Louis J. Hartman Taken by Death

Louis J. Hartman, 515 W. Cedar Street, passed away at 11:05 o'clock Sunday night at St. Joseph's Hospital.

Mr. Hartman was born December 23, 1893, in the Town of Tilden, the son of Frank and Maria Yakish Hartman. He attended St. Charles School in this city and later was married to Florence Marek at St. Paul's Catholic Church in Bloomer.

Mr. Hartman was a cabinet maker at Tschopp-Durch and Camastral Company; a member of St. Charles parish, of the Loyal Order of Moose; the Carpenter's Union and the Holy Name Society of St. Charles. He served in World War I in France and was one of the survivors of the sinking Tuscania.

He is survived by his wife, Florence; two sons, Eugene of Menomonie and Richard, in the United States Air Force at Rapid City, So. Dak., three daughters, Mrs. William (Donna) Haley, of Decatur, Ill., Patricia and Karen, at home; five sisters, Mrs. John (Minnie) Thurner and Mrs. John (Ann) Clements, both of Milwaukee; Mrs. Joseph (Barbara) Mondy, Oswego, N. 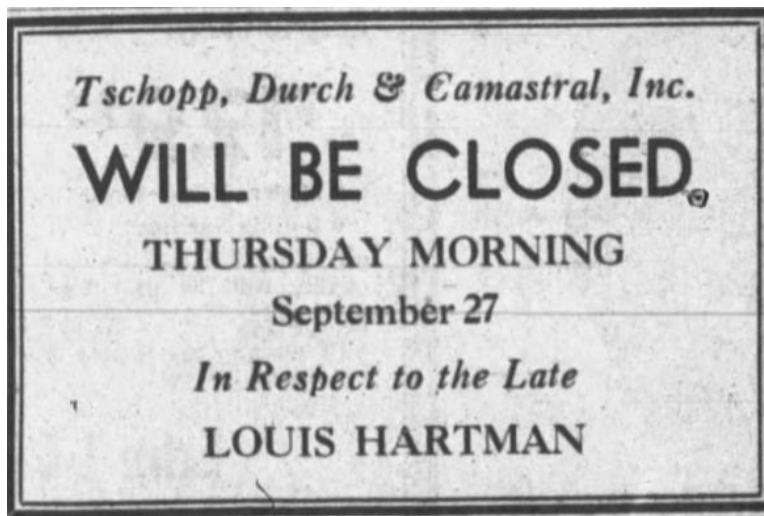
He was a cabinet maker and served in World War I. Mr. Hartman was one of the survivors of the sinking Tuscania.

