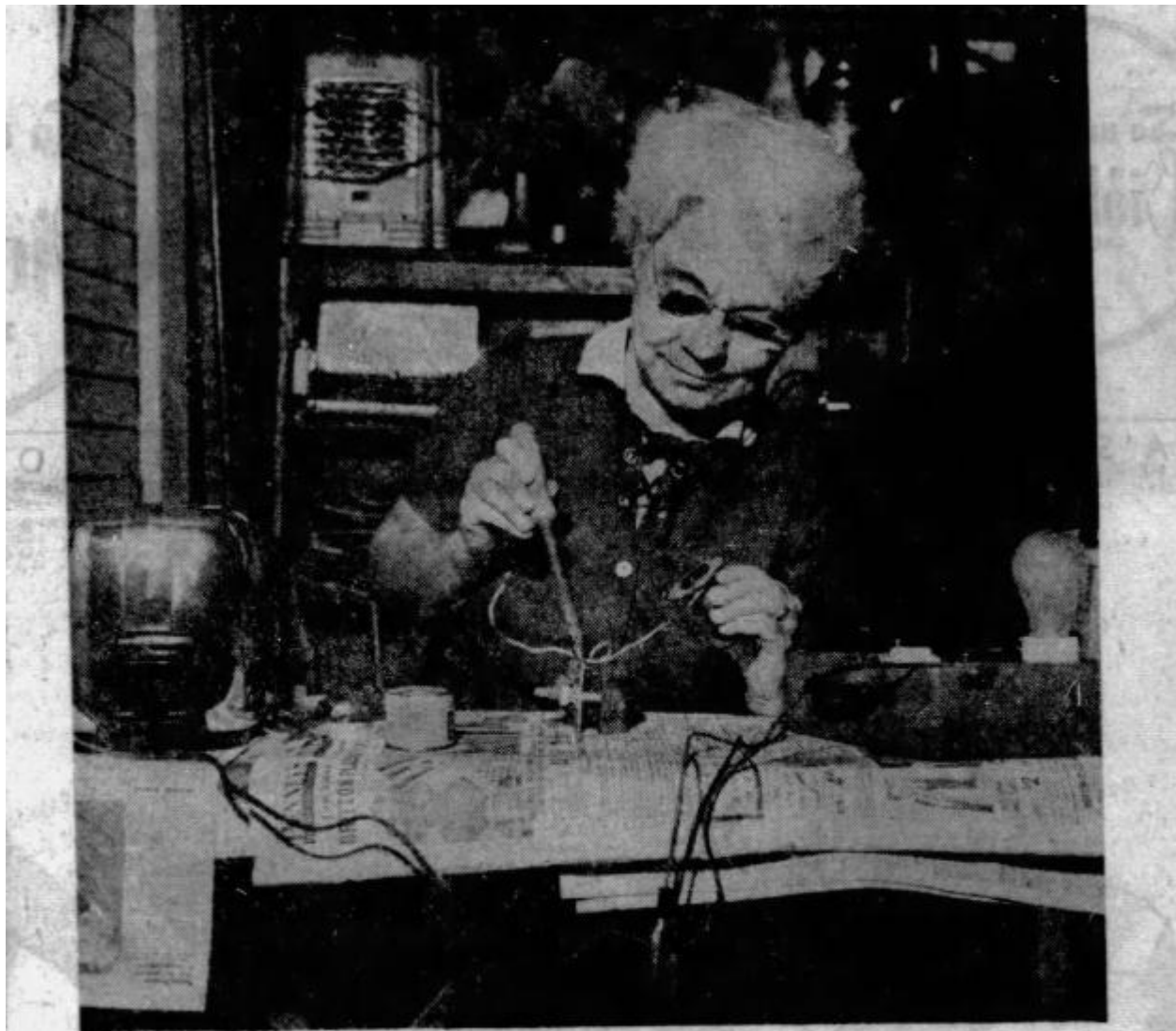

Jill of Many Trades, Tampa Lady Now Runs Appliance Repair Shop

Keeping busy is the real vocation of Mrs. Grace Hartt Rose, who in following that career has been a welder, home builder, bookkeeper, writer and electrical repair woman.

And keeping pace with her has been her husband, Fay, whom she married after a shipyard romance during World War II.

The Roses have slowed down and with reason. She is 64 and he is 69 and retired.

THEY DON'T build houses any more and welding is a thing of the past, but they still maintain a keen sense of humor and a warmth that makes friends easily and keeps them.

Mrs. Rose runs a small electrical appliance repair business in a back room of the house at 800 W. Henry, while her husband steps out of retirement to pick up and deliver the items.

Everything seems to be fun to the Roses.

While discussing a head set she built for use with the television set, Mrs. Rose quipped, "When I'm using the telephone, he still can listen to his 'bang-bang' television shows."

