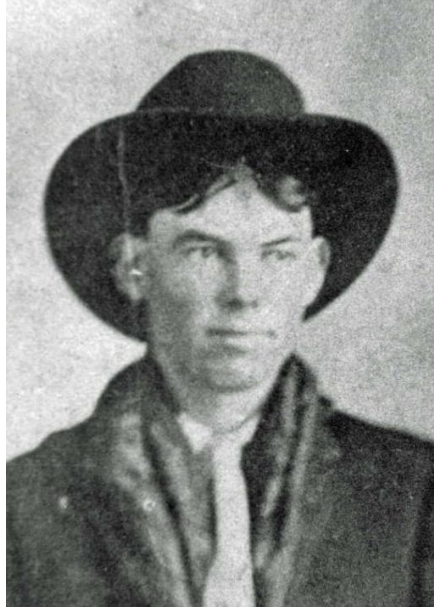

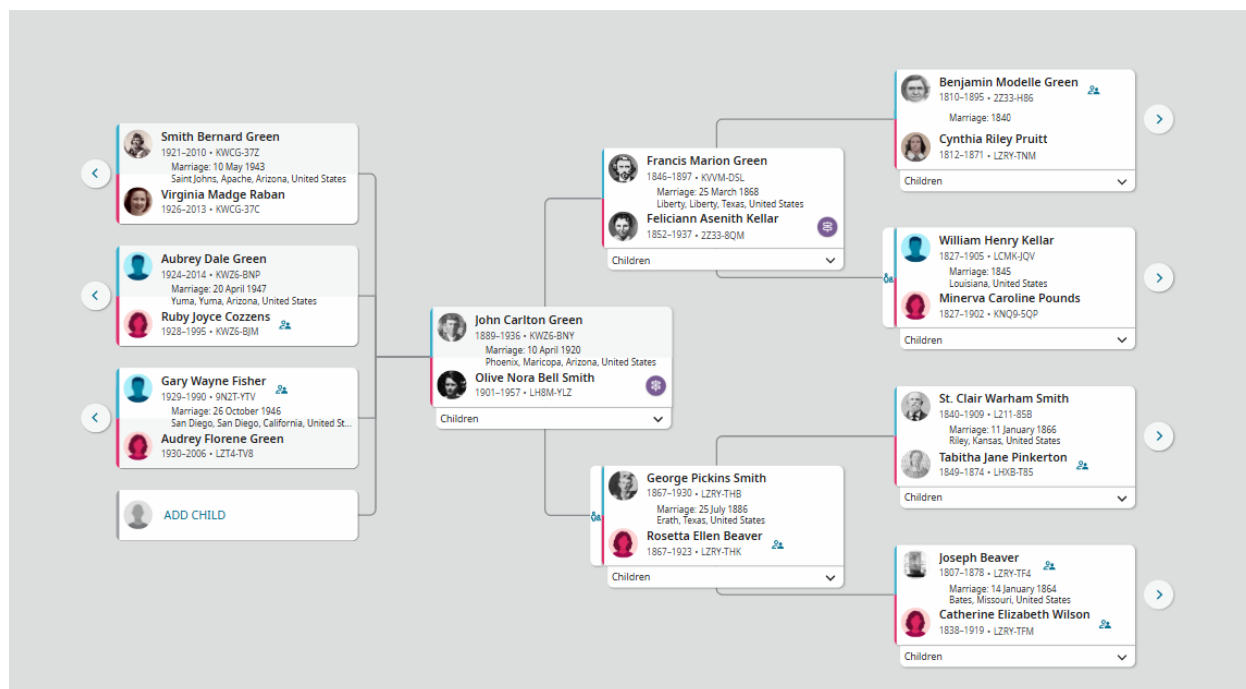

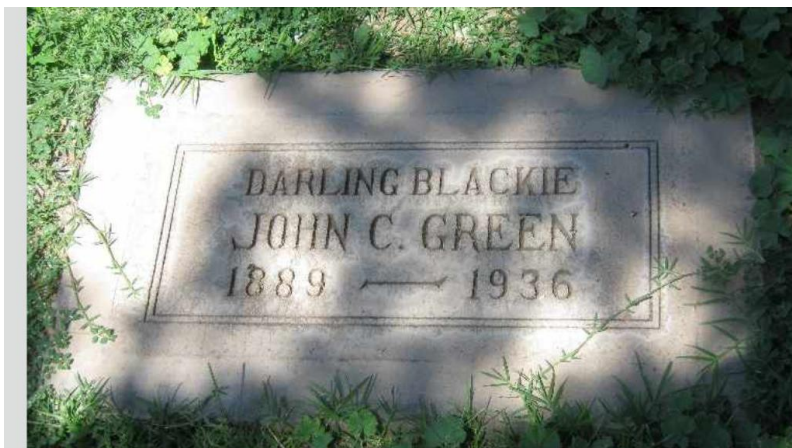

The Violin

The Saga of the Violin as told by Stephen Dallas Green

Uncle Troy Havins (husband of Felicia Rose Green aka Aunt Dot, daughter of Archie Dallas Green, older brother of John Carlton Green) had John C's violin and in 1954, Stephen Dallas Green, grandson of Archie Dallas Green, started playing the violin, so it was given to me. Then, in 1956, Garland Green, who was Uncle T's (Orr Toliver) son started making sting instruments. He was a high school principal in Phoenix and an accomplished fiddler himself. He made the instruments for the Indian children who had musical ability but couldn't afford an instrument. He sent the first violin he made to me. The, in 1962, we took one of our annual Easter vacation trips to Avondale. We stayed every year with Johnny Green, who was the son of Uncle Prue. We went over to visit Uncle T and he gave me another violin that he had acquired. Dot and Troy, and uncle Joe (my dad's brother) and aunt Helen had also came over that year, so we were all camped out in Johnny and Dema's yard. When Troy found out that I now had a third violin he asked if he could have John C's violin back because he wanted to "fiddle" around. So, my dad gave it back to him. I didn't think about it until several years after Troy died and then George (Troy Havens son) died about 10 years ago. I ask George's wife Cleo if she had the violin and she said no, they didn't have it. I also asked Dot's other two girls, Barbara and Dottie Jo if they had seen it, and they hadn't. Finally, another cousin thought that Dot might have given it to Omen (uncle Francis Henry's son). And when Omen died he gave all of his fiddles (and he had several) to the church to give to poor kids. So that is the saga of uncle John C's fiddle. I don't have any contact with George Havins kids, so I don't know for sure if any them might have it.

A Brothers Love

Edward Pruitt Green - A Brother's Love

My uncle Dale at the age of 86 talks about HIS uncle Prue with fond memories of the early 1930s in Coldwater, Arizona. Prue and his younger brother John Carlton Green (my grandpa who is called Blackie), took over the 160 acre cotton farm that their mother Feliciana (fondly known as Mammy) had owned. Prue split the property in half giving 80 acres to his brother John. In the beginning, they lived in tents while constructing the houses, but the tents always remained in use. During the week they would tend the farms and on the weekends Prue and John would be in great demand to play music at the local barn dances. They hired cotton pickers and paid them one dollar per each 100lb bag, and they could pick about 2 bags per day, where the going wage for this work was 75 cents per bag. (See the photo of typical cotton picking.. it is not our relatives there, just a representative of what it was like to pick cotton.. I've done it myself.).

One night after a dance and much drinking by John, the two started home but John insisted on driving. They crashed into a pole, leaving John with a chest injury leading to his chronic lung disorders. See, John was also exposed to mustard gas during WW1 and he insisted that it contributed to his chronic cough but never suffered until after the accident. Prue knew what the real problem was and recognized that John had tuberculosis. John was in denial and filed for a WW1 pension for disability and was awarded \$16.00 per month. Prue knew about the disease and kept John isolated in the tent they had and that's where he slept. My grandmother never knew why John slept in the tent and thought it was her being partially paralyzed from neck surgery that caused the abandonment. Back then TB was a dirty word and described as other conditions like consumption. Still, John did not suffer alone. Prue took care of him. Blackie couldn't work much, but could play the fiddle and drank heavily at dances. Uncle Dale thought that was why his dad spent the nights in the tent instead of the house, because of his late nights and heavy drinking. While being sick in the tent, John was getting worse so Prue drove him to the doctors and discovered that he had a collapsed lung and the other was so diseased with TB that he didn't know how he was still living. Prue took him home and stayed by his side. John died the next day.

Prue lived another 28 years and at the age of 78 also died of tuberculosis.

I cried when uncle Dale told me this story and it still makes me cry.. not because of how my grandfather died, but because of the love of a brother.

