John Herman, 70, Passes Away

John Herman, 70, a lifelong resident of Richland County, passed away yesterday afternoon at the Richland Memorial Hospital following a long period of ill health.

The son of Philip Herman and Anna Iffert, he was born in Richland County on October 18, 1892. Mr. Herman was never married. He served his country in World War I as a member of 337th Infantry Division of the United States Army. He was a member of Richland Post No. 30 of the American Legion.

He leaves three brothers: Otto Herman, Leo Herman and Carl Herman, all of Olney.

Funeral Mass will be held on Thursday morning at 9 o'clock in St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Olney with the Rev. Fr. George P. Lally the celebrant. Interment will follow in the family plot at St. Joseph's cemetery.

The Holy Rosary will be recited in the Summers-Rainey Funeral Home tonight at 8 o'clock. Friends may call at the funeral home.

Members of Richland Post No. 30 of the American Legion will render military graveside rites at the cemetery.

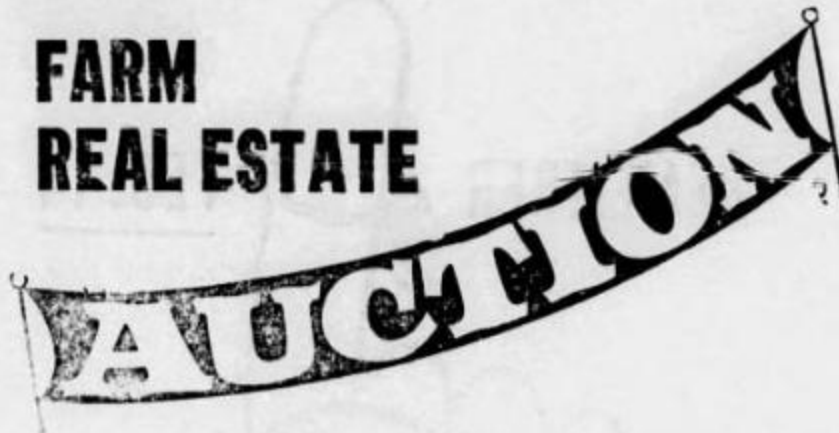

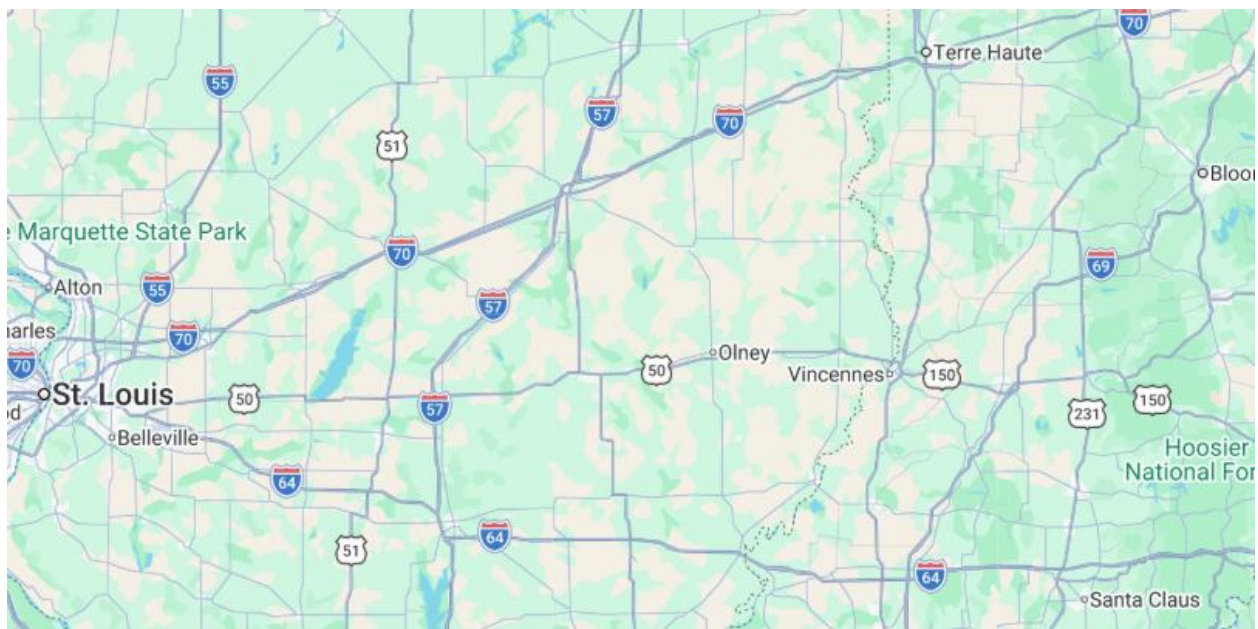

Monday morning word was received that Mr. Herman was among the survivors, having been saved from the wreck and landed in Ireland. Mr. Herman enlisted from Sweden, Texas, where he was engaged in farming with his brother, Dan Herman.

