Born April 1, 1899. Entered the service April 10, 1917 at Chippewa Falls as a member of Company A, 4th Wisconsin Inf. Trained at Camp Douglas, Wis., and McArthur, Texas. Transferred to Troop I, 107th Supply Train, 32nd Division. Sailed on the Tuscania. Torpedoed February 5, and died as the result of injuries and exposure, February 6. Buried in Scotland.

TUSCANIA LIST DISTRESSING NEWS TO SISTERS OF A. N. HARVEY HERE

Missing Soldier 19 Years of Age; Lived Here and in Chippewa Falls.

The list of Wisconsin soldiers not accounted for among the Tuscania's passengers was distressing news to the two sisters here of Arthur Nelson Harvey, aged 19, the only Eau Claire man on the ship who has not been reported in the list of survivors. His sisters here are Mrs. Martin Field and Miss Fern Harvey, 172 Ferry street. His father, Nels Harvey, resides on a farm near Cadott. Two other sisters, Mrs. Bert Green and Mrs. Leford Green, live on adjoining farms. The father was rendered blind in a dynamite explosion in a sewer trench at Chippewa Falls November 21 last. Mrs. Nels Harvey died six years ago.

Arthur N. Harvey enlisted in Chippewa Falls Company A, Fourth Wisconsin Infantry, April 10 last and went to Waco with that unit. When the Fourth regiment was broken up in the reorganization at the Texas camp Harvey was transferred to Troop I, 107th Supply Train in October, and went to Camp Merrit,

N. J., January 15. Prior to his enlistment he had been employed in the bottling department of Leinenkugel's brewery at Chippewa Falls. He had lived with his sisters here for much of the time during the last two years and hence designated Eau Claire as his city of residence. He was home on a furlough of ten days in the latter part of November.

Mr. Field said last evening that Arthur wore a metal identification tag about his neck when he was home on furlough. Wire reports have said that many of the men aboard the Tuscania did not have identification tags.

Harvey is the only Eau Claire man unaccounted for among the soldiers on the Tuscania. The list of survivors received Saturday contained the name of Clarence J. Jaquish of the town of Brunswick. Additions to the list since then have given the names of Ernest Dearth, James

Falch, and Edward Dillon of Eau Claire, and that of George McDonald, who had been in Eau Claire for two years previous to enlisting, being an employe of the Taylor Motor Car company, but who gave his residence as Augusta.

Arthur Nelson Harvey, of Eau Claire was on the torpedoed Tuscania and is the only one from that city that is not accounted for and a strange thing says the the Eau Claire Telegram, he is not in the directory of that city and no one seems to know who he is.

PARENTS HAVE NOT GIVEN UP

WORLD WAR TRAGEDY TOOK LIVES OF 225

Many Soldiers from Eau Claire and Vi- cinity on Boat

None of the Eau Claire men that were on the transport *Tuscania* when it was sunk 15 years ago Sunday will attend the *Tuscania* Survivors association reunion in Chicago, which began Saturday and will last through Monday.

Only 3 men can be located in Eau Claire at present, Russell Gibson, 1515 S. Farwell, L. B. Rist, 1303 Altoona avenue and Clarence J. Jaquish, who were on the transport.

The files of this paper reveal that there were five men from this city on the vessel, one of whom was drowned. None of the other survivors can be located. The paper shows that Edward Dillon, Ernest Dearth and James Falsch, survived, but Arthur N. Harvey, whose sister still lives here, was the victim. Mr. Harvey lived with his sister, Mrs. Martin Field, 1237 S. Dewey street, and his father owned a farm near Cadott.

The reunion at Chicago was to have been featured by the presence of Capt. Wilhelm Meyer, Saarbuck-en, Germany, the commander of the German submarine that sunk the transport. A mild diplomatic incident grew out of the invitation which Capt. Meyer had accepted, and the German embassy at Washington frowned on the visit, and it was cancelled.

