The drawing of the serial numbers of a large number of Lane county men in the army draft which began in Washington, D. C., this morning, is the result of the system employed to reduce the necessity of drawing for each registration or state separately. The serial numbers run uniformly in all districts in the nation and by drawing one serial number all men in the various districts will be called before the exemption boards.

That the state of Oregon will supply but 717 men. It has been announced that Lane county will not be called upon to furnish any men and 14 other counties of the state will also be exempt because of credit for men now in the service.

Key numbers in the adjutant general's office at Portland will determine those actually drawn in making up the state's quota of 717 men.

Numbers of Lane men drawn include one man who is totally blind, one alien enemy who recently obtained a permit which would allow him to come within one-half mile of the armory, several men who have been rejected when making application for admission to various branches of the service because of physical deficiencies and one man who has one leg which is five inches shorter than the other.

Numbers of men now at the Presidio officers' training camp have also been drawn.

MEN IN GOOD HANDS

Tuscania Survivors in Irish Hospitals Recovering.

OFFICIAL LIST GIVEN OUT

Americans Rescued When Troopship Was Torpedoed Recovering From Injuries and Effects of Exposure—All Well Cared For.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—Sixty-three American survivors of the torpedoed troopship Tuscania were reported to the War Department today as recovering in Irish hospitals from the effects of injuries or exposure. The dispatch said none of the cases was serious and it was expected all the men soon would be discharged.

All of the 63 had previously been reported saved, and the presence of many of them in hospitals had been recorded in press dispatches, although today's dispatch brought the first official list of those in hospitals.

TUSCANIA INJURED RECOVER.

Will Curtis, Guss Johnson and Hallie Hoselton In Hospitals.

A Washington dispatch reports sixty-three survivors from the Tuscania in hospitals in Ireland recovering from injuries and exposure. In no case, according to the statement to the War Department, is the condition in the least critical, and all will be moved on soon.

At Londonberry, William B. Curtis, son of W. B. Curtis of Marshfield, is recovering. Guss Johnson of Reedsport, and Hallie M. Hoselton from Coburg, Ore., who formerly worked at the Courtenay mill here, are at the same place.

A smaller number of the 63 are at Larne, but no Coos Bay boys are in this list.

Mrs. L. M. Hoselton on Friday received a letter from her son Hallie Hoselton also on the Tuscania. It was very brief and is as follows:

"Am getting along fine. Arrived safely on other side." It is dated February 8, three days after the accident, and he was then in a hospital according to word received from the war department. His address is Co. F, 6th Battalion, 20th Engineers, A. E. F. via New York.

Hallie Hoselton, who is in France with the logging regiment, writes to his sister, Mrs. Allie Steinke, of Co-burg, that he was never so well off physically in his life and that he likes the country and the work. He says:

"I will try and drop you a few lines tonight, as I have some spare time. I received your letter some time ago, but haven't had times to answer it. It takes your letters just about one month to get here, but it takes mine longer to go back because they have to be censored.

"I hope you have got a bunch of my letters by this time; I have written a bunch of them since we have been over here. We are settled at last for a while, I guess; hope so, anyway. All

we have been doing is just moving since we have been on this side. I have sure seen some pretty sights in this country. Everything is so much different than it is in the states. This is a pretty place where we are here. It is about a mile to the nearest village, just nice walk after supper.

"The mill will soon be completed and then we will start in to work in earnest. We are living in tents now. I don't suppose we will have anything else as long as we are in France, but I don't care if we don't. They are more healthy than a house, I am getting fat since we have been over here. I weigh more now than I ever did before in my life and never felt better. This climate sure agrees with me.

"I got that box some time ago. Was sure glad to get it. I had been expecting to get it for two months. It has been on the road about three months. The candy was pretty stale, but that box of cigars was sure fine. There is an order out now that we can't get any more boxes from home unless we make out an order and have it signed by the captain. It went into effect April 1."

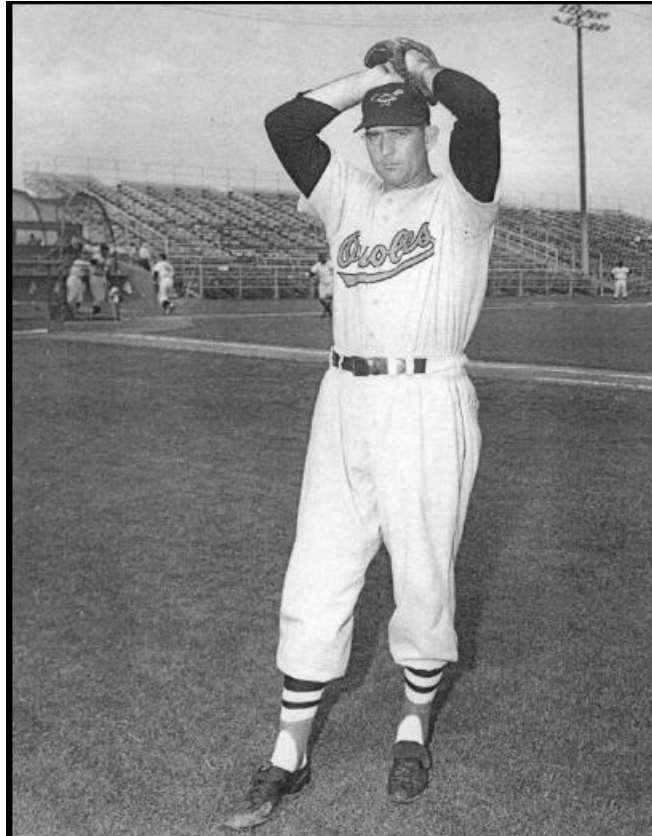

Three Youths Are Held For Fatal Stabbing

SAN ANTONIO Tex. (INS).— Three youths were held by San Antonio police today in the fatal stabbing of Howard Fox, 34, former major league baseball pitcher.

