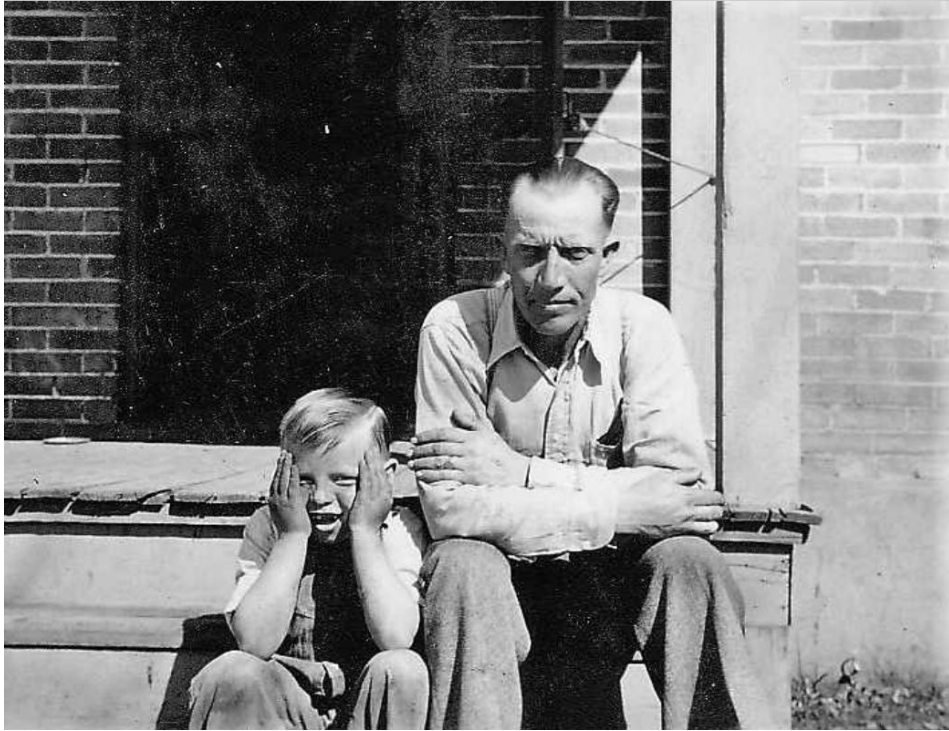

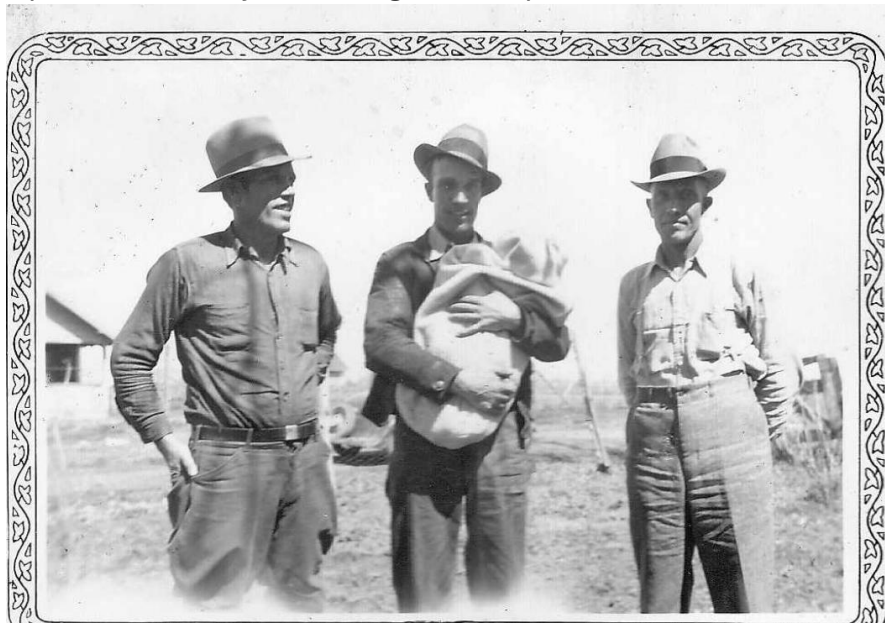

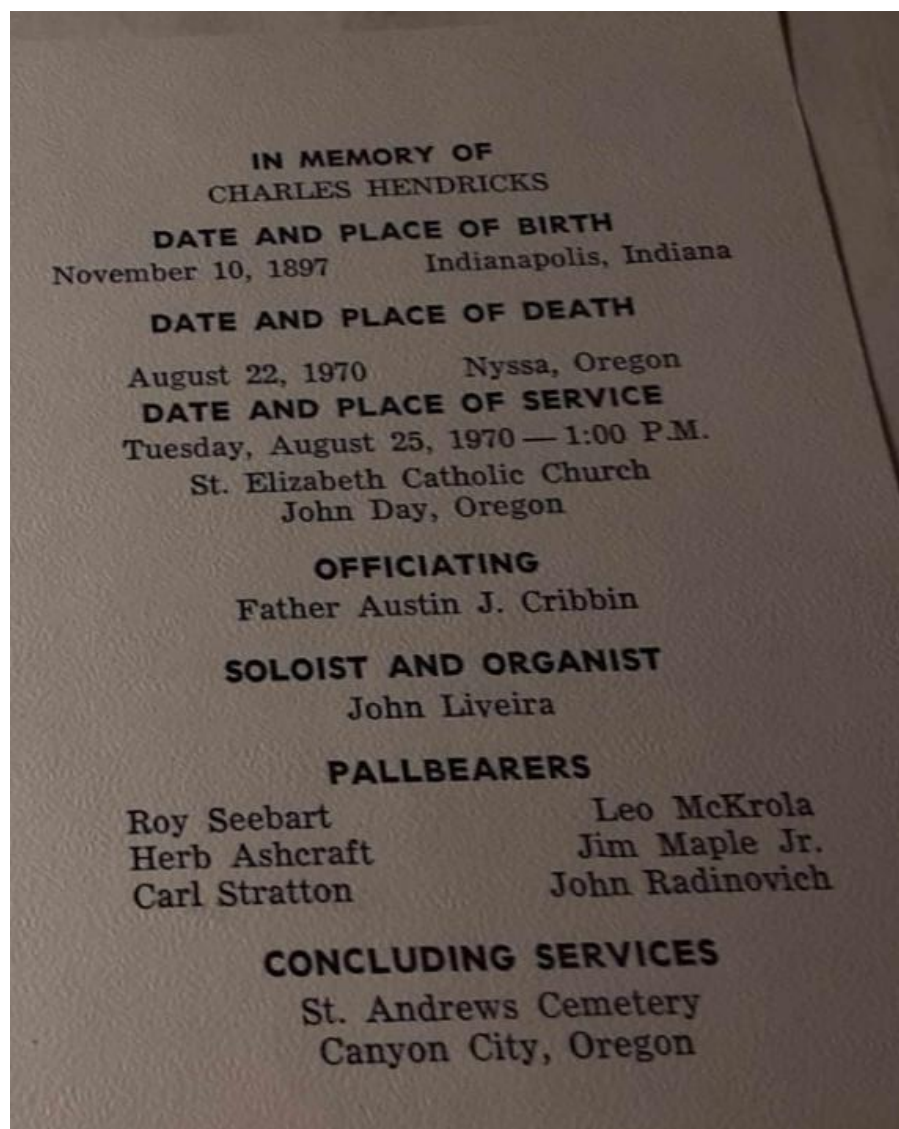

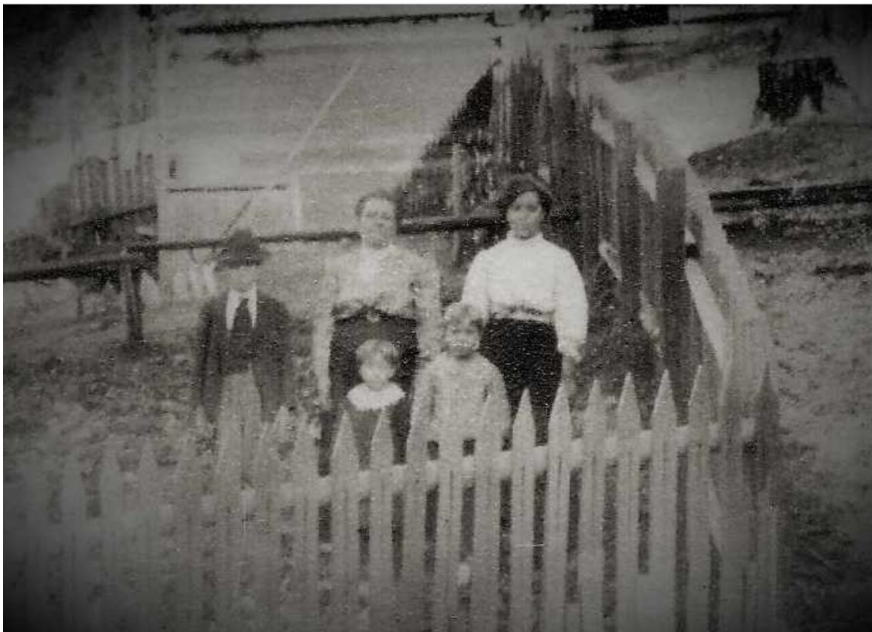

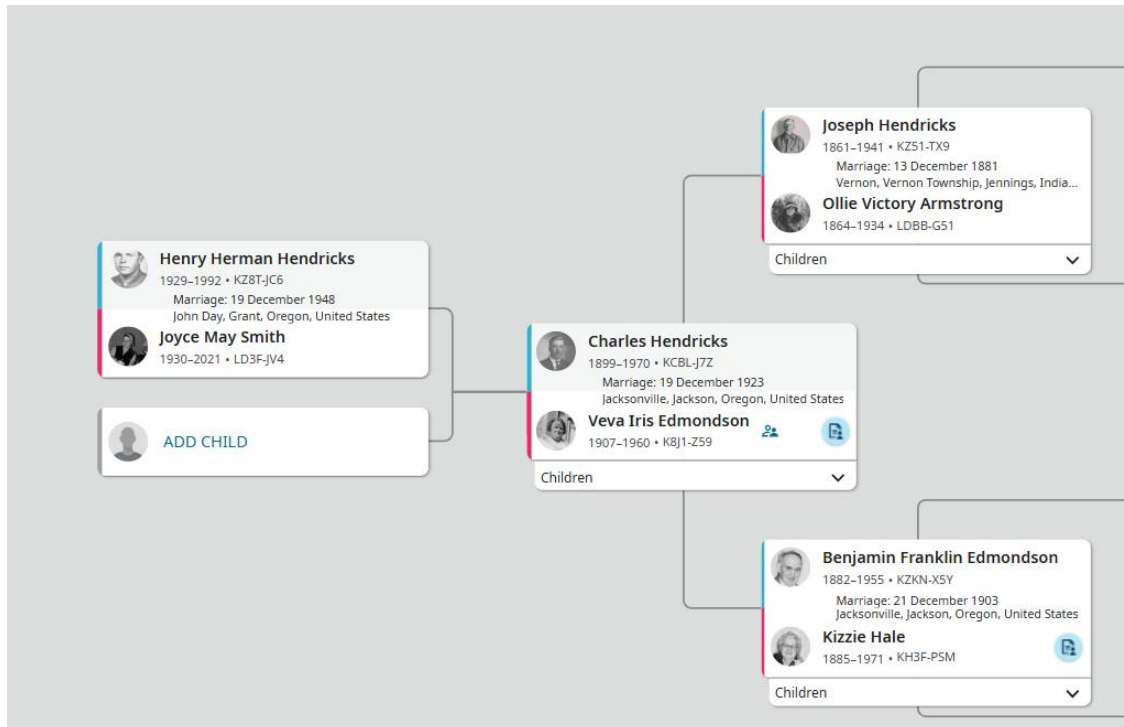

Charles Hendricks, 73, of John Day, died Saturday, Aug. 22, in Nyssa. Funeral services were held Tuesday, Aug. 25, at St. Elizabeth Catholic Church in John Day with the Rev. Austin J. Cribbin officiating. Burial was at St. Andrews Cemetery in Canyon City. Driskill Mortuary of John Day was in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Hendricks was born Nov. 10, 1897, in Indianapolis, Ind., and was a retired timber feller. He was also a veteran of World War I and a member of the Catholic Church.

