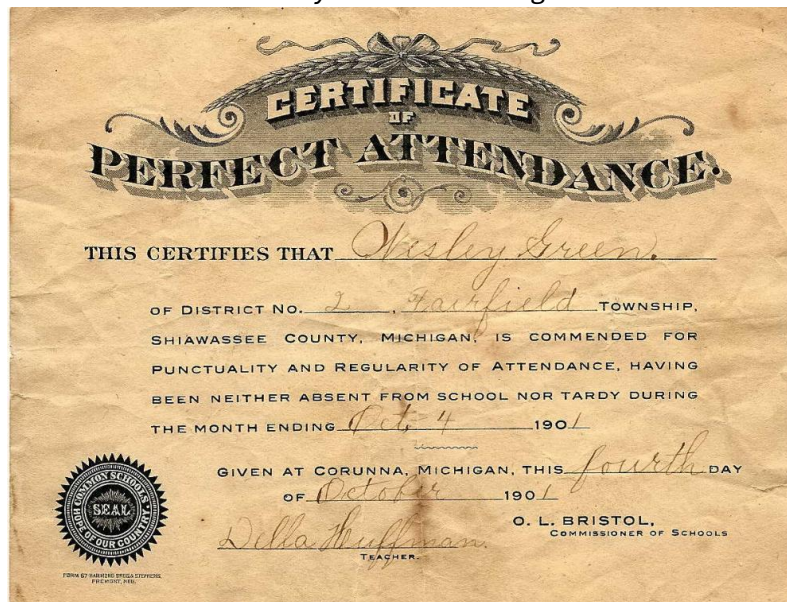

It isn't often that an Indianapolis bowling team crashes into the nation's spotlight but when one does it leaves an impression long to be remembered. **Officers and Men Chosen for
Intensive Training and
Trip to France.**

**Will Report at Ft. Wayne June
24, Then Proceed to
Indianapolis.**

Lansing, Mich., June 20.—Eleven commissioned officers, 15 non-commissioned officers and 18 enlisted men in the medical corps of the Michigan National Guard have been called into the federal service, with orders to report to Fort Wayne in Detroit by noon of June 24.

From there they are to be taken to Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind., to take a course in intensified training to fit them for almost immediate service with the United States army in the European war zone.

The men selected were chosen several days ago by the company officers under orders from Washington, and the detachment which will represent Michigan at Fort Harrison is considered practically to be the pick of the corps.

The wedding of Miss Betty Janet Green of East Lansing, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Green of Saginaw, to George E. Dell of Lansing, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Dell of Lansing, took place Sunday afternoon at Westminster Presbyterian church with the Rev. C. M. Muilenberg officiating before about 125 guests.

Candelabra and baskets of chrysanthemums, palms, ferns and autumn leaves decorated the chancel. Forrest A. Rinehart of Saginaw sang for the ceremony.

The bride wore a gown of white taffeta, cut on princess lines with a long train, long sleeves, and a sweetheart neckline. Her veil fell from an orange blossom tiara. Mrs. Henry Havens of Three Rivers was matron of honor, wearing periwinkle blue taffeta with a dubonnet pleated dust ruffle and similar ruffle trim at the neckline. She carried a bouquet of white rubrum lilies with matching flowers in her hair. Miss Jean Webb and Miss Dorothy Suesz, bridesmaids, wore raisin and dusty rose taffeta gowns with basque waists and full hoop skirts. They carried colonial bouquets and wore flowers in their hair. Jack Patterson was groomsmen and the ushers were Maurice Dell, Arnold Dell, Henry Havens, and Allen Tenney.

A reception in the church parlors followed the ceremony. Bowls of pompons and ivory candles in crystal holders decorated the rooms. Man Fatally Shot In Attic of Flat

Target Practice Gun Kills George Dell, City Worker

George Dell, 34-year-old employe of the board of water and electric light commissioners, was instantly killed at the home here early Sunday afternoon when a rifle he was handling apparently accidentally discharged a bullet into his head.

Coroner Ray Gorsline and police detectives who investigated the case said they could find no evidence to support a suicide motive.

Dell and his wife, Betty, had spent Saturday night with the latter's brother-in-law, Forest Rinehart, 605 East Charles street, East Lansing. Dell came to their Lansing apartment at 808½ West St. Joseph street Sunday morning to change clothing.

Used Gun for Practice

When he failed to return to East Lansing after a lapse of two hours, Mrs. Dell became worried and went to the apartment with Rinehart. A search of the apartment led Rinehart to the attic room, where he found Dell lying dead on the floor with the gun beside him.

Police detectives said no note was found to indicate Dell had purposely taken his own life. They said the bullet entered the head above the right ear and toward the back of the head, penetrating the skull at an angle and lodging in a rafter a few feet away.

Coroner Gorsline said he had

learned Dell had intended to take the gun out to the farm of his mother, Mrs. Clyde Brace, near Grand Ledge for target practice. He and Mrs. Dell were to go there for dinner. The family told Gorsline Dell usually took the gun with him to the farm for target practice and revealed that last week he had filed down some ammunition to fit the rifle which was of German make and a souvenir of World War II.

Beside the widow and his mother, the victim is survived by two brothers, Arnold and Maurice Dell.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock with Rev. H. G. Gaige officiating. Interment will be in Evergreen cemetery.

Dell was a member of the Elks lodge and had been employed by the board of water and electric light commissioners for the past 11 years.
