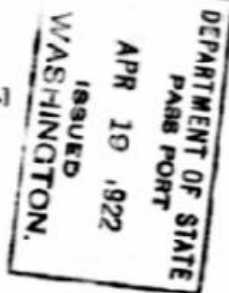

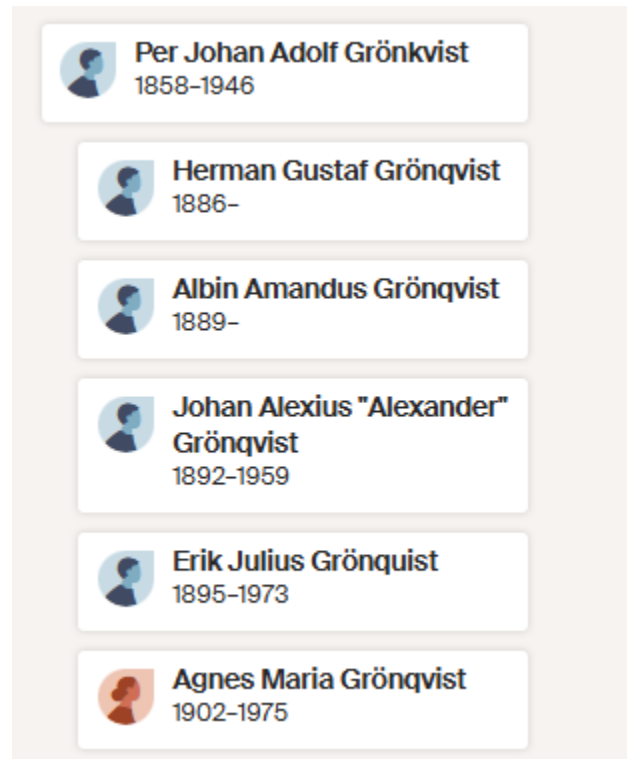

“Chicago Tribune” 10 Feb 1918 p 2 – news has come of the safe landing of 12 more survivors, including Alex Gronquist of 9900 Avenue H.

1920 – Alexander John Gronquist, naturalized US District Court in Chicago IL on 5 Mar 1920, resident of 9720 Ave. H, Chicago, arrived in NYC in US 17 May 1913, birth date 27 Mar 1892 Varmland, Sweden

1922 – Passport application on 19 Apr 1922 to visit relatives in Sweden, also to visit Norway & return through Denmark for travel. Gone for up to 1 year. Alexander Gronquist, age 30, height: 5’9”, b. Varmland, Sweden 27 Mar 1892. Son of Per John Gronquist; father b. Sweden, now residing in Sweden. Sailed from Christiania [i.e. now Oslo, Norway] on 10 May 1913. Employed as machinist in Chicago. Missing little finger of left hand. Was outside the US in AEF (France) Jan 1918 to Jun 1919 Is leaving NYC on "Bergensfjord" 28 Apr 1922.

1923 Alexander John Gronqvist, age 31, single, sailed from Kristiania [i.e. Oslo Norway] on 5 Apr 1923 on the “Bergensfjord” & arrived in NYC on 15 Apr 1923. Passport 149186 issued 19 Apr 1922 in Washington DC. Resident of 9720 Avenue H, Chicago IL.

1934 – Alexander Gronquist, age 42, sailed on the “Stavangerfjord” which left Oslo, Norway, on 23 Oct 1934 & arrived in NYC on 2 Nov 1934. [His brother Erik Julius was also in Sweden at the same time – family event?] He had been naturalized in US District Court of the Northern District of IL on 5 Mar 1920 & resided at 327 W. 103rd Place, Chicago IL.

On his naturalization papers, it is noted that Alexander has the “little fingers on left hand missing.”

In 1939, as a member of the National Tuscania Survivors Association, he resided in Harvey, Cook IL.