Mr. Hendricks was the hus-

MANY OREGONIANS ABOARD TUSCANIA

WAR DEPARTMENT GIVES OUT
PASSENGER LIST.

Casualty List Not Yet Made Up.
Names of 16 Portland Men
Among Those Given.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Feb. 7.—The War Department tonight made public a list of names of all passengers aboard the transport *Tuscania* when she was torpedoed off the north coast of Ireland. The list is not a casualty list, but a complete passenger list, containing the names of all who sailed on the *Tuscania*. At midnight the casualty list had not been made public, if received. Among the passengers were many Oregon men, for the most part members of the 20th Engineers, the forestry regiment. On this passenger list appear the following Oregon names:

Charles Hendricks, Klamath Falls.

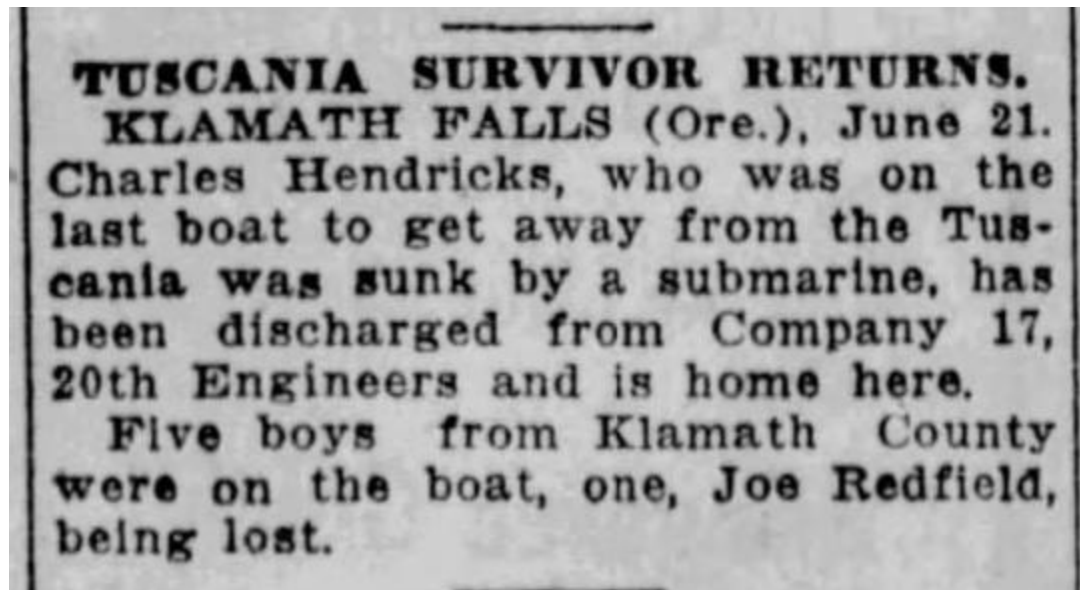
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"It certainly was a sinking sen-
sation," declared Charles Hendricks
who was on the last boat to get away
from the sinking Tuscania on that
foggy night of February 5th, 1918,
when the big boat went to the bot-
tom about fifteen miles from the
Irish coast.

Hendricks, who has just had his
honorable discharge from the 17th
Company of Engineers, recorded at
the County Clerk's office here, in re-
ferring to the incident said that the
transport floated over three hours af-
ter being struck, dropping gradually
lower in the water. The Tuscania
had been dodging nearly all that af-
ternoon in an effort to escape the U
boats and in a few minutes more it
would have been too dark for the
periscopes to detect her. Three de-
stroyers reached the scene before the
boat sunk, the one on which Hen-
dricks departed, getting away about
thirty minutes before she disap-
peared.

Five boys from Klamath county
were on the boat, one, Joe Redfield,
being lost.

Grant High Band Wins Superior Rating At Bend Festival

Students from nine schools, 800 strong, took part in the East-Central Oregon competitive music festival last Friday, April 16 in Bend Oregon. The group included 240 Bend students, and about 560 from Redmond, Madras, Culver, Prineville, Lakeview, John Day and Dayville. The bright uniforms of the various bands added color to the occasion, as the groups took their turns for auditions, to be rated by a committee of school specialists. The judges were: John Stohn of the University of Oregon; Maurice Brennen of Willamette University and Leslie Armstrong, music instructor in the Olympia, Washington public schools.

