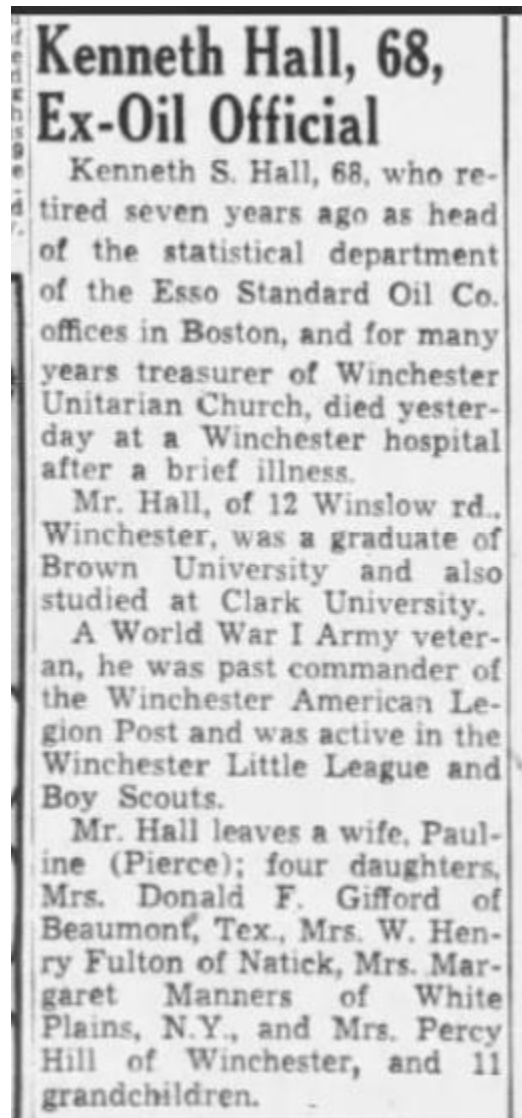

Had Fatal Heart Attack Sunday

Kenneth S. Hall, of 12 Winchester road, one of Winchester's most widely known and highly esteemed residents, died early Sunday afternoon, October 25, at the Winchester Hospital, to which he had been admitted Sunday forenoon after a heart attack. He had been bothered with a heart ailment in recent weeks and had been hospitalized earlier in the fall. He had, however, seemed improved after his return home and his sudden passing was a shock to the entire community.

Mr. Hall was the son of Henry and Frances (Paul) Hall. He was born August 15, 1901, in Newton, Mass., but spent his boyhood in Winchester and was graduated from Winchester Classical High School. He spent a year at Clark University in Worcester and then was graduated from Brown in the class of 1921.

As a young man Mr. Hall worked for the old Federal Mutual Insurance Company of Boston. Later he was for 30 years associated with the Essex Standard Oil Company, first in the accounting department, in a supervisory and executive position. During his last five years with the company, prior to his retiring in 1942, he was a marketing executive doing statistical work and acting as a contact man with the operating department.

During World War I Mr. Hall was commissioned a second lieutenant at Pottsville, N. Y., and served 14 months overseas with the 128th Aero Squadron. He crossed the Atlantic on the ill-fated *Tuscania*, which was torpedoed February 5, 1918, off the coast of Northern Ireland with the loss of 350 men. His detachment was the last to leave the ship and when their lifeboat was destroyed he and his men were saved from drowning by the timely arrival of a destroyer.

Mr. Hall came to Winchester more than 25 years ago, and during his long residence he was particularly active in community affairs, especially in those involving boys. He was prominent in Boy Scouting, serving for 24 years as secretary of the Boy Scout Board of Review. On January 24, 1927, he was given the Silver Beaver Boy Scout award, highest within the local council, in recognition of his faithful and effective service to boys for more than 25 years.

An ardent follower of Winchester High School athletics, Mr. Hall founded and for 17 years served as chairman of the High School Football Transportation Committee, the members of which are responsible for providing transportation for high school football players at all out-of-town games.