In WW1, John was assigned to drive the "chow wagon" to the troops at the front in the trenches. He was exposed to mustard gas on three occasions and recieved a disability pension of \$16/mo in the early 30's, which at the time "a dollar-a-day" was the usual earning wage. As you can see by the photograph of the horse with a gas mask, there were only enough masks for those animals and the soldiers who were actually in the trenches. So, a food van driver was not counted as a soldier.

Blackie was having lung problems when he applied for his pension, but his condition turned out to be tuberculosis instead.

Dead Man's Arm

Uncle Dale tells a story of the time when living near Aunt Nervie's when the I-80 was being diverted, taking 3 acres of her property. She was sandwiched between it and the railroad. Passenger trains would pass through going 70-80 miles an hour. One Sunday while sitting at the kitchen table they heard the train screeching to a halt, taking about two miles to stop. The train had hit a man on the tracks cutting him in two. The torso part of him got dragged under the train ripping it to pieces. They later learned that this man lived down the road from the Mexican neighborhood. He was a divorced man wanting to marry, but the father of the girl said no because she was only 13 years old. At that the man got a gun and shot the girl (we don't know what happened to the girl), then ran away throwing his gun on the tracks. Later he decided to retrieve his gun but never heard or saw the train coming. Well, the police and coroner came out and had to wait until the train backed up all the way so that they could collect all the victims body parts. They were missing the man's arm, but the train would not wait for them to find it because they had been delayed for too long. A few days later Dale, Bernard, and their pals were on the track and they found the man's arm, but it was too late to get it to the morgue so they buried it next to a telephone pole. The boys bragged about what they had done and sure enough, nobody would believe them. So, they dug up the arm and buried it again. Dale doesn't remember how many times he had to do this, but the last time they dug up the arm the ring finger was missing. Evidently someone had removed the man's wedding ring the hard way. It grossed Dale out so much that he never went back!

The residents of Coldwater moved to the railroad stop. The original post office was called Coldwater and was established in 1896. In 1897 it was changed to Cold Water and continued under this name until 1905. In 1911 it was reestablished, this time as Avondale. 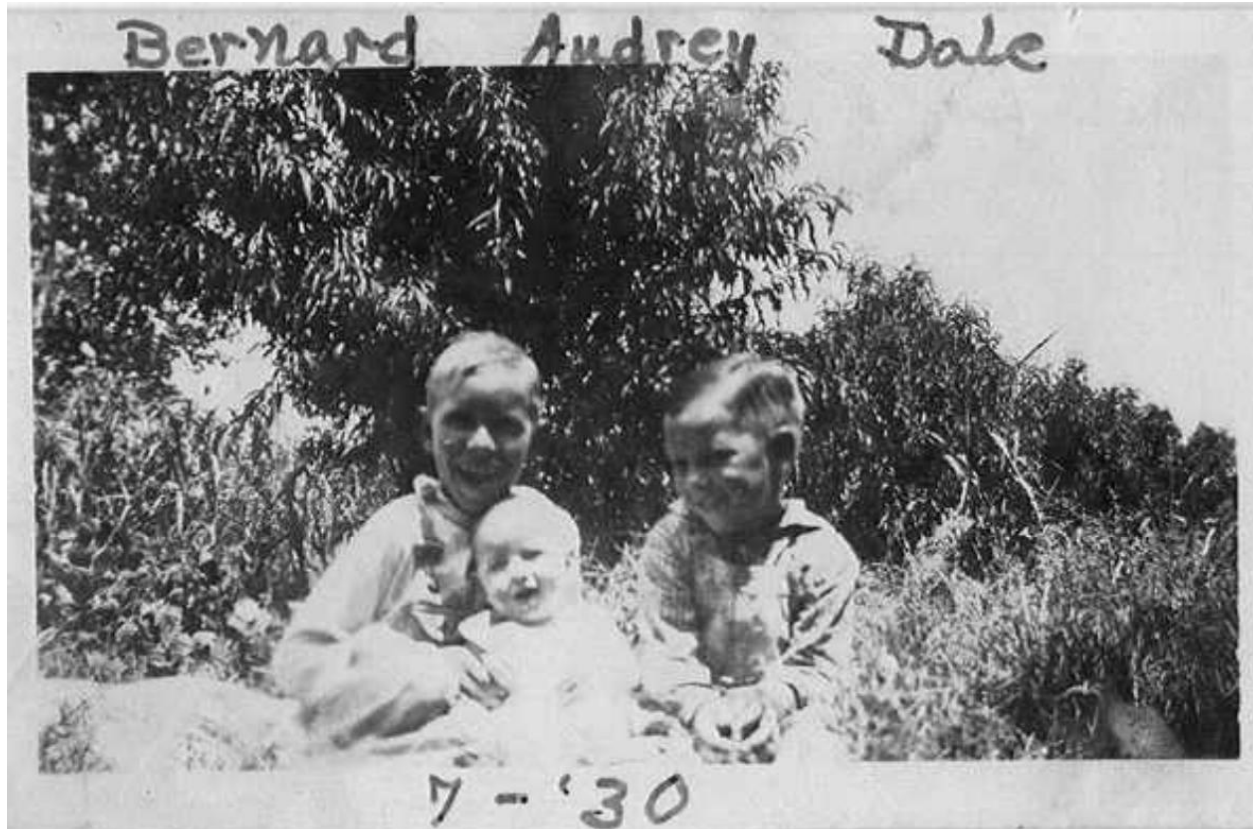

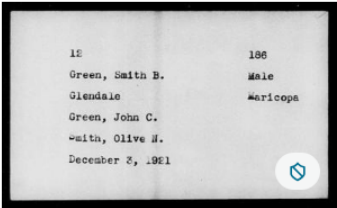

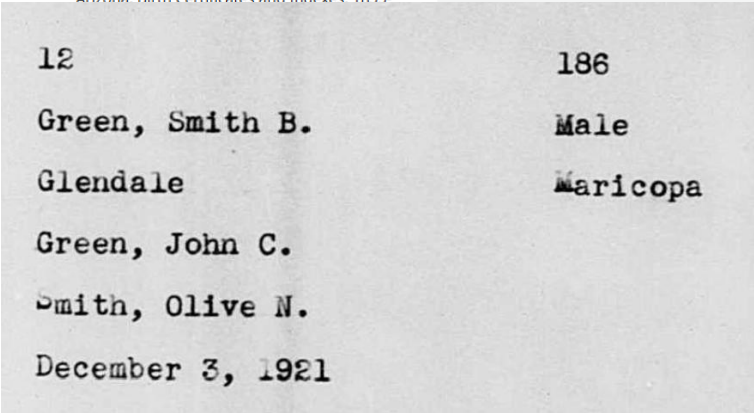

Life History Of Smith Bernard Green

Even as late as the year of my Birth, 1921 record keeping of Vital Statistics was rather haphazard . My Birth Certificate shows that I was born 3 DECEMBER 1921 at GLENDALE, MARICOPA County, ARIZONA the son of JOHN O. GREEN and OLIVE N. SMITH ; that at the time of my birth my Father was 32 years of age and my mother's age was 20 both in the STATE of TEXAS and their Address was given only as PHOENIX, ARIZONA . The signature of F.A. BURNUM, M.D. was shown on the birth certificate as the attending Physician .

This record is in part both inaccurate and incomplete . According to the Story I have picked up from my Parents, I made this initial solo flight in a small White House on West Van Buren Street in PHOENIX, MARICOPA County, ARIZONA 3 DECEMBER 1921 . I do not recall ever hearing the house number on Van Buren Street, but I have been told that it was due North of the State Capital Building in PHOENIX . The Address of the attending M.D. was GLENDALE and this is probably the reason for the error in showing my Birth place as GLENDALE .

My Father was JOHN CARLTON GREEN born 10 APRIL 1889 at GEORGETOWN, TEXAS . He was Married 10 APRIL 1920 to OLIVE NORA BELL SMITH, born 11 FEBRUARY 1901 at LUBBOCK, TEXAS . We lived at this PHOENIX Address for about three years, and my Father worked as a piano tuner for REDWELL Music Company of PHOENIX . The only things I can remember about our stay in PHOENIX was that when I was about 18 months old, I sat down in an ANT Bed and was stung 17 times from my waist to my feet . At about the same time I was partially caught under the wheels of a backing truck and broke my left collar bone .

