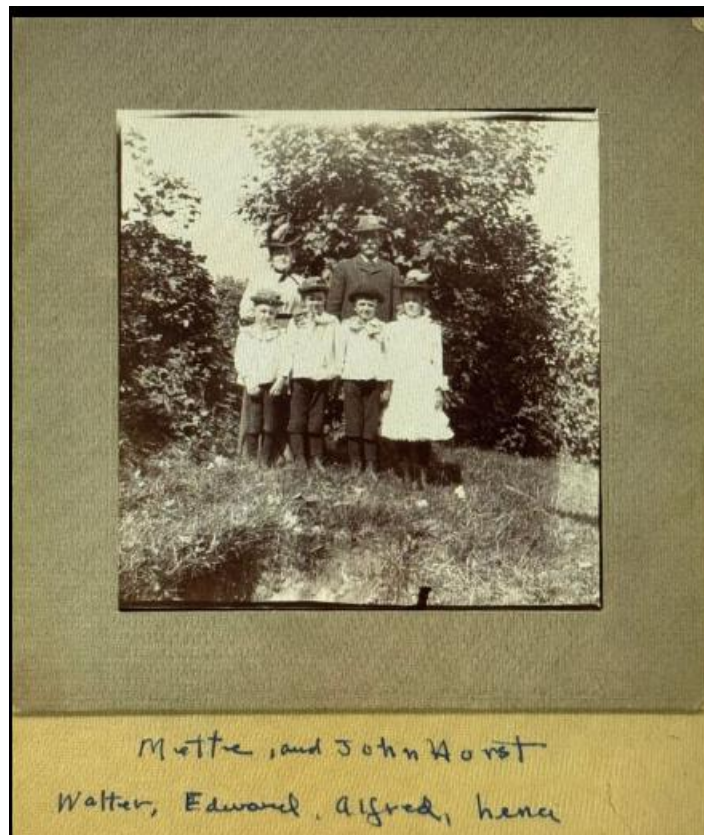

Funeral services for Edward Horst, 51, of Washington, D. C., who died Saturday morning, will be held at the Estes-Leadley Colonial chapel at 2:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, Rev. William Young officiating. Interment will be made at Brookside cemetery, Charlevoix, Wednesday afternoon. Mr. Horst is survived by the widow, D'Lores; the mother, Mrs. Mette Horst of East Lansing; two brothers, Alfred of Detroit and Walter of Three Rivers; and a sister, Mrs. Lena Stevenson of East Lansing. Mr. Horst served in World War I with the U. S. army in France, being one of the survivors of the torpedoed troopship *Tuscania*. He was a graduate of the Michigan College of Mining and Technology at Houghton and from 1925 to 1931 was employed by the state highway department, with headquarters at Ann Arbor. Since then he has been with the federal road administration, spending a year on the Alcan highway. At the time of his death he was living in Washington, D. C.

Word was received here Saturday of the death in Washington, D. C., of Edward Horst, whose mother, Mrs. John Horst, lives in East Lansing. Mr. Horst was formerly connected with the state highway department but had been in Washington for several years. Besides the mother, he is survived by the widow, Delores; a sister, Mrs. Stewart Stevenson of Lansing, and two brothers, Alfred of Detroit and Walter of Three Rivers. The body will be brought to the Estes-Leadley funeral home. Funeral arrangements will be announced later.

FIVE STUDENTS ARE FROM CHINA

**Register of M. C. M. Shows 127
Are Now Enrolled**

Five students enrolled at the Michigan College of Mines this year are from far off China, the 1913-1914 register, which has just been issued shows. One student is from Peru, one from North Ireland and one from Honolulu. Forty-one of the 127 students whose names appear on the register are from the copper country towns.

About half of the states are represented as shown by the following: Illinois, six; New York, four; Minnesota, Wisconsin and Ohio, three each; Texas and Pennsylvania, two each, and Indiana, Alabama, Washington, Vermont, Arizona and Missouri, one each. Following is a register of students:

Few Upper Peninsula Men Aboard Tuscania, Belief

Calumet, Mich., Feb. 7.—Probably not more than a dozen upper peninsula men were on the Tuscania when she was torpedoed.

Lynn Fisher, son of James Fisher, of Laurium, one of the leading bankers of the upper peninsula and member of the state pardon board, was first sergeant of the One Hundred and Seventh engineers' supply train. Half a dozen other Calumet, Houghton and Keweenaw men were with him. The engineer supply train, One Hundred and Seventh regiment, also carried several northern Michigan men.

Edward Horst, son of the foreman of the Lake Linden smelters, and Melvin Dock, son of a Hancock merchant, were among those saved, according to a cablegram received this morning.

Forty-two men, in counties outside of Wayne, are reported saved, according to war department advices.

George E. Schwartz, of Richmond; Glenn B. Dennison, Lansing; Charles C. Stoddard, Mt. Clemens, and Garland R. Gore, Tecumseh, Mich., four Michigan men reported by the war department among those rescued are either sick or injured. It was stated in a cable from Londonderry late Saturday night. They are in two hospitals in an Irish port.

