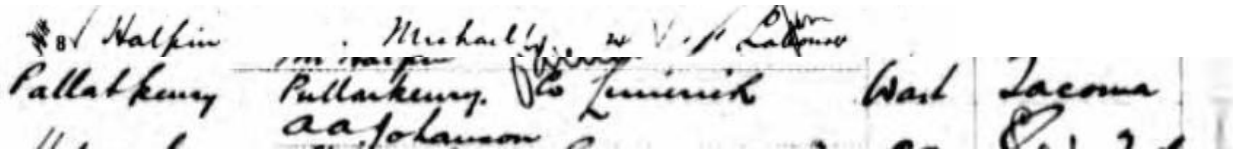

TACOMA SHIP IN DISTRESS;

SENDS SOS SIGNALS AS LOAD SHIFTS

Tacoma Oriental Freighter in Trouble When Dock Cargo of Lumber Moves During Storm Off Aleutians

Local Officials Believe Vessel in No Great Peril

SEATTLE, March 3.—(AP)—An SOS call and brief message that shifting cargo had caused her to list, floated today from the freighter *Bellingham*, south of the Aleutian Islands, and been followed by several hours' silence as radio stations here awaited further word to night.

Her deck load shifting suddenly while she was fighting her way through the heart of a dreaded southwester in the North Pacific near the westward Aleutian Islands, the *Tacoma Oriental* line *Bellingham* sent out SOS calls for help late yesterday, according to word received in Tacoma Monday.

The message was picked up by the Alaska-Washington cable system station in Seattle and the army signal corps radio station at Sitka harbor.

Deck Gear Strung

Word of the ship's difficulty was also received by local officials of the company, which operates a fleet of ships in the oriental trade out of Tacoma and other coast ports.

In their belief the ship is in no immediate danger as her deck gear is unusually strong. They could have sent out a message, so to say, to the *Capt. W. Reed*, on the bridge of the ship, would send an SOS call.

Several Ships Nearby

Several ships of the *Tacoma Oriental* company are near the *Bellingham*, company officials declared last night, and were proceeding to her aid.

The *Bellingham* left Tacoma February 14 for the orient with a cargo of lumber and general as well as a consignment of mail.

According to local waterfront men the ship could probably right herself by cutting loose her deck load, but this would mean the loss of several thousand dollars.

The *Tacoma Oriental* line has been operating for more than two years and this is the first time any of its ships has been in distress.

The *Bellingham* is 379 feet 6 inches long, has a beam of 53 feet

and a draft of 27 feet. She was built in 1918 at the old Todd yards.

His WWII draft record lists Thomas H. Pattison as his contact.

Thomas Herbert Patison was born 7 Sep 1891 in County Cavan, Ireland. On his WWII draft registration, Thomas lists his address as 13354 Corliss Ave., Seattle WA, the address given by Michael Halpin for his next-of-kin Thomas on his own WWII registration. In his WA obituary (original not seen, only the index), Mr. & Mrs. J.H. Pattison (J. misread as T, perhaps?) are listed as Michael’s surviving relatives.

On his WWII draft registration, Thomas Herbert Pattison listed his date of birth as 7 Sep 1890 in Tunnyfoyle [County Cavan] Ireland. He was a logger, single, residing in Detroit, Mason Co. WA.

Thomas's father was Thomas Pattison (1858-1942) & his mother was Eliza Jane Anderson (1862-1950). Presumably Thomas was related to Michael Galpin through one of his parents.

Thomas served in the US Army from 25 Apr 1918 to 21 Aug 1919, being overseas in WWI from 31 Aug 1918 to 10 Aug 1919.