He was also active in football, Junior Legion baseball, and probably Little League baseball, that was his greatest interest in recent years. Since the institution of Little League baseball in Winchester in 1938 Mr. Hall filled with distinction the important post of players' agent. He was president of the league organization in 1934 and was known affectionately to players, officials and fans as "Mr. Little League, himself," attending all games in or out of Winchester, including the World Series games at Williamsport, and out-of-state scouting meetings.

Now in Winchester have been more popular with boys than "Ken" Hall, as he was known to everyone. Few have had a better influence for character and good sportsmanship than this quiet, friendly man with his infectious smile and never-failing confidence in "his boys."

Last spring shortly before he and Mrs. Hall left on an extensive tour trip throughout the country Mr. Hall was given a testimonial dinner by his friends in Little League at the Kenwood Club in Hales. Among the gifts he received at that time was a handsome travelling bag, the gift of his Little League associates.

Obviously Mr. Hall served the town as a member of the Finance Committee from 1932 to 1935, as a town meeting member for District 2 from 1942 to 1948, as a member of the committee for the survey of public school accommodations in 1941 and on the more recent Horn Pond Brook improvement committee and the committee appointed to study the floodation of the town's drinking water. Actively identified with Winchester Post, 97, the American Legion, he served the post as commander in 1933. Flags on the common and town buildings were displayed at half-staff on his death.

Mr. Hall was a member of the Unitarian Church since 1927. He had served the society as treasurer continuously from 1947 until his death and was also a member

of the Unitarian Church since 1927. He had served the society as treasurer continuously from 1947 until his death and was also a member of the standing committee. For several years he served as treasurer of the Winchester United Church. Every Member Canon Committee. He was a member of the Winchester Boat Club and an honorary member of Winchester Rotary.

On April 14, 1907, Mr. Hall married Pauline Peirce, who survives, with four daughters, Mrs. Donald F. Gifford of Bournemouth, Texas, Mrs. W. Henry Filton of Natick, Mrs. Margaret Masters of White Plains, N. Y., and Mrs. Percy H. Hill of Winchester; also 11 grandchildren and two stepchildren, Howard Stewart, living in Pennsylvania, and Stanley Stewart of Colbyville, Washington.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday by the Rev. Robert A. Stone, minister of the Unitarian Church. Mr. Stone will also officiate at a memorial service to be held Sunday afternoon, November 2, at the Unitarian Church at 8 o'clock.

Massachusetts Men Also on Tuscania

[Special Correspondence]

BOSTON, Feb. 7.—Two lieutenants and one private from Massachusetts were aboard the torpedoed troopship *Tuscania*. They were Lieutenant Kenneth Standish Hall, of Worcester, Mass.; Lieutenant Richard Warren, of Waltham, and Private Vincent A. Gorman, of West Somerville. Up to a late hour to-night no word had been received that they were among the survivors. Adjutant Fred B. Dawes, of Hudson, who was believed to be on the ship, is safe in New York. Only part of the 20th Regiment of Engineers, in which he is an officer, was on the troopship.

Lieutenant Hall, of Worcester, was supply officer of the 158th Aero Squadron. Lieutenant Richard Warren, of Waltham, was a member of Company E, Sixth Battalion, 20th Engineers. He was graduated from Harvard in 1910. Vincent Gorman was a member of the 100th Aero Squadron and was married to Miss Grace H. Gooding, of Somerville, on January 9. He was twenty-one years old.

Friends of Adjutant Dawes, of Hudson, were relieved when letters posted last week in New York were found, showing that he could not have been on the ship.

BAY STATE MEN ON TUSCANIA

Waltham and Worcester
Lieutenants Aboard

Three Greater Boston Boys Believed
to Have Sailed on Ill-Fated Liner

Apprehension among friends of American soldiers who might have been aboard the torpedoed Tuscania was somewhat lessened last night when reports to the effect that the number lost would be considerably less than was at first feared, were received.

The 29th Engineers (Foresters) was the largest regiment in the world, its strength being 17,309 officers and men. According to the cabled dispatches, however, only one battalion, comprising headquarters and companies D, E and F, was aboard. Many New England men are in the regiment.