Police said Fox, who was optioned last season by the Baltimore Orioles to San Antonio of the Texas League, was stabbed yesterday after he ordered the three out of his tavern because they had created a disturbance.

A bartender, Hubert Callahan, 47, was critically knifed in the brawl.

The three youths involved in the stabbing — John J. Strickland, 20, Jack Allen, 21, and Martin Belto, 27 — surrendered at City Jail.

Strickland, a college student

who police said admitted inflicting the wounds, was booked for investigation of murder and assault to murder. His two companions were booked as material witnesses.

In his statement, Strickland claimed Fox hit him on the head with what he thought was a miniature baseball bat after the trio had been ordered outside.

Strickland said he went to a

car and got a knife during the fight.

Witnesses said Fox was stabbed once and fell to the floor. When he tried to get up, he was stabbed a second and third time.

Fox, who stood 6 feet 3 inches and weighed 195 pounds, pitched for the Cincinnati Redlegs in 1944 through 1946, and again from 1948 through 1951.

Victim's Widow Raps DA's Case

The widow of former Mission Baseball Pitcher Howie Fox took issue Thursday with the district attorney's office over the release of Martin John Belto.

BAR BRAWL

The stabbings came during the course of efforts by Fox and Callahan to eject Strickland, Belto and Jack Allen, 21,

of 128 Winnipeg, from the establishment.

Belto in a statement to the district attorney's office made no mention of possessing a knife. He said he hit Fox with his fist at the start of the trouble.

He added Callahan struck him later.

Belto, 27, of 338 Linares, was one of three men involved in the fight which ended in Fox's death early Sunday.

MURDER CHARGE

John Strickland, 22, of 538 Gilbert lane, has been charged with Fox's murder and with assault to murder in the stabbing of Hubert "Tex" Callahan, 42, of 239 Amber.

In a telegram to the district attorney's office Mrs. Fox said she had just learned through newspaper accounts of Belto's release.

Her telegram continued:

"To me he is as guilty as Strickland. He had a knife, too.

"DO YOU KNOW?"

"How do you know he didn't do it? Surely Strickland couldn't have knifed them both.

"Belto is at least an accessory, not just a material witness."

The state has listed Belto as a material witness.

The telegram was signed Mrs. Howard Fox, 2617 Roosevelt.

Fox, 34, and Callahan, his bartender, were stabbed in an altercation at Fox's tavern and dance hall, the Club House, 1379 New Laredo hwy.

Strickland Enters Not Guilty Plea

John Joseph Strickland, 22, entered a plea of not guilty Monday in Criminal District Court to the Oct. 9 fatal stabbing of baseball pitcher Howie Fox as the highly publicized trial got under way.

Selection of a jury was to get started about noon.

Howard (Howie) Fox, 34, of 2617 Roosevelt Ave. was stabbed to death outside his tavern, the Club House, 1379 New Laredo Hwy., as he and his partner Hubert (Tex) Callahan, 42, tried to eject boisterous patrons.

In the altercation that followed, Fox was stabbed fatally three times with a Navy Bowie knife and Callahan was injured critically. He later recovered.

Charged in the assault with intent to murder in the Callahan case is Martin J. Belto Jr., 338 Linares St. He will go on trial April 9.

Fox was a relief pitcher for the San Antonio Missions in 1955.

First Asst. Dist. Atty. Richard Woods heads the prosecution staff, and the Strickland defense attorneys are Peter M. Curry and Guy Bonham.

Fox's Widow Testifies in Murder Trial

Mrs. Marilyn E. Fox, widow of slain Mission Pitcher Howie Fox, testified Wednesday in Criminal District court about the fight in which her husband was fatally knifed.

Trial of John J. Strickland, 22, charged with Fox's murder during a fight outside the ball player's tavern Oct. 9, moved into its third day. Selection of a jury took two days.

HEARD THREAT

Mrs. Fox said at one point in the fight, Strickland flourished a knife and said:

"I'll whittle you down to size."

She said Strickland, accompanied by Martin Belto, 27, of 338 Linares, entered the tavern about midnight. An argument developed between Strickland and Hubert "Tex" Callahan, business partner of Fox, she said.

A fight developed, Mrs. Fox testified, in which Strickland and Belto were knocked down and thrown out of the tavern, 1379 New Laredo hwy.

SECOND TIME

Mrs. Fox related the pair forced their way back into the establishment and were tossed out a second time. She said there was a cut on Strickland's forehead.

The ball player's widow said her husband closed the tavern door and then heard rocks hitting the door and walls of the building.

After seeing Strickland and Belto display knives, she went to call police, Mrs. Fox said.

In the meantime, her husband and Callahan had gone outside the tavern. Mrs. Fox said she heard one of them say:

"The boys have gone."

HOLDING SIDE

Next thing she saw, Mrs. Fox recalled, was her husband coming up the walk, holding his side. She said he told her he had been stabbed. Mrs. Fox related she called an ambulance, but her husband was dead when it arrived.

First witness called by the state was Dr. G. D. Boyd, county health officer. He testified an autopsy performed on Fox showed four wounds in his left side, one of which penetrated the heart.