The Grant High Band was the last group to be judged and was given a 1 rating, which makes the band eligible to participate at the state competitive music festival, next month in Eugene. Following are the ratings awarded other schools: Senior high school bands: Class B—Bend 1; Redmond 2; Class C—Burns 2; Madras 3; John Day 1. Interperating these ratings, 1, superior, 2, excellent, 3, good and 4 fair.

The school gymnasium was filled to capacity that night, for the concert of band, chorus and orchestra music, climaxing the festival program. Participating in the program were some 500 students, including a 350 piece band, a 250 voiced chorus and a 15 piece string group. Four hundred tickets were available for spectators and all were sold in advance and none were available at the door.

FIFTEEN-YEAR-OLD GIRL TAKES HER OWN LIFE

AFTER A QUARREL WITH HER
SEVENTEEN-YEAR-OLD LOVER.

SWALLOWED CARBOLIC ACID

The Boy Just Before Had Snatched
Some Morphine from Her—Only
Pretended Anger, He Said.

Because of a quarrel with her boy sweetheart, Lillie Hendricks, the fifteen-year-old daughter of Joseph and Ollie Hendricks, of 1439 Blaine avenue, West Indianapolis, took her life last night by swallowing carbolic acid.

She died in W. K. Gardner's drug store, at 1635 Howard street, surrounded by a half hundred persons, and in the presence of her grief-stricken mother and her boy lover, Earl Kipheart, seventeen years old, who lives with his mother at 336 Virginia avenue. The boy had taken from the girl a button picture of himself which she had been wearing. He said he "only pretended" to be angry, and did not know she intended any rash step.

In the little cottage in Blaine avenue this morning the mother of the boy consoled with Lillie's parents, who are almost prostrated. She said she loved the child as her own daughter and encouraged her son in his attentions to her.

Called on Her Often.

During the last year the boy called regularly at the Hendricks home to see Lillie. He took her often to see his mother, and no objections were made by Lillie's parents, although they recognized the increasing regard the boy and girl had for each other. Lillie was a good-looking girl of quiet demeanor, although impulsive, and was loved by all her neighbors. They spoke of her as a good girl.

Last night Earl Kipheart called and spent the evening with Lillie. They quarreled over some trifling matter, and afterward, in a spirit of humor, the boy, who Lillie realized the effect on the girl, refused to become reconciled. He pretended to be angry, and took from Lillie the button picture of himself which she was wearing.

Before Kipheart left the house Lillie went to a closet in another room and took from it a bottle of morphine liniment and a vial containing two ounces of carbolic acid, and hid them in her bosom.

Little dreaming of the serious termination to their love affair, Kipheart left the house after again refusing to "make up." The girl walked with him to the street car two blocks away. Before the car came the girl attempted to seize the button and it was refused her.

Snatched Morphine from Her.

She then intimated that she would kill herself, and walking a few feet away drew the bottle of liniment from her dress and placed it to her lips. With one bound Kipheart was beside her, and seized the bottle before any of the liquid passed her lips. He then poured the contents on the ground and threw the bottle away.

He walked toward the car which was passing the corner, and when about to step aboard looked back over his shoulder in time to see his sweetheart holding the other bottle to her lips. She was opposite the drug store, and the lights showed her actions plainly.

Throwing back her head in a determined way, the girl drained the vial of carbolic acid. Part of the acid fell on her face and hands, burning them severely. She screamed in agony as the empty bottle fell from her hands, and, staggering a few steps, she fell unconscious near the curb.

Mr. Gardner, the druggist, and others, heard the screams and ran to where the girl was lying. One glance sufficed to tell the druggist the cause of the girl's condition. She was carried into the store and Dr. Cortez M. Leeth was hastily sent for. In the meantime the druggist applied antidotes for carbolic acid poisoning, and everything was done to counteract the effects of the poison. Dr. Leeth took charge of the case, but he soon realized that all efforts to revive her were in vain.

As the girl was being carried into the store, Kipheart ran with all speed to the Hendricks home. He called through an open window:

"O dear, Mrs. Hendricks, Lillie has taken poison."