When I was three we moved to an Area about ten miles South-West of CHANDLER, ARIZONA where my Father and his Brother, EDWARD PRUITT GREEN (Uncle PRUE) farmed Cotton together . I can distinctly remember that while we lived at CHANDLER we lived in a tent with a Wood Floor and Wooden sideboards up about three feet high . I can also remember killing a Scorpion Crawling up the inside of the tent about once a week or so . and in this newly cleared Desert Land, one could expect to find several Scorpions under any board or loose object left laying around any damp area that had been recently irrigated . I was stung many times by Scorpions,

and after a few stings got to where I would hold some mud on the sting to ease the pain, and generally wouldn't even bother telling my Mother about

During my First year of School, our Family which included my three year old Brother AUBREY DALE, along with Uncle PRUE'S Family moved to AVONDALE , ARIZONA . About 15 miles West of PHOENIX . At AVONDALE Uncle PRUE bought a Farm and he and my Father raised Cotton together . Uncle PRUE built a house on his newly acquired farm and still lives there to the day of this writing, 1962 some 34 years later . My Father , Mother, Brother and I moved into a house about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile North of Uncle PRUE'S . This house was occupied by three Ladies, FELICIA ANN ELIZABETH KELLER GREEN , MINERVA CAROLINE GREEN, YANCE , and HELEN OZELLA NARCISSUS GREEN, my Father's mother and two Sisters, known to us youngsters as " Mammy ", " Aunt NERVY ", and " Aunt ZELL ", the property being owned by Aunt NERVY, a Widow . My father was not a Religious man and had no Church ties . His Mother and two Sisters were " devout members of the JEHOVAH'S WITNESSES" and my mother's Church was the PROTESTANT " CHURCH OF CHRIST ". I don't remember my mother attending Church at any time before my father's death, probably because of my father's disinterest . My only Sister AUDREY FLORENE was born at AVONDALE on 14 MARCH 1930, and then in SEPTEMBER of 1930, Mom was operated on for the removal of a Thyroid Tumor on the right side of her neck . Something went wrong with this " Simple " Operation and Mom wound up near death with a Blood Clot on her Brain and complete Paralysis for two years, then gradually regained the use of her left side, but she had to relearn to do everything, even to talk just as a baby would . Her right side remained Paralyzed until she died in 1957 . In her condition. Mom was unable to give us children any Religious training what so ever although I knew she strongly resented the J.W. Doctrine we were subjected to through the Activities of our Grandmother & two Aunts . I did not agree with the J.W. Doctrine, and during my entire Childhood , I did not once attend any Sunday School class or participate in any Church activities what so ever . This was the situation up until the death of my Father by TUBERCULOSIS on 28 NOVEMBER 1936 at AVONDALE , ARIZONA .

I remember vividly the day Mom was Operated on for the Tumor . Dad had driven her in to PHOENIX one morning, and that afternoon he brought word that something had gone wrong and that Mom couldn't possible live until morning . When I heard this, I began to cry and wandered off by my self . After walking around for awhile, I found myself behind our Old barn and I decided to Pray, something I had never done before . I knelt down and between sobs, begged the LORD to not let my Mom die . I didn't

know enough to qualify my Prayer with " THY WILL BE DONE ", and will always believe that this eight year old boy's sincere Prayer kept my Mother alive when Doctors insisted, " She can't possibly live another 24 hours ". " She can't last out the week ", " She can't possibly live another month ". etc . Mom lived almost 27 years after the Operation, but never regained the use of her right side and during all this time, she was plagued by severe headaches most of the time .

My Mother had wanted to be with her own Brothers and Sisters for quite some time so at the death of my Father in 1936 Mom, DALE, AUDREY I moved to VISTA, took two full days to Travel and I can remember crossing the ARIZONA - CALIFORNIA border at YUMA on my 15th Birthday, 3 DECEMBER 1936 . The Highway from GILA BEND to YUMA , ARIZONA was not paved and a considerable amount of automobile travel had created fairly deep ruts in the sandy soil . The ruts were almost filled with a very fine powdery sand that would splash out almost like a liquid when the car wheels rolled through it . We crossed the CALIFORNIA - ARIZONA Border after dark and camped at an oasis just West of YUMA . The next day we drove on into VISTA , and I can remember very little about that part of the trip except for the old board roadway for about six miles across the SAND DUNES just

West of our campsite at YUMA . The board roadway was single lane with a widened area each mile or so for passing cars . Fortunately we met no on coming cars while traveling this road .

We arrived in VISTA with an Old 1930 HUPMOBILE and about \$ 800.00 in cash from Dad's Insurance . We paid \$ 400.00 for and Acre of ground with a small one bedroom frame house on it . This house had no bathroom so we spent another \$ 200.00 in building a bathroom, Septic Tank, and service porch . This left us with about \$ 200.00 and the HUPMOBILE, and we sold the HUPMOBILE and used all we had left to buy a Cow, some Chickens and some used Furniture for the house . So I feel that we were indeed fortunate to be able to settle down in VISTA with a modest little home , furniture , cow, and chickens all paid for and Mom starting to receive a \$ 38.00 per month portion of Dad's disability pension to live on . Even during the DePression of the 1930, \$ 38.00 per month was no fortune, but it did get us by fairly well by eating a lot of Beans , Potatoes , Eggs , Milk and very little Meat . Our situation could certainly have been much worse .

I had attended Grade School at AVONDALE Grammar School, Graduating from the eighth grade in 1935 . In the Fall of 1935, I entered Litchfield Park High School at LITCHFIELD PARK, ARIZONA, just five miles North of

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our home in AVONDALE . I had completed my Freshman year and part of my Sophomore year at LITCHFIELD High at the time of my Father's death . Then after moving to VISTA I entered VISTA Union High School, and was able to complete my high School training there in VISTA graduating in JUNE of 1939 . My four years in high school were rather routine or average , and I can remember no out standing Achievements worthy of mention here .

My Graduation from High School came at the tail end of the big Depression of the 1930's and steady jobs were hard to find . During the following few years , I worked as a rod and chain man on Surveying Crews, metal work in an aircraft factory in SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA and various other jobs of common labor . Being able to play a fiddle, guitar and bass fiddle, I played quite a few dance jobs during this time . In AUGUST of 1942, I entered Military Activity by joining the U.S. ARMY AIR Corps Civilian Pilot Training Program . I was sent to ST. JOHNS, ARIZONA for Primary Pilot Training in preparation for Training as a WORLD WAR II Glider Pilot . It was in ST. JOHNS that I met VIRGINIA MADGE RABAN .

VIRGINIA and I were Married by CARL A. ANDERSON, Bishop of the ST. JOHNS Ward of the CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY-SAINTS in ST. JOHNS, ARIZONA on the afternoon of 10 MAY 1943 . At that time I was on inactive status with the Enlisted Reserve Corps of the U.S. ARMY AIR Corps . The day after we were married , we moved to VISTA, CALIFORNIA, then to SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA where I worked for a short time at Consolidated Aircraft Corporation . Being some what unsettled and insecure I quit my job and we came back to ARIZONA where I started work driving truck for SMITH-HEYWOOD Truck Lines in HOLBROOK . We were living in HOLBROOK when I got my call to Active Duty with the U.S. ARMY AIR Corps.

I reported in to FORT Mac ARTHUR, CALIFORNIA 13 NOVEMBER 1943 .

Between NOVEMBER of 1943 and FEBRUARY of 1950 , I was in and out of Military Service three times . From NOVEMBER 1943 to AUGUST 1945, I was on active duty in the Aviation Cadet Program of the U.S. ARMY AIR Corps. I spent time Training at BUCKLEY FIELD, COLORADO , ELLENSBURG , WASHINGTON, SANTA ANA, CALIFORNIA ; BAKERSFIELD , CALIFORNIA ; MARANA , ARIZONA ; and LUKE FIELD , ARIZONA . On 4 AUGUST 1945 I Graduated from Pilot Training as a 2nd LT. Single Engine Pilot, at LUKE A.F.B. ARIZONA .

Changes of Address , periods of time in & out of the Military Service, and Variations of Employment were too numerous to describe in detail here. Military Service took me to ABERDEEN , MARYLAND ; GALLUP, NEW MEXICO ; OSAKA , JAPAN ; WICHITA FALLS, TEXAS ; & SCOTT A.F.B., BELLEVILLE,

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ILLINOIS . In the pursuit of Civilian Employment, I have worked in ARIZONA , CALIFORNIA , TEXAS , ILLINOIS , NEW MEXICO & CANADA .

At the time of this writing three children have been Born to my Wife VIRGINIA and I . GARY RUSSELL was born at TEMPE, ARIZONA, 5 SEPTEMBER 1945 ; MITCHELL DALE was born at ST. JOHNS, ARIZONA 19 JULY 1950 and PATTY DIANE was born at TUCSON, ARIZONA 26 AUGUST 1955 .

