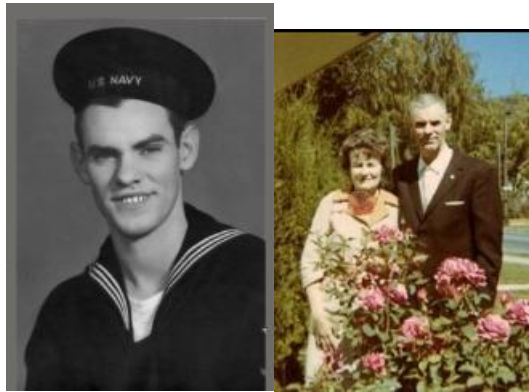

Hobbs Woman Has Proven Arthritis Can Be Overcome

Putting the baby in the crib, dusting under the beds, pulling the plug to the electric iron from the extension cord, and other simple movements made by millions of housewives were complicated for Mrs. Nelda Emerick in 1956.

Everyday household tasks were almost impossible to perform without experiencing excruciating pain in her joints. Afflicted with rheumatoid arthritis, Mrs. Emerick began taking cortisone treatments for relief. For 10 years she was able to work steadily, attend night school and take piano lessons. The cortisone treatments for her were halted in November, 1966, for fear that prolonged use of the drug would be harmful.

Thereafter, Mrs. Emerick suffered from arthritic pain until hope for relief came on May 9, 1968 when a group of doctors affiliated with the Arthritis Foundation met in Hobbs. At the suggestion of an Arthritis Foundation worker, Mrs. Emerick gave permission for a review of her case. X-rays were made of her hands, feet and major joints.

On July 1, 1968, a synovectomy was performed on Mrs. Emerick's right hand which had to be partially reconstructed. She began receiving injections of gold salts, a recently-develop-

these symptoms to see a qualified physician. "No case of arthritis is hopeless if caught early and properly treated."

ed treatment, in November 1968 and is scheduled to have similar surgery on her left hand.

Mrs. Emerick and her husband Ed, a television technician at Montgomery Ward, have two grown daughters and a son and daughter at home, 904 Sayers Drive.

All are grateful for the help and guidance provided by the Arthritis Foundation. Mrs. Emerick said, "Two months ago I couldn't lift my arms to comb my hair and it was painful and frustrating to dress myself. Now I'm lifting my arms with less pain and have even stopped my regular daily dosages of aspirin." She added, "I'm thankful too, that now orthopedic surgery is helping the arthritic. In some cases deformities can be corrected and in most cases the disease is arrested in the joints where synovectomy is performed."

The Arthritis Foundation, which helps arthritis sufferers all over the country, is supported by contributions. Area residents will have an opportunity to join in the fight against arthritis starting tomorrow when the Lea County Unit of the Arthritis Foundation begins its 1969 fund-raising campaign.

Kenneth Shelton, chairman, has announced a goal of \$2,250 and said, "In addition to raising money to aid approximately 3,000 arthritis sufferers in this area, the campaign would seek to expand public knowledge about arthritis and its symptoms."

"Too many people think of arthritis as a disease of the elderly. That simply is not true. In its most crippling form it strikes most frequently between the ages of 18 and 40. And it strikes people from all walks of life. It is a major health hazard in fact the nation's number one crippling disease," he said. "Not nearly enough is being done about it. It is imperative that we continue and step up our programs to aid the country's 17 million arthritis sufferers."

The chairman said that neighborhood volunteers will pass out flyers during the door-to-door campaign listing the major warning signs and symptoms of arthritis which are: Persistent pain and stiffness upon arising; pain or tenderness in at least one joint; swelling in at least one joint; recurrence of these symptoms; pain and stiffness in fingerlips, hands and feet, and unexplained weight loss, fever, weakness or fatigue.