He then ran back to the store and stood about trembling with excitement, while the physician and druggist worked with the girl. Mrs. Hendricks, who had gone to bed, hurriedly dressed and ran into the street. She had no idea where her daughter was, and, after running frantically about the neighborhood for several minutes, she stumbled breathlessly into the drug store. The agonizing grief of the woman caused tears to come into the eyes of many of the persons crowded into the place.

The City Dispensary ambulance, in charge of Dr. Kennedy, was called, and the body taken home.

Carl Ralph Hendricks Biography, by Ann Hendricks Covington, August 2018

Carl Hendricks was born 16 May 1911 near Butte Falls, Oregon. He was the youngest of 12 children born to Joseph and Ollie Victory Armstrong Hendricks. He was raised for a few years on a homestead in Jackson County, but the land was extremely steep and could not be successfully cultivated. And I don't believe that there was enough timber on the land to make it a profitable tree lot. His father, Joe, worked in the timber to feed the family. Carl remembered that when he was about 4 or 5 years old he had to be carried because his legs did not work right. Years later he believed that he had contracted polio, and one of his legs was always a bit shorter than the other. As a child, his parents called him "Buster". That led to his being called "Buss" by his family and closest friends for the rest of his life. That is what my mother always used to call him. However, his other associates called him Carl.

The family finally gave up on the Oregon venture when Carl was 7 or 8 years old and moved to Ashton, Idaho. He trapped muskrats in the creeks and rivers around Ashton as a boy. He told some of his grandchildren about going to the 9th grade in the Ashton City schools and playing baseball on the school team. Interestingly enough, I have a certificate that Carl received in May 1925 for being "Neither Absent Nor Tardy" during the entire school year. But Dad told us that he did not like school and he dropped out in the 11th grade. He worked at various jobs as a farmhand or anything else he could find to help support his parent's family. He spent some time during the early 1930's in the Civilian Conservation Corps, driving a truck near Salmon, Idaho.

He continued to love baseball, and tried to play on any team he could find wherever he lived. (I recall him playing on the Seneca town team when we first moved there in the late 1940's.) And Dad followed Major League Baseball on the radio and television his entire life. He also loved to read and spent hours reading the newspaper after work every day when I was a kid.

"Buss" and Lula Rachel McLane met in Ashton, courted around Ashton, and were married there on 5 July 1934. (In 1984 they told the Forest Grove Ward Newsletter editor that when they married Carl was playing semi-pro baseball in Ashton and that he was working at a saw mill.) After they married he worked in the woods falling timber, as a truck driver at the construction of Grassy Lake Dam, sorting potatoes in the seed potato industry in Ashton, and as a bar tender in the local pool halls. Lula had been teaching school in St. Anthony during what we call the Great Depression. But when she married she lost her job because married women were supposed to be supported by their husbands.

"Buss" and Lula's first child, Carl Clayne was born in Chester, Idaho, at her parent's home, on 19 December 1935. They had three more children all born in Ashton: Ilene Marie, 5 February 1938; Robert Laurel, 17 June 1939, and Patricia Ann, 14 September 1941. Carl had to work very hard to support his growing family while Lula stayed at home to care for the children. Mom (Lula) had red blond hair and green eyes. Dad (Carl) had dark brown hair and dark brown eyes and was about 5' 11" tall. When I was a young girl he always seemed really tall to me, until I was in 8th grade when I grew to be 5' 10" so he was not much taller than I. And unfortunately, although his father had a full head of hair when he died, Carl inherited the baldness genes from his mother's family, as did all of his older brothers that I knew. So most of my life and all the lives of his grandkids, they only knew him as a bald guy with a fringe of hair. When I was young, Dad always wore a hat, and when I was a teen, he wore baseball caps. He said he had to keep his head from being sun burned. Even though we kids all had different colored hair and complexions, we all inherited his dark brown eyes, which I thought was really neat.

