The Utah National guard boys have gone from Camp Lewis to Camp Kearney. The following postal card was received by Mrs. J. W. Harrison of Myton from her son:

"I am leaving this morning for Camp Kearney, Linda Vista, California, with Utah National guard. I will let you know where I am located and send you my address as soon as I arrive."

While in Washington, D. C., Edward had his photo taken with Pertile Linder another Idaho boy in sending it home he wrote, "we pine cats must stick together." This evidently proved true as Mr. Linder's name is listed with his among the survivors of the torpedoed ship.

LOGGERS QUIT BECAUSE COOK SPOILS GRUB

Merrill & Ring Refuse to Make Change and 64 Strike

Sixty-four employees at Merrill & Ring's logging camp No. 2, at Pysht, walked out Monday morning, after the firm had refused to change cooks.

The discharge of the cook was demanded a week previous and the logging concern then agreed to get a new cook, the strikers claim. Monday morning the change in cooks was refused.

The demand for a new cook was based on the charge that food was improperly cooked and unfit to eat, according to the strikers.

James Benjamin, superintendent of the camp, was panned by strikers who visited the Union Record office Wednesday evening. They declared that after he had told them they could take a boat patronized by the company, he telephoned to the owner of the craft and offered the fare of all if passage for the strikers was refused. Accordingly, after walking six miles, the workers had to hire an Indian's small fishing craft, and it required two trips to take them to Twin, where they could board a train.

The strikers charge that Benjamin's action was based purely on spite and was for the purpose of annoying them. They were delayed a day because of failure to arrive in Twin in time for the train.

E. C. Harbaugh, owner of the poolroom at Twin, was highly praised for taking care of the strikers, who included one woman. It was raining and there was no place to stay outside of the poolroom. Harbaugh scoured the vicinity of Twin for food and kept the crowd from suffering from hunger.

Benjamin, it was stated, blamed the trouble over the cook on the waitress. He claimed she started the agitation to get the cook ousted.

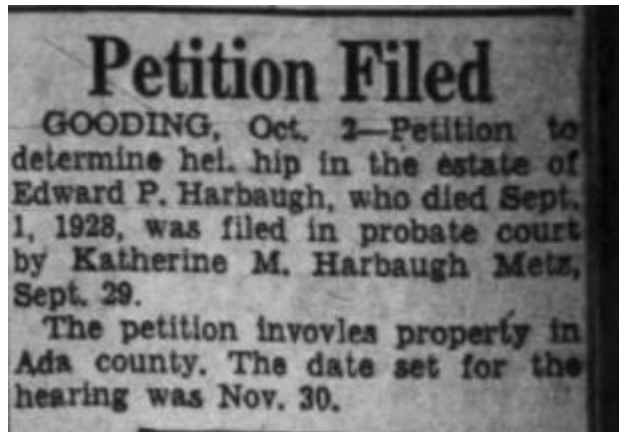

Wreck Kills Motorist

Seventeen deathless days on Snohomish County highways ended just after midnight last night when a head-on collision just north of the city limits took the life of Ralph Daniels, 61, Woodway Park, Edmonds.

Daniels was killed when the car in which he was traveling struck a Mount Vernon Transfer Co. truck and trailer driven by Theodore C. Velcoe, Rt. 2 Mount Vernon.

Injured in the accident was Lawrence C. Sellers, 42, 1028 Daley St., Edmonds. He was also in the sedan which struck the truck. He is in General Hospital for treatment of lacerations of the face and head and for a fractured left ankle.

Investigating state patrolmen were unable to definitely determine who was driving the sedan. Sellers reportedly said the man who was killed was driving but an Edmonds physician for whom Daniels worked as a gardener said the man was unable to drive and could not even park his car for him.

The southbound truck and the northbound sedan were both damaged in the right front. The driver of the truck said he noticed the car coming toward him on the wrong side of the road and he swerved but was unable to avoid the collision. Other motorists following the sedan also reportedly said the sedan was weaving from side to side on the highway.

Velcoe, the truck driver, was uninjured but the truck was damaged in the crash.

Daniels is survived by a sister, Mrs. Lora A. Isham of Seattle, who told Coroner Ken Baker her brother had an estranged wife and a son, William Daniels, who lives somewhere in California.

