FIVE WEST PENNA. BOYS ON TUSCANIA REPORTED AMONG THE SURVIVORS

Conflicting Reports About Scottsdale Boy, Still Officially Unaccounted For; No Word About Ball.

Of the several young men from this immediate section of the state, who were on board the Tuscania when that vessel was sunk by a German U-boat off the coast of Ireland, definite word has been received that five are among the survivors.

Gomer E. Greenwood of Waltersburg, Lester W. Piot of California and Thomas B. Young of Freeport, members of Company D, 20th Engineers, Frank E. Graft of Alverton and Edwin H. Fries of Windber, members of an aero squadron, have been reported by the War Department as among those rescued from the torpedoed ship.

The name of William Lewis Ball of Connellsville, has not been reported in any list issued by the War Department, either of the passengers or the survivors of the Tuscania.

The name of Thomas A. Lewellyn of Scottsdale, a member of Company D, 20th Engineers, has been reported among those not yet accounted for, although word was received in Scottsdale Saturday night that he was among those who had reached land in safety. Still another report stated that he had been lost when the steamer went down.

FAYETTE BOY IN PERIL

Gomer Greenwood Nearly Drowns In
Sinking of The Tuscania.

Plunged into the icy waters of the Atlantic when the lifeboat he occupied was overturned and being compelled to swim for shore was the experience of Gomer E. Greenwood who was on the transport Tuscania which was torpedoed by the Germans, according to a letter to his mother, Mrs. Carrie Greenwood of Waltersburg. Gomer says:

"Just a few lines to let you know I have arrived safe and am pretty well considering what I have gone through. We were on the ship 12 days when, February 5, we were torpedoed and sunk. There were 60 in the life boat that I was in and we floated around until 2 o'clock in the morning when our boat upset and we were all dumped into the water. We swam to a big cliff and climbed upon the rock and stayed there until about 5 o'clock in the morning and was rescued by a farmer who took us to his house. We were all nearly frozen, but were given dry clothing and something to eat. Everybody treated us fine. We landed on the Scottish coast and stayed four days and then went to England. I was awfully seasick for three days and was certainly glad to set my foot on land once more."

The interpretation that Gomer had to swim for shore is misleading. Gomer's lifeboat had drifted from the Tuscania, driven by tide and wind, to the isle of Islay, Scotland, where it crash-landed at 2 a.m. at the foot of massive cliffs. The swim was not very far. Two local Islay men, Duncan Campbell and Robert Morrison, gathered up soldiers in the morning & took them to their homes on the Mull of Oa on Islay. WOMEN Y. M. C. A. WORKERS OPERATE A MATRIMONIAL BUREAU FOR 20TH ENGRS.

How two American women operated a matrimonial bureau in France so successfully that all the men of the 20th Engineers who sought their service were saved for the girls of the United States is told by Miss Edith Souther and Miss Mildred McCluney of St. Louis, who spent eight months as Y. M. C. A. workers in a forestry camp at Eclaron on the main road to St. Mihiel.

"In every case," said Miss McCluney, "we were able to avert an international marriage. Many of our boys became infatuated with some pretty French girl while they were enjoying the surroundings of the 'Y' leave areas to which they were sent for rest. They came to us for assistance in carrying on the correspondence that followed. They had little opportunity to study

French in the Y. M. C. A. post schools because they had the responsibility of supplying lumber for the construction of great piers at the base ports, for use at the front in wire entanglements, for railroad ties and trench planks. We supplied the knowledge of French required in their correspondence.

"Many a time a husky forester would ask us to prepare his letters. Discussion of what he wanted to say to his beloved usually ended by authority being given to us to write the letters in our own way. And we did."

