TWO YOUNG MEN ACCEPTED.

One Who Had No Excuse Was Physically Deficient, While Number of Aliens and Others Discharged.

These are the names of the two registrants who appeared before the exemption board this morning and were accepted for military service, although neither of them had any exemption excuses to offer.

On the other hand, a large number of registrants who were ordered to appear before the board today appeared, and most of them being aliens and armed with Mexican citizenship certificates, were discharged, while a number of others presented exemption papers claiming to have relatives or families dependent upon them for support. One appeared without exemption, who was later found to be physically deficient and was excused. This afternoon the board will complete its examination of registrants so far summoned to appear before them for examination, and will then begin a search for a large number of young men who were summoned to appear, but who failed to do so.

A total of ten registrants were accepted yesterday by the Webb county exemption board, although two of them, Lieut. Luke W. Loftus, with the U. ELEVEN REGISTRANTS SKIP OUT TO EVADE ARMY SERVICE

More Men Have Been Summoned as
Alternates to Take Places of Those
to Fill Gaps of Defficient Ones.

On Saturday the Times published the list of names of the accepted registrants of Webb county whom the exemption board had notified to report to them about September 19 prepared to entrain immediately for the training station at Camp Travis. That sufficed to apparently scare the wits out of some of the Mexican-Americans on the list of "principals" summoned, with the result that this morning the exemption board learned that eleven of the Mexican-Americans had crossed the Rio Grande on Saturday and Sunday "Mexico bound" to escape service in the national army. That means that, at least eleven of the alternates published in the list are supposed to show up to take the places of the deficient ones, and there may be more of the latter before the time rolls around for them to leave for the training camp.

This morning the board issued a call for the following additional registrants to appear about September 9 to serve as alternates: Harold F. Smith, Bernardo de la Garza, Jr., Adolfo Longoria, Alfredo Campbell, Gregorio Flores, Enrique Foster, Paul L. Sauvignet, Otto Stevens, Orville W. Rogers, Miguel Hernandez, Milus D. EL FENIX PANADERIA

The owner of the El Fenix Panaderia Mr. Miguel Hernandez, can boast of an experience that few have had. He is an ex-service man, and while on the way to France during the war, was on the Tuscania which was torpedoed and sunk by the Germans, and he was one of the fortunate few who escaped. Soon after returning to Laredo after the war, he opened what is now known as the Fenix Bakery—located at the corner of Hidalgo and San Agustin Ave. And which at first was just a small store has now developed into one of the largest and most up to date shops in this part of the state. All kinds of bread is sold, but they specialize in Mexican sweet breads and pastries—of which they have innumerable kinds.

Recently, a Frigidaire soda fountain was added to the store, and is one of the largest and best in Laredo. And in connection with this department is a Mexican restaurant which was opened about ten days ago—and the most delightful of preparations are served at all hours.

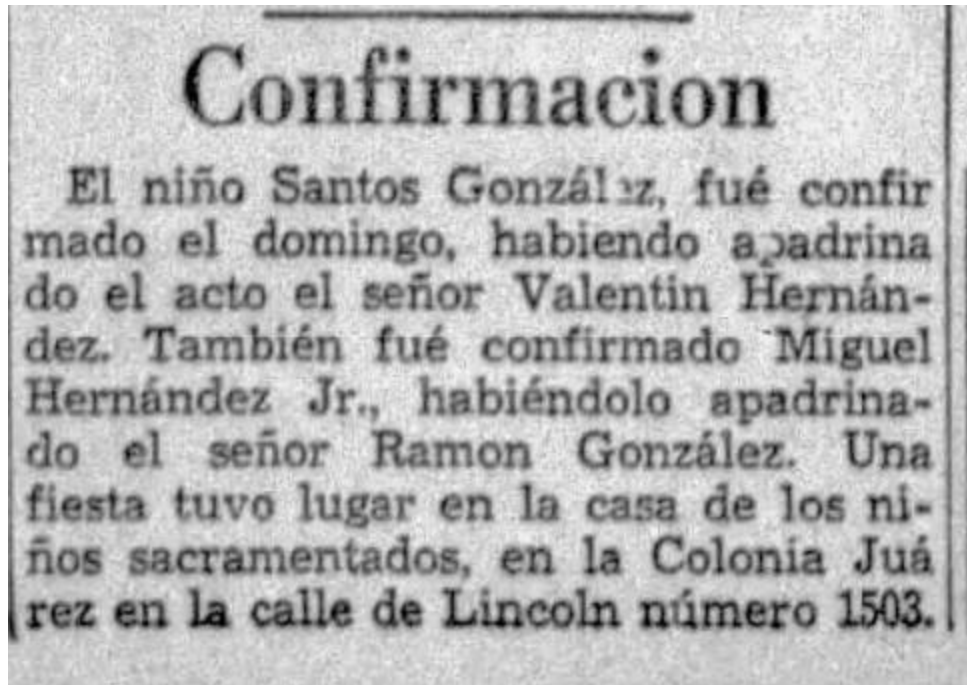