Mrs. Fox Says She Used Club

The wife of ex-major league baseball pitcher Howie Fox took the stand Wednesday morning as the first state witness in the trial of the man accused of her husband's murder.

She testified that on the night her husband was knifed to death, she herself wielded a miniature baseball bat in a fracas that resulted in Fox's death.

On trial for his life is John Joseph Strickland, 22-year-old college student of San Antonio.

Selection of a 12-man jury was completed Tuesday night.

Mrs. Fox testified that her husband and his business partner, Hubert (Tex) Callahan, attempted to eject Strickland and Martin J. Belto, Jr., 27, several times after they became "boisterous and troublesome" at a tavern owned by Fox and Callahan.

Atty. Peter M. Curry has said he would base his defense or self-defense, contending that Strickland defended himself from an attack by Fox who was wielding the miniature baseball bat.

Belto is also charged with assault to murder and is scheduled for trial April 9.

Strickland Beaten By Fox, He Says

John Joseph Strickland, 22, took the stand in his own defense Thursday and testified knife victim Howie Fox beat him mercilessly with his fists and a baseball bat the night of Oct. 9, 1955, slaying.

Fox, a former major league pitcher, was painted by Strickland as a brutal bully who after beating Strickland choked him into unconsciousness while holding him off the floor like a rat.

Strickland is on trial for murder of Fox in the knife death and took the stand after the state's witnesses had testified earlier in the week.

The young Navy veteran said he was 5 feet 7 inches tall and weighed 123 pounds. He said Fox was 6 feet 4 inches tall and weighed 225 pounds.

Strickland said he went to the Club House, owned by Strickland and Hubert (Tex) Callahan with Martin Belto Jr. and Jack Allen Oct. 9. He said he had met Belto, indicted for assault with intent to murder in the stabbing of Callahan, only an hour and a half before they went to the tavern.

Belto asked some girls to dance, and Callahan came over and told Belto to leave and there was a scuffle, Strickland said.

"Mr. Fox came over to the table. I looked up at him. I was ready to leave. I started to leave. Fox hit me in the face, gave me a black

eye and knocked me down. I tried to get up, and he kept knocking me down," Strickland testified.

"Then he grabbed me by the neck and held me out in the air, choking and holding me. They threw us out. Somebody kept pushing us back in. Fox hit me in the jaw and back onto some parked cars. I was almost out.

"I saw Fox and Callahan coming with Mrs. Fox behind them carrying a bat. She handed the bat to him. He yelled at us, 'Now we're going to beat you little brains out.'"

Strickland added he flung himself at Fox but was thrown to one side in the scuffle. He said Fox chased him between cars, caught him and hit him in the head with the bat.

He said he blacked out and that Fox quit beating him when he came to. He then went to the car and found his knife when the car light came on as the door opened.

"I got it and turned. He was raising the bat. I swung the knife three or four times to keep him away," Strickland said.

He said he was treated at the Green for broken ribs and the gash in his head. He said he be-

came ill when Det. Eddie Campa told him Fox was dead and Callahan was dying.

Jurors Wednesday heard two state witnesses testify they saw Strickland stab Fox three times outside the latter's tavern Oct. 9.

The witnesses were Robert Dardeman and Pat Patterson, musicians at the tavern at 1379 New Laredo Hwy. Dardeman said he saw Martin Belto, Strickland's companion, hit Fox in the tavern, then watched Fox and his partner, Hubert (Tex) Callahan, put Strickland and Belto out.

He told the jury he saw Mrs. Fox give her husband a miniature baseball bat and that Fox found Strickland waiting between some cars when he went outside.

"Fox just stood there, and Strickland ran up on him. Fox didn't even try to defend himself. This fellow (Strickland) knocked him down and when Fox started to get up, he stabbed him three times," Dardeman said. He said he saw no bat in Fox' hand at that time.

Mrs. Fox earlier had testified she did not remember handing her husband the bat, saying she wielded it herself in the tavern melee.

Patterson gave substantially the

same testimony as Dardeman.

A different version of the fight was given by Callahan on the stand. He said Fox hit Strickland in the face three times without provocation and chased Strickland around the tavern with a bat.

In an examining trial Nov. 22 in Justice of the Peace John Onion's court, Callahan had testified that Strickland had molested other customers and that he saw Fox and Strickland exchange blows. He said he didn't remember who struck first.

Callahan Wednesday identified Belto as the youth who stabbed him. At an examining trial for Belto, Callahan testified he didn't know who had stabbed him.

Belto was indicted for assault with intent to murder on a statement given by Callahan to Paul Thompson, San Antonio News columnist and repeated to district attorney investigators that Belto had stabbed him.

Asst. Dist. Atty. Dick Woods repeatedly emphasized that Strickland appeared in court with a crew cut and glasses, while he wore no glasses and had long hair at the time of the stabbing. One witness, Andrea Nelson, said he didn't recognize Strickland as the knife wielder.

Strickland Takes Stand

John Strickland took the stand at his murder trial Thursday and said he was "terrorized" by a beating he suffered the night Howie Fox was stabbed to death.

He said Fox administered the beating.

Strickland said he "swung" a knife at the former Mission pitcher to make him back away, but he denied knowing the knife had found its target until the following day.

TRIAL RESUMES

He took the stand at 9 a. m. as his trial resumed in Criminal District Court No. 2.

Strickland said he went to Fox's tavern on New Laredo highway with two companions the night of Oct. 9. He said one of his friends got in a quarrel.

He continued:

"I was getting ready to leave when Fox came up and hit me, knocking me down. He knocked me down three or four times and started choking me.