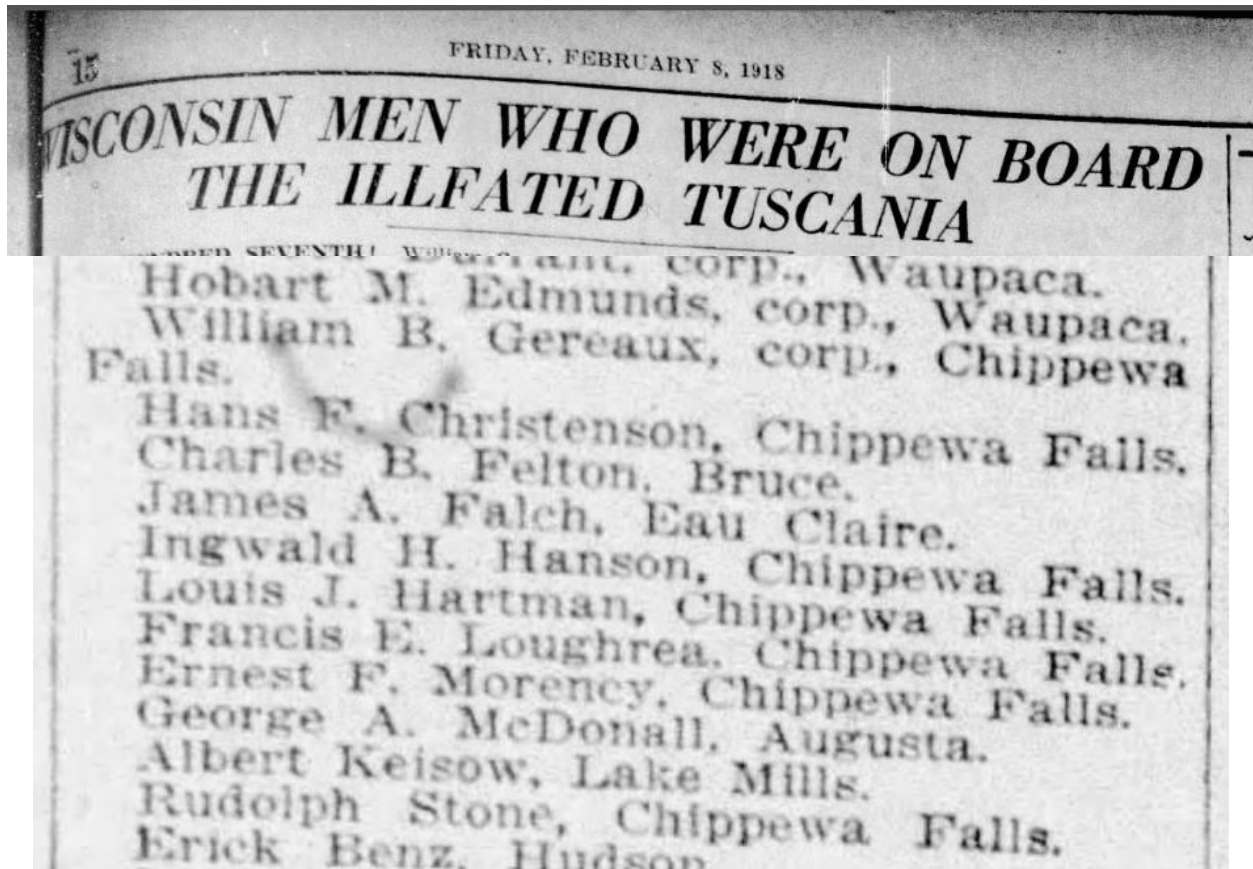

The News publishes today a list of soldiers, sailors and marines who entered the service of the country from Dunn county during the recent war. This list was compiled from cards furnished the County Council of Defense by the various schools of the county after a canvass made by teachers and pupils with the co-operation of the local defense councils. Every effort has been made to make the list complete. It is highly important for historical reasons that no names be omitted. There is no comprehensive official list in existence; therefore it was necessary to go to original sources.

Publicity is being given the list by The News in order that its readers may check it over and carefully note any omissions or errors that come to their attention. Any reader finding an error in any name is urged to notify this office of same without delay. If you know of any soldier, sailor or marine who served from Dunn county whose name is not on this list, send such name to The News, together with address, or, if the man who served is now deceased, send name and address of his nearest relative.

Readers will note that in case a service man here listed is dead, that fact is indicated. This feature of the list should receive attention and, if any changes should be made with respect thereto, this office should be notified in order that the record may be properly corrected. In case a soldier is deceased and the fact not indicated, please inform us, or vice versa.

Correction of any errors as to location is also important, and the same is true as to spelling of names.

The list as compiled shows that 978 men entered the service from Dunn county, of whom 81 are deceased. Of this number Menomonie furnished 257, of whom 28 are deceased.

The co-operation of all citizens in assuring completeness and accuracy to this record will be appreciated.