I was Baptized into the CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY-SAINTS on 22 MARCH 1947 in the ARIZONA Temple at MESA, ARIZONA by Elder ALMA E. FARNSWORTH . I was confirmed a member of the Church 23 MARCH 1947 by Elder J. CARROLL SHUMWAY , a High Priest . I was Ordained to the Office of a Deacon by J. CARROLL SHUMWAY on 17 SEPTEMBER 1950 and to the Melchizedek Priesthood as an Elder on 14 DECEMBER 1951 by ALBERT F. ANDERSON, a High Priest and at that time President of the ST. JOHNS Stake . My wife VIRGINIA MADGE RABAN GREEN and I received our Endowments and Temple Marriage and had all three of our children sealed to us at the ARIZONA Temple on 3 MAY 1956 . Temple Marriage and the Sealing Ordinances were performed by President PIERCE of the ARIZONA Temple . My activities and callings in the Church have included work in Ward Sunday School Superintendency, Stake Sunday School Superintendency M.I.A. Explorer Advisor , Member of Branch Presidency , Ward Teacher , Genealogy Home Teacher , and on this date 13 October 1962 my Family and I live in ST. JOHNS, ARIZONA.

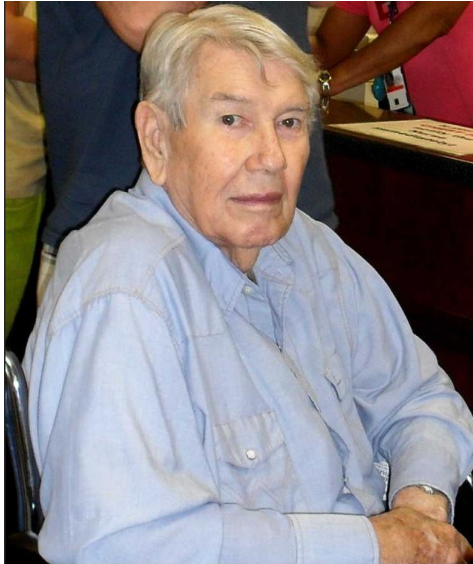

Dale in the Navy

I joined the United States Navy and after 12 weeks of boot camp at USNTS, San Diego, California, I was assigned to go to the Class A Electrical School on the Training station for a 16 week course to become an Electrician. After graduation in July of 1943, I was transferred to the W S Navy reception station at San Francisco where I was then assigned to be in the crew of the USS Orion AS18. After the Orion was commissioned, we left San Francisco for our shakedown cruise some 600 miles to San Diego. After the shakedown cruise and underway training we again returned to San Francisco for some minor changes and in December of 1943, we set sail for Pearl Harbor, Hawaii and then on to Freemantle, Australia. At Freemantle, we began servicing the submarines of squadron 16 which had 16 subs in the squadron and also serviced another 16 subs from squadron 32. After 8 months at Freemantle, we left for the island of Mios Woendi, a small island off the northern tip of New Guinea. There we serviced all of the above-mentioned subs until December of 1944 when we returned to Pearl Harbor for overhaul of the Orion. After the modifications and overhaul we left Pearl Harbor in April of 1945 for duty at the island of Saipan. We were stationed at Saipan until WW11 was over which we then set sail for our new homeport in New York City Harbor. I was transferred from the Orion for San Pedro, California and was discharged from the Navy in January of 1946.

Homerites reflect on cherished community member Brother Asaiah Bates

Feb. 14 is Brother Asaiah Bates Day in Homer. The day marks an opportunity to celebrate the philosophy of the longtime Homerite, city council member and preacher of respect and tolerance who died 23 years ago at the age of 78.

Brother Asaiah was born Claude Bates in South Carolina in 1921. He served in World War II before coming to Kachemak Bay in the '50s to join a religious commune. He quickly grew to become a beloved member of the Homer community.

And on Valentine's Day 2000, the City of Homer recognized its first Brother Asaiah Day. Then-mayor Jack Cushing said it was a day meant to recognize Asaiah's "deep love for everyone and everything." And that passion for the community Cushing described still resonates with locals today.

"He was an institution. Everyone in Homer knew Asaiah," said Brad Hughes, a Homer artist and friend of Brother Asaiah. "His role in life was to bridge, mediate and to seek peace and understanding."

"It didn't matter who you were, you were either 'sister' or 'brother' to him," Mayor Ken Castner said. "He was well respected, if not loved, and just a person that kind of emanated peace and harmony."

After fighting in World War II, Brother Asaiah became devoted to peace.

Journalist and historian Tom Kizzia said Brother Asaiah objected to the placement of a war memorial in Wisdom, Knowledge, Faith and Love Park, which Asaiah donated to the city.

"As a World War II veteran of the most serious kind, he was hugely supportive of the veterans, and yet he didn't want to have a veteran's war memorial in his place dedicated to peace. That was kind of his new perspective on the world," Kizzia said. "I remember talking to him, and he burst into tears over the anxiety he was feeling over that conflict. I think I was surprised at the turmoil that remained in his heart over the things he'd seen in the war, and it made me realize that being Brother Asaiah was a big job for him. And I admired him all the more for it."

Brother Asaiah was an active member of Homer's community. He attended a different local church each Sunday, wrote numerous letters to the editor in the Homer News, spoke up at nearly every city council meeting and served as a councilmember during the 1970s.

Local artist and friend Hughes described Brother Asaiah as a calm and moderating voice on the council during a time when there was sharp divide between the older homesteaders of the '40s and '50s and the arrival of a new freethinking group of hippies.

"Asaiah was the guy who was respected by most of the community and served as a liaison between the longhairs and fishermen and towns folks," Hughes said. "He was always advocating for peaceful solutions."

Castner, who moved to Homer in 1973, just as Brother Asaiah was elected to the Homer City Council, said having a day named in Brother Asaiah's honor cements him in the community's culture and memory.

"I think that if Asaiah is looking down at the city that he loved, that he'd be kind of happy with how people are getting along," Castner said. "[It's] probably a more tolerant town than we've had from time to time. We've suffered through all of those anxieties of intolerance. Hopefully, he would consider it to be a more tolerant and loving town. I certainly think it has become more that way."

Ken Landfield, an active member of Pier One Theatre for the past four decades and a friend of Brother Asaiah, said Asaiah was the best neighbor in the world.

"I'd be hard pressed to come up with anyone who didn't like him. And that's a rare individual," he said. "He was a good mediator. He could find compromise where compromise was not obvious. Hardly ever missed a city council meeting. There was rarely a Homer News that came out without a letter from Brother Asaiah. [He's] close as we're ever going to get to a patron saint. But, like all humans, [he was] more complicated than you might think. But ultimately just a super guy, just a super guy."

With so much lasting admiration for Brother Asaiah and his commitment to love, it seems Homer's city leaders picked the perfect holiday to celebrate the former community member.

Homer's Brother Asaiah passes into the cosmos

Brother Asaiah Bates, the 78-year-old patron sage of the Lower Kenai Peninsula, left this mortal plane Monday night in Homer, the town he lauded as "our cosmic hamlet by the sea."

Bates, a tall, ethereal presence who wore his white hair gathered in a wisp of a ponytail, dispensed boundless praise in a southern accent at virtually every public meeting in Homer. His frequent and grandiloquent letters to the Homer News spoke of positive energy flows, enlightenment and love. He called everyone by first name, preceded with "Brother" or "Sister." He officiated at the marriage ceremonies of more than 100 Homer couples. Homer's politicians named him one of the town's greatest citizens.

Bates, who moved to Kachemak Bay in flowing robes in the 1950s to establish a religious commune, in time became the town's most beloved eccentric.

People close to him said Thursday it was too soon after his death to talk about him.

"Part of his philosophy is not to make any waves for three days," explained longtime friend and Homer recycler Mike Kennedy.

Bates' bodily self never completely mended from a 1991 heart attack. His heart trouble took him to South Peninsula Hospital again this year, but he checked out about two weeks ago to die at home.

Bates was born Claude Donald Bates on April 19, 1921, in Greenville, S.C., to an unmarried mother. He was raised, he said, on the streets and in an orphanage. His formal schooling ended after third grade.

In World War II, he served in the South Pacific as a nose gunner on a bomber. He killed, by his count, "hundreds of Japanese."

At war's end, he received an honorable discharge, a handful of medals and \$322. But the killing left him psychically scarred. He was arrested in Denver after a bar fight in which a gun was pointed at his heart.

"In the jail that night, I could not get my mind off that gun," he told the Homer City Council in 1990 in explaining his devotion to peace. "And I thought about the millions of Japanese who couldn't get their eyes off the guns and the millions of Americans who couldn't get their eyes off the guns. And I thought this is insanity."