"I don't know why he did that. I just wanted to leave the place."

SAW BAT

Strickland said Fox pushed him out of the tavern. He said someone pushed him back inside and he saw Fox's wife had a small baseball bat in her hand.

He said he grabbed the bat but it was wrestled away from him and he staggered outside between two cars.

Strickland said he heard Fox say:

"Now we are going to beat your little * * * heads off."

He continued:

"I saw Fox running at me with the bat. I ran but he caught me, spun me around and hit me with the bat, knocking me down. He kept beating me as I lay on the ground.

"Then he walked off.

"I was dazed and shocked." WAS STUDENT

The defendant, 22, was a student at San Antonio college when Fox was killed. He has been in the county jail three and a half months.

The state rested its case against the youth at 5 p. m. Wednesday.

Earlier two musicians who played at Fox's tavern testified they saw Strickland rush at the pitcher, strike him and knock him down, and, as he started to get up, stab him three times with a bowie knife.

NO EFFORT

The two, Robert Dardeman and Pat Patterson, told the court Fox was standing between two parked cars and made no effort to defend himself when Strickland charged.

They said they heard Fox say:

"He stabbed me."

They also told that Strickland replied cursing Fox. Strickland then fled and Fox staggered back inside the tavern.

SCUFFLE

Both said that earlier in the evening there had been a scuffle between Strickland and Fox and Hubert "Tex" Callahan, Fox's partner, and Martin Belto, 27.

Dardeman testified that Mrs. Fox handed her husband a small baseball bat filled with lead and Fox ran out the door chasing Strickland after rocks and a beer bottle were hurled against the building.

Det. Eddy Campa, homicide, told the court that the day after the stabbing Strickland took him to a parking lot at 136 Dwyer and took the bowie knife from a car saying he had used it in a fight and stabbed a man with it.

Bobby Martin, another musician, testified that Mrs. Fox told her husband:

"Don't go outside."

"I WAS AFRAID"

"A minute later he came at me again. I was afraid he was going to kill me. I looked for something to defend myself with and found my 'navy' knife in the back seat of my car.

"I grabbed the knife and swung it three or four times as he came toward me, hoping he would back off.

"We both backed up and he walked toward the tavern.

"I got in the car and we drove off."

Strickland said a friend drove the car, explaining he couldn't see because of blood in his eyes.

He said he was treated at a hospital and then went home to the Cactus hotel. He said the next morning the clerk told him the police wanted to talk to him.

ONE KILLED

Strickland said he went to police headquarters and an officer told him one man had been killed and another was dying from injuries suffered in the fight.

He said:

"I got sick and almost fainted. It was a shock to me."

On cross examination Strickland said he consumed about 12 beers the night of the stabbing. He said he couldn't recall what was in a statement he signed for the police.

Strickland said:

Callahan was the next state witness for Asst. Dist. Atty. Dick Woods, Dist. Atty. Hubert Green was also present.

EXPRESS SURPRISE

Woods and Green said they were "surprised" at Callahan's story. They said it had varied greatly from testimony he gave in an examining trial.

Callahan said that Strickland had not caused any disturbance in the tavern that he had noticed until he saw Fox strike Strickland and knock him down three times.

He continued that the argument started when Belto accosted several women at the tavern. He said Strickland had not molested the women.

ANNOYED WOMEN

In the Feb. 22 examining trial Callahan testified that

Strickland had been annoying the women.

Also at the first trial he said he "didn't know about any blows" exchanged between Fox and Strickland.

Green said Callahan at various times had first said Belto stabbed him. At the examining trial he claimed he did not know who stabbed him, and Wednesday returned to the original story.

Callahan was hospitalized several weeks as a result of his injury in the fracas.

Wednesday he said that as he followed Fox out the door he said he himself was struck on the head by a rock and stabbed. He said he staggered back inside and claimed lack of memory of what other things happened.

He also testified that Fox carried the miniature bat outside with him and Fox said:

"I think I'll settle this once and for all."

Three girls testified that Belto annoyed them at the dance.

Defense and prosecution stipulated that Strickland received treatment at the Robert B. Green hospital for a 3-inch cut on his forehead.

Strickland Killed Fox, Two Testify

Two state witnesses testified Wednesday they saw John J. Strickland stab Howie Fox three times outside the latter's tavern Oct. 9.

Strickland is on trial in Criminal District Court for murder of the former major league and San Antonio Mission pitcher.

The eye witnesses to the fight between Fox and Strickland, which involved two others also, were Robert Dardeman and Pat Patterson, musicians at the tavern at 1379 New Laredo Hwy.

Dardeman was one of the final state witnesses presented Wednesday by Asst. Dist. Atty. Dick Woods, who is handling prosecution with Dist. Atty. Hubert W. Green. Defense testimony is due to begin Thursday morning.

Fight Described

Peter Curry, attorney for Strickland has not indicated whether the 22-year-old defendant will take the stand. Four or five defense witnesses are scheduled to testify Thursday.

Dardeman's testimony, which was repeated by Patterson was that he saw Martin Belto, 27, of 338 Linares, Strickland's companion, hit Fox inside the tavern and then saw Fox and his partner, Hubert (Tex) Callahan, put Strickland and Belto outside.

Dardeman said he saw Mrs. Fox hand her husband a miniature baseball bat. Mrs. Fox had testified earlier she did not recall handing Fox the bat. She said she wielded it herself.

Dardeman said Fox went outside the tavern and Strickland was waiting between some cars.

"Fox just stood there," said Dardeman, "and Strickland ran up on him. Fox didn't even try to defend himself.