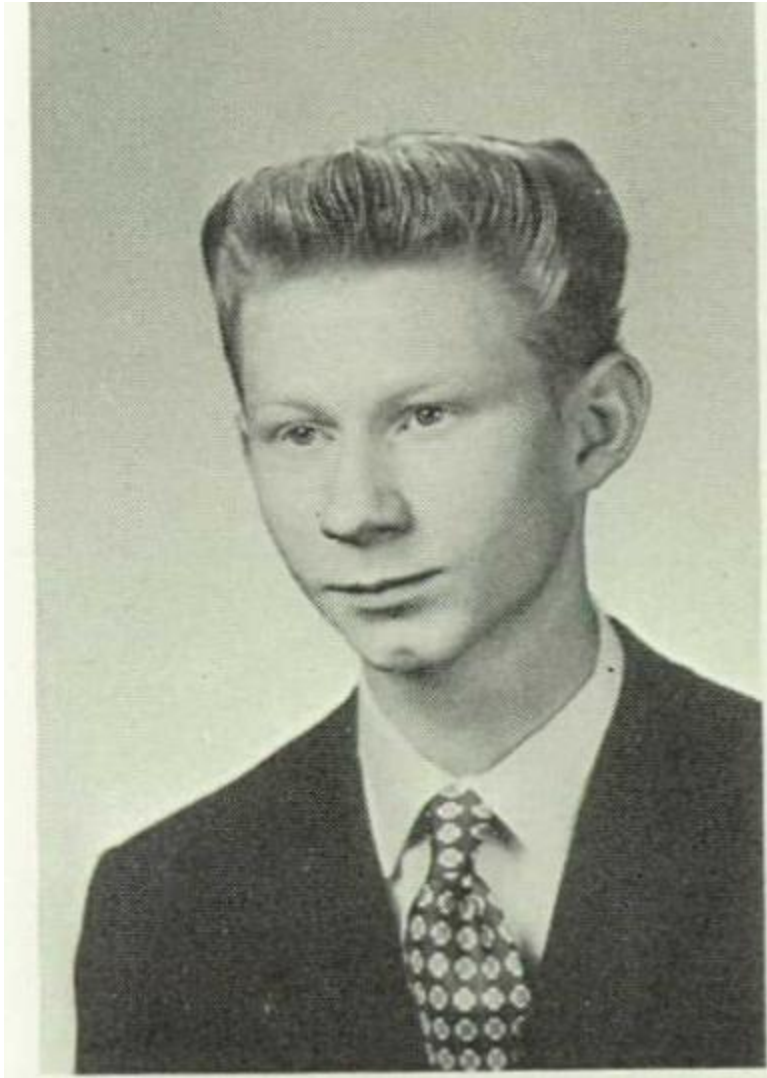

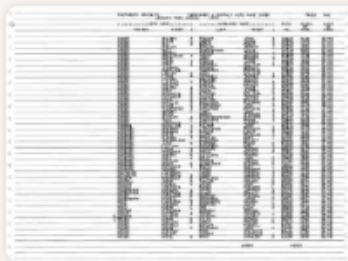

Sussex County dog-theft suspect just a lonely man, police say

An unemployed Sussex County man sought canine companionship by pilfering other people's pooches because he was lonely, police said yesterday.

Vaughn Greenwood, 59, of Hamburg was arrested Wednesday by Hardyston police on two counts of third-degree theft in connection with the abductions of two dogs in town.

Greenwood also may face charges in connection with the abduction of another dog taken twice from its home in Lafayette. Those incidents remain under investigation by the New Jersey State Police.

In the Hardyston dognappings, witnesses reported a man in his 50s or 60s in a small red or orange car in the area both times. After the incidents were publicized, police received numerous tips that re-

sulted in officers talking to Greenwood, who admitted taking all three dogs, police said.

"He said he was feeling a little lonely at the time," Hardyston detective Robert Zicarelli said.

"If that's his reasoning, that he's lonely, I do feel sorry for him. But go get your own dog. Leave my dog alone," said Amy Zupko, whose 7-year-old mixed breed, Jazzmyne, was taken and missing for two days.

Greenwood, who could not be reached for comment, is married and does not have pets of his own, Zicarelli said.

Greenwood told police he did not harm the dogs and took them for walks. After a few hours, he would drop them off near their homes, hoping they would safely return on their own, police said.

However, Kim Brisbane of Lafayette,

whose 9-year-old purebred husky, Baby, was taken twice from her home on Beaver Run Road, doesn't buy that explanation.

"There's got to be more to it than that," Brisbane said.

The first time Brisbane's dog was taken, it was missing for a week before being spotted about six miles away in Wantage, with a rope around its neck that the dog appeared to have chewed through to get free, she said.

