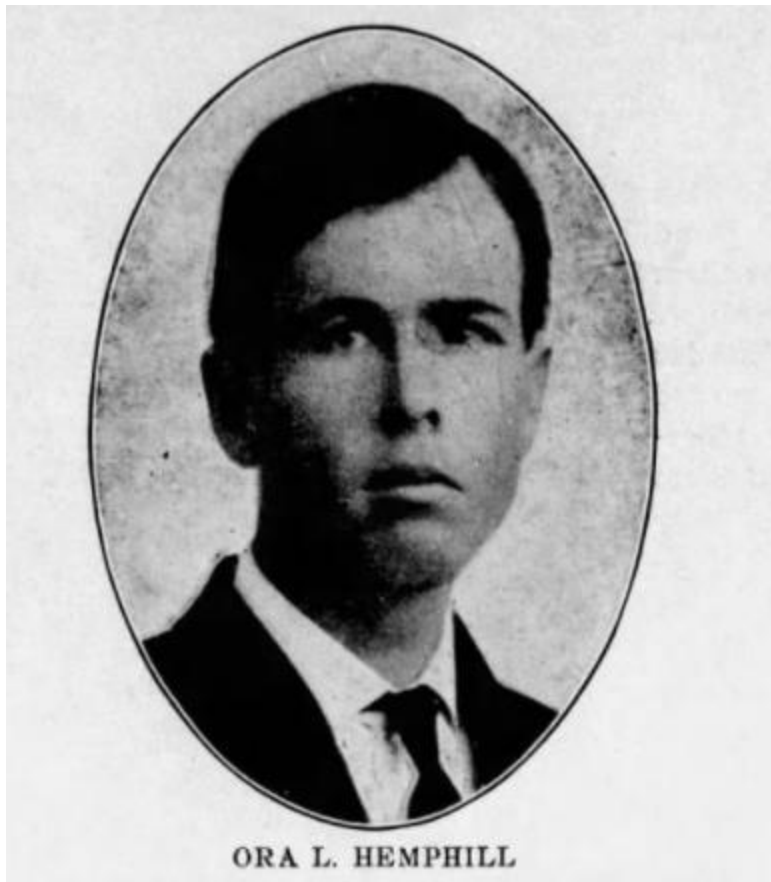

Ora L. Hemphill, AHD Engineer, Is Dead, Little Rock

Former Chief Highway Engineer Succumbs After Illness of Several Months

Little Rock, Feb. 29.—Ora L. Hemphill, 47, construction engineer for the State Highway department and former chief engineer, died at his home here today following an illness of several months.

Mr. Hemphill first became associated with the highway department in 1921. In 1927 he was appointed highway engineer, but resigned several months after to re-enter private contracting work. Several years later he returned to the highway department as construction engineer, a position he has held since.

Stillwater, Okla., Sept. 7.—At a meeting of the faculty of the A. and M. college a military organization for the corps of students was outlined as recommended by Colonel Fravel, commandant of the corps. The plan contemplates organization into five companies of infantry of not less than sixty men to the company. HIGHWAY COMMISSION COMPLETES ELECTION DISTRICT ENGINEERS

Reorganization of the state highway system, as recommended by federal authorities, was completed with the appointment today of Richardson Ayres and O. L. Hemphill, as district engineers for the highway department, at the regular monthly meeting of the state highway commission and advisory board.

The present plan provides for five district engineers to have supervision over road work with R. C. Limerick state highway engineer, as general supervisor of the entire highway improvement work for the state.

The complete personnel and districts over which they have supervision are as follows: G. H. Sykes, central district with headquarters at Little Rock; W. C. Hight, northwest district with headquarters at Fayetteville; Mr. Ayres was appointed to succeed E. B. Reynolds at Hope; Mr. Reynolds was today selected for the southeast district with headquarters at Pine Bluff; Mr. Hemphill, northwest district with headquarters at Forrest City.

District State Highway Engineer is Making Inspection of Vast Stretches—Over 200 Miles of Good Roads.

Earle, March 3.—Crittenden county has more hard-surfaced roads than any other county in Arkansas, according to O. L. Hemphill, district state highway engineer, of Forrest City, who is here on his regular inspection trip.

Mr. Hemphill is engineer for the first district composed of 17 counties in eastern and northeastern Arkansas. He said that Phillips county was second in the district in good roads construction. He was favorably impressed at the maintenance of Crittenden roads, of which there are at present 12 miles of concrete, 130 miles of gravel already constructed and another 60 miles to be constructed in the county's sixth district.

Notices were mailed late Thursday to an additional 169 men to appear before the Little Rock Exemption Board No. 1, having jurisdiction over that part of Little Rock east of Gaines street, to appear next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday for medical examinations.

The district's quota for the first draft of the national army is 169, but the board has summoned a total of double the number, estimating that 50 per cent of those called will be exempted. The first 169 were ordered to report on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week.

If the board is unable to get 169 men who are not exempted and who physically qualified for army service from the 338 men called, the men next in line for draft from the master lists will be called.

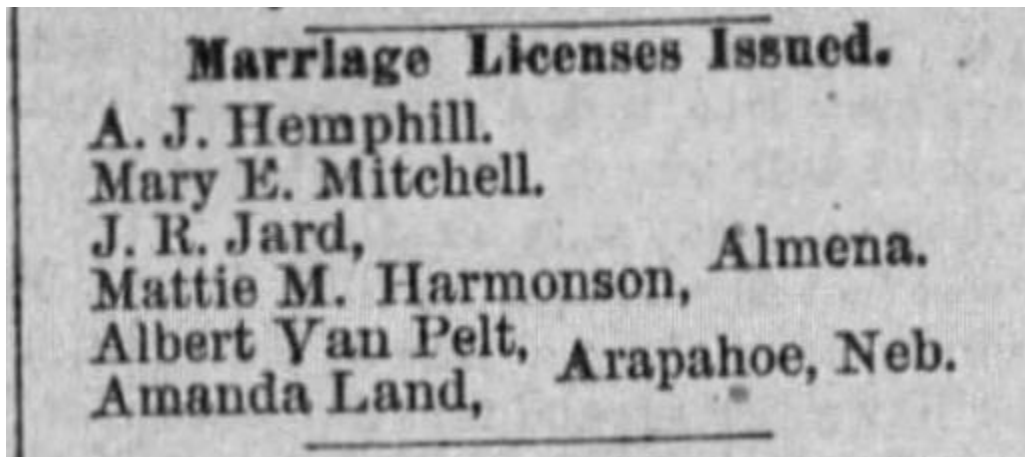