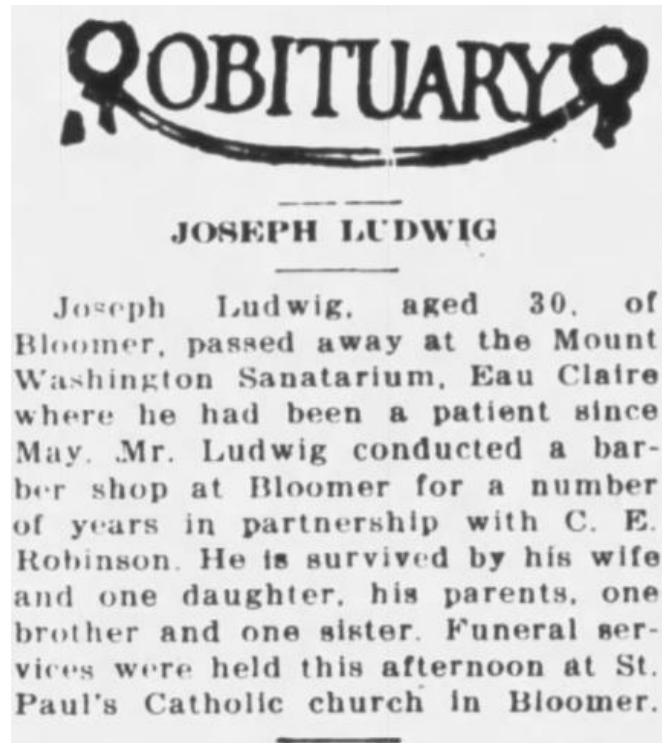

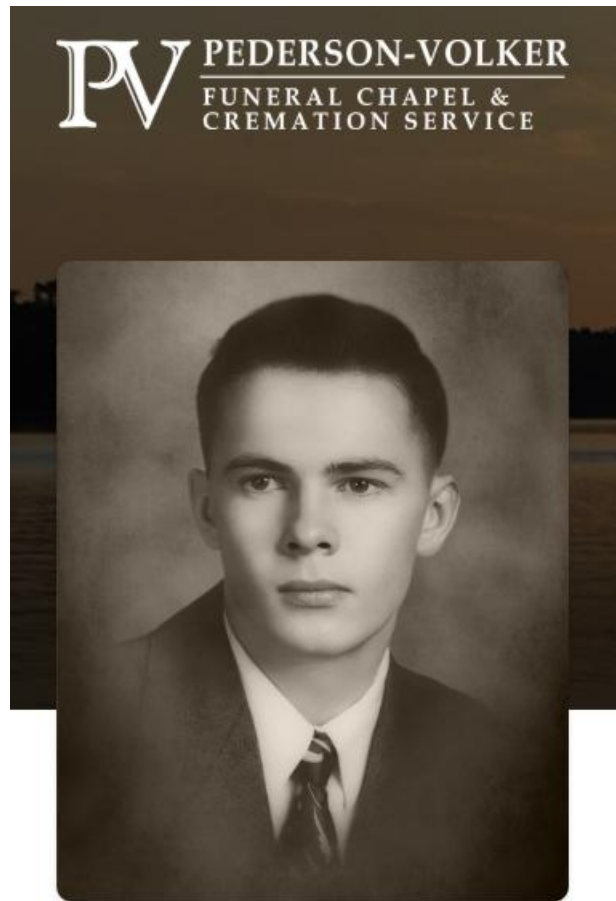

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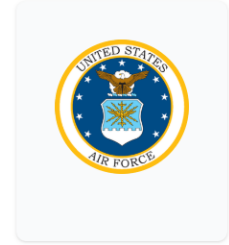

He was preceded in death by his wife, Sally; great-granddaughter, Everlee Mae Dachel; brother, Gene (Catherine) Hartman; and parents.

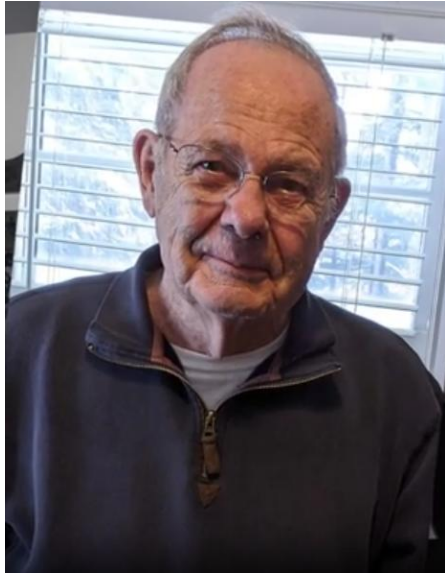

Joseph died in the Mount Washington Sanatorium [Sanitorium] in Eau Claire WI, according to his obituary in the "Chippewa Daily Herald" (Chippewa Falls WI) 30 Sep 1926 p 3 (copied above). This was a facility for tuberculosis patients.