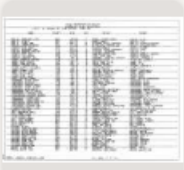

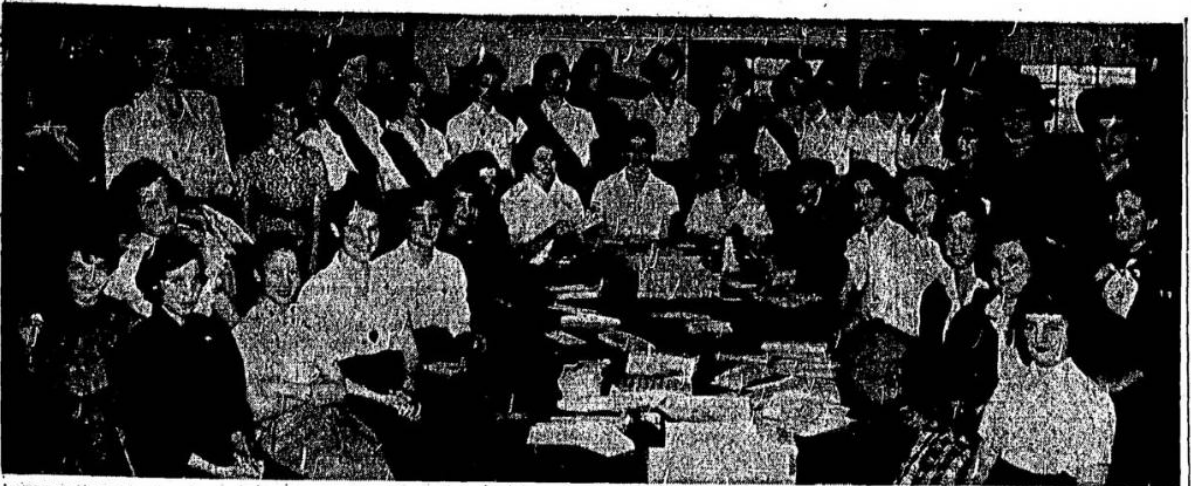

Brownwood Girl Scout Tells Of Experiences At National Roundup

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following story was written by Miss Elwana Hawthorne following her return the past week from the National Senior Girl Scout Roundup held near Detroit, Mich. A senior student at Brownwood High School, Miss Hawthorne is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. B. L. Hawthorne, 1218 Duke. She describes below some of her experiences at the Roundup.

A busload of laughing girls jounced up the road to the sheep barn, and the National Senior Girl Scout Roundup was on.

Within 36 hours we had pitched 3,000 tents on the rolling woodlands of the Highland State Recreation Area. Charcoal fires snapped in 600 outdoor kitchens, and the Stars and Stripes whipped out over 150 troop sites.

For 12 days we lived together. We ate more than 16 tons of meat and fish and drank nearly a quarter of a million glasses of milk. More than 20,000 visitors came to see us.

Four times we came together as a family—to raise our voices, 6,000 strong, around the opening campfire, to thrill to the march of flags on the 4th of July. We had for speakers on the 4th Charleton Heston, Jacqueline Cochran, and Dr. Lillian Gilbreath. We danced the American Girl Polka at the

Americana pageant and heard the Girl Scout story on our last night together.

For the first few days it was "Hi, where are you from?" We found that there were girls from the 48 states and such countries as Norway, Denmark, Alaska, Canada, and Brazil. We learned

to know each other by our hats—10 gallon hats, sunbonnets, sombreros, coonskin caps, and crash helmets. Then we started swapping, and a California prospector's hat turned up, like as not on a patrol leader from Tennessee.

Hats weren't the only things we swapped. Water from the Panama Canal went for oil from President Eisenhower's farm. I took devilclaws, cockleburs, book marks and earscrews and pins in the shape of Texas. The devilclaws and cockleburs were all the go. I called them snipes and porcupine eggs. We actually had one woman from New York trying to hatch porcupines.

There will be a display of my swaps all day today in Waisman's window.

We learned to speak each other's language. At first accents fascinated. Do you say "to-mah-to" or "to-may-to," "hi, there" or "hello, yo' all?"

There were people to remember—the people who made the Roundup possible, and the people at home who made it possible for me to attend. I remembered the civic clubs in Brownwood and friends—especially my Girl Scout leaders, Mrs. Ray Masters, and Mrs. Eddy.

Ray Masters, and Mrs. Eddye Farren—then the people who have planned and worked three years on the Roundup.

On the way to the Roundup we had a tour of Forest Park Zoo in St. Louis, and we saw Cinerama. In Michigan we saw Greenfield Village, Henry Ford Museum, and the Ford assembly plant. We had a six-hour ride down the Mississippi River on the return trip home.

Miss Hawthorne arrived in Dallas Thursday on her return trip home. Mrs. Ray Masters and Mrs. Eddye Farren met her there and accompanied her home.