**Divisional Highway Engineer's
Department Moves to Six-
Room Suite on Third Floor

H. P. The first stretch of concrete road to be built in Greene county and, in fact, within the jurisdiction of H. P. Mobberly, division state highway engineer here, under the \$60,000,000 road bond issue, has just been completed adjoining the National cemetery on the east. The road is of concrete, is one and one-half miles long and is the finest in the Springfield region.

The road was built by the Springfield Construction company, composed of J. N. Barde and I. C. Sherwood, under the supervision of Mr. Mobberly and Edward Horst, pro-

ject engineer with headquarters here.

The road is part of state highway No. 3, which extends from the Iowa to the Arkansas line and is in what is known as section 294.

Inspection of the road preparatory to acceptance by the state will take place soon under the direction of Mr. Mobberly and the road will then be opened for the public.

Told It to Me**

E D W A R D
HORST—his escape from the torpedoes Tuscania in 1918, took, for him, the starch out of one of the world's stoutest superstitions—motored to Chicago Friday with Abner E. Larned and Edward T. Fitzgerald, of Detroit, to attend a reunion of the survivors of the sunken troopship.

Guests of honor at a dinner tonight will be the commander of the German sub which sank the remodeled Cunarder, the captain of the Tuscania, and the commander of the British destroyer which took off many of the survivors.

Horst, now a field engineer in the State Highway Department laboratory at University of Michigan, was a member of the First Army artillery. He was on deck when the German torpedo hit. As he was starting to get into his lifeboat, a rope slipped and all in the boat were trampled out into the sea. Many never came up.

Finally, Horst leaped overboard, climbed on a raft, was picked up by a minesweeper after the raft had drifted around until 1 a. m., was finally landed with his mates at Larne on the Irish coast at 7 o'clock in the morning.

There were 13 men on the raft. Horst's most prized souvenir is a picture of the 13. All were sent to the same army camp at Winchester, England, and three weeks after the sinking had the photograph taken. * * *

AYRES GIVEN HEARING ON BURGLARY CHARGE

Preliminary hearing for Elmer S. Ayres, said to be a "show trailer," held in the county jail on breaking and entering and robbery charges growing out of the burglary of the Phil Levy home here Sunday, Oct. 2, was held before Judge Arthur R. Clarke in county court this afternoon.

Norman Valentine, arrested by police shortly after the robbery as an accomplice, and alleged to have had in his possession articles stolen from the Levy home, was released last Saturday after a habeas corpus hearing before Judge Paul C. Albritton in circuit court but was taken into custody by immigration authorities. It is alleged he had entered this country illegally, having held an American seaman's passport since 1924.

At the habeas corpus hearing it was said that Ayres had assumed all blame for the robbery and admitted that he was guilty, having given Valentine the suitcase and other stolen property to take to his hotel room. It was intimated at the time that Ayres would plead guilty. He is said to have a previous record.

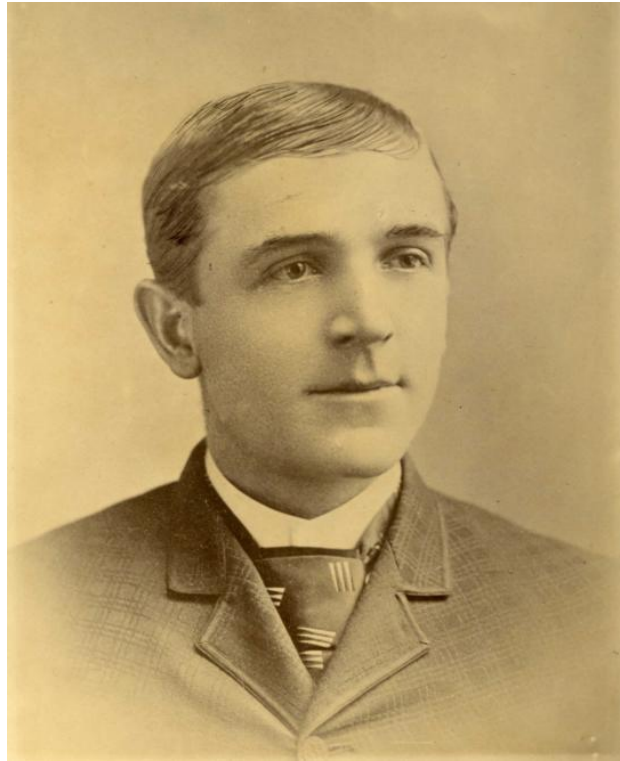

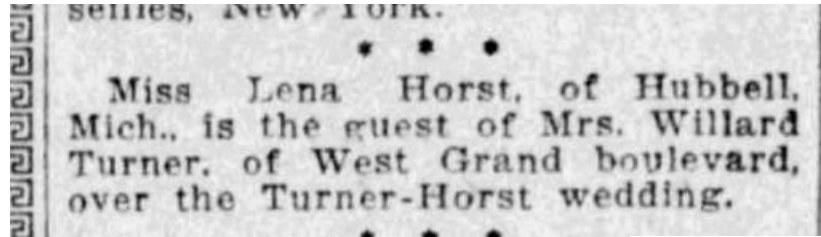