Among the Bay State men aboard the Tuscania were Lieut Kenneth Standish Hall of Worcester, supply officer of the 158th Aero Squadron, and Lieut Richard Warren of Waltham, a member of Co E of the 6th Battalion, 29th Engineers.

Lieut Warren enlisted in Washington some months ago and trained at the American College, Washington, D C. He

is a Harvard 10 man, and a son of Nathan Warren of 50 Weston st. Waltham. His father is vice president of the Waltham Savings Bank and cashier of the Equitable Life Insurance Company.

After leaving college, Lieut Warren was employed by the Boston Consolidated Gas Company for two years and then entered the lumber business. As purchasing agent of the Woodstock Lumber Company of Boston he traveled extensively through the lumber regions of Northern New England and Southern Quebec. In 1915 he was married to Miss Edith Smith, and they have one child.

Lieut Hall Graduate of Brown

Lieut Hall, when he entered the training camp at Plattsburg last August, was an inspector for the Contractors' Mutual Liability Insurance Company.

His wife, who is making her home at 8 Shaffner st, Worcester, was with him the day before he sailed and she says all the men in his contingent were Southerners.

Lieut Hall is a stepson of James C. Stewart of 75 Lancaster st, Worcester, and lived with him until he was married last April. His wife, before marriage, was Pauline Peirce.

Lieut Hall is a graduate of the Worcester Classical High School, 1909, and attended Clark College two years, going from there to Brown University where he was graduated in 1913. Shortly after his marriage he came to Boston.

After Plattsburg, he was sent to Leon Springs, Tex. and assigned to the Aviation Corps as a supply officer. He was ordered to Hempstead, L. I. with the 118th Aero Squadron, but was later transferred to the 158th.

Thomas A. Carey, 23, married, of 72 Winthrop st, Charlestown, a private in the Medical Corps of the 113th Aero Squadron, was one of the men on the Tuscania. Carey was born in East Boston, the son of Mr and Mrs Thomas Carey of 38 St Andrews road. Before entering the service seven months ago he was employed by Hornblower & Weeks. Two weeks before he was called for service he married Rena A. Gilbride, daughter of Mr and Mrs Thomas J. Gilbride of 72 Winthrop st, Charlestown.

MAJORITY OF BAY STATE MEN SAVED

None Known Definitely to
Be Among Victims

Massachusetts Soldiers on List of Tuscania Survivors

News of the safety of a big majority of the Massachusetts men who were on the transport Tuscania when she received her death wound from a German torpedo on the coast of Ireland Tuesday, came yesterday in dispatches from Ireland and from the War Department.

Of the 29 Bay State men known to have been on the Tuscania, all have been listed as rescued with the exception of seven.

Four officers on board who claimed Massachusetts as their home were saved.

MEN CALM ON THE TUSCANIA

Lieut Kenneth S. Hall of Worcester Writes Interesting Account of Disaster

Worcester, March 15—Lieut Kenneth S. Hall, who was the only Worcester man on the Tuscania, which was sunk recently off the coast of Ireland, and who was among the survivors, writes a very interesting account of the happenings on board the ship, to his wife, who is with her parents, Mr and Mrs J. C. Pierce of 8 Schaffner street.

Lieut Hall is well known to Worcester people, and was employed by the Contractors mutual liability company, Boston, before he enlisted and entered the second Plattsburg camp.

Previous to his insurance business he was in the employ of the Norton company.

The letter received by his wife is undoubtedly the first account of the sinking of the Tuscania received by anyone in Worcester or Worcester country.

It reads in part:—

"Somewhere in Ireland.

"It is very hard to start this letter, as I do not know how much I am allowed to state. We are safe and sound on land, and we sure have had thrilling experiences. I now have in my hands the miniature of you. I made a special trip to my stateroom to get it. Outside of that I have my woolen suit and my short coat, one helmet, one pair of shoes, one set of underwear, one sweater, my spiral puttees and one of those collars you made for me. Of course all of my money was in the belt, and I had that on. I am better off than a good many of the other officers. I will try and tell you about this, but the censor may cut out part of it.