In March 1944 Carl joined the Army and went to Camp Roberts, California, for his training. Before he was shipped out to Europe, Lula traveled to California to visit him. He went to Germany via England and France, arriving in September 1944, after the D-Day invasion so he was not involved in that action. But he told me that he enter France somewhere near the port facilities that had been built near the Omaha Beach Area. While in Germany, somewhere near Aachen, (near the place where Holland, Belgium and Germany join, according to Helen E. Hendricks' short bio) Carl injured his back when he slipped while jumping over a ditch carrying a heavily loaded pack. He suffered back pain all the rest of his life because of this injury and thought that the polio he'd had as a child probably contributed to the problems. He later had spinal fusion surgery, and for a long time wore a brace to help stabilize his back.

Dad did not talk much about what else he'd done in Europe. He did visit a couple of his Army buddies once when we were on one of our trips in the western U. S., and he did mention visiting Oberammergau(?). And there are some photos of him and his buddies in the album I have. But when I asked about them toward the end of his life, he could not remember names or places and did not want to talk about it much. I think he had a Purple Heart Medal, but I don't know why. Mom told me years after he was in the Army that she wanted Dad to stay in when the war was over. It was a sure paycheck, and his former occupation as a bar tender was not a very stable career. And since she was a school teacher, she could find a job most anywhere because she had been teaching while he was away in the Army. But Dad did not like the Army, so he was discharged 7 December 1945 when he came back from Europe.

In 1946 they decided to move to La Grande, Oregon, where "Buss" would work for his brother-in-law Roy Magden. He worked in The Corner Café across from the passenger train depot in La Grande. The family of six lived in a one bedroom apartment above the café, and sometime during that fall there was a fire in the warehouse where their furniture was stored, so they lost most of their household goods. During the summer of 1947 the family lived in a house behind Uncle Roy and Aunt Ethel Magden's house in La Grande while Lula went to Summer school at Eastern Oregon College to obtain her Oregon Teaching Certificate. Later that summer the family moved to Seneca, Oregon. Carl had obtained employment with Edward Hines Lumber Company, where his brother Charlie had worked for several years. Lula was hired to teach at Seneca Elementary School, where she worked for the rest of the time they lived in Seneca.

Dad was born with only the name Carl, but when he was growing up he really liked the name Ralph so he began using that as his middle name when he became an adult. I don't believe that was ever legally added to his name, but he was Carl Ralph Hendricks, or Carl R. Hendricks, for the rest of his life. When he joined the Church in 1955, that name was used on all his church records.

In Seneca, Dad worked as a "Choker Setter", which was a pretty dangerous job. That is the person who puts the cables around the cut logs so they can be skidded to the landings to be sent either by truck or railroad to the saw mill. Dad lost part of a finger in an accident while doing that job. He also worked as a "Stripper", walking the surveyed timber to mark the trees to be harvested. Later he also drove one of the work crew busses from town to the job site. This was a good use of the truck driving skills he had gotten in the CCC years earlier. Carl's last job with Edward Hines was as a "Log Scaler". This was his favorite job, and he was really good at the math involved. After the trees were cut down, the limbs were removed, and the trees were cut into lengths for the saw mill to cut into lumber. Dad's job was to walk the cut logs to measure their length and to measure the log's diameter with a huge caliper. Then he had to figure the board feet of lumber in each log and that is how the timber fallers were paid. He was able to add long columns of numbers in his head. At the end of the day the office workers in town, using an adding machine, always checked his calculations. There were seldom any mistakes, and they said Carl was their favorite "Scaler" because he made their jobs so easy.

In September 1955, Carl was baptized a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Moscow, Idaho, where Clayne was attending the University of Idaho. In July 1956, Dad and Mom were sealed in the Idaho Falls Temple and we kids were also sealed as a family. For the rest of his life Carl was an active member of the

church, first in the John Day Branch, then in the Forest Grove and Banks Wards. Lula had been a member of the church her whole life and a bunch of her family history had already been done. So while they lived at Banks, Mom and Dad spent a lot of time researching his family who were from Indiana and Kentucky. That was an enormous help to me (Ann) as I have tried to continue the research on Dad's family lines.

Because of his childhood polio and his injury during the war, Dad's back became increasingly painful through the years as he walked the uneven ground in the woods. After a couple of back surgeries, he had to stop working in the woods about 1960. Since Mom (Lula) was still teaching they stayed in Seneca (with one year away in Southern California). Dad began raising chinchillas after they moved back from California, and worked at that for most of the rest of his life in Seneca and then near Banks, Oregon, where they moved in 1970.

