A man who survived the sinking by a World War I German submarine of the troop transport Tuscania early in 1918, Edward Clark Green, 76, died yesterday at his home, N4828 Walnut.

A meat cutter for Safeway Stores, Mr. Green had been a Spokane resident the last 39 years. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1474.

Mr. Green had enlisted in the infantry at Ft. George Wright and was en route to France when the Tuscania was torpe-

doed off the Irish coast. A British liner, carrying 2,500 American troops, the Tuscania had a casualty list of more than 200.

Mr. Green is survived by his wife, Mrs. Elida Green, at the home; two sisters in Canada, and a brother, James Green, in Grants Pass, Ore.

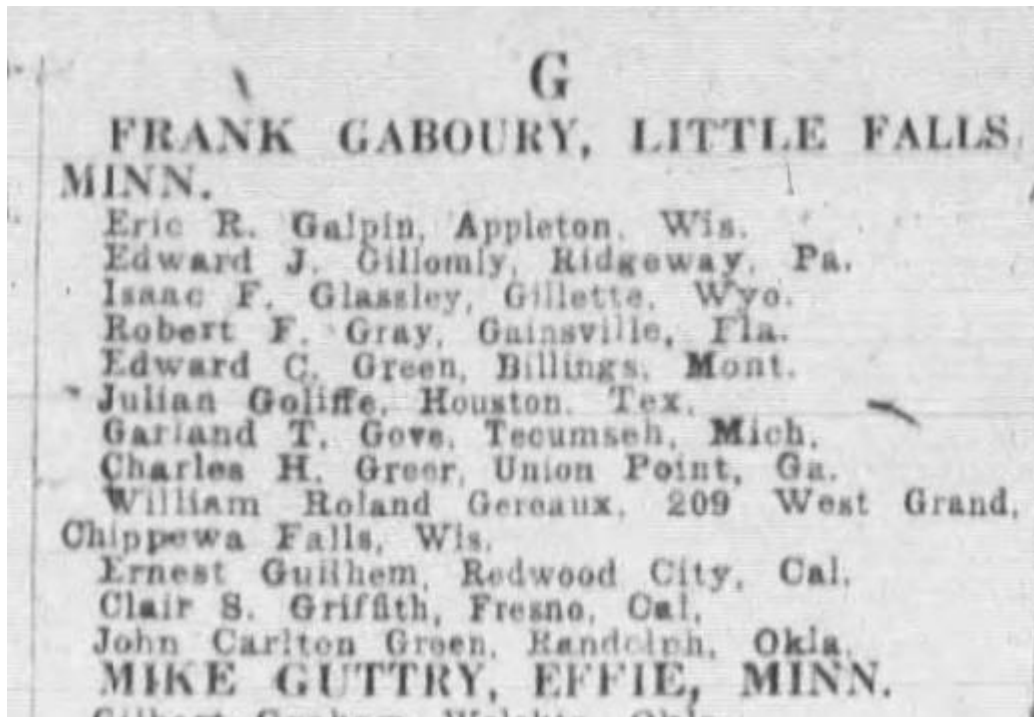

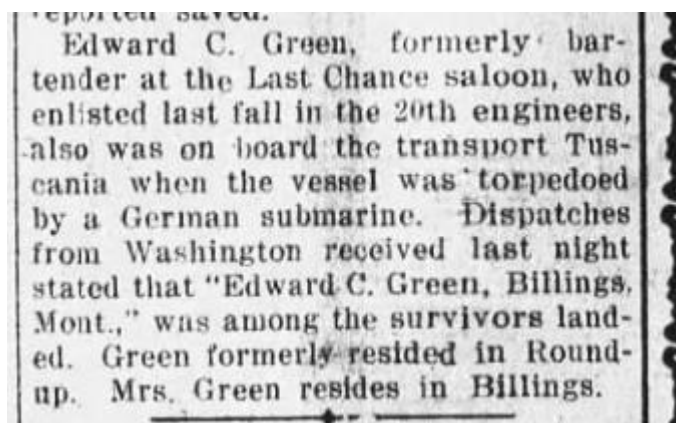
Here Are All Names of Tuscania Survivors So Far Decoded

Billings Boy Writes Graphic Story of Tuscania Disaster

That a number of soldiers on board the Tuscania lost their lives when that transport was torpedoed off the coast of Ireland, through jumping overboard instead of waiting to be taken off and that many others were drowned when the ropes broke while lifeboats were being lower, are among the statements made in a letter received here from Edward C. Green, a former Billings bartender, who enlisted last fall in the 20th engineers. Green's letter was addressed to Claud H. Hunter, former secretary of the Bartenders' union, who now is in active service himself in an engineering regiment and is believed to be on the high seas on his way to France.