He was ready to check himself into a psychiatric hospital but instead found a messianic leader named Krishna Venta. Venta, based in California's San Fernando Valley, taught that mankind came to Earth in 12 rocket ships powered by cosmic energy, that man has 110 interconnecting senses and that one's negative thoughts are registered on the bodies of others.

He renamed the troubled veteran "Brother Asaiah."

In the 1950s, Bates and other disciples established the Wisdom Knowledge Faith Love commune at the head of Kachemak Bay. They wore long robes and went shoeless, even in winter. They became known in Homer as the Barefooters.

The movement fizzled after Venta was blown up by two excommunicated followers in 1959.

Bates moved to Homer and took to wearing leather boots, but he held strong to Venta's teachings. He was the last adherent, the leader's daughter said.

With no congregation of his own, Bates visited a different Homer church every Sunday. He was elected to the Homer City Council and joined the Chamber of Commerce. He wore thrift-store clothes and became a janitor for the phone company.

Here's a taste of Bates' style:

"Joy and love to all you dear souls at the Daily News Temple," he wrote in a letter to the editor in 1990. "I must say, next to the exotic Homer News, your paper is the best on the planet! . . . One of the greatest events dancing from your paper upon my mind is the 'out of this world' cartoons. . . . I am dancing on the wheel of the Great Brahma's mystical dream."

The letter ran sandwiched between one accusing the Daily News of ruining people's lives and another urging it to stop printing "insulting drivel."

At a 1993 hearing on a proposed oil lease sale in the Homer area, Bates described for state and borough officials Earth's chakras, or centers of psychic force.

"I do not see oil wells on the lower Kenai Peninsula as a part of the chakra," he said.

Unlike many of the constituents who speak at City Council meetings, Bates was unfailingly positive, said councilman Mike Yourkowski.

"He'd say things like 'This is the finest group of minds I've ever been around,' " Yourkowski said.

Not that the council members believed it, he said, but the words made them feel good nonetheless.

In 1990, Bates clashed with area veterans by objecting to the placement of a war memorial in a peace park he'd given the city. He was further vexed by the outbreak of the Persian Gulf War. One night during that period, he had a heart attack and felt his spirit leave his body.

"I saw the most beautiful veil you've ever seen in you life. . . . I wanted to go into that veil, and it was coming to get me," he told a reporter later. "The veil, brother -- Ooooh, there is something out of this world."

A ringing phone brought him back. He had been ready to go, he said, and he had felt no fear.

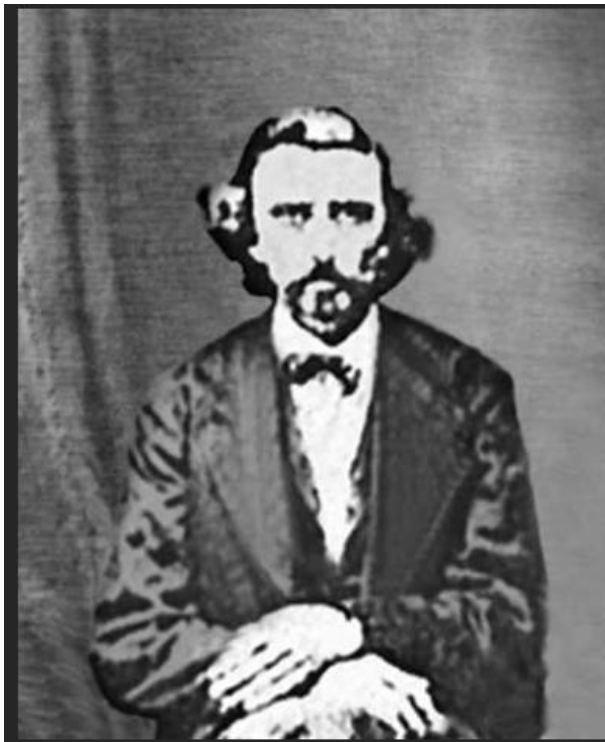

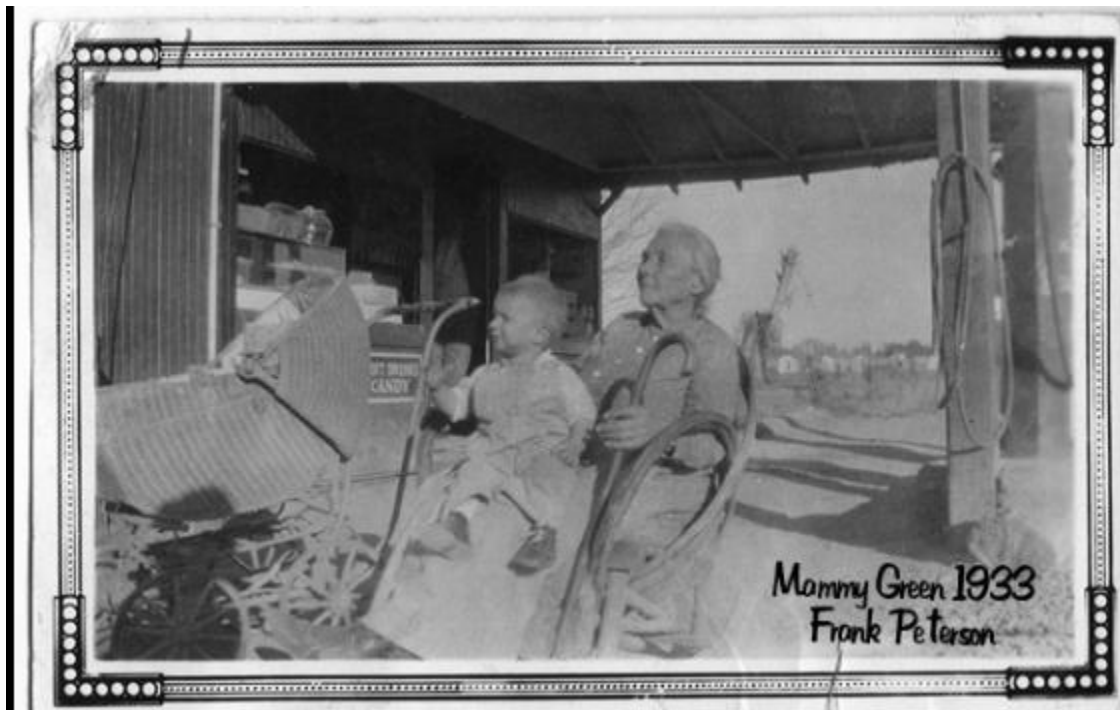

THE LAW IN THE COUNTY

There were several disputes started as to who really owned some of the land in Coke County. EUGENE CARLIDGE filed 20 suits at one time in the justice court. Parties were charged with "forcible entry and detainer." The defendants had "squatted" on several tracts of land in HARRIS pastures and had refused to move. When the cases were tried, the judgment was rendered in favor of the plaintiff in most cases.

Men were arrested for most anything. At one time a man stood in his store across the street from the public square and shot a prairie dog on the square. He was charged with "unlawfully shooting on a public street, road or highway." After being found guilty, he appealed to the county court in which the judge reversed the case and freed the man on the technical ground that he did not shoot "on the street" but across it.

→ HILLY GREEN, the sheriff in 1902-04, was the first man convicted of murder. He and his deputy, JEFF DAVIS, went to arrest a man who had refused to work on the county roads, which at that time was a requirement of every able-bodied man. The report was that the man resisted arrest and one of the two men killed him. The sheriff and deputy were tried in Nolan County and given twenty years each. On a new trial appeal they were brought back to Coke County where the verdict was reversed. The only man ever to be convicted of murder in the county's history was in 1958 when two Negroes robbed and killed a truck driver.