Torpedoed About Dark

The transport was struck by a torpedo about dark on the evening of Feb. 5, 1918. Mr. Rist a high school instructor here, said that it was light enough for the ship to show against the sky but too dark for the destroyers to see the periscope. The vessel remained afloat for hours and about half of the men remained on the ship until they were taken off by destroyers and mine sweepers. The others were taken off in life boats, and the loss of life was due to the life boats being swept on to the rocks on the shore of Ireland, where they were broken up. Some of the loss of life was due to jumping overboard. Two hundred twenty-five Americans were drowned. The life boat that Mr. Rist was in was picked up by a mine sweeper after being afloat for about 8 hours.

Most of the outfits that were aboard the transport were service troops, principally engineers. It was early in the war and few fighting troops were being taken over.

A Barron man who married an Eau Claire girl was also drowned in the catastrophe, Benjamin H. Brown, who married Miss Marie Peterson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Peterson of this city.

CHIPPEWA FALLS—At least 216 — and probably more — Chippewa County people have died during World War I, World War II, the Korean conflict and the Vietnam war — and the Patriotic Council plans to memorialize them on a monument at the approach to the Veterans Memorial Bridge here.

But according to Russel J. Lee, chairman of the Council, the list may not be complete and additions will be accepted from now until a deadline is established.

The list, as it has been compiled by the Council, will be placed in each bank in Chippewa County, Lee said today, "and we are asking that anyone interested look it over and if they have any suggestions for changes we ask them to write us."

Lee also notes that a group has "volunteered to furnish the labor to construct the base of the memorial as soon as a site has been secured from the Soo Line Railroad, "but", he says, "we are still badly in need of donations to pay for it."

"Anyone wishing to contribute to the Memorial Fund," Lee says, "can do so by making checks or money orders payable to the Patriotic Council Memorial Fund and send them to either the Northwestern or the First National Banks in Chippewa Falls."

CHIPPEWA FALLS — According to current records, 280 Chippewa County servicemen have died in the Civil War, World War I, World War II, the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War.

Dozens of locals died aboard WWI ship

THE HERALD

Arthur Nelson Harvey of Chippewa Falls was just 19. A Jim Falls resident, Earl Odear Weisenberger was slightly older, 25.

Both privates in the U.S. Army were on board the transport ship *Tuscania* with Corp. Claire Metzenbauer, 23, of Chippewa Falls, when the ship sank in a torpedo attack by a German U-boat.

The three men were among 48 from Wisconsin and 210 American troops in all to die in the attack off the Irish coast on Feb. 5, 1918.

They were also the first World War I casualties from the area.

Metzenbauer's parents in the town of Lafayette were notified that their son was killed when they received a cablegram from the Department of War.

More than 2,000 American troops were aboard the transport ship. A 1962 account in the then-Chippewa Herald-Telegram said that 225 of those troops were from Wisconsin, and 35 were from Chippewa Falls.

Nelson Harvey Dies at Eau Claire Early Today

The death of Nelson Harvey, aged 74, and a former well known resident of Chippewa Falls, occurred at an Eau Claire hospital at 4 o'clock this morning. Mr. Harvey was born in Waupaca, Wis. For several years he has made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Field at Eau Claire, having been rendered blind by an explosion when the sewer was opened on Willow St. His wife preceded him in death 25 years ago.

Funeral services will be held at two o'clock Monday afternoon from the Hogseth Funeral parlors, Rev. J. J. Dixon officiating. Interment will be made in the Bateman cemetery.

DYNAMITE EXPLOSION HURLS TWO MEN FROM SEWER TRENCH; BOTH MAY DIE

**CONFUSION OF SIGNALS CAUSES
BLAST AS LAST WIRE IS
CONNECTED.**

John Hoepner, aged 56, married and the father of three daughters, and Nels Harvey, aged 50, widower, father of five children, were perhaps fatally injured while at work yesterday in a trench of the Willow street sewer when a dynamite explosion occurred just as Harvey was attaching the last wire to the charge.