"This fellow (Strickland) knocked him down and when Fox started to get up he stabbed him three times."

Dardeman said Fox had no bat in his hand at the moment "that I could see."

Testimony Differs

Det. Eddie Campa added Strickland had come to the police station later that day and handed him a Navy knife, saying, "I used this in a fight, stabbing a man."

Callahan had followed Mrs. Fox to the stand to testify that Fox hit Strickland three times in the fact, without provocation and each time knocking Strickland to the floor of the tavern. He said Fox chased Strickland around the tavern with a bat.

This conflicted with Callahan's testimony at an examining trial Nov. 22 in Justice of the Peace John Onion's court. Then he said Strickland had molested other customers and that he saw Fox and Strickland exchange a few blows, but didn't remember who struck first.

When Callahan first talked from a hospital bed about the fight, he

told Paul Thompson of San Antonio News that Belto stabbed him. On the basis of a similar statement made later to Dist. Atty. Investigator Amos Linger, Belto was indicted for assault to murder. At an examining trial for Belto, Callahan testified that he didn't know who stabbed him.

To a question by Woods on whether he recognized the man who stabbed him, Callahan's reply Wednesday was:

"Yes, it was that boy, Belto."

Change Noticed

Throughout questioning of various witnesses, Woods kept stressing the point that Strickland appeared in court Wednesday with a crew cut and wearing glasses, while at the time of the Fox stabbing, witnesses said Strickland wore his hair long and had no glasses.

One witness, Andrea Nelson, said she didn't recognize the defendant.

Curry has said he will base his defense on self-defense, contending that Strickland defended himself from an attack by Fox who was wielding the baseball bat.

Belto is scheduled to go to trial on the assault to murder charge on April 9.

Strickland May Try Appeal

John F. Strickland, 22, received a 10-year sentence Friday morning from a Criminal District Court No. 2 jury, which found him guilty of murder with malice.

Strickland was charged with murder of Mission Pitcher Howie Fox, who was stabbed to death in a brawl outside Fox's New Laredo hwy. tavern last October.

CALM AT VERDICT

The youth, a former San Antonio college student, re-

ceived the verdict calmly and with no change of expression. His attorney, Peter Curry, indicated an appeal from the sentence will probably be filed.

The jury returned its verdict 14 hours after receiving the case at 8:30 p. m. Thursday.

Strickland testified he was "terrorized" by the former big league pitcher in the fight and charged Fox attacked him with a small baseball bat.

NO COMMENT

Of the penitentiary sentence facing him now, Strickland said:

"I have no comment to make at this time."

Rev. Luther Osborn, whose own son is serving a prison sentence for the death of a pool room operator, was an observer in the court room.

Asst. Dist. Atty. Richard Woods led the staff of prosecutors.

"TOO LIGHT"

Fox's widow and his father considered Strickland's sentence too light, Mrs. Fox said:

"I just heard the news and I'm quite excited. The sentence is not as much as I would have liked to see him get."

H. H. Fox, the late ball player's father, said:

"We thought he should have got a heavier sentence, but I'd hate to put in the time he (Strickland) is going to have to."

Belto Indictment Quashed By Judge

An indictment against Martin Belto Jr., charging assault to murder on Hubert (Tex) Callahan, was dismissed Monday by Criminal Dist. Court Judge Joe F. Brown.

Belto was charged with John Joseph Strickland in connection with an attack on baseball pitcher Howard Fox and Callahan, who were partners in a cafe on the New Laredo Hwy. at the time of the attack last fall.

Strickland was tried for the murder of Fox, who died of knife wounds, and was sentenced to 10 years imprisonment by a Bexar County jury in February.

In his motion to dismiss charges against Belto, First Asst. Dist. Atty. Richard Woods gave as reason the inconsistency of Callahan's versions of the stabbing. Woods said in his motion that

during an examining trial before Justice of the Peace John F. Onion, Callahan said he did not know who stabbed him. Later, at the Strickland trial, Woods said, Callahan said Belto stabbed him. Last week, Woods said, Callahan went to the Belto home and "while attempting to obtain money from the Belto family, Callahan said he knew Belto had not stabbed him."

Justice of the Peace George L. Wideman, who has been employed as defense attorney for Belto, was at the Belto home, and allegedly heard this conversation, Woods said.

Woods told the court that these discrepancies "gave rise to a reasonable doubt which would exist in any mind as to the guilt of the defendant."

Square dancer, athlete Fox dead

Delano N. "Slick" Fox, a Bend resident since 1949 who was known for his achievements on athletic fields and on the square dance floor, died of cancer Tuesday at St. Charles Medical Center.

He was 63.

"Slick" — a nickname given to him as a child after a radio broadcaster named Slicker Fox — was born in Coburg, a tiny town a few miles north of Eugene, in November 1924.

Fox attended Thurston High School, where he was an all-star baseball and basketball player. Standing well over 6 feet, Fox was one of seven tall sons, most of whom were involved in athletics.

Two years after his graduation from Thurston in 1941, he served in the military for four years.

Before he was discharged from the Army Air Forces, he married Melba Hoselton in Tacoma, Wash., on Oct. 4, 1946.

Shortly after leaving the mili-

tary, the New York Giants organization signed him as a pitcher.

Fox and his wife joined the Bachelor Beaus Square Dance Club in 1968.