He liked showing the chinchillas even though it was a lot of work to care for them. My brother, Laurel, financed the operation, so it was called the "Lucala Chilla Ranch". I don't believe they every made any profit, but Mom, Dad, and Laurel all had a lot of fun working with the chinchillas through the years. And after my parents passed away, my brother Clayne and his wife Helen continued the chinchilla operation with Laurel. Watching the animals was greatly entertaining to the grandkids whenever they came to visit.

While living at Banks, Carl and Lula had a huge garden in back of their house which they both loved to tend, even though it was really hard work. Mom especially loved the fresh vegetables, and planted several fruit trees and berry bushes as well. Dad said it reminded him of when he was growing up in Ashton, when they often, during the summer, had only the food they could raise in their own garden. And Mom and Dad had all kinds of flowers around their yard. They had not been able to grow many of these things in Seneca, because of the freezing temperatures all year round there.

The family always loved to travel, and when I was a kid we visited all the Western States in the U.S. And I know that they traveled to New York when Laurel graduated from the Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point. They visited us in California, Virginia, Hawaii and Japan, and made many trips to Alaska while Laurel worked there. They visited Clayne in Arkansas, Utah and probably Montana, Marie in California, and my cousin Betty in Georgia. And they made many trips to various places when they were showing the Chinchillas. So I think they could have been called world travelers.

Lula passed away in August 1987, and a few years later, after Clayne and his wife Helen moved to Banks to help with the Chinchillas, Carl moved to a retirement home in Forest Grove, Oregon, where he lived the rest of his life. I remember once talking to

him by phone about his new home and he said his neighbors were "...dropping like flies around him." When I laughed he said that they were all younger than he was at the time, so he thought it was a good joke.

He lived a good life, generated lots of good memories with his kids and grandkids, and was an independent soul to the end of his days. Carl, Dad, passed away in June 1995 at the age of 84. He is buried with Lula, Mom, in Union Point Cemetery overlooking the town of Banks, Oregon.

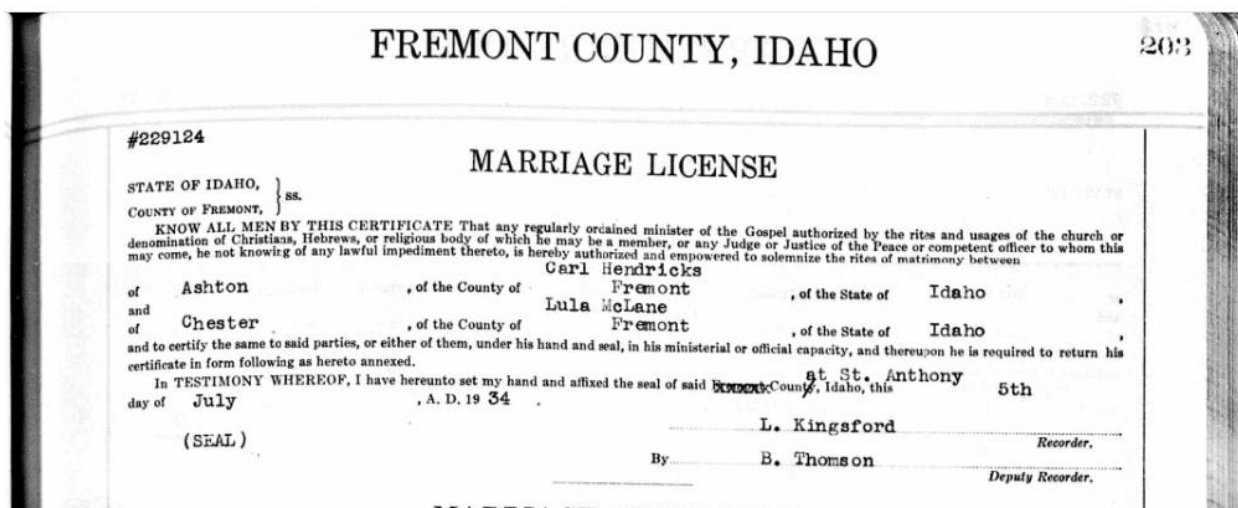