Both men were taken to the hospital where it is said their chances for recovery are remote. Of the two men Hoepner is the more seriously injured. The flesh on Mr. Hoepner's face from the upper lip to his eyes was blown away by the charge and the lower jaw bone is almost entirely exposed. Both eyes were shot out and he suffered some injury on his hands and chest. Nels Harvey suffered many injuries on his face and neck and it is believed that he too has lost the sight from both eyes. Besides the injuries to his face he lost a finger and his thigh was injured.

Were Barely Conscious.

At the hospital at four o'clock yesterday afternoon the men were conscious but could speak only with difficulty. Harvey said he and Hoepner were standing over the dynamite and that he was attaching the last wire when the explosion occurred. Their condition was such that an anaesthetic could not be administered.

Attending physicians were of the opinion that Hoepner might not survive the night but that Harvey has a fighting chance, though the full extent of his injuries could not be determined.

The men with several others were employed by the Cast Stone Construction company of Eau Claire in the sewer work on Willow street. Dynamite was being used to break the granite boulders. The men were placing a charge under a large boulder in the trench about nine feet down. The explosion occurred at about 11:30.

City Officials Investigate.

The board of Public Works held a hearing yesterday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock on the accident. City Attorney Bowe conducted the hearing. Harold Hockenbrock, city inspector and Richard Ryan, foreman for the Cast Stone Construction Co. were questioned. Charles G. Moore of Eau Claire, engineer for the Cast Stone Construction Co. was also present.

From the evidence given it appears that there was a mixup of signals and that Harold Hockenbrock gave Mr. Ryan the signal to discharge the dynamite, believing that all the men were out of the trench. It was stated, however, that usually the men gave the signal themselves.

Not until the men started to crawl out of the trench with their faces bleeding and their clothes torn was it known that they had not left the trench before the signal was given.

MISTAKEN ORDER CAUSES TERRIBLE ACCIDENT TODAY

Faces of John Hoepner and Nels Harvey Frightfully Mutilated By Dynamite Explosion

John Hoepner, aged 56, of 910 Water street, and Nels Harvey aged about 55 had their faces terribly mutilated in a dynamite explosion at 11:30 o'clock this morning while they were in the sewer ditch on East Willow street. The sewer is being constructed by the Cast Stone Construction company of Eau Claire. They are working thru a ledge of granite making it necessary to use dynamite. The dynamite is exploded by electricity and the switch is in a small shanty at the corner of Willow and High streets, half a block away from the scene of the explosion. When the dynamite is ready to be exploded the man in the shanty is notified by a shout from the ditch.

Mr. Hoepner and Mr. Harvey have been placing the dynamite charges and were engaged in this work when the explosion occurred this noon.

The other men working in the ditch were out waiting for the explosion. There was some confusion. Some of the men told Harold Hockenbrock, who was with the crew to tell the man in the shanty to pull the switch as they had been waiting fifteen minutes for him to discharge the dynamite. Mr. Hockenbrock carried out these orders. Dick Ryan, the foreman, was in the shanty and Hockenbrock asked him what was the matter he hadn't fired the dynamite as the crew had been waiting fifteen minutes. Consequently Ryan pulled the switch and the dynamite exploded. Hoepner and Harvey were still in the ditch and were working over the dynamite when the electric spark touched off the explosive. Harvey had been out of the ditch but went back.

The cries of the injured men was the first warning that they were in the ditch. Their faces were frightfully mutilated beyond recognition. Hoepner. Consequently a man pulled the son, the attending physician, stated that he had a possible chance for recovery.

Harvey's right eye was blown out and the left eye can probably be saved, the fore finger of his right hand was blown off and his left leg was bruised. Harvey has a chance for recovery. Both men were taken to the hospital by Dr. Ellenson.

Hoepner's injuries are of a more serious nature. Neither man felt any great amount of pain as their nerves were numbed by the shock of the explosion.