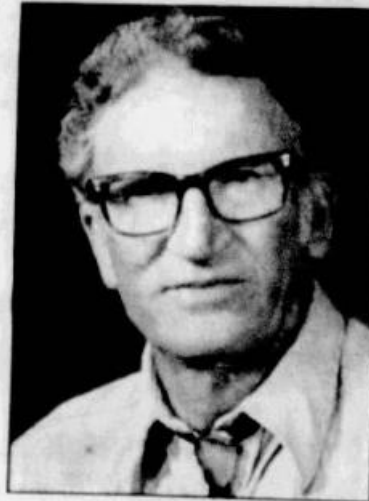
Fox became the club's caller in 1971, and five years and many square dances later, he constructed Fox Hall. The hall, where the funeral will be held at 11 a.m. Saturday, is on Studio Road.

By profession, Fox was a building contractor. For the past 10 years of his life, however, he was a square dance teacher and caller, while operating Fox Hall as a business.

Many local square dancers will remember him for his dedication, patience and abilities.

In the athletic fields, Fox played baseball and basketball locally for several years and was active in Bend youth baseball. He was also an outstanding bowler and had recently learned to play golf.

Ballroom makes comeback

Grace and romance return to dance floor

Betty Fairham likes to think her time has come. And Smithsonian magazine agrees with her.

Ballroom dancing, for almost three decades relegated to ancient history by the twist, the monkey and other non-touch dancing, is making a comeback, according to an article in the March 1989 issue of Smithsonian by Alice J. Kelvin.

Kelvin says that membership in the U.S. Amateur Ballroom Dancers Association has doubled in the last five years.

A magazine called Ballroom Dancing USA, published in Minneapolis, lists 1,000 dance spots across the country where people can again dance cheek-to-cheek, and cruise companies are even offering dancing vacations to San Juan and the Virgin Islands.

"People like the elegance of ballroom dancing, the beauty in the movement," explains Fred Kaviani, manager of the Arthur Murray studio in New York City. "They like to wear tuxedos and gorgeous dresses and go out dancing. They seem to welcome the formality and a return to a conservative, more mannered time."

Fairham felt that the Bend area, too, was ready for the nostalgic return of dancing to big-band music of the 30s and 40s, so she approached the Bend Metro Park and Recreation District's Wayne Smith to help organize the first such dance in October.

"We never could have done it without them," she said. "They took care of all the publicity, the posters, the mailing."

The first dance, held at Fox Hall on Studio Road in Bend, drew a core group of about 20 couples plus maybe 10 to 15 other twosomes, according to Fairham. "We thought that was pretty good for the first time," she

said.

However, she admitted they lost money on the first dance and "The Park and Rec subsidized it. They can't keep doing that, so we hope to break even on the next one."

The next one, held on Dec. 3, was the Christmas dance and, according to Smith, at \$10 a couple they did break even. "Close enough, anyway," he said.

The success of the event, though, was not just measured financially. Smith said there were 47 couples at the dance, and, perhaps more significantly, many were there for the first time.

"There were people at the first dance that weren't there (at the Christmas dance) and people at the second dance that weren't at the first. Hopefully, they'll all come to the next one," he said.

Smith said tentative plans are for a Valentine's dance on Feb. 11 from 4 to 7 p.m. at Fox Hall.

The Christmas dance had live music, but Fairham said the initial search for a band proved to be a problem.

"We finally found the Wall Street Dance Band," she said. "They were the only ones who would play the kind of sound we wanted. All the other (area) bands are

into rock 'n' roll or country/Western."

Smith expressed gratitude to the band during a break in the dancing. "Despite the fact they may be the only game in town," he joked, "they have done a great job for us."

The nearly 50 couples who whirled and twirled on the wood dance floor seemed to agree, as the seven-piece band switched from fox trot to waltz to tango.

Joe and Melba Pieper (formerly Melba Fox), who own the dance hall and hold regular square dances there, were out enjoying themselves to the mellow sounds. "We like to see this," Melba said. "I think there is more demand for this kind of dance than most people thought."

Eunice Munn and her husband Bob have attended both dances. She said the core group of dancers felt a real yearning to kick up their heels since coming to the area.

"We square-danced before," she said, "and once in a while there would be a (ballroom) dance at the Inn (of the Seventh Mountain), but, except for that, there was no place to do this kind of dancing." Now there is.

Fairham said that al-

though the dances are open to the public and all adults are welcome. "90 percent of the people who show up are over 50. Most young people don't know how to do this kind of dancing," she said.

To encourage younger couples to attend, there will be thirty-minute free lessons offered at each dance for those who want to learn. Eunice Hannen, who has taught ballroom dancing for Central Oregon Community College, or Patty Fallon, who teaches dance for the Park District, will be there to guide any-age feet through some basic steps, said Fairham.

After the holidays the group will do a phone survey of those who attended the dances to see if there is anything they want changed or any interesting ideas for future dances.

Fairham has some of her own. "I'd like to see some theme dances," she said. "Maybe a '20s dance or one with a Latin American theme or a hobo party after taxes."

But she emphasized, "We don't want it so structured that it won't be fun and

friendly."

And success locally is likely based on many signs that ballroom dancing will be the height of fashion in the 90s.

Amateur dance competitions, with dancers as young as six or seven, are thriving, with more than \$50,000 in cash and prizes at stake in the national competitions in Miami last year.

Roseland, a legendary taxi-dancing spot in New York City, has been refurbished and is drawing good crowds. And, for the younger generation, colleges such as the University of Wisconsin and the University of California at Berkeley are among schools now offering courses in ballroom dancing.