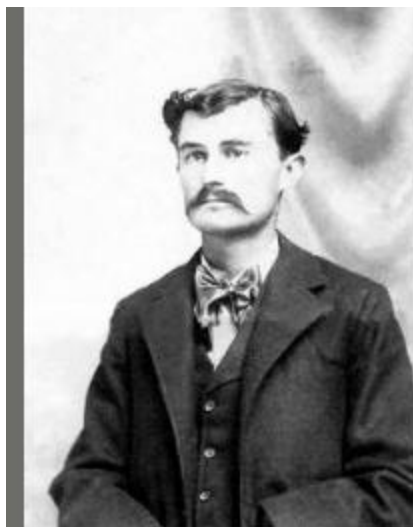

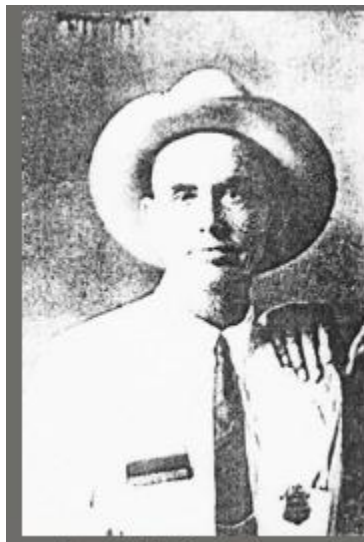

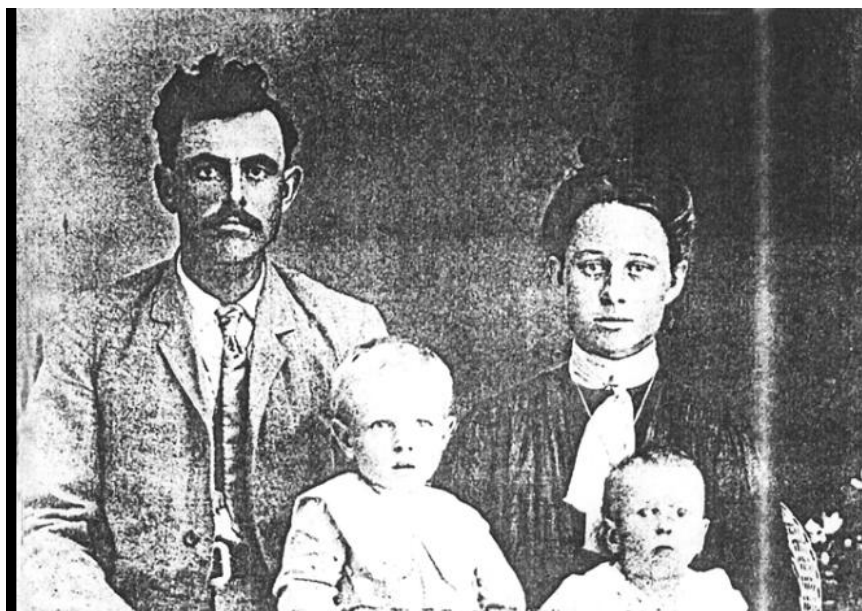

Edward Pruitt Green - A Brother's Love by Debbie Bell

My uncle Dale at the age of 86 talks about HIS uncle Prue with fond memories of the early 1930s in Coldwater, Arizona. Prue and his younger brother John Carlton Green (my grandpa who is called Blackie), took over the 160 acre cotton farm that their mother Feliciana (fondly known as Mammy) had owned. Prue split the property in half giving 80 acres to his brother John. In the beginning, they lived in tents while constructing the houses, but the tents always remained in use. During the week they would tend the farms and on the weekends Prue and John would be in great demand to play music at the local barn dances. They hired cotton pickers and paid them one dollar per each 100lb bag, and they could pick about 2 bags per day, where the going wage for this work was 75 cents per bag. (See the photo of typical cotton picking.. it is not our relatives there, just a representative of what it was like to pick cotton.. I've done it myself.).

One night after a dance and much drinking by John, the two started home but John insisted on driving. They crashed into a pole, leaving John with a chest injury leading to his chronic lung disorders. See, John was also exposed to mustard gas during WW1 and he insisted that it contributed to his chronic cough but never suffered until after the accident. Prue knew what the real problem was and recognized that John had tuberculosis. John was in denial and filed for a WW1 pension for disability and was awarded \$16.00 per month. Prue knew about the disease and kept John isolated in the tent they had and that's where he slept. My grandmother never knew why John slept in the tent and thought it was her being partially paralyzed from neck surgery that caused the abandonment. Back then TB was a dirty word and described as other conditions like consumption. Still, John did not suffer alone. Prue took care of him. Blackie couldn't work much, but could play the fiddle and drank heavily at dances. Uncle Dale thought that was why his dad spent the nights in the tent instead of the house, because of his late nights and heavy drinking. While being sick in the tent, John was getting worse so Prue drove him to the doctors and discovered that he had a collapsed lung and the other was so diseased with TB that he didn't know how he was still living. Prue took him home and stayed by his side. John died the next day.

Prue lived another 28 years and at the age of 78 also died of tuberculosis.

I cried when uncle Dale told me this story and it still makes me cry.. not because of how my grandfather died, but because of the love of a brother.

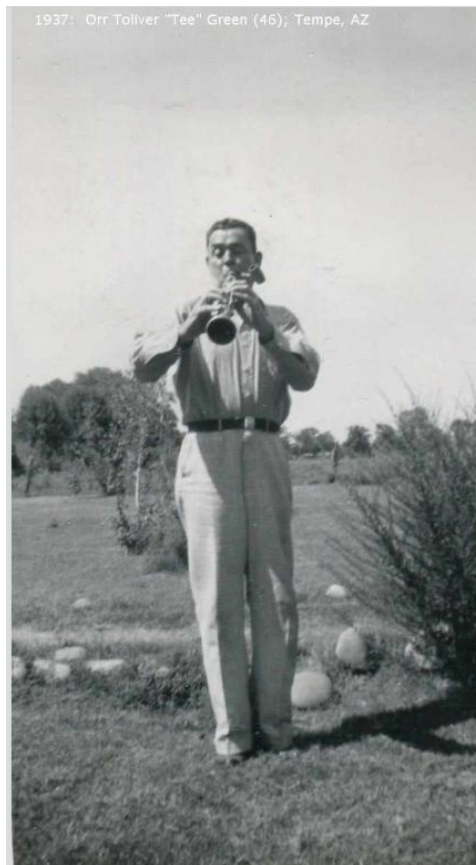

Second Square Dance Fete To Open Friday

Governor Garvey will open the second Arizona Square Dance Festival and Fiddlers Jamboree in the Shrine Auditorium at 8 p. m. Friday—a two-day program which is expected to attract dancers and callers from all sections of Arizona, Texas, New Mexico and probably California.

It will be sponsored by the Valley of the Sun Square Dance Organization and The Arizona Republic.

THE GOVERNOR will give the address of welcome and will open the dances by leading the grand march, said Carl Stevenson, president of the dance organization.

But even before that—at 2 and 4 p. m. each day—will be sessions for exhibitions and exchange of dances between local enthusiasts and visitors.

And even earlier—at 10 a. m. Friday—will be preliminaries of the fiddlers contest to select six semifinalists for a competition during the intermission of the Friday night session, said Charlie Taylor, fiddler contest chairman.

The state champion fiddler will be selected at the Saturday night dance, to be held at Bud Brown's Barn, Ninth street and Northern avenue, by experienced, out-of-state judges. He will receive \$100 and second and third prizes of \$50 and \$25 will be given.

PRIZES OF \$1250 will be given to the oldest and the youngest contestants.

Among the outstanding visitors will be Jimmy Clossin, a square dance recording artist; Herb Gregerson, one of the nation's foremost instructors of old time dancing; and Butch Nelson, rated among the top callers of the country. All are of El Paso, Tex.

Bob Merkley, head of the invitational committee, said reservations are being received daily from out of the state. Several exhibition sets are expected, Merkley said, including one from Silver City, N. M., headed by Forrest Deik, prominent caller and fiddler.

Use of two orchestras nightly will make it possible to have almost continuous dancing, allowing only enough time between dances for the floor to clear and new sets to form, said Burney Shock, who heads the program committee. Thus more dancers may participate.

Petersons Sued In Highway Case

Civil action against Isaac D. Peterson and Zella Peterson, his wife, seeking to abate a purported obstruction on the Phoenix-Yuma highway in Maricopa county, was filed yesterday in Maricopa County Superior Court by John L. Sullivan, attorney general, on behalf of the state of Arizona.

Her sister Kittie Elizabeth Smith married John Carlton Green's older brother, Archie Wilson Green.

When Olive was around 29 years old, she had a thyroid tumor removed from her neck in Sep 1930. Something went wrong, in the words of her son Smith Bernard Green, and she had a blood clot on her brain. John Green drove to his home in Chandler AZ the afternoon of the morning surgery & told his son Smith that his mother would likely not live until morning. Smith wrote that he had resented the religious activities of his paternal grandmother Feliciann and John's sisters Minerva & Helen in the Jehovah's Witnesses and had never prayed – until the day of his mother's surgery. He then prayed for the 1st time, at age 8. Despite doctor's alarms that Olive would die that day, or in the next 24 hours, or this week, or this month, she lived, although Olive was paralyzed.

During her recovery, her children lived with members of her husband John Carlton's family. Daughter Audrey lived with John's sister Helen Ozella Green, who was childless at the time. Sons Smith Bernard & Aubrey Dale Green lived with John's brother, Orr ("Tee") Green.