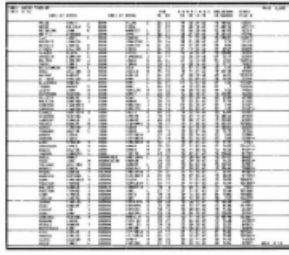

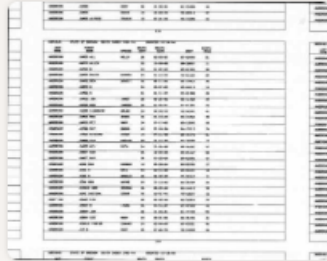

From the research I've done on her death information, I believe this to be Shirley E. Daniels, also known as Charmayne Griffin. However back in the 1960's everybody in Newton knew her as Charmayne Larson.

Charmayne had an alcohol problem and was often picked up and brought to the Harvey County jail when she'd had too much to drink. That's how my sister Mary and I got to know her. Our father was the Sheriff and we lived in the Sheriff's quarters of the jail.

After Charmayne had been there a few days and was feeling better, our dad would let her out of her cell as a trustee. She would help us with laundry, cleaning, and ironing. She was especially good at getting chocolate out of my Dad's dress pants when he occasionally sat on a candy bar.

Charmayne didn't have a mean bone in her body. She called everybody honey, was always cheerful, had a kind heart and we loved her.

Jan. 29, 1970 she was murdered by two young Newton men that were robbing a residence. It was so unnecessary. She couldn't have been a real problem to those two men, and it makes me sad to think of it.

I have written some of my memories about Shirley (Charmayne) so that anyone that might have known her, or be related to her, might know that there are people living that have fond memories of her.

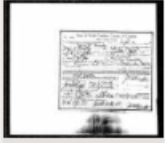

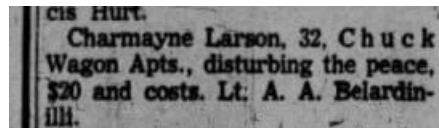

Suspect Held in Early Morning Newton Slaying

NEWTON, Kan. — One man is being held on a first-degree murder charge here today in the slaying of a Newton woman while police continue to search for a second suspect in connection with the murder and the shooting of the woman's 62-year-old male companion early this morning.

The dead woman was identified as Charmayne Larson, 52. Newton Police Capt. Paul Hastings said the woman also was known as Charmayne Griffin.

Hospitalized in good condition at Bethel Deaconess Hospital was James Tate, of Newton.

Tate suffered a gunshot wound to the right elbow in the aftermath of the pre-dawn killing and apparent robbery.

A 21-YEAR-OLD NEWTON man was named in the murder warrant issued today by Harvey County Atty. Mike Sizemore. The name of the suspect, however, was withheld until formal arraignment later today.

Police, meanwhile, concentrated their search in the Newton area for the second suspect whose name also was withheld.

Hastings said Mrs. Larson was shot twice in the head with a small caliber pistol when two men invaded Tate's home in North Newton where she was visiting sometime between midnight and 3 a.m.

Tate told police the armed men took money from him, tipped over a jukebox in his home and removed a small amount of change from the coinbox.

THE MEN, HE SAID, then forced him to accompany them as they drove to an isolated area about four miles northwest of Newton.

Tate reported the men forced him to remove his clothing, leave the car and start running. He said he was shot at as he ran from the men and one bullet struck him in the elbow.

The wounded man managed to elude his assailants in the darkness and made his way to a nearby farm home where he sought aid.

CAPT. HASTINGS SAID the man now in custody was arrested about 6 a.m. as he sat in the Santa Fe train depot in Newton.

"He was just sitting there like he owned the place," Hastings commented, "and didn't give us any trouble."

Hastings said the second suspect, also a Newton resident, was believed to be still in the city and several locations were under surveillance.

A pickup order issued early this morning for two cars thought to be driven by the suspects later was canceled when both vehicles were located in Newton.

Gun Death Is Murder; 2 Charged

NEWTON, Kan. — Charges of murder and accessory thereto were filed Thursday against two Newton men following an incident early Thursday that left a woman dead and her male companion wounded.

Major White, 21, is accused

of first-degree murder in the shooting death of Charmayne Larson, 52, also known as Charmayne Griffin. She lived in Newton.

Les Tolbert, about 20, is accused of being an accessory to murder in the death of the woman and with attempted murder in the wounding of

James Tate, about 60, of Newton.

At their arraignment in Harvey County Court here, Judge Levi Goossen ordered a preliminary hearing Feb. 5 for White and set Tolbert's hearing for Feb. 12. The men were ordered held in the county jail without bond.

Newton Police Capt. Paul Hastings said the woman was

shot twice in the head with a small caliber pistol between midnight and 3 a.m., when two men invaded Tate's home in Newton where she was visiting.