Kelvin is convinced this is no passing fad. "As for me, I believe ballroom dancing is here for a long run because it's at once personal and universal. (It is) the dance of love. I'll take the sequins and chiffon, the roses and the romance, the misty reminiscing. I'll return to the unfettered dance floor and dance with elegant abandon."

And it's virtually certain she won't be out there alone.

Frank King of Eugene was killed; Mrs. M. E. Conley of McMinnville was seriously injured, and six other persons were shaken up in an automobile accident two miles west of Crow on the Vaughn road, Saturday night.

The car driven by King and another driven by Ernest Lingo, route 1, Junction City, are said to have crashed into each other in a head-on collision. They were traveling along a straight piece of road.

King was dead when brought to the hospital, but whether he was killed outright or died on the way is not known.

Lights Are Blamed

Mrs. Conley and Eunice Tompkins of Crow were in the car with King. Mrs. Conley received fractured pelvic bones, a deep cut on the chin and other bruises. She is at the Eugene hospital. Miss Tompkins was only slightly bruised.

In the Lingo car were Mr. and Mrs. Lingo and their baby, Don Freeman and Mildred Wright. None was injured.

State police officers reported that the King car had but one headlight and that Lingo became blinded. The accident happened around 8 o'clock.

King Leaves Family

Mr. King has been in Alaska but had returned to his home here, physicians at the hospital said. He is said to be survived by a wife and several children.

Mrs. Conley's home is in McMinnville but she has been visiting her mother at Crow for some time.

Miss Tompkins' home is reported to be near Crow, about one mile from the scene of the accident.

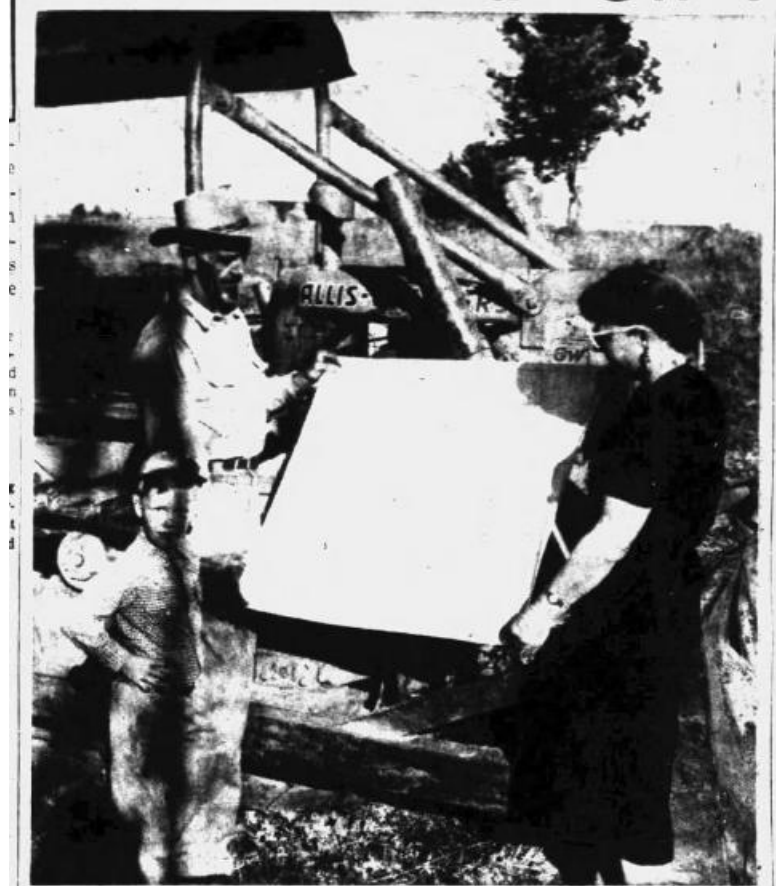

Cost of the new course has been estimated at \$50,000. The course layout was designed by Fred Federspeil of Portland, golf course architect who has designed several Oregon golf courses.

Included in the plans are a driving range near the first tee and a putting green.

The Hoseltons have had no experience in building a golf course, but became interested when public opinion was extremely favorable when they mentioned the idea. They own approximately 100 acres at the end of Allen Lane.

Next June Is Tentative Date For Opening

Next June has been tentatively set as the opening date of the new Corvallis public golf course, which is presently under construction. The new nine-hole course is being laid out by Mr. and Mrs. Mode Hoselton, former owners of the Hoselton Lumber company in Corvallis.

The course will be located near the end of Allen Lane, southeast of Avery Park. The clubhouse will be built on Allen Lane, with the course stretching towards Mary's river.

The Hoseltons' plan to name the new golf course the Marysville Corvallis Golf Club. The course will be 3293 yards long, with a par of 36 for men and 38 for women.

At present, Hoselton is clearing the land with his caterpillar and will install the drainage system soon. He plans to seed the grass this fall. Work on the clubhouse will also start this fall.

New Course to Open at Corvallis

It certainly looks as if the citizens of Corvallis will have sufficient links facilities by next spring. A new nine-hole public course, owned and operated by Mode Hoselton, is expected to open around Memorial Day. It is located one-half mile south of the city near Avery Park, extends approximately 3290 yards and has a par of 36. The swimmers get a break with water on two holes. Longest hole is 525 yards. In pioneer days, Corvallis was known as Marysville and thus the new layout has been named the Marysville Golf Course. A driving range also has been installed.

Corvallis' new Marysville golf course, spread out over 3293 yards just to the south of Avery park, will open to the public Monday. Mode Hoselton, retired local sawmill owner, and his wife Rozell have spent the past two years building the course.