"We went on board the boat as per

cut out part of it.

"We went on board the boat as per schedule, January 23, and did not sail for another day. Then we went north and put into a port where we picked up other steamers and gunboats. I believe that it was the Sunday after I left that we started across the briny deep.

"Everything went along very smoothly and I did not miss a meal. It was a new feeling to be out of sight of land, but we always had these ships near us. We had a good library aboard, so there was plenty to read, and we used to play bridge and checkers and chess. Then there were walks on deck and boat drill every day. These drills were to let the men know the quickest way to get to the boats that they were assigned to. I was in charge of boat No. 9.

"On the afternoon in question I had finished a rubber of bridge and was in the lounge watching a game of checkers. I did not believe there was a

chance in the world for the subs to get us, as we had — torpedo boats playing around us. I had just got up to go down to shave before dinner when, bl/ey—and the lights went out.

"There was no confusion up there among the officers and we all went directly to our boat stations. When I got to mine I looked up and the boat was not hanging where it belonged. I left my men in charge of a casual officer who was assigned to my boat and went up to the top deck to see what had happened. We were hit right under my boat, and the force of the explosion had thrown the boat back on the deck and smashed it in such a way that it was useless and prevented the launching of three other boats. There was nothing to do. I went back to my men and told them that we would have to stand fast until some other boat came to take us off. They were wonderful, and calm as could be.

"I went back to my stateroom and got my coat and helmet and my flashlight and gun. The time seemed to fly by like lightning.

"One of the torpedo boats pulled up on the side of the ship away from me, and men began to go down ropes onto her deck, but there was no chance to get my men around to her, so we just had to wait. I had the feeling from the minute that we were struck that I would get ashore safely, as there was land very near on both sides. After 15 minutes more waiting a torpedo boat drew up right under where my men were standing, and they started down the rope in good order. I then went back and got my miniature and then slid down a rope onto the destroyer.

"Every man was taken off the ship and we had a six-hour ride on the open deck of this little destroyer, to a port in Ireland. We had been on our big ship for two hours after it was struck, and when we left she looked as though she would float for hours. There was a camp where we landed, and we received hot soup and bread. Some torpedo boats put into different ports and we have now checked up

ports and we have now checked up the men, and there are very few missing; they have probably been taken to a port which hasn't reported yet. When the final check is in, there will be very few missing, and they are the few men who lost their heads and jumped overboard.

"Everybody who remained cool was saved, and it was a very calm sea to launch the lifeboats in. We have been treated like princes by the British officers here, and they certainly are a fine lot of men. We are slowly being shipped to our destinations. I will probably be in a training camp in England for the next few months.

"I see no reason why the censors should cut this letter, for our censors and heads of army and navy have promised the papers that they would give news of disasters when everything was checked up. I did not get any cold in my six-hour ride on the torpedo boat. I know that I will get back home all right, and this first experience goes to show it."

TRIO CLINGING TO BOAT RESCUED OFF IPSWICH

Man and Two Jackson College Co-Eds Hang On to Upset Craft 2½ Hours in Sea

Special Dispatch to the Globe

IPSWICH, Sept 3—A Winchester Selectman raced out through the pounding surf on the river bar at dusk tonight and at the risk of losing his cabin cruiser rescued a man and two Jackson College sophomores, who had

been clinging for 2½ hours to an overturned sailboat, a mile off the sand dunes at Crane's Beach.

The Jackson girls—Miss Nancy J. Hall of 12 Winslow road, Winchester, and her roommate, Miss Janet L. Maclachlan of 31 Whitfield road, West Somerville—were saved, in company with Miss

Hall's father, Kenneth S. Hall, by Selectman Franklin Lane and another Winchester man, Ober Pride, all Summer residents at Conomo Point, here.

Both Fall Overboard

Their Annisquam catboat, which may be a total loss, capsized after Miss Hall had fallen overboard in the heavy seas of a northeast blow and Miss Maclachlan, in trying to pull her back, also had fallen in. Mr Hall cautioned the girls against any attempt to swim to shore and clung with them to the boat until rescue came.