Olive's older sister, Kittie Smith Green, married to her husband John's brother, came from CA to AZ to help her. Because Olive just laid in bed, her sister Kittie got angry. In return, Olive raised her "paralyzed" right arm after 2 years of inactivity – and then began to recover. Olive's left side remained paralyzed until her death 27 years later, although she suffered severe headaches.

After the death of John, his brother Francis Henry ("Uncle K") Green took the family to CA to live near San Diego CA at Vista. They existed on a \$38-a-month disability pension of his father's.

Buried in Oak Hill Memorial Park, Escondido, San Diego, San Diego Co. CA.

UT. – Smith had begun his education in AZ, but graduated from Vista Union High School in Vista, San Diego CA where the family moved after the death of his father. Husband of Virginia Madge (Ginna/Ginnie) Raban (1926-2013, F: 193164079) whom he married 10 May 1943 in St. John's, Apache AZ. - He is pictured in a plane on his Find A Grave record. – Following his lack of religious education in his early life, Smith was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints & ordained a high priest on 23 Mar 1947. — Smith is buried in Mountain View Memorial Estates Cemetery, Cottonwood Heights, Salt Lake UT. F: 193164045
- **Aubrey Dale Green**, 23 Dec 1924 Phoenix, Maricopa AZ – 15 Jan 2014 Booneville, Logan AR. – Birthname spelled Aubray on his AZ birth certificate but he used Dale because he disliked Aubrey. - His father John had wanted to name Aubrey "Archie" after his brother Archie (who was married to Kittie Smith, the sister of Aubrey's mother) but Archie disapproved & said John could name his son with the initials A.D. but not Archie. - Husband of Ruby Joyce Cozzens (1929-1995, F: 70666098) whom he married 20 Apr 1947 in Yuma, Yuma AZ. – They adopted their 3 children. – Aubrey was ordained a high priest in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints on 8 Jan 1961. - Widowed, he married Jewel Delena Quesenberry

Swick Steffen Blackwelder (25 Jun 1928 Pike Co. KY – 5 Jun 2019 Booneville, Logan AR, F: 199853660). Jewel was the daughter of Robert Roy Quesenberry & Louise Esther Helma (later Carner). Jewel Quesenberry married Robert Lee Swick (1923-2006) on 28 Oct 1946 in Canyon City, Grant OR. She married 11 May 1953 in San Diego Co. CA to Thomas Francis Steffen (1928-1990). She married at age 34, to Earl Blackwelder (1930-2008) on 9 Feb 1963 in Riverside Co. CA; he was age 32. - Audrey grew up in CA, attending high school in Vista CA but dropping out. - She married Gary Wayne Fisher for the 1st time on 29 Mar 1957 in Los Angeles, Los Angeles CA; they had a daughter Donna. Gary wanted to go to Mexico, so they left Donna with an adoption agency in Phoenix. It is doubtful they made it to Mexico. Gary & Audrey returned to Vista CA & had 3 more children. Gary was drafted into the Army for the Korean War in 1951 but was discharged due to his number of children. After the birth of his 4th child, while Audrey was pregnant with child #5, Gary was sent to jail. - According to an Ancestry.com record, Gary was guilty of fraud on his Social Security record & also falsified his age. He was the son of Homer Franklin Fisher (1906-1976) & Lou Fern Gaylor (1906-1994). He was born either 17 Sep 1929 or 20 May 1927 in Iowa & died 16 Sep 1990 in Fridley, Anoka MN. He is buried in Fort Snelling National Cemetery, Minneapolis, Hennepin MN, F: 74028500
- Audrey moved to the San Fernando Valley CA & joined a group called “Fountain of the World” (or simply “The Fountain” – also found listed as Krishna Venta) This was a religious organization which helped the needy. Its members in the 1940s & 1950s dressed in robes, went barefoot & male members had to grow beards & wear long hair. -
- To join the group, a member had to donate all his/her worldly goods to the group. The group had 25 acres with communal buildings, such as separate dorms for the men & women & a children’s nursery. Audrey worked in the laundry & sewing room & had to solicit door-to-door for money, clothing & food. -
- While at The Fountain, “Sister Audrey” divorced Gary Fisher & married “Brother Asaiah” (aka Claude Donald Bates, born 19 Apr 1921 SC, died 28 Mar 2000 Homer AK). Claude Bates was age 36, a resident of Canoga Park, Ventura CA, son of Donald Bates (b. NC) & Ethel Beasley (b. NC). In his obituary, he claims his mother was unmarried. This was his 1st marriage; he had been born in SC. Audrey Florene Fisher was also a resident of Canoga Park, Ventura CA. She was divorced, with 1 previous marriage. She had been born in AZ to John Green (b. TX) & Olive Smith (b. NM – which is incorrect]. They were married by Sister Jane C. & Brother Eugene M. Schoenfelt; Eugene was a priest in the Aaronic Priesthood.
- Audrey & Claude went to Alaska, leaving Audrey’s children behind. Her 6th child was born in Alaska, but Audrey was sent out to a farm site 30 miles inland from Homer AK (called Venta) without her baby. -
- When her mother Olive died in Jun 1957, the obituary listed Audrey as Mrs. Audrey F. Bates of Canoga Park CA.
- In 1958, some of the Fountain members in CA became disgruntled & bombed it, killing 11 people. Two of Audrey’s children were in the main lodge but unhurt. The group’s leader Krishna Venta (AKA Francis Herman Pencovic) was killed. -

- Following the bombing, Audrey's children were sent to join her in Alaska, where they spent 2 ½ years in harsh conditions. The land grant the family had earned for living in Alaska for 7 years was instead given to Brother Asaiah. –
- Audrey then asked her brother Aubrey Dale Green for assistance. He had Audrey & all of her children brought to Vista CA except for the youngest (who was left with the child's father, Asaiah). Asaiah sued Audrey for divorce; she regained custody of her youngest child, who came to Vista CA. –
- Audrey & family lived next door to her brother Audrey Dale & family in Vista CA.
- When her ex-husband Gary Fisher appeared on the scene, Audrey remarried him, on 9 Aug 1962 in San Diego Co. CA. Debora said that Gary attacked her. Audrey left Vista with her children & went back to The Fountain, divorcing Gary for the 2nd time.
- Audrey married a retired veterinarian named Frank Dean Person (1922 KS – 1968 CA, F: 475645002) who ran an automobile shop, on 29 Jun 1964 in Ventura Co. CA. The Fountain took care of Audrey's children until Donna left there in 1966.
- Audrey's youngest son & daughter returned to Alaska to live with Asaiah while her other son stayed with the cult.
- After inheriting money from her youngest son Ken who died in 1997, she moved to AR. Audrey died of pancreatic cancer. –
- Cremated; ashes spread over the Buffalo River in AR. F: 80098813

Siblings: John had 11 biological siblings & 1 adopted sibling. John was born between brothers Edward & Orr.

- **William Benjamin ("Billy") Green**, 12 Dec 1869 Georgetown, Williamson TX – 20 Dec 1920 Litchfield, Maricopa AZ. - Husband of Mary Alice Hendricks (1872-1927) whom he married 24 Dec 1894 in Coke Co. TX. - Was a deputy sheriff for Coke Co. TX in 1900 census; later served as county sheriff for a short time. – The family story online says Billy was sheriff from 1902-1904. When he & another law officer went to apprehend a man who had failed to fulfill his road work duty (a male citizen's obligation at the time), the man ended up shot dead & the two law officers were sentenced to 20-years in prison; this was revoked when the case was brought in Coke Co. TX. – His cause of death is recorded as "acute indigestion." - Obituary in "Arizona Republic" (Phoenix AZ) 24 Dec 1920 p 6. - Buried in Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery, Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. F: 35757916
- **Minerva Caroline ("Nervie") Green Yance**, 5 Dec 1871 Georgetown, Williamson TX – 13 May 1957 Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. - Wife of James Thomas/Thomas James Yance (1870-1907, F: 70761259) whom she married (as T.J. Yance) in Coke Co. TX on 3 Apr 1898. He died of diphtheria, with pneumonia as a contributing factor. – Minerva's cause of death: "shock." - Buried in Greenwood Memory Lake Cemetery, Phoenix, Maricopa AZ (unmarked grave). F: 70761345
- **Francis Henry ("K" or "Kay" or "Kaye") Green**, 16 Feb 1874 Georgetown, Williamson TX – 16 Sep 1957 San Marcos, San Diego CA. - Husband of Rhonnie Arnold (1877-1965, F: 42932051) whom he married in Robert Lee, Coke TX on 16 May 1899. - Buried in San Marcos Cemetery, San Marcos, San Diego CA. F: 70760770
- **Joseph Riley Green**, 14 Oct 1877 Georgetown, Williamson TX – 20 Dec 1904 Dublin, Erath TX. - His wife Laura Elsie Witherspoon (b. 1875 Ellis Co. TX, died circa 1892, possibly in childbirth. In the 1880 census for Precinct 6, Ellis Co. TX, conducted 8 Jun 1880, Laura E. Witherspoon (age 5, b. TX) lived with her parents F.E. Witherspoon (45 TN, parents b. TN, farmer) & Sarah C. (26 NC, parents b. NC) & siblings Nannie (9 TX), Eddie L. (7 TX) & Sarah E.