Tate told police the armed men took money from him, tipped over a music box in his home and removed a small amount of change from the

coin container in the box.

The men then forced him to accompany them as they drove to an isolated area about four miles northwest of Newton, said Tate.

They forced him to remove his clothing, Tate said, leave the car and start running. As he ran, he was shot in an elbow.

Tate eluded the men and made his way to a farm home where he got help. He is listed in good condition at Bethel Deaconess Hospital here.

Capt. Hastings said White was arrested about 6 a.m. as he sat in the Santa Fe train depot in Newton.

Tolbert, accompanied by an attorney, turned himself in to police about 2 p.m.

Hastings said the case still is under investigation, but apparently the motive for the crimes was robbery.

BLAZE NARROWLY MISSES GASOLINE

GOODING, Sept. 23—Burning to within six feet of stored high octane gasoline, a fire of undetermined origin destroyed the Shell Oil company's files and office equipment here tonight. The flames broke out at 6:30 p. m.

The building, a fire-proof structure sided with corrugated iron, withstood the blaze, but interior walls of the office collapsed, the fire burning to within 72 inches of more than 1,000 gallons of high octane gasoline stored in barrels in an adjacent room.

Harley Crippen, chief of the Gooding volunteer fire department, said the blaze "could have been caused by either a discarded cigarette stub or by a short-circuit in the wiring."

Myron Harbaugh, manager of the oil company, out of the city at the time of the blaze, said later: "Matches are not allowed on the company's grounds, and I don't smoke."

He stated he had been in the office shortly after 2 p. m.

Although not close to the actual blaze, more than 24,000 gallons of the highly inflammable gasoline was stored in barrels in an enclosed back room of the building.

"Had the fire missed the 1,000 gallons stored in the next room to blaze, and reached those barrels in

the back room, we would have had one of the worst fires in Gooding's history," Chief Crippen said.

The blaze was first discovered by a neighbor who saw smoke pouring from the roof. Bob Cassidy, Gooding night marshal, notified Chief Crippen.

When firemen arrived at the scene, the building was so securely locked that Chief Crippen was forced to go to Harbaugh's home for keys before an entry could be effected.

"The building is partially covered by insurance," Harbaugh said. "There was no insurance on office contents, and I cannot even make an estimate of the damage for a few days, until I make an inventory of the loss."

Also destroyed was an undetermined amount of gasoline rationing coupons.

GOODING WOMAN SHOT TO DEATH

GOODING, Nov. 21—Verdict in the shotgun death of twice-divorced Mrs. Della Harbaugh, 37, who was found dead on the floor of her home here last night, was postponed today until Sheriff W. W. Lowery, Twin Falls, could examine the 20-gauge death instrument for possible fingerprints.

Testifying at a coroner's inquest in the courthouse here this morning were Arthur W. Barrett, Arco, whom she had promised to marry; Myron Harbaugh, from whom she was granted a divorce a month ago on grounds of cruelty, and Bob Cassidy, night marshal here who was the first person after Barrett to view the body.

Was in Home

Barrett, the first witness called, responded to questioning by County Prosecutor M. F. Ryan by admitting that he was in the woman's home at the time the shot was fired. He related that she had threatened to kill herself when he told her he was going to see her ex-husband and tell him what their relationship had been during the past year. His reason for telling her, he testified, was that she had "reneged" on their proposed marriage.

Although the six-man jury had been dismissed once, it was resummoned when Harbaugh appeared at the inquest and asked to testify. He advanced the belief that his former wife had not killed herself because they had, since the divorce, come to an agreement whereby she promised to stay home and care for his two boys, age nine and four years.

Another statement he made,

which led to the calling of Sheriff Lowery, was that the gun had been unloaded following a hunting expedition the day before on which his former wife had accompanied him. She had been using the shotgun with which she was killed, he said. His gun was a 12-gauge.

In his testimony, Harbaugh disclosed that his ex-wife had remarked about Barrett:

"I despise him."

Gun at Side

It was learned that when found the woman was clad in a slip and housecoat. The gun was at her feet as she lay on her left side.

Testimony of Barrett, who was the last person to see the woman alive, revealed that he had made two visits to the woman's home last night. The first time, at about 9 p. m., he said he had called to give her the money for a present which he had bought for her a year ago and which had since been stolen. The gift had been a rifle, he explained.

As to her threat of suicide on his second visit, Barrett remarked that he thought "she was putting on an act for me the same as she has done during the past year."