MR. HERMANN IS GIVEN ASSURANCE

Philip Hermann, father of John I. Hermann who was aboard the Tuscania, today received a telegram from Congressman Foster, assuring him that his son was safe and uninjured. Congressman Foster added that his exact location could not be communicated.

Mr. Hermann this morning also received from the sailing station of his son, a post card which the boy wrote to be mailed after the arrival in Europe.

**JOHN HERMANN,
ONE OF TUSCANIA
VICTIMS, WRITES
FROM ENGLAND**

Mr. and Mrs. Philip Herman today got their first word from their son, John Herman, who was on the Tuscania when it was sunk north of Ireland. Two letters came, postmarked "Horn Hill Camp, Winchester, England".

The letters follow:

Feb. 10, 1918—Dear Parents: Arrived Somewhere in England safe and feeling fine. This is sure a beautiful country.

The climate is sure a surprise to one I was expecting to see, this land covered with snow and ice and very cold. Although it is cloudy and rainy here a greater part of the time it isn't very bad.

The pastures are covered with a fine coat of grass. Cattle, horses and sheep are sure in fine condition.

There is a lot of plowing done and this and this land sure don't look like it had been farmed for centuries, it is so well improved.

Well this is all for now, will write more the next time.

Hoping this will find you all well.

Feb. 15, 1918—Dear Parents, Brothers and Sisters: I am well, hoping these few lines will meet you the same.

Our sleeping quarters are pretty good as we have barracks to live in. Although they are not as good as they were in the good old U. S. A. they are a lot better than I expected.

We get enough to eat although we are on war rations.

Have to have our money exchanged for English money before we can buy anything. All goes in half penny, half penre, shelling, half crown and crown. A penny in English coin is worth two pennies in American coin. A shilling is twenty-four cents in American money or

four cents in American money or about the same as a twenty-five cent piece, about the same size. A penny in English is as large as a half dollar in American. When we get to France will have this money affair all new again. The trouble there will be we can't take with them only by motion; be a whole lot like it was in Southwest Texas with the Mexicans.

Having pretty good weather generally, although it is cloudy practically all the time, never have any bright sunshining days like there at home or southwest Texas, although I guess it will be different here in the summer months.

Have you heard from Dan lately, and is he still in Camp Travis.

I was on the Tuscania when she was struck by the torpedo, but I got through all right. So don't worry about me as I will tell you all about my experiences when I get back home.

TUSCANIA SURVIVOR WRITES FROM BRITAIN

Feb. 24, 1918--Mr. and Mrs. Phillip Herman. Dear Parents: Will write you a few lines. I am well. Hoping this will meet you the same. Are having pretty fair weather here now, more or less cloudy the greater part of the time. Had freezing weather about two or three days last week, the ground was frozen about an inch or so in depth. I guess by the time you get this letter you will be farming some as I don't think you will get this till about the middle of March. And believe me, I sure would like to help you farm some this spring, instead of the job that I have. But as it is now I may be some in time to help pick corn or help Mr. Mitchell pick some of them good old Ben Davis apples.

Do you ever get any letters from Julius Howland. I haven't heard from him since I left Duval Co. I had Dan to sent for me from Camp Travie. I mean the hat and pants.

Has that insurance policy been sent to you by now. I mean the W. S. insurance policy

Will close for now, hoping this will meet you all well. Yes and by the way I am doing my religious duties as I used to do. I received the Sacraments last Sunday but I haven't joined the K. of C. as yet. I may do so later. From

Somewhere in England, March 5, 1918. Mr and Mrs. Philip Herman. Dear Parents: I am well and feeling fine hoping these few lines will find you all well.

We go on a hike nearly every day now, take a different route very near every time, sure like to go too as this is sure a land of pretty scenery. This morning we went a little farther than usual. I think the lieutenant wanted to come back on a different road than he took us out on but every time he turned in a road that we thought would lead back to camp we would get farther away or lead into some by road or private place so he took us back the same road we came out on. Roads here are not built straight with the world, but run a whole lot with the formation of the land, so it is very easy to get lost.

Philip Herman received a telegram last Sunday from Washington stating that his son, John I. Herman, was severely wounded July 1st. John Herman was on board the Tuscania when it was submarined in the North Irish sea. He was rescued and taken to England. In June he was transferred to the west front.

Phillip Herman, of this city, has received a letter from his son, John, who is in France and who has been reported seriously wounded and dead, stating that John has been transferred to another company and is well and getting along all right.

John Herman came home Monday, having been discharged from the service. He was a member of Co. D, 23rd infantry, and was on the Tuscania when that ship was sunk by a German submarine. He was also wounded by shrapnel in the back and leg.

John Herman, who went down with the ship, Tuscania and was in a life boat for seven hours along a rocky coast and finally rescued; wounded in the left lung with a piece of shrapnel, and later wounded through the knee, arrived home Sunday morning looking none the worse for it.

Paul said that a rear wheel apparently ran over the boy. After Kenneth was run over, he got up and started to run down the road. He ran a short distance and then fell dead.

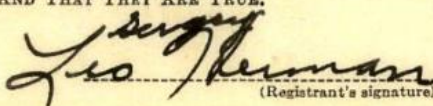