The recital of happenings on the Tuscania after the German torpedo struck, as written by Private Green, is the most intimate portrayal of the disaster that has been received here. He wrote:

Was in Bunk.

"I suppose that by this time you have seen in the papers over there that the transport Tuscania was torpedoed. Well, I was on that ship. I cannot tell you all about it, but can give you an idea of what it was like.

"It was our thirteenth day out from the States. At 5:40 o'clock I was in my bunk, just awaking from a little nap, when we were hit by a torpedo from a Hun sub. The lights went out and I had six deck stairs to go up in the dark, but it did not take me long to do it, although there was considerable pushing and crowding from the men who were caught below decks. I thought it was an hour

below decks. I thought it was on board before I made my way to the deck and found my life boat station at last, only to find it broken into bits while being lowered, so I had to look for another means of getting away.

Says Some Lost Heads.

"The ship stayed up for some time—something like three hours. I was on her deck for about two hours and a half and while I was there I saw some sights I do not care to see again. Men were being killed and drowned; some of them good friends

of mine. Lots of them lost their heads and jumped overboard. I didn't. That water looked too cold for me so I stayed on board. Some of the boys went into lifeboats and while being lowered the ropes broke and they went into the sea and drowned. At last a sub chaser came alongside and took about 500 men aboard. You should have seen the men going down the ropes.

"I could not get near a rope that time, so it was just wait. But soon another destroyer came along and that time I got aboard it. There were about 1,200 men saved in this manner.

Praises Treatment.

"We were landed in different ports, so it is taking some time to get us all together again. There are some of the boys in hospitals and some are missing. We do not know if they are dead or alive. I think we lost about a hundred men in all, maybe more. We will not know for some time.

"Where we have been landed the people have treated us as I never was treated before. There are surely some fine people in this country. It is spring here and they are doing their spring planting. It is certainly pretty here. I cannot tell you where I am, but I am a long way from Billings."

Edward C. Green of this city is now with the 20th engineers in France according to letters received by friends here last week. He is a member of the bartenders' local of Roundup. At the regular meeting of the local Sunday, both local papers were ordered sent to him so that he can keep informed as to the happenings at home. This was done because he deplored the fact in his letters that he hadn't seen a newspaper from home since arriving in France.

Roundup People in Car Accident Sunday Night

Ed C. Green of Billings was arrested Wednesday by State Highway Patrolman Charles A. Dell of Roundup charged with driving on the centerline of the highway between here and Billings and is to appear in justice court here on or before Saturday.

The charge was filed against Green as the outgrowth of an accident 15 miles south of here on U. S. highway 87 at about 7 o'clock last Sunday evening, in which accident three cars were involved.

Green was driving south to Billings, and Mr. and Mrs. Leo Cross, who moved to Big Timber the first of this month, were coming to Roundup, followed by Mr. and Mrs. Virgil Cross in another car. Green, who was accompanied by Mrs. Green, side-swiped the Leo Cross car when he was passing them. Green's car then swung in behind Leo Cross's car to the wrong side of the road and into the path of Virgil Cross's car, meeting the latter head on.

Mrs. Virgil Cross was hurt slightly, cutting her forehead, but the others were not injured. Damage to Leo Cross's car does not amount to much but Virgil Cross's car was damaged to the extent of about \$125, and Green's to the amount of about \$150.

Other newspaper accounts (copied above) report how Charles met his son Edward from Coeur d’Alene ID at the boat from Seattle WA after not having seen him for several years. Charles got in the rear seat of Edward’s car & died a few minutes later.

Her father was born in Canada (English) & her mother in IA. She was an operator for the telephone company. She lived with Charles Litzinger (42 PA, parents b. MN, a telephone lineman) & his wife Belle Litzinger (40 IA, father b. OH, mother b. IA) & their son-in-law Clarence Harr (19 SD, father b. Canada, mother b. IA, a telephone lineman). Grace's mother Elizabeth (Belle) Clark had married Charles Litzinger.

Herbert Purdy was the petitioner for a divorce, which was granted 31 May 1911 in Helena, Lewis & Clark Co. MT. In 1911, Herbert married Jessie S. Broshius (1889-1963) & in 1918 married Marie Ludbrook (1896-1963).

No sooner was Edward Clark Green home from WWI, having been discharged from the US Army on 10 Jun 1919, when Grace, whom he had married in 1916, sued for divorce as of 19 Jun 1919 in Billings, Yellowstone MT on the grounds of desertion & non-support.

J.J. Sullivan sued Grace for divorce in Dec 1927 in Billings, Yellowstone MT on the grounds of desertion. The divorce was granted Jan 1928.