(1 TX). - Husband of Ella (Ellie) Fay Jameson (1881-1969, F: 153636097) whom he married in Coke Co. TX on 1 Sep 1897 as J.R. Green; she died with the surname Day. - Buried in Barbee Cemetery, Edna Hill, Erath TXZ. F: 31583890

- **Mary Rose Ann Green Creighton Scott**, 21 Nov 1879 Georgetown, Williamson TX – 21 Dec 1967 Prescott, Yavapai AZ. - Used the name “Rose.” - Married to Cliff Creighton in 1897; they had a son Billy Knight (1898-1919). This information taken from her Find A Grave record; it does say if her son is “Billy Knight Creighton” or not. - After Cliff died (?) (a “Cliff Creighton” is found in later TX newspapers than 1900), Rose married George Edgar Scott (1865-1950, F: 54286540) on 29 May 1900 in Lubbock TX. They had 8 children, but must have divorced, as George married Julia Estelle Hammon (1878-1965) in 1927. - She played guitar in the Green Family Players. - Buried in Yavapai County Cemetery, Prescott, Yavapai AZ. F: 71554945
- **Archie Dallas Green**, 23 Mar 1882 Georgetown, Williamson TX – 27 Apr 1936 Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. - Married in 1903 to Kittie Elizabeth Smith (1887-1960, F: 70759369), whose sister Nora Smith married his brother John Carlton Green. - Obituary in “Arizona Republic” (Phoenix AZ) 29 Apr 1936 p 7. – Cause of death: chronic lung abscess. - Buried in Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery, Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. F: 70847528
- **Ward Beecher (“Beech”) Green**, 22 May 1885 [or 1884?] Georgetown, Williamson TX – 3 Jan 1929 Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. - Married Winnie Alice Green (1887-1959, F: 91820792) on 18 Oct 1908 (or 29 Feb 1908?) in Robert Lee, Coke TX. [also found as 18 Oct 1907]; she was from an unrelated Green family who originated in TN. In 1926, their son Riley attended the Institute for the Deaf & Dumb in Tucson AZ. - Widowed, Winnie remarried on 7 Apr 1931 in Yuma Co. AZ to Otis Clement (1884-1947). – Beech died after an operation for appendicitis (according to the newspaper). His death certificate says his death was from influenza. - Buried in Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery, Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. F: 70796450
- **Edward Pruitt (“Prue”) Green**, 2 Feb 1886 Georgetown, Williamson TX – 14 May 1964 Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. - Married 6 Oct 1902 [on marriage record] or 1912 [on Find A Grave in Robert Lee, Coke TX to Ophia Childress (1890-1956, F: 70766398). Their 1st child is born in 1913 and she would have only been age 12 in 1902.- Obituary in “Arizona Republic” (Phoenix AZ) 15 May 1964 p 35. Buried in Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery, Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. F: 70766351
- **Orr Toliver (“Tee”) Green**, 24 Apr 1891 Sanco, Coke TX – 4 Jan 1966 Mesa, Maricopa AZ. - He took in his brother John Carlton’s sons when John’s wife Olive had neck surgery which paralyzed her on 1 side. - Husband of Bennie Cleo Posey (1891-1986, F: 65723599) in Duncan, Stephens OK on 19 Jan 1913. - Pictured on his Find A Grave record playing a fiddle. - Buried in Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery, Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. F: 70766881
- **Helen Ozella Narcissus (“Zella”/“Zell”) Green Peterson**, 26 Oct 1893 Sanco, Coke TX – 28 Nov 1969 Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. - Played fiddle in the Green Family Players. - Wife of Isaac Demarcus Peterson (1880-1943, F: 20055771) whom she married in 1928 (according to Find A Grave) but on 26 Oct 1929 according to her Pinal Co. AZ marriage record. Zella was age 36, while Isaac was age 48. The couple’s son Issac Berman Peterson was born 14 Dec 1929 in Phoenix, Maricopa AZ & died the next day, 15 Dec 1929 in the same location; his birth was premature. - Buried in Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery, Phoenix, Maricopa AZ. F: 70768330

Adopted brother:

- **Edmond Leroy Green, Sr.**, 3 Jan 1874 Dayton, Liberty TX – 7 Jan 1961 San Marcos, San Diego CA. - The son of Edmond Modelle Green (1854-1881, F: 35789928). - When Edmond Leroy was orphaned at the age of 7, he was taken into the family of his father's brother, Francis Marion Green & his wife Feliciann who had 5 children of their own at the time. - Edmond Modelle Green had been killed by his own father, Benjamin Modelle Green, when he was hit in the head with an axe tip being swung by Benjamin while the two men were collecting wild honey. Edmond Leroy's mother Alma Tullar had died when he was 1 year old. - Edmond L. married Martha Elizabeth Preslar (1880-1905, F: 35714124) in 1898. They had 4 children. - In 1906, he married Catherine Maud Tulley Geraldts (1869-1929, F: 70857419). They had 3 sons. – Buried in San Marcos Cemetery, San Diego, San Diego CA, F: 9444425

Wartime:

"Sulphur (OK) Times-Democrat" 14 Feb 1918 p 1 – the War Department listed the names of survivors from Carter, Love, Johnston, Murray & Marshall counties, among them John Carlton Green of Randolph OK.

He was exposed to mustard gas on 3 occasions and received a disability pension of \$16 per month in the early 1930s. "Blackie" was having lung problems when he applied for the pension, which was actually tuberculosis.

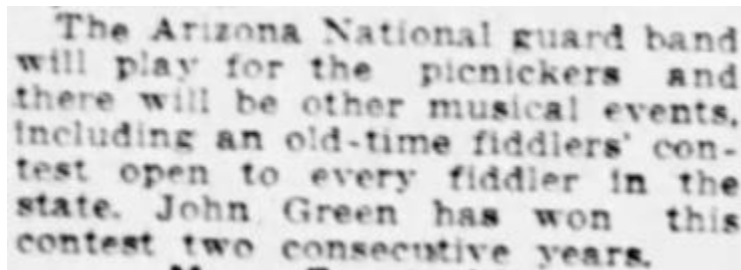
Post-war:

According to the Find A Grave record 70766351 of his brother Edward Pruitt ("Prue") Green, John Carlton Green & Edward Pruitt Green operated side-by-side 80-acre cotton farms in Coldwater (whose Spanish name is Agua Fria & which is now known as Avondale). The two brothers would take their guitar & fiddle & play at country dances until the wee hours. When John developed tuberculosis, Prue cared for him, his farm & children until John's death.

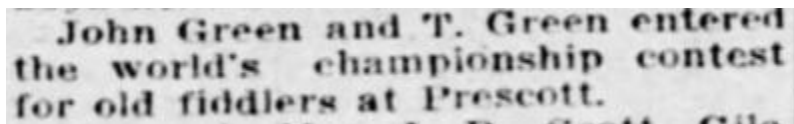
Prue and John took over the 160-acre cotton farm that their mother Felicianna had owned. Prue split the property in half, sharing it with John. In the beginning they lived in tents while constructing houses, but retained the tents. Following the car accident which injured John's chest and because of John's chronic cough, Prue determined John had tuberculosis – which John denied – and had John sleep in the tent. Some family members thought John slept in the tent because of the late hours he kept and his heavy drinking.

Prue finally drove him to the doctor where it was discovered that one lung was collapsed & the other so diseased with tuberculosis that the doctor didn't know how John was still alive. Prue took John home & stayed by his side until John died the next day. Prue lived another 28 years, also dying of tuberculosis.

According to a family story on Ancestry.com, John's and Prue's cotton farms ultimately failed due to the Dust Bowl conditions of the 1930s. The Fiddler – John Carlton was a member of the Family Green Players (Green Family Players) with his sisters Mary Rose Ann, Minerva & Zella/Zell and his brother Edward Pruitt (“Prue”) Green. He was in constant demand to play his fiddle at dances. During the week John farmed cotton on his & Prue's lands & on weekends played the fiddle. John was provided with his favorite beverage – whiskey – while playing his fiddle. One night John convinced Prue he should drive home, even though he was intoxicated. John crashed the car into a telephone pole & crushed his lungs, which caused [or may have accentuated, according to other family stories] his lung problems.
