# PUBLIC SCHOOL NO. 108 HAD THE BIGGEST CLASS

Lyman A. Best, the Principal,  
Graduated Yesterday 139  
Boys and Girls.

## HOW EAST N. Y. HAS GROWN.

In District No. 39 There Were 441  
Graduates, Nearly 1,000 a Year.  
High School Needed.

Public School No. 108, Arlington avenue and Linwood street, was the last, or one of the last, to hold its graduating exercises, but it was also the largest class to be graduated in an elementary school in Brooklyn—sixty-four boys and seventy-five girls, a total of 139. In February there were fifty-four boys and seventy-six girls; total, 130. Both classes this year numbered 269. And No. 108 is not one of the great new buildings, although it was the largest single public school building erected before consolidation. At that time Frank B. Stevens, who was principal of No. 76, on Wyona street, and who was slated for No. 108, had to fight for a large building on the site. The people of Livingston street wanted to put not more than a thirty-two room building there, claiming that a larger building could never be filled. Mr. Stevens prevailed, and the result showed that his foresight was very much better than that of the powers that were at that time. The present powers are making no such mistake. For several years after No. 108 opened there were

years after No. 108 opened there were only two graduating schools in East New York, No. 72, on New Lots road, being the other. In 1896, the first year No. 108 was opened, it had eighty graduates and No. 72 had probably as many more.

Now there are six graduating schools in the same territory, and they graduated in the half year, ending yesterday, 441 pupils, or at the rate of nearly 1,000 a year—sufficient to supply a high school as large as the Manual Training or the Girls High. This is in what is known as District 40, which includes only that part of the Twenty-sixth Ward on the east side of the Manhattan Beach tracks at East New York, and more houses are being erected—two and three family houses at least. In the adjoining district, No. 39, which includes Brownsville, there are nearly as many more graduates, and if there was another high school there it could be filled. East New York ought to have a cosmopolitan high school for itself—and it ought to be a very large one.

Lyman A. Best, the principal of No. 108, had not only the largest class in the borough, but probably the largest class in the city—that is, in an elementary school—with the exception of No. 62, Manhattan, which is the graduating school for the entire district, and has in it only pupils of the last two years. No. 108's assembly hall was entirely too small to accommodate all those who desired to attend the exercises, held yesterday morning. Charles E. Smith, the chairman of the local school board, presided, and the entertainment furnished by the glee club, the orchestra and the class was exceptionally fine. The singing was under the direction of Mrs. Edith Hart, which is always an assurance that time and tone are exactly as they should be. The Rev. Dr. D. C. Snyder was the orator of the occasion, and District Superintendent McCabe, who also made a brief address, presented the diplomas to the following:

Cooky crusaders have arrived to combat the loneliness of the men in quarantine at Camp Dodge on account of Spanish flu.

Under the double star of the Jewish welfare board, 150 Des Moines girls baked cookies enough to fill 500 boxes which were sent yesterday to 500 restless, lonesome boys at the cantonment.

Every soldier who had registered at the Jewish welfare board clubrooms, 715 Grand avenue, is today relieving the tedium of a quarantine Sunday by munching cookies "like mother used to make."

The boxes contained other things besides cookies. Apples and cigarettes were also to be found in these boxes. But the cookies, which came hot and mouth watering from the ovens, are the features of the boxes which are perhaps being received with most delight today.

Although many soldiers besides Jewish soldiers make use of the Jewish welfare board clubrooms and were therefore recipients of the boxes today, it is hoped by Isadore Sondheim, secretary of the Jewish welfare board in Des Moines, that the next time cookies are sent, even a greater number of boys from other denominations can be reached. The cooky crusaders claim that they are anxious to enter the fray again.

The Jewish welfare clubrooms were opened when Camp Dodge was opened Sept. 5, 1917. Since then seventy-five affairs have been given, smokers, dances, lectures and dinner parties. The clubrooms are open at all times to boys of all denominations.

#### Handle Many Cases.

Thousands of personal service cases have been handled by Mr. Sondheim and Max H. Cohen, Jewish worker at Camp Dodge. Money has been sent to boys overseas with the American expeditionary forces and many boys registering at the clubrooms have been put into touch with families in the city who have extended hospitality to them. The Jewish welfare board secretaries get into immediate personal touch with the parents of boys whom they serve.

"We have one message to offer

the boys who enter our clubrooms," says Mr. Sondheim. "It is that they are first and foremost American citizens."

The girls' auxiliary of the Jewish welfare board, which was largely responsible for baking and distributing the cookies, is composed of five companies of girls, each company having a captain and two lieutenants and a company mother. The girls have been organized to do active war work and have purchased Liberty bonds, adopted three Belgian babies and in the present influenza crisis have made hundreds of masks. 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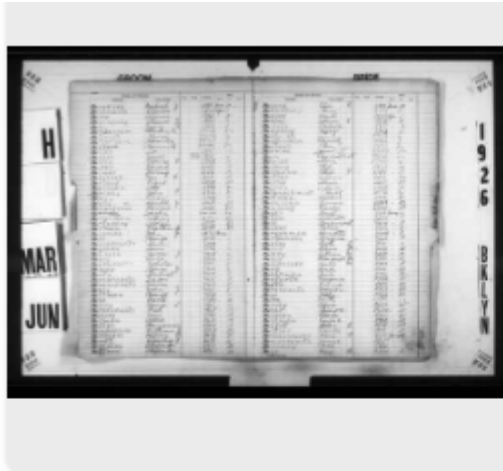

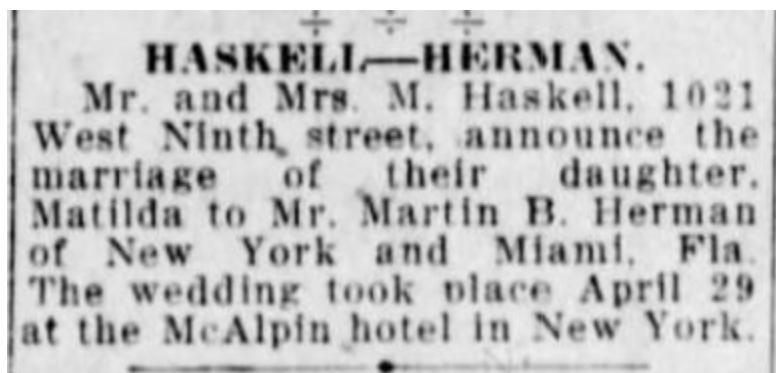

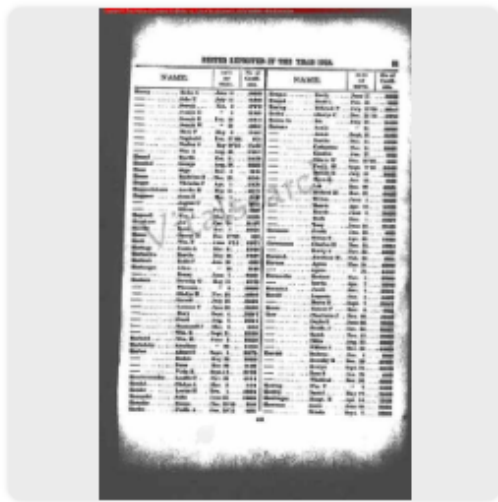