They were exhausted by their long stay in the water.

Credit for the first warning of the party's danger goes to four boys camping out on the sand dunes—Robert Swan, Bud Stanton and two companions. They saw the boat, named the Wildcat, overturn far from shore and saw the three persons clinging to the sides. Believing it was impossible for them to

make the rescue in their small row-boat they rowed to the nearest place to give the warning to Mr Lane.

Mr Lane's 26-foot cabin cruiser, Susie, was at anchor in the bay at Conomo Point. He started out with Mr Pride until they reached the bar. The waves were breaking so heavily across the bar that it seemed impossible to get over safely.

Through glasses Mr Lane could see the sailboat, and in the fast fading twilight made out the three persons clinging to it. He took the long chance with the Susie, fearful that she would not make it, or turn, end on end, in the raging surf.

He managed to get through and out to the scene of the upset, between Little Neck, Ipswich and Annisquam.

When Mr Lane started out and it was seen that he might be unable to cross the bar, telephone calls were sent to the Coast Guard stations at Plum Island and Gloucester and to the Coast Guard Air Base at Salem. Surfboats and an amphibian plane went to the rescue, but Mr Lane reached the scene first.

Margaret Sydney spent a year looking for the perfect studio apartment. She is an artist and a grandmother. In September she moved into a two-level studio apartment in the Annex.

Ms. Sydney's green eyes are alight with pleasure as she talks about her new apartment: a long rectangular room for work and relaxation, and a bedroom and bath in the loft above.

Light, says Ms. Sydney, is the most important consideration for her as a painter. She raises her arm toward the five 4½-by-8½-foot windows in her southeast corner apart-

ment. As they are in the other apartments, her walls, 13-foot ceilings and asbestos tile floors are all white to enhance the natural light. The windows have deep wooden sills which she has decorated with houseplants.

Ms. Sydney's last apartment was the upper half of a house on Cherry Street. Both she and her landlord were bothered by the pervasive odor of Ms. Sydney's paints. But here, the high ceiling and the wide-bladed ceiling fan give her the ventilation she needs.

The two longest walls of Ms. Sydney's living work area are covered by paintings, mostly her own, hung in rows, and by tall bookcases filled with books of all kinds. She has a gallery and a library. Her easel, placed under the two windows facing Mt. Holyoke, and a high white double-doored locker with buckets full of brushes make her studio.

Ms. Sydney has been painting for six years, and says sadly that she has produced little in the past 18 months because her shoulder and wrist, broken in 1983, have healed slowly.

She began painting as a child in Winchester. She learned from her artist mother but became more interested in the theater.

After two years in the theater department at Vassar College, with summers at the Gloucester Summer Theatre, Ms. Sydney moved to Manhattan to join the Neighborhood Playhouse Company. She was married, had two children and later divorced. She returned to Boston and received a master's of educa-

tion from Tufts University and taught elementary school in Winchester.

In 1978, after her children were married, Ms. Sydney moved to Los Angeles and began to study painting again. She enrolled in a private school in Santa Monica and worked there for three years. She returned East to be near her grandchildren in Amherst and New Jersey.

Ms. Sydney likes to paint with acrylics and watercolors, but prefers to paint figures in oil. One of her pieces hung on the gallery wall is a striking portrait of a young woman in a dress of harlequin black and white. Ms. Sydney speaks of her painting with pride and some humor: "There are going to be early, middle and recent Sydneys. I'm getting better and better."

Suicide of Henry A. Hall.

