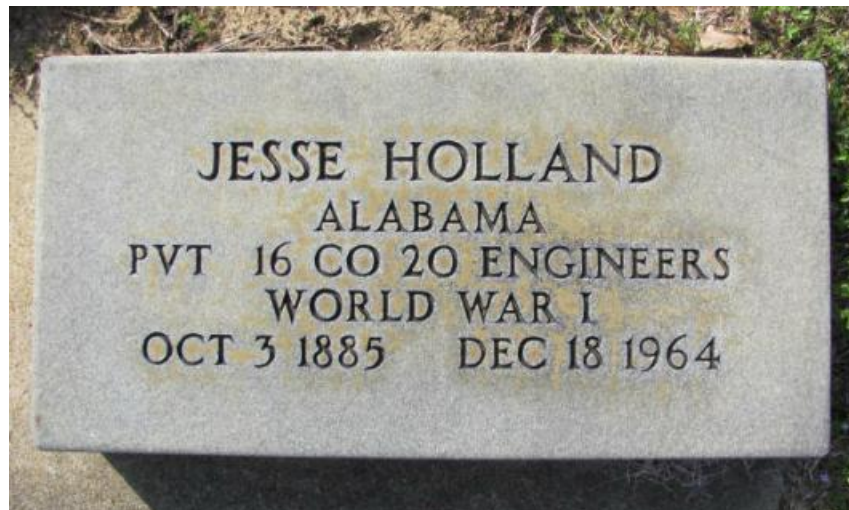

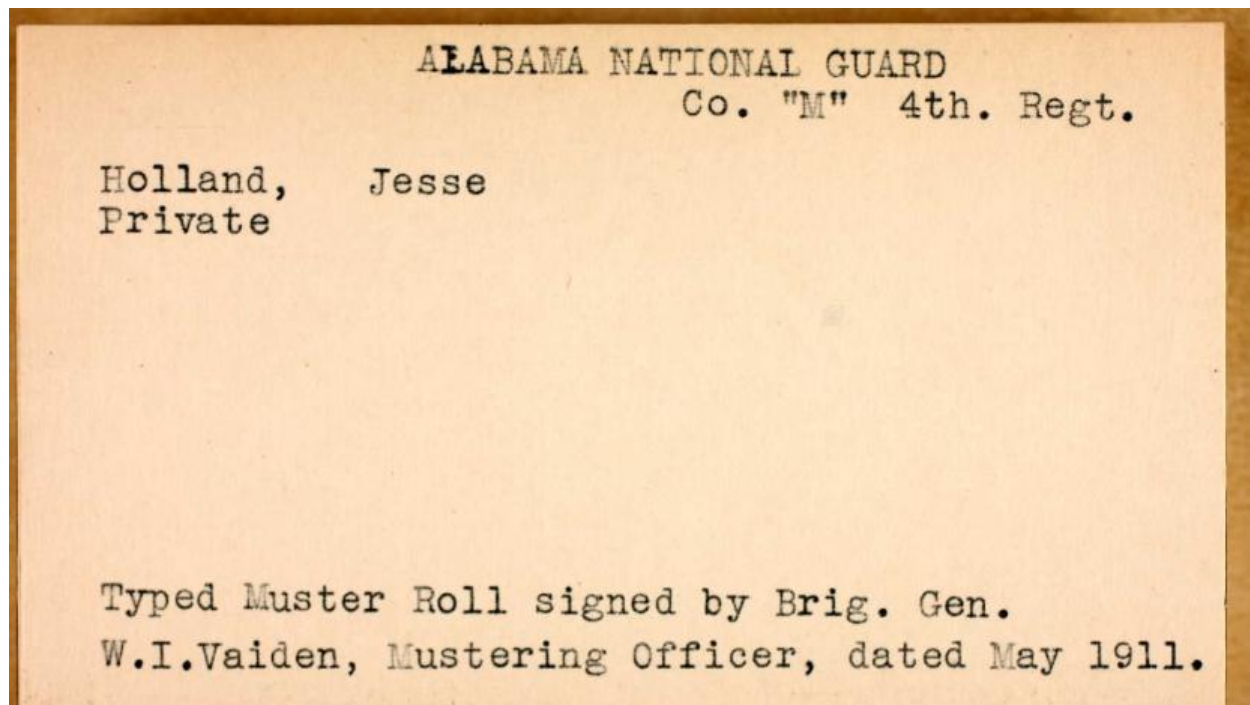

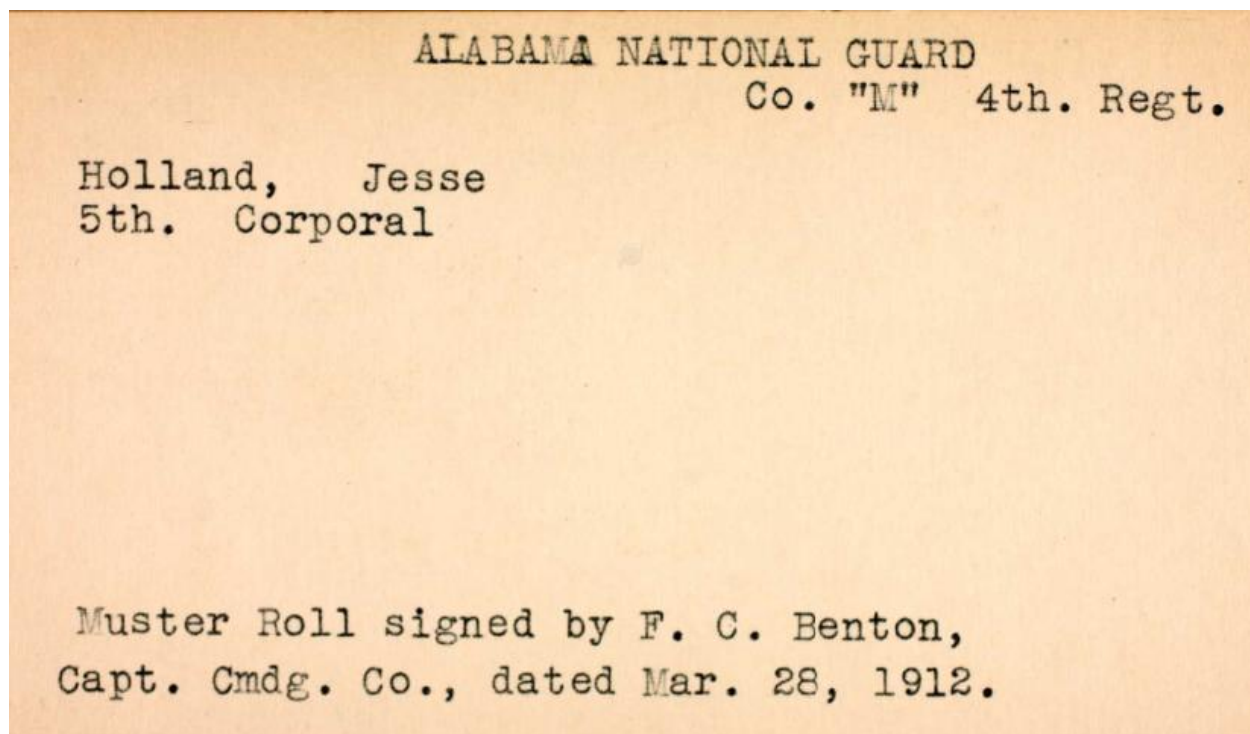

**By the Associated Press**

Washington, February 9. — At midnight, ninety-six hours after the troopship *Tuscania* had been torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine, a little more than 1000 names of the survivors has been announced here by the bureau of public information.

A few more names were in possession of the war department, but will not be arranged for publication before tomorrow, by which time it is expected the remainder of the survivors' list will have come over the cables from England.

### War Victims Well Known Here.

"I was reading in The News the list of the survivors of the Tuscania disaster," said Mrs. C. E. Johnson, "and was surprised to find in the list of names that of a schoolmate of mine a number of years ago. It was Jesse H. Holland, of Newville, Ala. His address is given as Newville, but the fact is he lives several miles from Newville, right near the plantation owned by my mother. He was a lively youngster from the farm when I knew him. We went to school at the Whitehurst schoolhouse and afterwards I went to college at Cuthbert and have never seen the young man since. I was