THE HUSBAND retorted, "I also use it to hear my programs when three or four women get together here and start talking."

This friendly chiding does not dim the deep feeling they have for others.

Listening on her short wave set about four years ago, Mrs. Rose heard a ham operator ask that someone help him recall the lines of a poem, "The Cremation of Sam McGee."

MRS. ROSE found a copy of the poem and sent it to the ham operator, Emery Dyers, a victim of spinal arthritis from north Georgia.

Mrs. Rose said they have become good friends and write to each other at least once a week and spend some time together each summer.

Another of the more than 20 persons she wrote more than 600 letters to during the past year, is a "kissing cousin" from New England. The 40-year-old woman is suffering from multiple sclerosis and is losing her sight so that even now she cannot read letters, said Mrs. Rose.

TO REMEDY this, they have begun a correspondence with tapes. The first recording is made and ready for mailing.

Rose recalls he was a steam-fitter welder and she was a pipefitter welder when they met in the shipyards in Tampa.

She became a welder in the first class for women in that craft in Tampa.

"I was the guinea pig, because I was over 40," she said.

SILVERY-HAIRED even at that time, she surprised many who saw her in the man-size occupation during two years and four months.

After the war, the Roses built four small houses for rental. Rose was in charge of carpentry work and Mrs. Rose, a licensed electrician, supervised and installed the wiring.

The houses were later sold when they found the tenants gave them too much work for the return.

Before becoming a welder, Mrs. Rose had done such things as bookkeeping and making models of animals. She also wrote a humorous column, "Penetrator Pens," for the Key West Citizen.

ROSE, a native of Champaign, Ill., says he must have worked in all the schools there before coming to Florida.

Rose says his wife is the only woman to pass the National Radio Institute's course on appliance repairs.

She says she is not sure of that, and continues the small enterprise begun about 1954.

She fixes irons, installs cords, rewires lamps, cleans and greases portable fans or mixers, and installs thermostats or elements in waffle bakers, hot plates and percolators.

MRS. ROSE also makes and redecorates lamps. Not long ago she used discarded slats from venetian blinds to help enclose the front porch of the house.

She says, "I've never seen the time when I'd say, 'What do I do now?'"

It's 'Redickuluss'

Widowed, Grace Gorman married Reilly H. Thomas on 3 Jul 1926 in Queens NY.

Sometimes Reilly’s middle name is found as Henry & sometimes as Harry, but on his WWII draft registration he says H. (middle initial only). Reilly was born 7 Aug 1901 in Brooklyn NY. In 1942 he was a resident of Jacksonville, Duval FL, employed by the US Engineers Office.

In the 1935 FL state census of Hillsborough Co. FL, Reilly H. Thomas (33 NY, engineer) lived with wife Grace H. (36 MA, housewife). In their household was his uncle, Louis A.S. Bodine (61 NY, retired).

Grace & Reilly Thomas divorced in 1941 in Hillsborough Co. FL. Reilly died 15 Jan 1977 in Duval Co. FL. He is buried in Jacksonville Memory Gardens, Orange Park, Clay FL, F: 86625293.

Grace H. Thomas married Fay Phillip Rose on 19 Feb 1943 in Hillsborough Co. FL. Fay was born 21 Aug 1893 in Brown Co. SD & died 25 Oct 1970 in Hillsborough Co. FL. He had married Estel Vena Lykins in 1916. He had divorced Wilma Brunn in FL in Feb 1943. The Tampa FL newspaper reported that Fay & Grace H. Thomas had obtained a marriage

license in Feb 1943 – but then again (with her name now listed as Grace Hartt) in Apr 1943, they obtained another marriage license.

- **John Walter Gorman, (Sr.)**, 2 Jun 1905 Weymouth, Norfolk MA - 24 Aug 1985 Weymouth, Norfolk MA. - Husband of Cecilia Morrison (1907-1997) whom he married 20 Sep 1926. SSN 029-05-9993. Obituary: "Boston Globe" 25 Aug 1985 p 94 - John W. Gorman Sr. of North Weymouth MA d. 24 Aug 1985. Hood Rubber employee Vincent had married co-worker Grace Gooding before he left for war - "Boston Post" 27 Feb 1918 p 3 – photo - over 8,500 employees of Hood Rubber Co. of Watertown were given liberal increases in wages, the 2nd time this year. To foster a spirit of esprit de corps, employees have a supply store, medical services, dental services at cost (photo shows employee receiving dental care), eye examinations at no charge, eyeglasses at cost. They have a hospital with a doctor & nursing staff. A semi-monthly newspaper is published for them. The company has a huge service flag, showing 565 stars for employees in the Army & Navy. "One former employee was lost on the Tuscania." Over 1,000 of the company's 3,000 women employees belong to a war relief club, which provides each person entering service with a complete outfit of clothing.