Says He Took Gun

He told her that the notion of suicide was "silly," and took the gun, which she had picked up, from her hand and leaned it against the wall of the kitchen, according to his testimony. After saying goodbye to her he turned and walked through the living room toward the front door, when he heard the report of the gun, he said.

Noting that she was dead, he remained at the house and attempted to call the sheriff's office, he related. Unsuccessful, as the sheriff was attending a state guard meeting, he tried the deputies and the night marshal without finding anyone. On his way downtown shortly after, he encountered Cassidy, whom the telephone operator had informed that he was wanted.

One Shoe off

Together they returned to the woman's home. On the witness stand, Cassidy explained that the woman was lying on the floor when they arrived. One of her shoes was about eight feet from the body, he remarked. It was Cassidy who first brought out that the two children had slept through the shooting and were still asleep when he arrived. It was about 10:30 p. m. when he and Barrett arrived.

Dr. J. H. Cromwell was called to the home at 11 p. m., he testified. The doctor told the jury that the woman's body disclosed no evidence of struggle. Death was instantaneous. Her chest had been torn open and her heart struck by the pellets, he added.

Harbaugh had been seeing his ex-wife since the divorce and had eaten dinner at her home Sunday before the pair went hunting. As late as yesterday noon he had lunched there, he testified. As he left to drive his gasoline truck to Hailey, he turned and saw his sons and ex-wife on the steps of the house, he said. It was the last time he saw her alive.

However, he had attempted to see her last night after returning from Hailey, he told the court. After receiving a letter from Betty Cooledge, 19-year-old daughter of Mrs. Harbaugh by her first marriage, which expressed the wish that the relationship between her step-father and her mother could be patched up, Harbaugh decided to show the letter to his ex-wife. It was 10 p. m. when he walked up to the door, he said. Through the window he could see the figure of a person standing in the kitchen, thinking it a man, he turned and left without knocking, he told the jury.

Later Cassidy found the ex-husband at the home of a friend about a block from Mrs. Harbaugh's home. He was having coffee, going there after he left the other house.

Jurors in the case are Rex Painter, foreman; J. W. Bate, Tom Rice, Delbert Hoodenpyle, William H. Schreiber and P. O. Massey. They are slated to reconvene this afternoon.

Survivors of the dead woman, other than those mentioned, include her mother, Mrs. Joseph A. Chris-

topherson, Twin Falls; a brother, Ellis McHan, north of Hailey, and one sister, not of this area. Her body remains at the Thompson funeral chapel.

No State Charges in Gun Death of Woman

GOODING, Nov. 22—Indications in the shooting-death of Mrs. Della Harbaugh, 37, are that the state will not file any charges against Arthur W. Barrett, Arco, but is detaining him "to give her family an opportunity to file charges if they so desire."

M. F. Ryan, county prosecutor, said that the Arco man, who admitted being in the room with Mrs. Harbaugh when she died, would be kept in custody for "two or three days, if necessary." Said Ryan this

afternoon:

"Barrett is willing that he should be held and we are just giving the family (of the woman) an opportunity to file charges if they so desire."

Yesterday a six-man coroner's jury attributed Mrs. Harbaugh's death to the "hand or hands of a person unknown." Barrett was taken into custody following the jury's decision. He had testified that Mrs. Harbaugh had promised to marry him.

Both the woman's ex-husband, Myron Harbaugh, and her brother, Ellis McHan, have expressed the belief that she did not commit suicide. Ryan announced that Barrett was willing to be held "until all were satisfied." Attorneys hired by McHan to investigate the matter said today that they had not yet taken any action.

Refused to Accompany Man

Barrett stated at the inquest that he planned to leave for California this morning with his sister, Miss Rose Barrett. He also stated he asked Mrs. Harbaugh to accompany them but that she refused.

A new development was added to the case when a brother of the dead woman stated his intentions of hiring other investigators "to find out how my sister was killed, because I do not believe she died of her own hand."

Ellis McHan, the brother, residing north of Hailey, who testified at the inquest, stated that he has obtained the services of James, Shaw and James, Gooding law firm, in an effort to "get to the bottom of this thing."

Unshaken in his belief that Mrs. Harbaugh did not take her own life,

McHan stated: "My sister told me that she wanted nothing whatever to do with Barrett. She lately expressed a desire to remarry her divorced husband. I am confident that she did not kill herself."

Also brought out at the inquest was the fact that Mrs. Harbaugh, a former beauty operator, dressed a woman's hair late Monday. The woman left the Harbaugh home shortly after 9 p. m.