Prices will be 75 cents a round on weekdays and \$1 on weekend. Par over the nine-hole layout has been set at 36 for men and 38 for women. The course will be open daily from 6 a.m. until dark.

Directions to get to the course are as follows: Drive out the Eugene highway to Miller's Food Center, turn right onto Avery lane, then turn left onto Allen lane just before you get to the east entrance of Avery park. The new course is located at the south end of Allen lane.

Attractive Clubhouse

The Hoseltons have built an attractive clubhouse on the front of the course. Rest room facilities and a refreshment bar are included inside the clubhouse. New rental carts, clubs, and other equipment will be available.

Tee for the first hole is just east of the clubhouse. The No. 1 fairway stretches out 407 yards to the south. A fence row along the left side provides a mild hazard. Par is four for men and five for women.

The second and third holes are 392 and 417 yards. Par is four for both but five for women on No. 3. Distance to the fourth cup is relatively short, 200 yards and par three.

Longest hole on the course is No. 5, 525 yards, par five. No. 6 is 370 yards, par four. No. 7 is another four par with a distance of 325 yards from tee to pin. It's a dogleg to the left and should be tough to play as it circles a grove of trees on the bank of a water hole.

Shortest and trickiest hole on the course is No. 8. It's 157 yards requires par three as it directly crosses the same 100-yard water hole.

No. 9 is another dogleg to the

left and stretches out 500 yards along trees' lining the south bank of the millrace. Par is five.

Golf course fountain of youth for Babe

Marysville keeps fees at mininum for loyal clientele

CORVALLIS — Three decades ago, Babe Hoselton practically tried to give away what she now credits for her long life: Marysville Golf Course.

Hoselton and her late husband, Mode, didn't know a thing about golf when they built the course back in the late 1950s. But they had some land, along the Marys River. And their friends wanted a golf course.

So the Hoseltons delivered. However, the course wasn't exactly a gold mine in those early days.

"We had a struggle," she says. "The first few years, we offered it for sale very cheap, and no one wanted it. We offered it to the Elks before

they went up on the hill. We offered it to the city, and they didn't want it. I think the Elks are pretty sorry. They would really have some club if they'd bought it."

Luckily for Hoselton, they didn't. "It's wonderful," she says of her life at the somewhat hidden south-Corvallis course. "It's kept me alive."

As for the nine-hole, 3,600-yard course, it stays alive despite many competing courses partly because of a strong clientele of senior citizens, attracted by the comparatively low green fees. Hoselton, now in business with sons Douglas, 42, and Deveen, 70, charges \$8 for nine holes weekdays, \$9 on weekends.

Corvallis' other full-length public course, Trysting Tree, has fees of \$13 for nine holes and \$22 for 18, every day.

"We don't charge too much, not any more than we have to," Hoselton says. "We own our own course. It's all paid for, and I doubt that very few others are paid for."

Marysville has no sand traps and just one small water hazard, but it has a men's club of about 90 members and a women's club of about 65. It has a clubhouse that sells snacks and beer, and the course also deals in golf supplies.

"We sell used equipment," Hoselton said. "We'll order anything for anybody, but we don't stock much."

One of Marysville's regular customers is Corvallis' Bill Rater.

"It's kind of a long course," said the 77-year-old Rater. "Nice, wide-open fairways, and the fairways are in pretty good shape for the weather we've had."

Rater says he golfs at Marysville four or five times a week. His regular foursome also features wife Betty and another couple, Wilbur and Ilien Varah, also of Corvallis.

Rater, a retired federal fire fighter, moved to the mid-valley in 1962 and figures he's been teeing them up at Marysville since '65. That means that while he's reaped the benefits of the course, located just south of Avery Park on Allen Street, he wasn't part of the group whose goading prompted its creation.

"Everyone wanted us to build one," Hoselton says. "There weren't any around when we built ours, just the country club."

Prior to their career as golf course owners, Babe and Mode Hoselton had a sawmill in Corvallis for 15 years.

"Neither one of us knew anything about golfing," Hoselton says. "When we sold our mill and

retired, we bought a place right to the side of the course."

When the person that owned neighboring property died, the Hoseltons bought it, and it ultimately became 74-acre Marysville Golf Course.

"I told my husband to buy it, so we bought it," she says. "We ran cows on it, and it was kind of a playground. Then everybody started yelling golf course, and my husband thought it was a good idea."

Mode Hoselton, who died eight years ago, named the course Marysville, after the original name of Corvallis; the community's name was changed in the late 1800s because the town was getting confused with Marysville, Calif.

When it came time to name the course, Babe thought the name Marysville should've remained on the shelf.

"My husband picked that," she says. "I didn't want it. Marys River I thought sounded better, being as we're right on it."

But Marysville it became, and a haven of low-cost golfing it's become.

"We have a lot of retired people on fixed incomes, and I don't have the heart to charge more than I have to," Hoselton says.

Hoselton in Reno NV late this week. “Nevada State Journal” (Reno NV) Friday 4 May 1934 p 6 – marriage license: Harve W. Hoselton, age 36 & Lucille M. Simmons, age 29, both of Klamath Falls OR. – As Harve Wayne Hoselton, was an employee of Pelican Bay Camp, Chiloquin OR when he registered for the WWII draft in 1942. Resident of Klamath Falls OR in May 1944, Mar 1961 & Jun 1970. – Lucille Marie Hoselton was born 28 Feb 1905 OR & died 22 Jan 1987 Klamath Co. OR.

Raised in the west Eugene OR area, then worked in logging camps around Eugene & Coos Bay OR.