In addition to being an outstanding Girl Scout, Elwana has served as president of District III, Future Homemakers of America and as president of her local chapter. She attended the state FHA meet last

year.

She served as a member of the BHS student council the past two years and was a delegate to the state student council last year.

Miss Hawthorne was selected by her classmates as Junior Class favorite. She is a member of the high school orchestra.

The NBC-TV program, "On Home," at 9 a.m. Monday, will feature the National Girl Scout Roundup, an event that is only held once in three years.

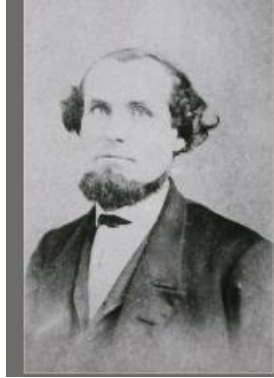

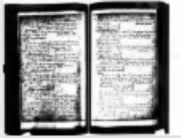

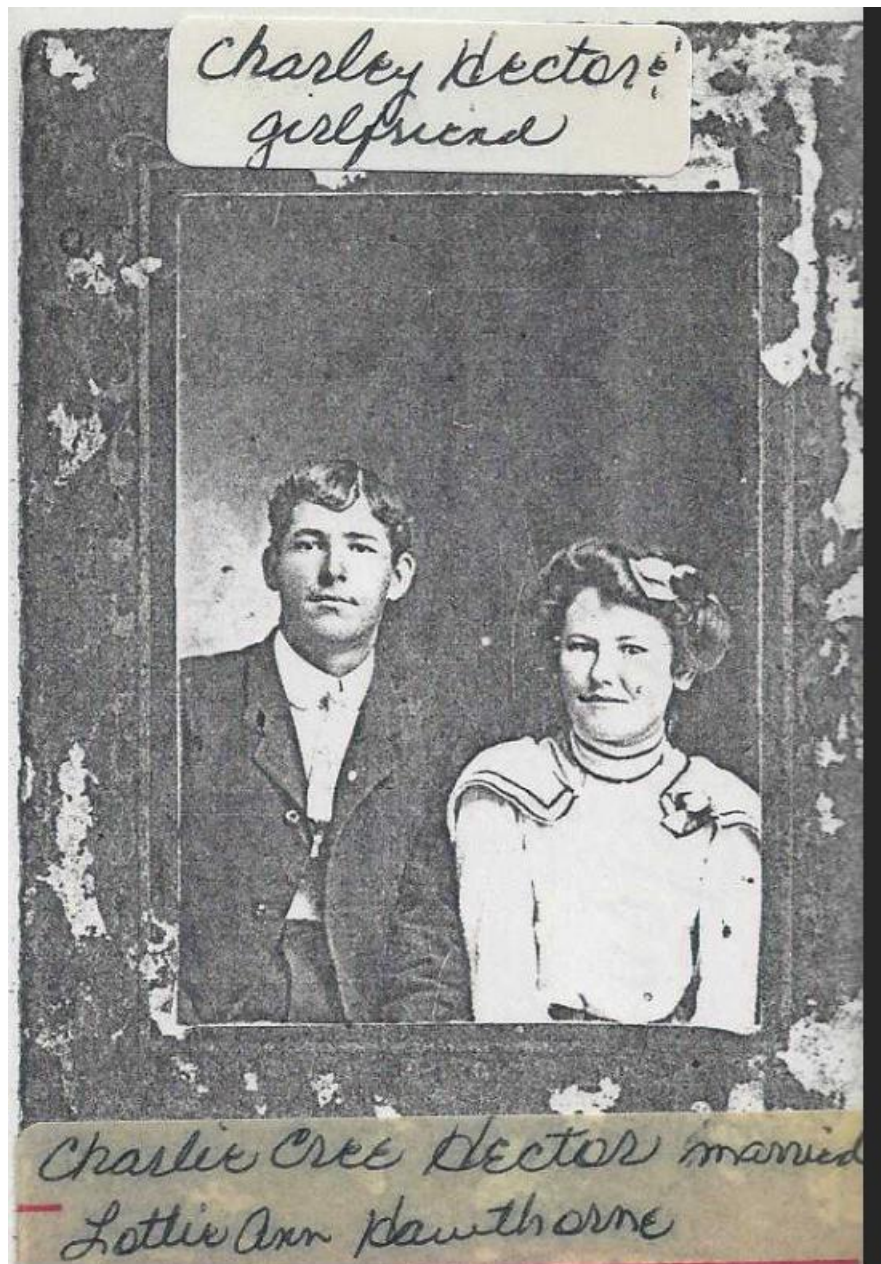

A.J. Hawthorn whose name is listed as J.A. Hawthorn on the population schedule owned 20 acres of improved land and 100 acres unimproved valued at \$400. He owned farm implements worth \$16 and \$120 worth of livestock. Estimated value of farm production for 1879 was \$175. He had 1 horse and 2 cows, both of which had dropped calves. Fort pounds of butter was produced. He had 7 swine and 10 poultry which laid 20 dozen eggs. Five acres of Indian Corn produced 50 bushels and 8 acres of cotton produced 3 bales. He had cut 25 cords of wood worth \$20.