also acquainted with young Ben Lindsey who died in France from pneumonia. He was with General Pershing's forces. His parents live at Abbeville, Ala., near my former home."

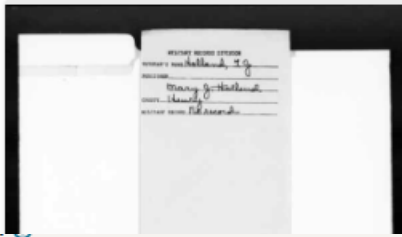

Tennille was nicknamed "Tennie" by family and friends. She was born in Alabama, daughter of a farmer. Her mother, Mary is a widow on the 1880 Census and Tennille is 10 years old.

I don't have an earlier record to tell me who Tennille's father was.

1900 Census tells us that Tennille married John D. Dunaway in 1887 when she was 16 years old. She has 5 children on that 1900 Census: Emma born 1891, Malinda born 1893, Ada born 1895, William born 1896, Ida born 1898.

On January 18, 1901 Tennille welcomes a new baby unto the world and named her Victorey, 2 year and 7 1/2 months later, baby Victorey died on September 3, 1903.

At that time Tennille also had a 5 and 1/2 month old baby named Tennie. 1 year later on September 7, 1904, baby Tennie died.

Mama Tennille died the following month on October 15, 1904, she was 33 years old.

Tennille's beloved husband John remained a widower for the next 34 years until his death. There is a family section in Ramah Baptist Church Cemetery where his family is buried.