Henry A. Hall, the well known rubber merchant of this city, committed suicide at his house in Bridgewater at 7.30 o'clock Tuesday evening by cutting his throat with a razor. When found in his bath room a short time after the above hour he was dead. He had been in a morbid condition of mind for several months, and some fear had been entertained that he might commit suicide. He was in Boston Tuesday, and returned home on the 5 o'clock train. Mr. Hall had not been able to attend to business for several months. On Sunday, the 8th of December last, Mr. Hall was stricken with an apoplectic fit while riding in an Arlington horse car from Cambridge to Boston. He was conveyed to the Parker House, where he remained in a critical condition for some days, but finally recovered sufficiently to resume the conduct of his business for a time, though some of his friends say that his mental condition has never been the same since that occurrence. Medical Examiner Payne of Brockton, who arrived in response to an immediate summons after the suicide, viewed the body, and it was then given in charge of Undertaker Probst. Mr. Hall's mother resides in Bridgewater, and he also leaves a wife and four sons. The eldest, Frank E. Hall, resides in Boston. Harry B. Hall, the second son, is in Baltimore. The next younger, Edward R. Hall, lives in Boston, and together with his brother Frank, has lately been managing his father's business in that city. The fourth son, Roderick, is only about 10 years old and lives with his parents. Mr. Hall was 53 years old.

I am satisfied that the large stock of rubber material in silk and Canton stock must be entirely ruined, if not by fire certainly by water or smoke. We had on hand

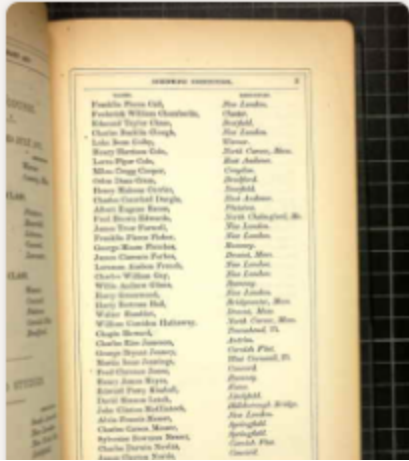

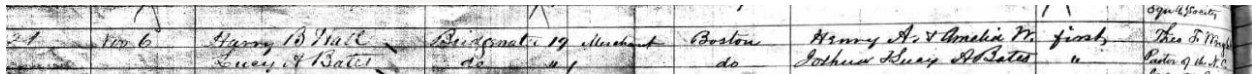

Seventh. I give and bequeath to my cousin Harriet H. Wallbridge of Bennington, Vermont, the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be hers absolutely.

Eighth. I give and bequeath to my grandson, Guy Shelton of Alma, Colorado, the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to be his absolutely.

Ninth. It is my wish and I so direct, that if any of the legatees mentioned in this my last will and testament should die prior to my death, then his or her legacy shall lapse and be divided share and share alike among the surviving legatees of this my last will and testament.

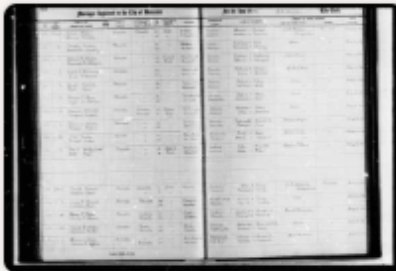

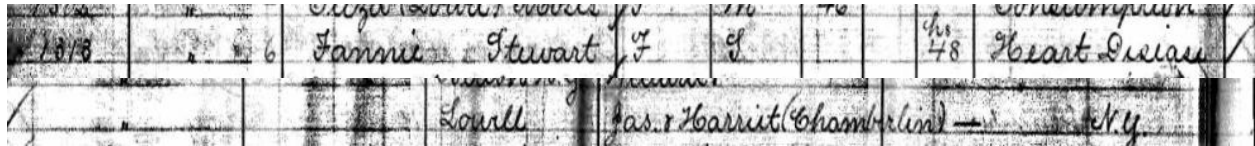

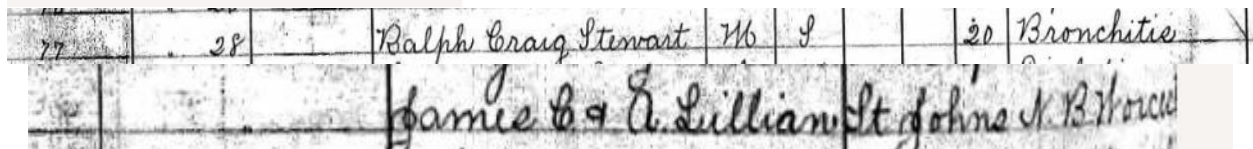