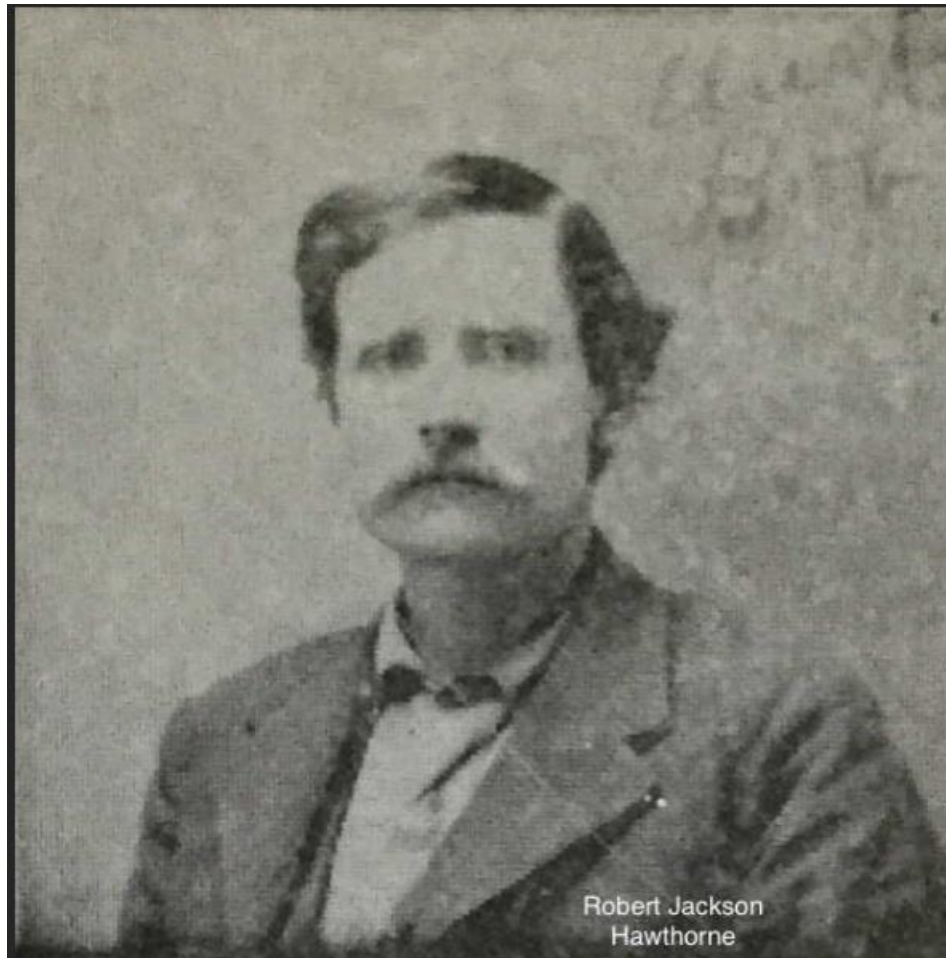

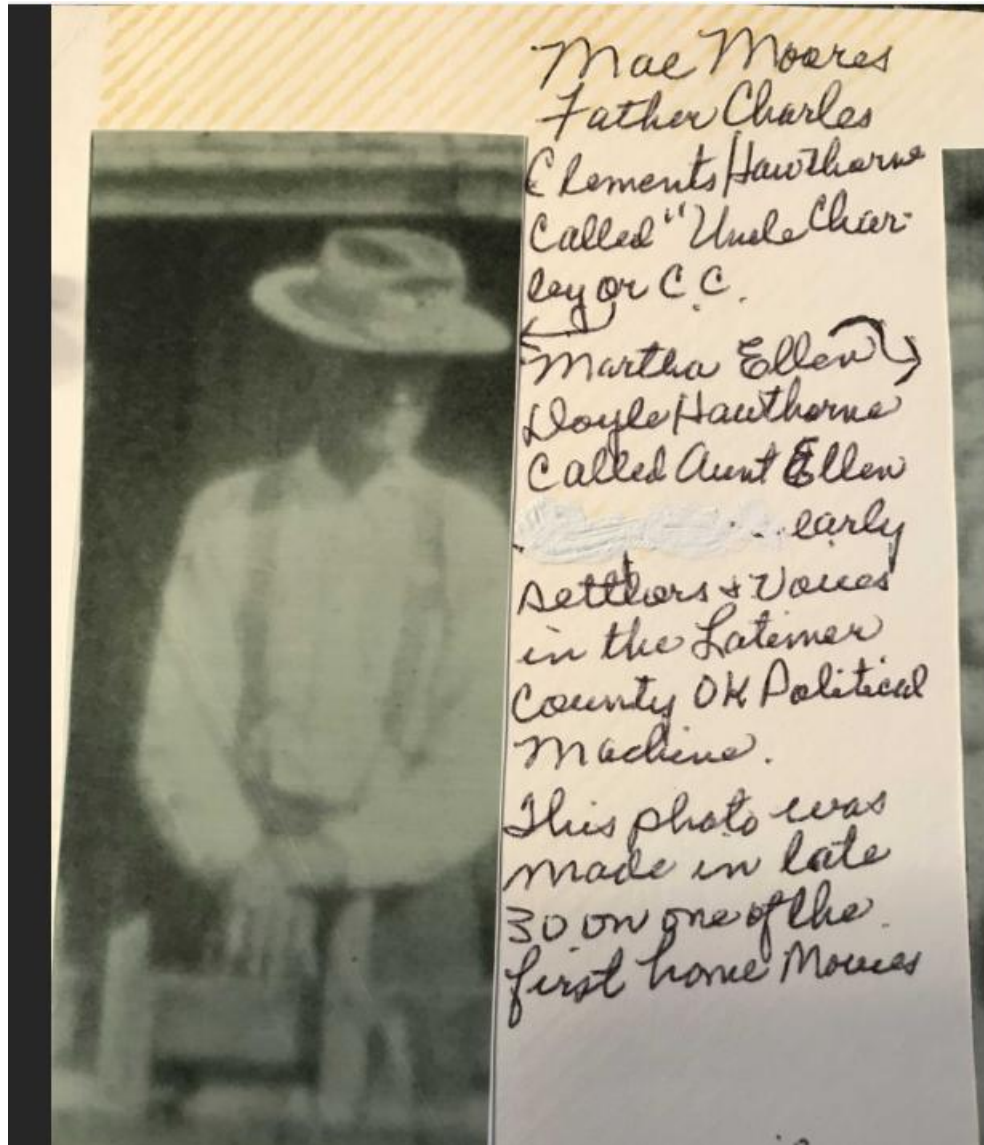

Confederate Pension request by Mrs. Elzada Hawthorne of Caradon, Mills Co. TX, filed 19 Jan 1925; rejected 12 Feb 1925 by S.H. Ferrell, commissioner of pensions. Widow of Charles Henry Hawthorne, who died 28 Jul 1897 in Scott Co. AR. They were married 26 May 1881 in Scott Co. AR. She is age 58, born Sebastian Co. AR, has lived in TX since 1897 & 5 years in Caradan. She says Charles never drew a pension. His commission was originally in the state of MO & he spent 4 years in service, in Co. A, 3rd Cavalry Regiment, 6th Division, Missouri State Guard. This was sworn to on 7 Jun 1924. Witness G.W. Dunn signed it 14 Jun 1924 & A.H. Weathers [her son-in-law] on 25 Oct 1924. She said the value of her homestead was nothing & the value of her other property was nothing.

Another attempt to gain a Confederate pension was granted on 31 May 1956, when she was residing at 2412 Avenue C, Brownwood TX. Copied above.