MRS. HOEPNER FILES CLAIM

Mrs. Jens Hoepner, whose husband was killed a month ago by a blast while working in a sewer construction gang as an employe of the Cast Stone Construction company of Eau Claire, yesterday appeared before F. M. Wilcox, state industrial commissioner, at the court house and filed a claim for \$3,000 compensation. Nels Harvey, who was injured in the same blast, also filed a claim yesterday.

MANITOWOC, (Special).—Tired of being taken from one jail to another in connection with alleged utterance of forged checks, Donald D. Kirks, returned to this city from Eau Claire to answer a year-old charge in connection with issuance of a \$15 check here, will have a permanent place of residence for him to an indeterminate term of not less than one year nor more than two years at the state's prison at Waupun. After stubbornly protesting his innocence for several days, Kirks late yesterday afternoon told authorities he would be ready to enter the guilty plea in court this morning.

Sought for Year

Kirks has been sought since November 6, 1928 when it was charged in a complaint signed by Detective Frank Tomczek that he cashed a \$15 check at the meat market of Emil Schmidt & Sons, the check being drawn on the Security National Bank of Sheboygan and signed "O. W. Sommers," a fictitious name. From Manitowoc he went to Sheboygan and it is claimed that he issued three forged checks in that city but his arrest did not take place until several weeks ago when he was picked up at Fond du Lac for Eau Claire authorities who wanted him on similar charges. Although he denied having been in Manitowoc or in Eau Claire, the authorities of the latter city agreed to drop the charges when it appeared that the Manitowoc case was the stronger.

Freed Prisoner Walks Into Arms Of Local Police

Walking to what he thought was freedom after serving a two-year term in the state prison at Waupun, Donald D. Kirks was met at the gate yesterday by Detectives William Rothe and Harry Bemus of the Sheboygan police department, who held a warrant for his re-arrest on forgery charges.

Kirks was brought back to Sheboygan to answer for alleged forgeries on local merchants totalling approximately \$90 in 1928, and was scheduled for a preliminary hearing in municipal court this afternoon.

The man was sentenced to a two-year term in Waupun in 1928 after a trial in the circuit court of Manitowoc county.