Brisbane said her papering the area with fliers about the missing dog paid off when a woman saw the dog on Cemetery Road in Wantage, took it home and contacted her.

Then, on June 21, the dog was missing again, but this time a witness gave a description of a man in a small car. She called the State Police, but the dog was found two days later in Hamburg.

On June 26 in Hardyston, a 7-year-old female bluetick hound named Blue was taken from a home on Wheatworth Road, but was later recovered and returned to its owner.

Then on Saturday, the Zupko family was out when their dog was taken from the driveway of their home on North Church Road. A family friend who was at the Zupkos' home at the time saw a car exiting the driveway, and later realized one of the family's three dogs was missing.

Chills went down Amy Zupko's spine Sunday when she posted a flier about her missing dog at a supermarket in Franklin and came upon one of Brisbane's fliers. The description of the suspect and car matched and she called police.

"It was just strange because, I mean, who would steal your dog? And then to have more than one dog taken by the same

car," Zupko said. "It's just kind of weird. The whole thing made no sense."

Brisbane said, "I left the fliers up, hoping he would see them and feel like a fool, and stop doing what he was doing."

On Monday, Jazzmyne, a dog well-known in the area as a friendly, faithful greeter of the school bus, was seen running loose in the North Hardyston Cemetery not far from North Church Road.

There were no signs the dogs had been abused or mistreated, except for being hungry and thirsty, the owners said. The swipings had them fearing the worst, that it was the work of some sort of cult or done for animal-laboratory testing.

Greenwood was released pending a hearing in Superior Court in Newton, police said.

Man charged with theft of dogs takes his own life

A day after being charged with stealing two dogs from their homes, a Sussex County man committed suicide at a cemetery by shooting himself in the head with a pistol, police said yesterday.

Vaughn Greenwood, 59, of Hamburg, was found dead of a single gunshot from a .32-caliber revolver Thursday at 8:29 p.m. at the Deckertown Union Cemetery on Route 23 in Wantage, police said.

Earlier in the day, Greenwood was reported as missing to Hamburg police by his son, who later notified police that his father was at the cemetery.

"Police were told by the son that his father was accustomed to

going for walks in that area that included that cemetery," said Sussex County First Assistant Prosecutor Jared McDevitt.

State Police investigating the suicide were not available for comment, and Greenwood's son declined to comment.

On Wednesday night, Greenwood was charged in Hardyston with two counts of third-degree theft in connection with recent abductions of two dogs in the township. He admitted taking those dogs and taking another dog twice from its home in Lafayette, police said.

Hardyston police said Greenwood told them he did not harm the dogs, but rather took them because he was lonely. He took the dogs for walks, and after a few

hours dropped them off near their home, hoping they would safely return on their own.

"All indications are he was basically a good husband and father," said Hamburg Police Chief Greg Kresge.

Word of Greenwood's suicide was unsettling for the dog owners.

"It's a sad ending," said Kim Brisbane of Lafayette, whose dog was taken twice in June. "It's just sad we had to go through what we went through and that it had to end the way it did. It was shocking."

Amy Zupko of Hardyston, whose dog was taken July 6 and found Monday running loose in the North Hardyston cemetery on Route 94, said, "It's awful. I really feel bad. It kind of threw me. I

would never want that to happen to anybody."

In some of the dogmappings, a man in his 50s or 60s in a small red or orange car was identified by witnesses. Brisbane and Zupko also had posted fliers throughout the area that described the man and car.

Police received numerous tips that resulted in Greenwood being questioned in Hardyston, where he admitted taking the dogs, police said. He was charged with two counts of third-degree theft and was released pending a hearing in Superior Court in Newton.

The first time Brisbane's dog was taken, it was missing for a week before being found about six miles away on Cemetery Road in Wantage, near the Deckertown

Union Cemetery where Greenwood killed himself.

The next time her dog was missing, Brisbane stopped at the cemetery looking for the pet, which eventually was found in Hamburg.

Sussex Borough Mayor Peter Horvath, a funeral-home owner active with the Deckertown Union Cemetery board of directors, said it's not unusual for people to visit the 11-acre wooded, hilly burial ground, which dates to the 1700s and contains the graves of several Revolutionary War soldiers. Some workers of nearby stores are known to take lunch breaks there because it's "peaceful and serene," he said.