Another reason advanced by McHan for doubting the suicide theory is the condition of Mrs. Harbaugh's daughter, Miss Betty Coolidge, 19, a resident of California, "who is in such poor health with heart trouble, that my sister was concerned about her daughter's welfare." The girl's doctor will not allow her to come to Idaho at this time, it was learned today.

Cites Sister's Temperment

Speaking further of his sister's death, McHan said: "There is one thing I would like the jurors to bear in mind and that was the temperment of my sister."

Discrediting Barrett's testimony that he "tried to take the gun from her hands before she shot herself," McHan said, "I cannot believe that Barrett could have removed the gun from her hands without some resistance if her mind was made up to kill herself."

The death weapon, measuring 46 1/4 inches, from stock butt to end of barrel, was brought into the inquest, an unnamed Gooding girl demonstrating how, with slipper removed, the trigger could be pressed with a toe.

Lowery Believes Case Suicide

Among those believing that Mrs. Harbaugh took her own life is Sheriff W. W. Lowery, Twin Falls county, who, accompanied by Lee McCracken of the Twin Falls police department, made extensive tests of fingerprint found on the death gun.

"Apparently Mrs. Harbaugh took a great deal of pride in her gun," Sheriff Lowery said. "The gun was well oiled, and if there had been a struggle of any kind the prints on the gun would have been smeared from the pressure exerted."

"As it is, we were able to find a number of prints. Although McCracken and I could not classify the prints, we are sure there was no struggle."

Sheriff Lowery also pointed to the course taken by the charge from the shotgun as proof that the shot was self-inflicted.

"The charge entered under the ribs, coursed up through the body, stopping in the shoulder area," he said. "That would indicate that the gun was held by Mrs. Harbaugh, for even in a struggle, no one could have held the gun at an angle to produce such an injury."

Measurements used at the inquest brought out the fact that the distance from Mrs. Harbaugh's heel to the wound was 47 inches. The gun measured 46 1/4 inches.

Gooding Jury Gives Verdict In Shooting

Inquest Holds Woman Dies at Hands Of Person Unknown

GOODING (P) — "Death at the hand or hands of a person unknown," was the verdict handed down here Tuesday by a six-man coroner's jury in the shotgun killing of Mrs. Della Harbaugh, 37, who was found dead on the floor of her home here Monday night.

Testifying at the inquest was Arthur Barrett, Arco, who admitted that he had been in the room with the woman at the time she died.

Twice a divorcee, once within the last month, Mrs. Harbaugh had threatened to kill herself when Barrett told her he would expose their relationship to her ex-husband, Myron Harbaugh, Gooding oil dealer, the Arco man testified.

As he turned to leave, he heard the shot, Barrett said. Harbaugh, who took the stand later, said he did not believe his ex-wife had committed suicide, as she had recently agreed to stay at home and take care of their two boys, aged four and nine.

He also said he had been hunting with her Sunday after which he had unloaded the shotgun.

GOODING'S DEATH CASE NOW ENDED

GOODING, Nov. 25 — Possibility of the reopening of the investigation of the shotgun death of Mrs. Della Harbaugh is remote, Sheriff Fred S. Craig said today after announcing the release of Arthur Barrett, Arco man who had agreed to remain at the county jail here until "everyone was satisfied."

Following the funeral of the woman here yesterday, James, James and Shaw, Gooding attorneys hired by Ellis McHan, brother of Mrs. Harbaugh, to investigate the case, said that they had not uncovered any evidence that would warrant the filing of criminal charges against Barrett. Earlier in the day, they had conferred with him at the jail here.

Cited Letter

Myron Harbaugh, from whom the dead woman was divorced exactly one month prior to her death, had requested that Barrett remain in Gooding until this morning so that he, the ex-husband, would have a chance to read a letter which the Arco man is said to have written to Mrs. Harbaugh.

Sheriff Craig indicated this morning that the letter had not affected the decision of the attorneys in any way and that the case is closed now as far as he is concerned. County Prosecutor M. F. Ryan announced that the state's previous decision not to file charges remained unchanged.

Even the possibility of an expected FBI examination of the death instrument, a diminutive 20-gauge shotgun, is beyond having any effect on the case as the gun was handled too much for an investigation to be conclusive, Sheriff Craig remarked, adding that it had not been sent to the federal authorities.

Verdict Final

With the closing of the case, at least for the time being, the coroner's jury verdict that Mrs. Harbaugh died "at the hand or hands of persons unknown" stands as the final official actiop.