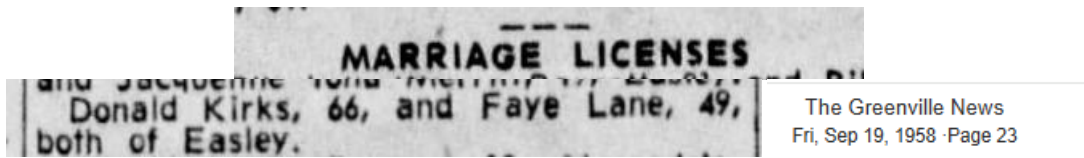

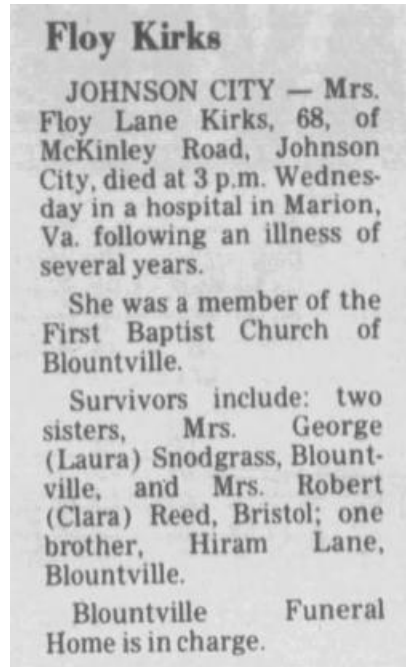

They married 29 Nov 1916 in Chippewa Co. WI. - Lefard Green was the son of Charles Green (1865-1924, F: 42561520) & Ada W. Wilbur (1870-1945, F: 42561466). Lefard’s brother Egbert Green married Maud’s sister Ednabell Harvey & his brother Earvin L. Green, using his assumed name of Donald Donby/Domby Kirks, married Ednabell’s sister Fern Harvey. Maud’s obituary appeared in the “Eau Claire (WI) Leader-Telegram” 1 Oct 1977 p 5 (copied above). Married to Leford [sic] Green in 1916; they farmed in Segal township, Chippewa Co. Green & Donald Domby/Donby Kirks**. – Earvin L. Green was the son of Charles Green (1865-1924, F: 42561520) & Ada W. Wilbur (1870-1945, F: 42561466). Earvin’s brother Egbert Green married Fern’s sister Ednabell Harvey & his brother Lefard Green married Fern’s sister Maud Harvey. -
- As Fern S. Harvey, age 18, of Eau Claire WI, she married Donald D. Kirks, age 21, of Fort Sill OK, in Comanche Co. OK on 10 Oct 1918, by minister Jeane L. LaGrane of the First Methodist Episcopal Church of Lawton, Comanche OK. – However, Fern was not yet age 16 (her birthday being in November).
- **The Story of Earvin L. Green – Donald Domby/Donby Kirks:**
- Born Earvin L. Green on 15 Sep 1897 in Cadott, Chippewa WI – died 28 Oct 1971 in the Veterans Administration Hospital, Mountain Home, Washington Co. TN.
- Son of Charles Green (1865-1924, F: 42561520) & Ada W. Wilbur (1870-1945, F: 42561466). His name Earvin is also found spelled Ervin, Erwin, Irwin.
- According to a family story on Ancestry.com, Earvin & his father Charles did not get along, and he was sent to the Wisconsin State Industrial School for Boys in Waukesha, Waukesha WI where he is listed in the 1910 census. The story goes that he met the “real” Donald Donby Kirks who had been drafted into the Army. Kirks did not want to enter military service & Earvin was too young to enlist, so the two swapped identification – and spent the rest of their lives with the other’s name.
- Now, the draft did not occur until 1917, but “Donald D. Kirks” is in the Army at Fort Sill OK when Fern Harvey marries him there on 10 Oct 1918.
- The 1910 census for Waukesha, Waukesha WI, conducted 30 Apr 1910, at the Wisconsin State Industrial School for Boys: on line 65: Irvin L. Green, 14 WI, parents b. WI, inmate.
- There are numerous articles on Newspapers.com about a Donald Kirks & his various financial crimes in WI, such as forgery and check-passing, which resulted in incarceration.
- Fern divorced Donald Kirks; their divorce notice was published 1 Oct 1938 in the Minneapolis MN newspaper.
- He married Ruth A. Homer (1906-1982) on 14 Jan 1938 in Michigan City IN. This was apparently before his divorce was finalized in Minnesota. Ruth & Donald divorced 10 Jul

1939 in Muskegon MI. When she filed for divorce, Ruth noted there was a 4-month-old son, William Charles Kirks. He was born 17 Nov 1938; resides in Kalamazoo MI.

- When Donald DOMBY Kirks registered for the WWII draft on 26 Apr 1942, he resided at 117 Post Rd., Aberdeen, Harford MD & was employed at the US Government Aberdeen Providing Ground in Aberdeen, Harford MD. It was noted “left arm shorter than right.”
- He married Floy Faye Lane (21 Sep 1908 TN – 13 Oct 1976 Marion, Smyth VA, F: 254072511), his surviving widow. They obtained a marriage license in Greenville SC in Sep 1958. Floy Kirks is buried in the same cemetery as Donald is.
- Earvin/Donald is not mentioned in his father Charles’s Sep 1924 obituary, nor in his mother Ada’s Mar 1945 obituary. A 1939 newspaper article in the reads: “Donald Kirks of Minneapolis.
- His Social Security record lists his mother as Adah Wilbur, but his father as Charlie Kirks.
- His obituary under the name Donald D. Dirks appears in the “Kingsport (TN) News” 29 Oct 1971 p 5.
- Donald Donby Kirks (Donby the spelling on his military headstone) is buried in East Tennessee Cemetery, Blountville, Sullivan TN. F: 254072512