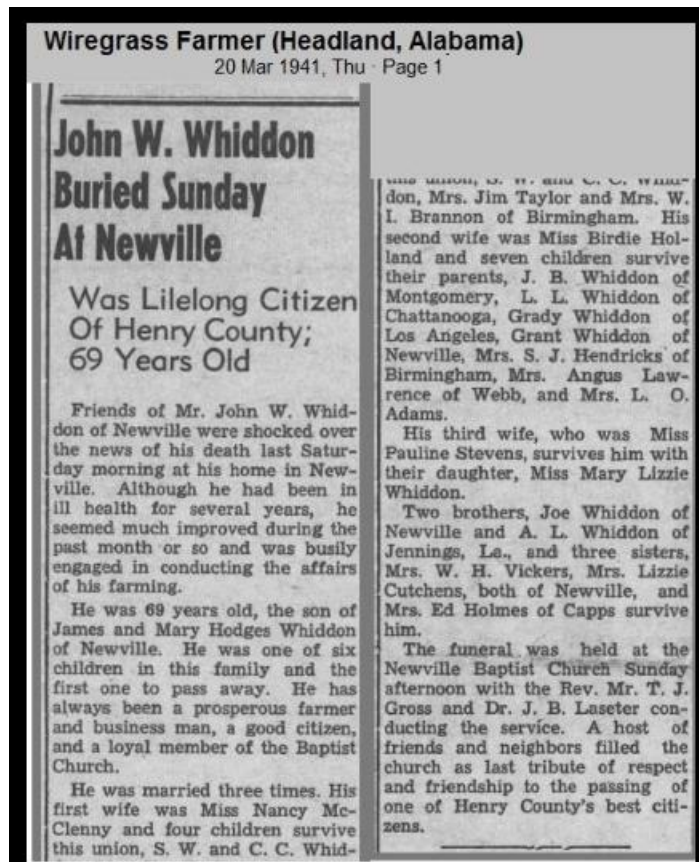

In the 1880 census, Addison W. Barnes lived in Eufaula, Barbour AL with wife Sarah.

She had 3 children with the surname Barnes in the 1880 census.

So either 1) she married a man also named Barnes; 2) she was unmarried when she gave birth; 3) she changed the birth surnames of her children back (from an unknown husband) to her unmarried surname of Barnes.

FL.) – His middle name is the 1<sup>st</sup> name of his maternal grandfather. - Husband of Rosa Belle Smith Holland Reddick (1896-1972, F: 101245255) whom he married in 1913 Rosa is buried in the same cemetery as her 2<sup>nd</sup> husband Nicholas Reddick (1892-1979, F: 101245252) & his 1<sup>st</sup> wife. Rosa is buried in Lake Mystic Cemetery, Bristol, Liberty FL, F: 101245255. – His obituary said he was survived by wife Rose, 6 sons, sister [half-sister] Mrs. Nannie Dunaway & brother Jesse Holland. - Thomas is buried in Evergreen Cemetery, Elba, Coffee AL. - **Susie Holland or M. Susie Holland**, 25 Sep 1887 Henry Co. AL – 20 Oct 1905 Newville, Henry AL. - Her gravestone was broken & a new one supplied next to it. - Buried in Newville Baptist Church Cemetery, Newville, Henry AL. The new tombstone reads: “daughter of Mary J. Barnes” - F: 79355478

**Half-siblings:** children of his mother, Mary Jane Barnes, prior to her marriage to Thomas Holland. Online genealogies do not identify their father, only their stepfather (Thomas J. Holland)

- **Nancy (“Nannie” Barnes Dunaway**, 25 Dec 1870 Dale Co. AL – 10 Sep 1943 Slocumb, Geneva AL. - Wife of Hiram D. Dunaway (1860-1918), son of Stephen Dunaway & Malinda Golden, the brother of John D. Dunaway, who married Nancy Barnes’s sister, Tennille. Nancy & Hiram married 28 Mar 1884 in Henry Co. AL. - She is buried with no marker in the New Teamon Baptist Church Cemetery, Slocumb, Geneva AL.
- **Tennille Idella (“Tennie”) Barnes Dunaway**, 11 Mar 1871 Henry Co. AL – 15 Oct 1904 FL. - Wife of John D. (J.D.) Dunaway (1861-1938, F: 20401952), son of Stephen Dunaway & Malinda Golden, the brother of Hiram D. Dunaway, who married Tennille Barnes’s sister, Nancy. John & Tennille married 18 Sep 1887 in Henry Co. AL. – They had 5 children, before having a daughter, Victorey Dunaway (1901-1903). Tennille died 13 months later, one month after her last baby Tennie had died.- Buried in Ramah Baptist Church Cemetery, Houston Co. AL. F: 20401953
- **Pearl Roberta (Berdie/Birdie/Berta) Barnes Whiddon**, 27 Aug 1880 Henry Co. AL – 28 Sep 1918 Newville, Henry AL. – She appears in one census record as “Birty.” - The 2<sup>nd</sup> of 3 wives of John Wilson Whiddon (1872-1941, F: 80517858). John Whiddon married on 14 Dec 1902 in Newville, Henry AL to “Bridie Hallow” (according to the indexed interpretation). - John had 4 children who survived him from 1<sup>st</sup> wife, Eddie Minnie (Nancy) McClenny. He had 7 children survive him from his marriage to Pearl. He had one child survive from his marriage to Pauline Stephenson. - Pearl is buried in the Newville Baptist Church Cemetery, Newville, Henry AL. F: 62606626