Barrett's stay in the county jail, following the verdict which was handed down Tuesday, was entirely voluntary, Sheriff Craig said. McHan had announced that he believed his sister's death to have been accidental and hired the attorneys in an attempt to prove his contention.

During the inquest Barrett admitted having been in the same room with Mrs. Harbaugh at the time she met her death.

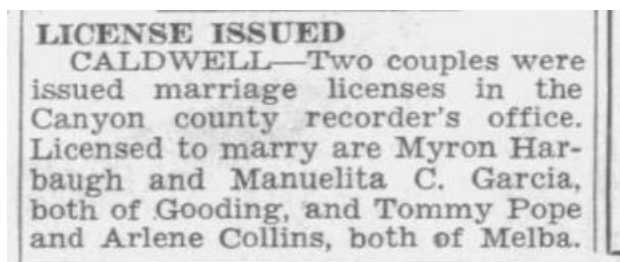

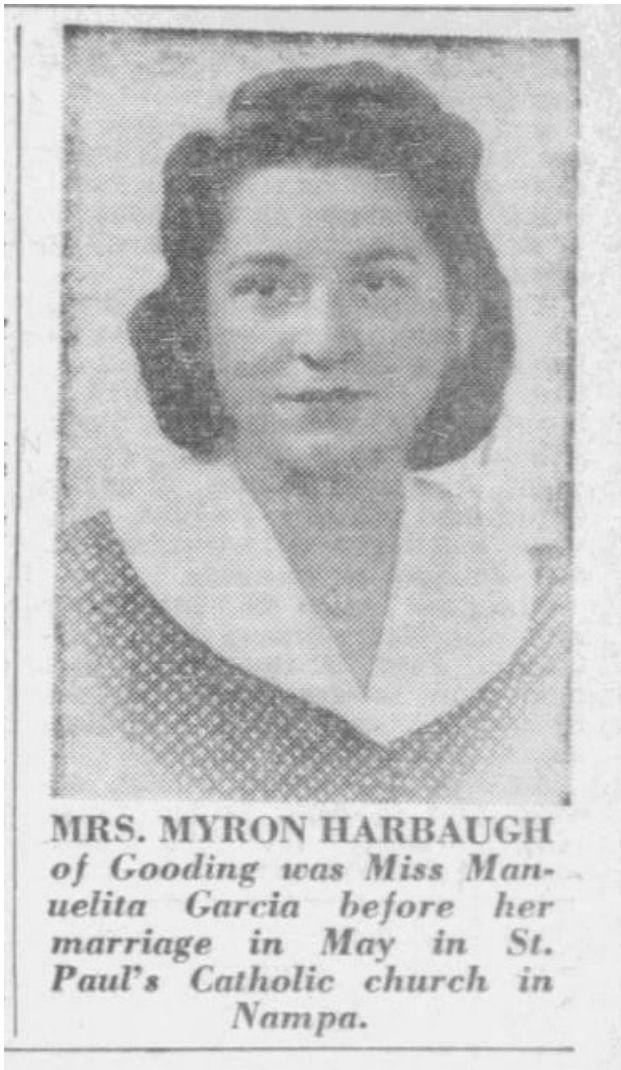

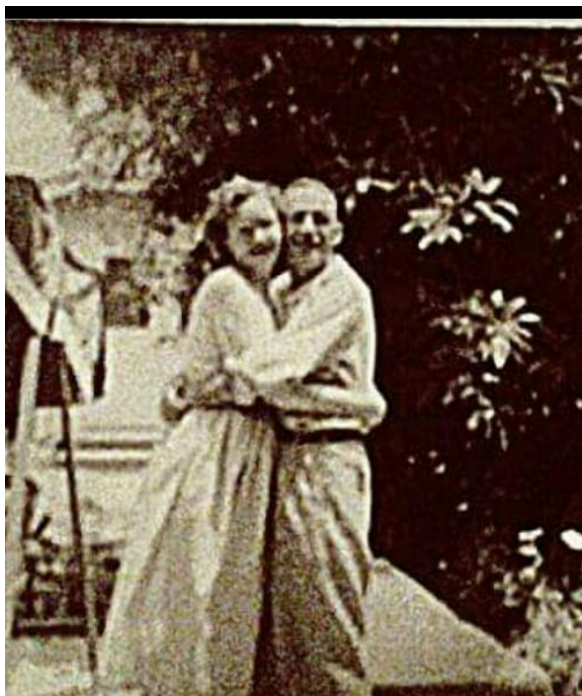
